THOSE RECKLESS PULPWOOD CONCESSIONS.

In 1891 the Government of Ontario granted certain concessions to the Clergue Syndicate at Sault Ste. Marie to cut pulp wood on Crown lands for use in the syndicate's mills.

The price was fixed at 20 cents a cord for spruce and hard wood and 10 cents for other wood for the first eight years; thereafter the price is to be fixed by the Government.


