

J. B. Lawes' British Wheat Estimates.

Mr. J. E. Beerbohm says that Sir J. B. Lawes puts the average yield at 30 bushels (of 60 pounds) per acre for the United Kingdom, which, on the area sown of 2,302,245 acres represents a crop of t 8,975,000 quarters, from which about 600,000 quarters are deducted for seed, so that the net quantity for consumption would be about 8,375,000 quarters, according to Sir J. B. Lawes, who has evidently taken no account of the more than usually large quantity only fit for cattle feeding this year. In this List the quantity available for consumption has been calculated at 7,500,000. tity for consumption would be about 5,000.00 quarters, according to Sir J. B. Lawes, who has evidently taken no account of the more than usually large quantity only it for cattle feeding this year. In this List the quantity available for consumption has been calculated at 7,500,000 quarters, and the writer is not yet disposed to increase that estimate. Owing to the fact that the Board of Trade now makes its returns in quarters of 480 pounds and allows only 72 per cent. yield of flour from wheat, Sir J. B. Lawes has based his calculations on a similar line; but this leads him to increase his estimate of the consumption of six bushels per head, which for a population of 38,034,615 means a total consumption of 28,525,961 quarters. Thus he estimates that the United Kingdom will require to import over 20,000,000 quarters in the present season, in which respect he does not differ much from the opinion of those more in touch with the trade, but whose estimate of the consumption, as well as of this year's crop, is much smaller.
