STANDING RULES

FOR THE

CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT

OF THE

Newfoundland Church Society.

I.—This Society shall be called "THE NEWFOUND-LAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

II.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Patron, a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer and Secretary. The Committe of Management shall consist of the Officers of the Society, and of Seventeen Lay Members, of whom four shall be elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay, of whom seven shall be quorum. The election of the Lay Members of the Committee shall be as follows:—On Easter Tuesday in the year 1855, and on Easter Tuesday in every succeeding fourth year, a meeting of Electors resident in each Deanery shall be convened by the Senior Clergyman (or, in the



event of his omission so to do, by public notice.) at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given during Divine Service in each Church in the Leanery, at least seven days previously; at which meeting the Senior Clergyman, or, in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members, shall preside, and the Members present, whether in person or by proxies, shall elect seriatim, their representatives to the Committee; provided that the persons elected may be resident in any other Deanery than that which they may be chosen to re-

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present.

III.--The President, or in his absence, the Archdeacon of the Diocese, or Bishop's Commissary, shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Committee; and in addition to his vote as Member shall, when the votes on any question are equal, have a casting vote. Clergymen of the Diocese shall be ex officio honorary members of the Committee, with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the said officers, of voting at its meetings. As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, or refusal to serve, of any of the said Lay members, to appoint others or another in his or their place or places, a special meeting of Members of the Society, in such Deanery where the vacancy shall arise, shall be convened in like manner as the Easter Meeting; and the like notice shall be given of such special meeting, when the necessary number of Members, to replace those retired, shall be in like manner elected.

IV.—His Excellency the Governor for the time being shall be requested to accept the office of Patron: The Lord Bishop shall be President, and the Rural Deans Vice-Presidents of the Society.

V.—All persons paying the annual sum of Ten Shillings currency, shall be members of the Society, with power to vote at the annual and other meetings.

VI.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the funds, to the furtherance of the Gospel in this Island, under the recommendation and sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese: The objects to which such appropriation shall be made shall be as follows:—1st towards the maintenance of the Clergy and licensed Lay-Readers—2nd, the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches. Parsonages, and School-rooms—3rd, the supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books and Religious Works and Tracts.

VII.—The Committee shall meet on the first Mon-

day of every quarter at St. John's.

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VIII.—The Committee shall appoint, each year, two of their Members to audit the Treasurer's Account.

IX.—A monthly Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held on the second Wednesday in every Month, at 7 o'clock: and a General Annual Meeting on the 2nd Wednesday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon thereafter as the Bishop may appoint.

X.—No existing law shall be repealed or altered, nor any new rule established, except at a General Meeting of the Society, the proposed change having been first recommended by the President, or the Committee, and in the latter case approved by the President. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be convened by the President at any time on his own authority, or by the Committee, or by any twelve Members of the Society by a written requisition adaddressed to the Secretary.

XI.—All Meetings shall be opened and closed with the Prayers recommended to be used at the Meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

XII.—The Members of the Church in every part of the Island, shall be invited to co-operate by form-

ing Local Committees, under the direction of the Clergy, in each Mission or Parish.

XIII.—No Mission nor Clergyman of any Mission shall receive any allowance or assistance from the Society unless at least a list of the contributions made in such Mission to the funds of the Society in the preceding year, shall have been duly forwarded to the President or to the Secretary, together with a return of all payments or offerings of money, not being fees for occasional services.

Note.—While it is hoped that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

PROCEEDINGS

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At the Seventeenth Anniversary of "THE NEWFOUND-LAND CHURCH SOCIETY," held at St. John's, 30th June, 1858.

The Right Rev. the LORD BISHOP of the Diocese, President, in the Chair.

The Report of the Committee having been read by the Secretary, and the Treasurer's Account submitted, it was moved by the Rev. W. K. White, seconded by the Rev. E. A. Sall:—

1.—That the Report now read, with the Treasurer's Account, be received, adopted, and printed.

Moved by the Rev. M. BLACKMORE, seconded by J. BAYLY, Esq.:—

2.—That this Meeting desires to acknowledge, with reverence and gratitude, the mercy and goodness of Almighty GoD to the Church Society during the past year.

Moved by B. Robinson, Esq., Q. C., seconded by the Rev. J. F. Phelps:—

3.—That the Members of the Newfoundland Church Society desire to record their gratification at the extension of the Church throughout the world by the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel; and although the opening from time to time of fresh fields for that Society's operations, especially in India, will render it more imperative than ever on the Committee at home to withdraw their grants from the older Missionary Dioceses, yet they cannot but rejoice, and acknowledge the greater obligation which is thus imposed upon them, of making increased efforts towards rendering the Church in Newfoundland self-supporting.

Moved by the Rev. J. C. HARVEY, seconded by J.

S. CLIFT, Esq.:—

4.—That there is a necessity for some alterations in the Constitution of the Society to enable it to maintain and extend the Church in this Colony; and that the President and the Committee be requested to draw up new Standing Rules to be submitted to a General Meeting.

Moved by H. W. HOYLES, Esq., M.H.A., seconded

F. B. T. CARTER, Esq., M.H.A:

5.—That it is desirable that a Fund should be formed and maintained for the assistance of the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese, and that £500 from the funds of the Society be appropriated for that purpose.

Moved by the W. V. WHITEWAY, Esq., seconded by the Rev. C. WALSH:—

6.—That the thanks of the Church Society be given to the Right Reverend the President for his counsel and assistance, and to the Treasurer, Secretary, and Committee for their services during the past year;—and that F. C. K. Hepburn Esq., be requested to accept the office of Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Moved by J. Hogsett, Esq., seconded by the Rev. T. M. Wood:—

7.—That the thanks of the meeting be offered to the Lord Bishop for his kindness in presiding on this occasion.

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REPORT.

In presenting their Report for the year 1857, the Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society desire in the first place to offer their humble thanks to Almighty God that they have so far been permitted to continue their labours, and that they have been enabled to a certain extent to assist in the extension and maintenance of the worship of God and the interests of true religion.

One most important object of the Church Society is to provide the funds for the support of the Clergy throughout the Diocese; and, after this, to assist local efforts in the erection and repairs of Churches, Parsonage-houses, and Schools; the circulation of Bibles, Prayer-books, and Manuals of Devotion. The first and second of these objects have received as large a share of support as the funds of the Society would safely warrant; but it is hoped that the annual payments of the members of the Church will in future be such as to justify the Committee in offering assistance to the Bishop in dividing some of the more extensive missions, so that the ministrations of Religion may be more regularly and frequently brought home to the inhabitants of the scattered shores of this island.

The net income received by the Treasurer for 1857 was £1357 12 7—a slight increase upon that of the previous year. Your Committee feel that the Society rest cannot satisfied with this result, and they sincerely hope that progress will continue to be made towards self-support, and that this most important object will be steadily kept in view by all who have

any regard for the honor of GoD and the welfare of His Church.—The Committee cannot help saying that the principle of self-support is the only true and safe foundation upon which the temporal interests of Religion can be placed. This is the system which ever has been acted upon with success, and by which alone the worship of GoD can be permanently maintained. The following extracts from a letter written by the zealous Missionary at Greenspond so entirely co-incide with the opinions frequently expressed by the Committee, that they cannot refrain from quoting them for the instruction of the Diocese at large:

"I beg to offer you a few remarks on the part my flock has hitherto taken, and might take, in supporting the Church in Newfoundland. The Mission of Greenspond never has done its duty in this respect, according to the means of the people. In the many out-lying settlements of the Mission, only one man here and another there is to be found who honourably makes a point of giving every year his offering to the Church. The great majority of people seem content to live on without sanctifying their worldly gains by making any offering to GoD who gave them their substance. In Greenspond proper, during the past two years, while the Church has been building, the contributions have been larger than ever before, and some persons, I do not doubt, have given to this purpose as largely as their means would allow. Almost all have given more than they ever gave before, and many of them often say that they "do not miss one shilling of it," that they "hardly know that they have given it." Indeed, while the Church has been building, Greenspond has been more prosperous than it was for a long course of years before, and during the past winter there was scarcely a poor person needing relief. We have truly found the fulfilment of God's promise to His people of old (Haggai II. 18, 19.): "From the day that the foundation of the LORD's Temple was laid, even from that day He hath blessed us." Would that every one in the flock would "consider it," and prove it in his own case!

"I am sure that Greenspond might continue to give in years to come as it has given for the past two years, and the other places in the Mission might well give as largely as Greenspond has now done; and not only would they "never miss a shilling of it," but God would honour them for honouring Him, and would increase their substance.

"I offer these remarks to you for insertion in the Report, because I do not doubt that they will apply to other Missions as well as my own. And I am moved to speak now more plainly, perhaps, than ever before, because now when the Church at home is put to such straits to provide Christian teaching for the millions of heathen souls in India it does seem to me more than ever a shame—it makes my heart

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burn—that I should have to receive my salary from the charity of the Church in England, while the flock I am serving is well able to maintain me.

"I am asked every year by the venerable Society which supports me, "what prospects do I see of this Mission becoming endowed?" and I am obliged to answer that I see none. But there ought to be some prospect of it, for there are many persons in the Mission who not only carry on the Fishery prosperously, but have also much money lying at interest,—in some instances several hundreds of Pounds. I cannot but think that if the Church Society would propose and urge that a fund should be raised by the people to endow the Missions of the Church in Newfoundland, at least one here and another there of the wealthy Planters would be found to believe, that by giving part of his money to provide a certain maintenance for spiritual Pastors to teach his children, and their children's children, after him, he would be placing it in a safe Bank, and securing a far greater Interest

than he would get by investing it for worldly gain."

The present crisis, the transition from a state of dependence to that of self-support, through which the Church of Newfoundland is undoubtedly beginning to pass, must be the excuse of the Committee when they respectfully urge upon the Reverend Clergy the necessity of impressing all under their care with this fact, that if the Church of England is to be supported at all in this country it must be by the exertions of its own members in the Island. Already two of the Clergy in St. John's are very properly thrown upon their flocks. And this will go on. The Society for Propagating the Gospel is acting and will undoubtedly continue to act upon the oft expressed intention, to leave the old established Missions to maintain them-And of this we cannot complain. The funds of the Society for Propagating the Gospel, as every one acquainted with its working and management is well aware, are obtained by contributions from persons who are, to a great extent, far poorer than the inhabitants of Newfoundland.

One great difficulty which presents itself, painful and humiliating though it be to place such a statement upon record, is the lukewarmness and indifference of the laity generally. There are, thank God, some few examples of men who support their religion liberally

and according to their means; but with the great majority it must be confessed this is not the case. Compare, for example, the Church population of this Island with the revenues of the Church, and can we say that they in any degree correspond with each other? By the last census the members of the Church of England number upwards of 42,000, while the money annually paid for the support of the thirty-eight parochial Clergy, all actively engaged in the duties of their sacred calling, does not exceed £2,000! Supposing each family to consist of six persons, then there are 7,000 families who on the average contribute less than 6s. annually! But bearing in mind that there are many persons throughout the island who give a much larger sum, we are forced to conclude that there must be a great number of our people who do not in any way make a return to Almighty God by contributing to the support of religion. At the same time it is admitted with thankfulness that there are many large sums raised for various local purposes, in connexion with the Church.

But still, your Committee would not wish to take a desponding view of this subject. They trust that its importance will be felt more and more; and that from year to year they may be privileged to bear witness to the increased appreciation of the great scriptural truth that the spiritual "labourer is worthy of hishire," and that "they who sow to us spiritual things should reap of our worldly things."

It is a matter of unfeigned satisfaction to the Committee that the Visitation now being held by His Lordship the Bishop has brought together so many of the Clergy of the Diocese. The Right Rev. the President of the Society has availed himself of this circumstance to ascertain the difficulties which have hitherto prevented several of the Clergy from forwarding the collections made in their missions to the Treasurer. Much and careful deliberation and dis-

cussion have taken place, and the result will be embodied in certain Rules, which the Lord Bishop intends at an early opportunity to submit to a General Meeting of members of the Church Society. These alterations are such as, it is hoped, will induce all the missions to avail themselves of the opportunity afforded them of united action. Such of the new rules as shall be passed will be printed and circulated generally in the Diocese.

Your Committee cannot but express their hope

Your Committee cannot but express their hope that the time they have so long desired will speedily arrive, when the whole Diocese will be incorporated with the Church Society. It will ever be their desire to cherish a feeling of unanimity; knowing that as the Church is necessarily, in her temporal concerns, subject to changes and fluctuations, there is the greater need for all who are joined together in the reception of "one Lord, one Faith, and one Baptism," to act and feel as one man, and to show that the richer portions of our flock are prepared of their abundance to contribute to the spiritual wants of the poorer brethren, and not only to maintain, but to extend, the ministrations of the Church of their fathers.

In the Report presented last year you were informed that it was in comtemplation to create a fund for the permanent relief of the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy. The want of such a fund had been long felt; and several painful cases in this Diocese had caused the Church to think seriously of helping the poorly paid Clergy to make some small provison for those whom in the Providence of God they might at their death leave behind them. An Institution of this kind has for several years past been in existence in the other North American Dioceses, and it will this evening be submitted to this Society to adopt such a fund as one of its objects, and to assist in its formation by the appropriation of £500, part of the balance late in the hands of the Treasurer, but at

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present at interest for the general purposes of the Society. This appropriation it is hoped the meeting will sanction, and enable such a provision to be made as will not only relieve the anxious minds of the Clergy while living, but be a comfort and blessing to their families after their death. If it should be the pleasure of the Society to concur in these objects, steps will be taken to bring such a scheme into immediate operation as will, it is hoped, commend itself to the whole body of Clergy and Laity in this Island.

It would be wrong were your Committee to omit mentioning that there is evidence of an increased and increasing appreciation of the services of the Church in the Diocese. There is much to discourage; but amid all, much to encourage. The following extracts speak cheeringly of the feeling in three Missions on the Western Shore, and justify the hope that the earnest labours of true-hearted, earnest, and self denying men, will not be without their results in the spiritual improvement and advancement of the people committed to their charge.

The Rev. W. K. WHITE, of Harbor Briton thus

"Herewith you will receive a list of subscribers to the Church Society with the total amount subscribed. It is satisfactory to find that so far as subscriptions are concerned, this Mission has not fallen away. Last year I had 82 subscribers, and £47 13s. 0d. While this year, I send you the names of 145 persons and £71 0s. 7d. But although this is the case, the increase is not nearly so large as it ought to be. I hope, however, that it affords an evidence that the principle of the Church Society is taking root among the people—and of the willingness of the people to acknowledge the duty and expendiency in making payments for the maintenance and continuance among them of the worship of Almighty God. I can scarcely take much credit to myself for the increase, inasmuch as in this particular part of my duty my services have not been more frequent. The knowledge that I have been engaged, though not amongst them, may have induced some to respond to my call; but I would rather attribute the additional names and accounts to the example and influence of individuals residing in different places,—an example and influence acting upon people who had already had the principle and duty often enforced upon them, and who only wanted somebody or something to bring into action that which they had almost unconsciously received. We cannot doubt that one word either for or against a good action to people in this state is of more weight than unreflecting persons suppose.

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"There has been a school at Harbor Britain, and as it gives satisfaction it still continues. The Sunday School meets in my house. A stove has been erected in the Church, and I have made every effort in my power to get the frame and material for the Chancel and Vestry; but I am not certain at this date whether anything has been done.

"I find great difficulty in visiting the people from the want of a boat or little yacht.

"A School was commenced at English Harbour in October; the master kindly reads the service on Sunday, which I trust will prove a great comfort to the people.

"In my capacity of Rural Dean I have visited Channel West and Lamaline East, and have to acknowledge many nets of hospitality, especially at La Poile, where I was more trouble than I wished or inended to be.

"I have visited forty one different settlements and held Service; baptised forty-five, married seven, buried six, and administered the Holy Communion publicly twenty-five times."

The Rev. Edward Colley, of Hermitage Cove reports:—

"The sum I have obtained is £13 more than was collected last year, which I think is a still further proof of the value the people generally in the Mission set upon the services of their Minister. The amount subscribed for the year 1853 for the whole Bay, was not more than £46; thus in four years, it has nearly doubled; but then this is in some measure to be attributed to the Fishery being more successful in this Bay the last two years; nevertheless many do see and feel that they ought to do their best to support their Missionary, and that they have no right to expect that others should provide them with the means of grace, and the ministrations of a Clergyman, when they are able to do it themselves.

"Some have even said to me, "we did begradge to give to the Church at first; but then, we did not see it in the light we do now; we thought you were paid by government, and had no right to ask us for money." Still, there are those who give little ar nothing, and others who would gladly find an excuse for not giving anything, and an offence, or too strong a rebuke, would perhaps close the strings of their purse for a time; yet even this, I think, by God's grace may be got over in a little while, by showing them that we are in earnest for their eternal welfare, and are seeking not so much theirs, as them, that we may impact note them some spi itsel heavilt."

impart unto them some spiritual benefit."

From the Rev. W. F. MEEK, of Harbour Buffett:—

"I forwarded to you some time since a list of subscriptions to the

Church Society for last year. You will see by that statement that the amount collected is considerably larger than in any previous year. This is more worthy of notice when it is taken into account that considerable sums have also been raised in the Mission during the past year for other Church purposes. At Harbour Buffett the sum of £45 is. 1d. has been paid towards enlarging the Church by the addition of aisles; these have been built during the winter, and not only afford great additional accommodation, but also very greatly improve the appearance of the Church; while the work was in progress two hundred and forty-six days labour were given by the people, and all the material requisite for framing and clapboarding brought by them in addition to their subscriptions.

"The Church at Oderin has been finished during the winter, £20 having been subscribed by the people for that purpose, which amount (together with funds which had been raised during the preceding year) sufficed to complete the building. I have also to report that the Church people at Woody Island have built a very neat and com-

modious school-room during the past winter.

"Thus (without reckoning labour and material) about £147 have been raised in the Mission for various Church purposes during the year; a satisfactory evidence, I hope, of a growing attachment on the part of the people of this district to their Church and her life-giving ordinances; and I have no doubt that much greater and more gratifying results would be apparent if the means of grace could be more frequently and regularly extended.

"The services both at Harbour Buffett and at the other settlements continue to be well attended, and the number of Communicants has increased during the past year. I have just returned from my spring cruize which has occupied five weeks. During this period thirteen settlements have been visited and services performed in each."

The Rev. W. Elder thus writes:-

"I beg to forward you a list of the contributions to the Church Society, collected in this Mission last fall; and I have no doubt your Committee will be glad to find that the amount is more than double the Collection of any preceding year, though still less than they may expect from such an extensive Mission. It should however be borne in mind that beside this amount other sums have been raised by each congregation in this Mission, viz., £54 in Fogo; £30 of which is paid to the Missionary; £42 at Baird Island towards enlarging the Church; and £6 18s. 6d. at Change Island; making in all nearly £103. Still, I hope for very much more than this when the people generally shall better understand their obligations and duty in this respect—when they have learned to devote a portion of their earnings as a thank-offering to the LORD; and when they shall have learned from their experience that the sums so devoted are repaid them ten-fold in Gon's blessing. I have already done something towards making this understood and felt, by preaching expressly on the subject and in behalf of the Church Society last full—and it would seem with some success. At Change Island in particular several persons afterwards spoke to me respecting my Sermon, acknowledging the force and truth of what I had advanced, and promising to double their contributions, which they have done; several others also contributing who had not done so before; at Fogo also many have contributed who had not done so formerly. I therefore propose, God helping me, to continue to preach on the subject every fall, while I remain here, and I now confess I shall not be satisfied until one and all contribute according to their ability—until they raise a sufficient sum for the decent maintenance of a Second Missionary in this Parish."

The Rev. J. KINGWELL says:-

"I exceedingly regret that as yet no considerable advance has been made in the amount of Contributions in this Mission;—nevertheless it is encouraging to witness an increasing readine-s in contributing. Several persons who were wont to make inadmissible excuses when called upon to subscribe to the Newfoundland Church Society, who were apparently determined to withhold their hand from endeavouring to promote its laudable objects, have the last year contributed without hesitation.

"The amount of collection last made would I think have been far in advance of that of the year previous, if my visit to the remote part of my mission could have been effected in the early part of August, instead of September; as I should then have found many persons at home who were absent in September—less of their summer's eatch of fish disposed of—and have been enabled to visit three or four settlements, which strong and unfavorable winds compelled me to pass by;

but a visit at that time was not practicable."

In conclusion, although we are now seeing "the day of small things" it cannot be doubted but that there is a work for good going on in this Diocese. No one who is in a position to contrast the present tone of feeling and state of the Church with that of a few years since can help knowing that the hearts of men have been and are being drawn more closely together; and that if, in the Providence of God, it is His good pleasure that the Committee and members of the Newfoundland Church Society should be spared to continue their labours for a few more years, we may hope to see the lengthening of the cords of our Zion, and the strengthening of her stakes, and our ancient and pure religion made a double blessing,—a blessing to those who send and those who receive the eternal truths of religion through its means; and that this may




