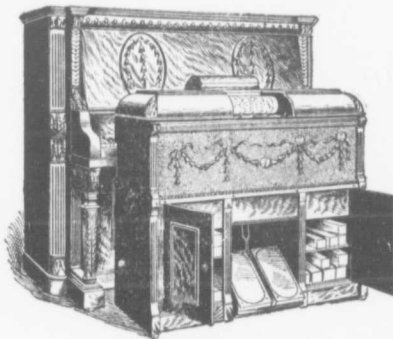

ON the tenth day of August in the first year of the fourth decade of last century, on the Six Nations Reservation, near Brantford, in the land of the "Maple Leaf," a Mohawk Chief first saw the light of day. After quickly mastering the intricacies of the Indian languages his mind rapidly broadened and developed under the cosmopolitan training and skilful tuition which he received in Wesleyan Academy, Kenyon College and Toronto University. In the early sixties a Prince of the British realm, while on a journey to this fair young Dominion of ours, was presented with an address by this Native Prince; this Chief of the Mohawk tribe of this American continent. That British Prince, captivated by the gallant bearing, majestic form and polished manners of our handsome young aborigine, took him under his patronage, and together they returned to "The tight little isle of the sea." Few years rolled by at Oxford ere our young Indian completed his course and returned to this, his mother-

land, and commenced practising the profession of Æsculapius in Ontario's "Forest" City.

Where stand these friends to-day? That erstwhile Prince of the British realm is to-day the Sovereign head of the grandest nation that has ever seen the light of day on this mundane sphere—His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII; and that erstwhile Mohawk Chief is to-day the Supreme Chief Ranger of the grandest fraternal society that ever blessed mankind—Hon. Oronhyatekha, J.P., M.D.

Oronhyatekha, in his early perigrinations and in his later ministrations for the sufferings of his patients, was ever painfully aware of the necessity for an organization that would not only link man to man in Liberty, Benevolence and Concord, but that would assist their widows and orphans after its members had "crossed the bar." In the year eighteen eighty-one, when he was offered the leadership of a young society with a few hundred members and a deficit, though to others the task seemed herculean, he realized that the moment of his golden opportunity had arrived, and with untiring energy and prophetic foresight he bent

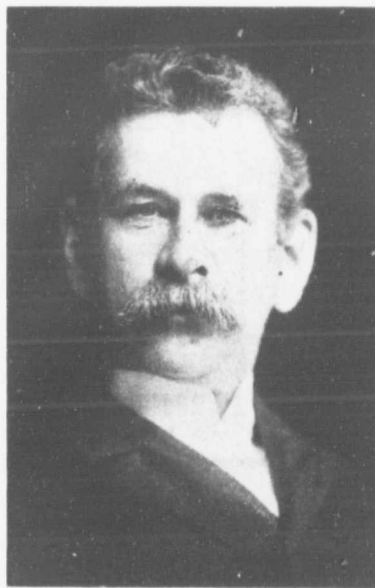

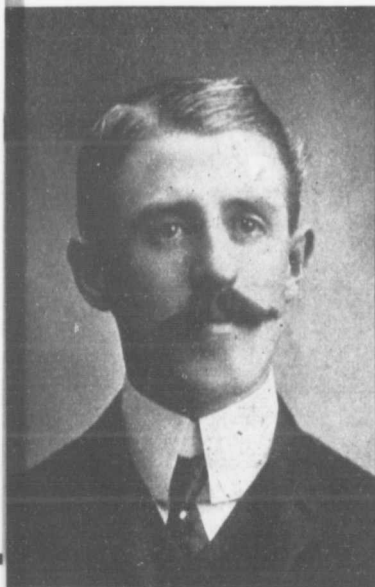

BRO. W. E. CRAIN, M.D., High Vice-Chief Ranger.



ONE who has been well and favorably known in Forestric work is our High Vice Chief Ranger, Bro. Dr. Crain. Born in Grenville County, in 1871, everything seemed auspicious of a prominent and eminently successful future. After attending school in Ottawa and Brockville he matriculated for Toronto University in 1890, and began the study of medicine in the same year. Here he began to show his brilliant abilities by capturing in the primary examination the first scholarship aid, and in the final the medal and the George Brown scholarship for highest standing in four years course. Bro. Crain was always prominent on the athletic field, holding the championship of Ottawa for fast skating and long distance running, and ever taking a prominent part in base-ball and lacrosse. He settled down to the practice of Medicine at Crysler, in 1894, where he now has a very extensive practice. He has taken a zealous interest in municipal affairs, and is at present reeve of the Township of Finch. Yet the dawn of his success in the political sphere has scarcely yet broken upon him. At the first meeting of High Court of Eastern Ontario

he was elected High Physician, to which office he was re-elected four times, showing his widespread popularity through Eastern Ontario. At Picton in 1902 he was raised to the position of High Vice and was again re-elected in 1903.



## Bro. J. D. CLARKE, B.A., S.V.C.R.



**B**RO. CLARKE was born on the 18th June, 1860, at Newtonville, Ohio. At the early age of seventeen he entered the National Normal University, and graduated therefrom in 1882. After travelling extensively for some years, he commenced the study of law in 1885, and was admitted to the Bar a year later. During the six succeeding years he filled several official positions of importance, and in 1892 he commenced practising law in Dayton, Ohio, where he now stands at the top of his profession. In his profession he is noted for his argumentation, forensic and oratorical ability and his skilful manner of addressing judge and jury. Though he has early risen to fame in his chosen calling, the high position he has held and now holds in fraternal societies show that his time has not always been devoted to business. He has frequently been elected to positions of importance in the Knights of Pythias and Masons, and at present holds the position of Supreme Vice-Chief Ranger of our Order, to which he was elected by a large majority at last Supreme Court meeting. He has been an active worker for our Order, and has done much towards placing Ohio amongst the first States in our Order. His voice has often been heard in the Supreme Court, where his persuasive arguments and eloquent utterances have ever commanded the most rapt attention. While few of our members in Ottawa have had the pleasure of hearing his sonorous voice, we are certain he will be a welcome guest not only to our companions and brethren but all who may have the pleasure of hearing him.

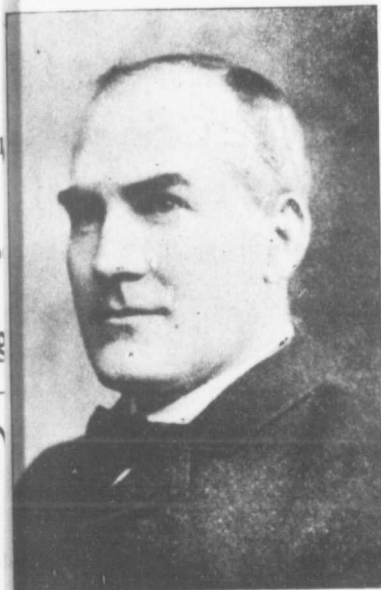

## BRO. A. W. FRASER, K.C., P.H.C.R.



**H**ERE we have a brother who is as favorably known to the people of Ottawa as he is to our brethren in Eastern Ontario. In 1882 he commenced his legal career, and five years later was called to the Bar at Osgoode Hall, Toronto. He rapidly rose to a prominent place in his profession, and was appointed a Queen's Counsel in 1899. He was born and received his elementary education in the County of Glengarry, Ont. Though naturally of a retiring disposition, his friends early discerned his executive ability and have forced him forward to his present position of President of the Liberal Association of Ottawa. About a year after he joined Court Ottawa, his brethren recognized his ability when they elected him Chief Ranger, and since that time he continued to rise in the Order till he reached the highest position in the gift of our members in this jurisdiction. After holding the position of High Counsellor for several years he was advanced to the Vice chair, and from there elected to the position of High Chief Ranger, which he occupied with credit to himself and our Order for two years, and then gracefully and with true Forestric spirit retired

to his present position of P. H. C. R., that the honors might go around. That the claims of Eastern Ontario might not be forgotten at the Supreme Court, he attended its sessions at Chicago, London, Toronto and Los Angeles, where his astute mind and thorough knowledge of legal phraseology was ever valuable when our now well-nigh perfect constitution required alteration. As brother Fraser is yet a young man, we may safely say that he is but on the horizon of his career, which, if his success along professional, Forestric and other lines may be taken as a premonition, shall yet have a brilliant zenith.

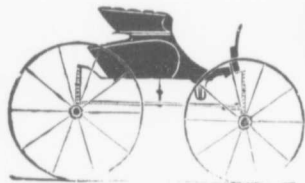

## *A Few Facts about the I. O. F.*

THE INDEPENDENT ORDER OF FORESTERS was founded at Newark, New Jersey, on June 17th, 1874. In 1881 the Order was reorganized and changed from a death assessment society to its present plan, and began business on July 1st, 1881, with 369 members and not a dollar in its treasury. At the present time the membership is over 214,000.

There has been paid to beneficiaries over \$14,000,000, and it is now paying out to widows, orphans, and aged and disabled members, \$6,500 per day.

It has accumulated over \$7,000,000 of surplus funds, all of which is safely invested. This fund is now increasing at the rate of about \$3,000 every day in the year.

The Order now extends over all Canada, the major portion of the United States, throughout Great Britain and Ireland, is firmly established in Australia, and has been introduced into France, Norway, Sweden and Denmark.

The government of the Order is vested in a Supreme Court, and in the High, Subordinate, and Companion Courts throughout its jurisdiction, and is not only representative, but thoroughly democratic and simple in the extreme.

Its financial strength is annually increasing much more rapidly than its obligations, thus leaving it at the end of the year relatively stronger and more vigorous than it was at the close of the year previous.

A FEW FACTS ABOUT THE I. O. F.—Continued.

The number of new members initiated in 1902 was over 100 per month greater than those admitted in 1901.

The mortality rate during 1902 was 6.60 per 1,000, or a little less than the year before.

The surplus fund increased during 1902 by \$957,239.65—nearly a million dollars. These figures show an increase in assets of 18.19 per cent., the increase in assurance at risk during the same year being only 4.52 per cent.

The increase in the premium income of the Order in 1902 over 1901 was 8.37 per cent., while the demands upon that income were only 1 per cent. greater. This showing demonstrates beyond doubt that the financial strength of the Order is increasing at a rate out of all proportion to the increase of the demands upon that financial strength to redeem the promises made by the Order.

The year 1903 has thus far, both in new members and financial growth, far exceeded the record of any previous year in the history of the Order.

**G**EO. L. DICKINSON, High Secretary, Eastern Ontario, Manotick, entered Court Manotick, 144, as a charter member in 1885. He passed through several offices of his Court, during which time as C. R. it was his pleasing duty to initiate 42 new members at one meeting. He served as a representative at three meetings of the Supreme Court. He was appointed by the S. C. R., High Secretary of the High Court of Eastern Ontario at the division of the Province into three High Courts, and has since been re-elected by acclamation at the seven meetings of his High Court to the position he now holds.

The first Bill of Incorporation stood in the name of Bro. Dickinson, at which time he represented the County of Carleton in the House of Commons. Assisted by Bro. Judge Jamieson, then also a member of the House of Commons, the Act of Incorporation was passed.

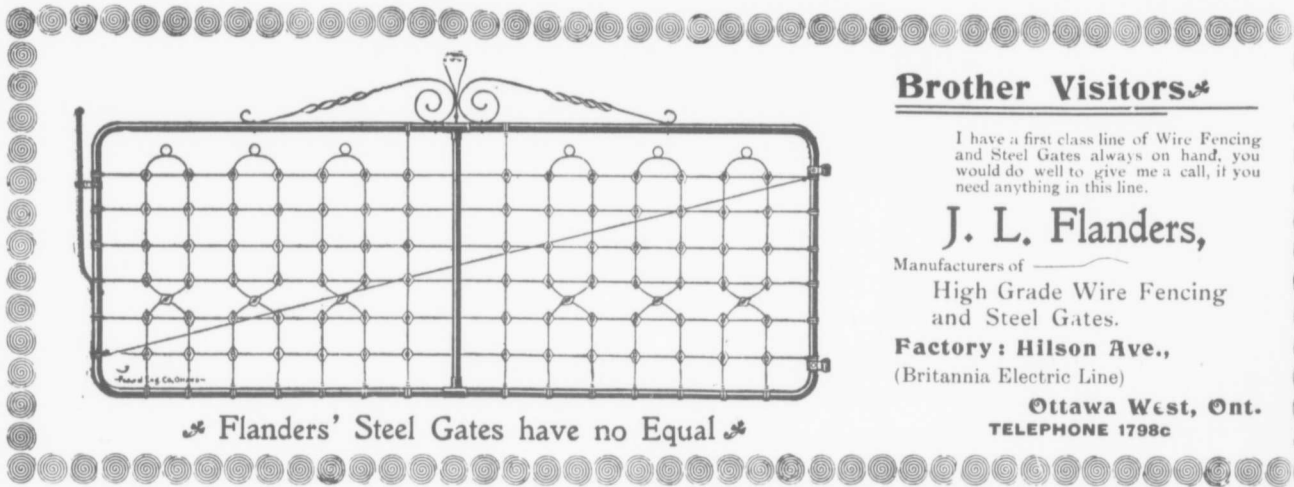
