MUST KNOW THE FULL COST

NO SUBWAY WIDENING TILL LAND CLAIMS ARE KNOWN

Accident Insurance Companies Ruled Out-Bungling About Devercourt-Road Trolley Extension-What Wheelmen Want Chat About Victoria Industrial School

The Executive Committee met at 3 o'clock, A. M. McMurrich in the chair. A. H. Lamb, J. J. Small, Sheppard, Burns, Scott, Dunn and Hallam assisted in the deliberations.

Settle the Land Damages First. Ald. Joffe offered a resolution to this effect. Ald. Hallam and Dunn could not see their way to "go it blind," on the land damages.

Ald. Scott saw a large-sized obstacle to the work in the report of the Joffe's resolution. He was supported by Ald. Lamb, who wanted the report to go to council, but the finding of the committee was expressed a willingness to take half a loaf, in the shape of Ald. Joffe's resolution, rather than have the report go back.

The motion was put and declared lost by 5 to 4. Ald. Lamb voting with the majority. The motion of Ald. Joffe, amended, to read as follows: "That no contract for the widening of Queen-street be entered into until the land damages on the north side of Queen-street are ascertained, and settled, and in the event of an amicable settlement not being arrived at before the tenders are opened, then the Board of Works must report again to the council, or to the Board of Control, if such board is constituted, such action as is deemed advisable."

Several amendments were made in the draft agreement, with a view to protect the city's interests. The company must keep the armory building in good repair, and within a short time thereafter action had been taken by either side towards conciliation.

EMPLOYERS TO BLAME

Judgment Handed Down in the Tailor Strike Case by the Ontario Board of Arbitration

The Board of Arbitration yesterday handed out its judgment in the tailor strike arbitration. The difficulty there adjudicated upon arose out of an effort on the part of a large number of tailors employing union men of the city to compel their employers to undertake in December of each year not to disturb their employers' business during the succeeding 12 months and not to endeavor to prevent them employing non-union men.

As always known, the employers refused to appear before the board, which nevertheless proceeded to take the evidence of the men. In the judgment, just handed down, the board upheld the tailors' refusal to sign an agreement which contained the following clause: "There shall be no interference, direct or indirect, during said year by any members of the union with non-union tailors, or with any other employers or any of them on trousers and waistcoats."

The judgment concludes thus: "It is plain to the arbitrators that the cause of the difficulty arose out of the employers submitting a document which they did not intend to sign, and the continuance of the difficulty arises largely, if not altogether, from the employers refusing to sign the agreement either by themselves or their committee to meet representatives of the tailors. From all that has transpired it appears before the arbitrators or to meet the arbitrators in conference over the dispute, and the employers refused to sign the agreement, and the employers were desirous of it, and we are compelled to report that in our judgment the responsibility rests with the employers for a continuance of the difficulty.
