













EXTRACT FROM A JOURNAL OF THE BISHOP OF NOVA SCOTIA, IN THE SUMMER OF 1842.

(From the Quarterly paper of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign parts.)
Sunday, June 5, 1842.—A fine day, for which we were thankful. The congregation began to assemble at an early hour from various quarters, some on boats, some in wagons, some on horses, and many on foot.

At 11 o'clock 600 persons were collected in the new church, a spacious and very handsome gothic building which is most creditable to the people and to the unweary exertions of the missionary. Here is another great change. I recollect Chester with a small church, and only a few worshippers to assemble within its walls. It now has a noble church, capable of containing more than 700 persons; and yet, to our great regret, many families are unable to find seats, which they desire to occupy as their own.

Thursday, June 9.—Several members of our flock made me an early visit. We were in the church at ten, when a congregation of 300 persons met us. I preached at some length on the rite of confirmation, and then confirmed 47 persons, whom I afterwards addressed as earnestly as I could, and they gave me reason to hope they were not unmoved.
