Report of Board of Home Missions.

HALIFAX, MARCH 7TH, 1894.

The Board of Home Missions again is charged with the responsibility of its annual report, and of the observations and recommendations incidental to its work of the current year.

Although the aggregate amount of contributions for the Mission Fund of the Diocese does not vary much from those of former years, yet there are signs of progress that are of a decidedly encouraging nature.

First the Diocese is evidently being educated into giving in a systematic way and one more proportioned to the means of the church members. And if the improvement appears at first in the sums forwarded for objects outside of the Province, yet it is matter for thankfulness that our people are contributing more largely. The more they give the more they will give.

Secondly.—The number of parishes is gradually increasing in which the Tangier scheme, or some modification of it, is being adopted. That is to say, in these parishes a certain sum is given by each contributor which he feels he can afford, to cover all objects for which he is usually appealed to. The parochial authorities then apportion the total amount by a fixed percentage, on which list the stipend for the incumbent is a first charge, but which also provides for each parochial and extra parochial demands as can properly be made. Such parishes as Tangier, (from which the scheme derives its name as having been the first to adopt it.) Beaver Harbour, Ship Harbour, are giving this method a fair trial, and hitherto with excellent results. It shuts out of course all special appeals from individual objects and eloquent canvassers. But the sooner it is universally applied, the more quickly will the spasmodic appeal to a transient feeling by special pleaders be rendered unnecessary.

Other parishes have made this plan their own so far as regards extra parochial objects alone, retaining the old method of subscription and donation for current expenses within the parish. Truro has done this. The Board recommend with all confidence the adoption of one or other of these principles, but press most strongly the covering all objects in the weekly gift if the circumstances of any parish render it possible and wise. If this were done in all our parishes, the financial worries under which we are now labouring would disappear, the Board could take up new work which is necessary if the Church would hold her own; and the

Scriptural injunctions on the matter of giving would be recognized and obeyed, with the corresponding promised blessing to follow.

The system of deputations to the parishes failed, comparatively speaking, last year, on account of the difficulty of getting appointments made by the different clergy in a Deanery. Some, however, were carried out by great energy on part of the Rural Deans, for which they are to be commended. The Deanery of Amherst, Annapolis, and Lunenburg were thoroughly visited, the latter calling forth a spirited report from Rev. Dyson Hague and Mr. C. S. Wilcox who formed the deputation. This report makes valuable and timely suggestions which are embodied in a canon to be presented to the Synod in June next.

The position of the W. and O. Fund is discussed in a separate report.

In conclusion, the Board feels that although much yet remains to be done, the Diocese is upon the right track, and that if the deputations are pressed forward by being regulated from head quarters, with a time appointed by canon and with suitable men engaged in the work, the contributions from our people will come from them not as a tax but as a free spontaneous and loving gift to Him "from whom all good things do come," and will draw down from Almighty God the healthful dew of His blessing.

Report of W. and O. Fund Committee.

The committee charged with the responsibility of managing the Widows' and Orphans' Fund beg to report that there is nothing particularly calling for remark during the past year, except to record the gradual extinction of the debt by the small surplus after paying the widows' pensions of \$100 a year, with the addition of a somewhat larger average of collections in the parishes. There are now 15 widows upon the Fund, with the children of the late Dr. Nichols which makes a first charge of \$1600 a year. The balance, after payment of office expenses, which are small, is wiping out the debt. When this is quite accomplished, the efforts of the church should be directed towards once more raising the pension which is, it must be confessed, lamentably insufficient.

The committee feel that there should be a collection taken in every parish once a year for this most necessary fund; not merely from the parishes of those who are members of it but from all others. The whole question will be dealt with by a proposed Canon, which will be brought forward in Synod, and will, if adopted, place the matter upon a much more satisfactory footing than it is now under mere regulations which are sometimes neglected.

Report of Church Endowment Fund Committee.

The Church Endowment Fund Committee, in submitting the accounts of the Fund, together with the present state of the classes, desire to call the attention of the Synod to the following statement embodied in the proceedings of the Committee, which will it is believed remove a misapprehension existing in the minds of some of the clergy who are participants in the benefits of the Fund.

The Committee desire to bring to their notice that in clause 7 of the Prospectus of the Church Endowment Fund there is an error in the estimate of the amount to be paid. The three classes of claimants made a total of \$11,100 or in other words \$1500 beyond the full yield of the Fund of \$160,000 at six per cent., which would be \$9600.00.

And as the payments to the claimants on the Fund were based upon a yield of six per cent. interest, no allowance being made for expenses in administering the Fund; and the net yield of the Fund making a net return of only \$7000, at 6 per cent. representing only a capital of \$120,000; the Committee do not consider the Fund complete as contemplated by the Prospectus; and are therefore unable to give the beneficiaries the full amount anticipated for the respective classes.

Report of the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

There is certainly one encouraging feature in the work of the Church at the present time, and that is the increasing interest taken in the missionary field. Not merely by the arousing of our most thoughtful people to the state of missionary operations as a test of the Church's fidelity to her Lord's last command; not only by the sending of individual missionaries to represent the Canadian church or single congregations within our dioceses; but by the gradual and sure growth of labour and prayer in organizations of the most varied kind, by the training of the young from their earliest years to look upon help to missions as a part of their life, and by the increase and extension of missionary publications of all sorts, is this interest fed and nourished.

The most hopeful direction in which this movement is developing is in the multiplication of children's societies. Few well regulated parishes are now without their Church Missionary Guild, or Mission band, or whatever the society may be called. This has been the greatest century for missions since the Reformation. The young are feeling their responsibility as never before. The tide of enthusiasm is gathering force, and the heroes of the mission field are appealing in life and death to the strong, generous and guileless instincts of the young in a wonderful way, and young folks everywhere are responding to the call. Who can regard unmoved the vast organizations without our own Church, such as the Student's volunteer movement, the Society of Christian Endeavour, and others which are encircling the world? These are signs of the times. And it is most cheering and refreshing to know that the Church of which we are members is sharing, if not at present leading, in this glorious work. We must strive and pray till we stand, as our heritage entitles and compels us to do, at the head, an example to the world at large of the possibilities of Christian obedience and zeal. There are many points in the horizon of Christian missions to-day on which it would be pleasant to dwell. There is one circumstance which fills us with sorrow. Our own Missionary Bishop of Algoma, so gifted and so beloved; who when appointed a few years ago was a model of physical and spiritual strength, now lies a broken man, borne down by cares and anxieties which are not lawfully his. It is not the part of a Missionary Bishop to canvass the world for the salaries of his clergy. The needed funds should be supplied by the Church herself. It has needed the martyrdom of two Bishops to teach the Church that her first charge on all offerings for Domestic missions within the ecclesiastical province of Canada should be her own Missionary diocese. Let us hope that the Central Board of Missions will recognize this fact, and appropriate a

King's College.

The interest taken in King's College as demonstrated by the annual collections has not increased in any marked degree during 1893. There are a certain number of Parishes which take the collections with regularity and at the appointed time; others leave it till some other occasion, and some give nothing. It would be a great help to the College if it could count on say \$600 or \$700 a year from this source, which it would be reasonably sure of receiving; and it would be comparatively easy for the 80 parishes to average \$10 each. It is to be sincerely hoped that the new departure in the College government, and the election of representatives on the Governing Board from the Deaneries, will awake the sympathies of the masses of Church people throughout the provinces.

Propositions have been made and will it is likely be carried out, for increasing the number of Governors, the new members of the Board to be elected by the Deaneries, so as to throw the College more effectually upon the sympathies of the Church at large. Should this be done, the College will enter on a new lease of life.

Summary of Reports from Various Parishes.

LUNENBURG.

The deputation to Lunenburg Deanery, consisting of REV. DYSON HAGUE and MR. C. S. WILCOX, after reciting in their report the various stages of their journey, conclude their report as follows :

In conclusion we desire to make the following comments and suggestions.

I. The appearance of the churches visited was in every case most satisfactory. The churches were, without exception, commodious, and well appointed, well heated, well seated, and well lighted. Some of the churches are exceptionally fine, notably those of Mahone, Lunenburg, Upper LaHave and Bridgewater. The congregations seemed hearty, and in many cases joined earnestly in the responses and singing.

II. The parsonages seemed comfortable and commodious, and in nearly every case well adapted to the clergyman's needs.

III. But, with the exception perhaps of Mill Cove and Petite Riviere, the collections taken in the church, and the collections appearing in the printed reports reveal a state of things which is truly *deplorable*. We have no hesitation whatever in saying that if the same state of things exists in other parts of the Diocese, that exists in the localities we visited (and we have every reason to believe it does) the Diocese requires nothing more or less than a revolution. There is no doubt whatever that the amount subscribed to the church and for church objects by the members of the church bears a proportion to the amount possessed by them that is lamentably small. Not only does the contract between the appearance and dwellings of the people and the amount annually contributed by them reveal an awful ignorance of the requirements of God, and an awful forgetfulness of His church's claims, but one clergyman actually stated to us that it is a common thing for young men who bring home \$200 and \$300 a year to give 10 and 20 cents annually to the Board of Home Missions, and if they give anything at all to give 50 cts. and \$1.00 to the support of the clergymen, while the Rector of Bridgewater publicly stated in his church on the evening of the 13th of December, that the offerings of the people in his parish to God did not amount annually to more than one per cent. of their income.

From what we could gather elsewhere we have reason to believe that things are not much better, the very poor parishes being the only exceptions, though we are both of the opinion that if the claims of Christ upon

As to the parishes of Lunenburg, Bridgewater and Mahone Bay, we are convinced that much more ought to be done and that a personal canvass by some representative outside men would probably bring hundreds where now we have tens. The Parish of Lunenburg claims an exemption on account of the \$350 it annually contributes to Upper La Have, but it must be remembered that this is only an equivalent after all for the glebes retained by the Lunenburg parish on the division of the parishes, and represents only *their release from the support of an outside part of their parish.*

What we need in fact is a revival, a spiritual revival, for until our people get new hearts the same old contributions will be annually given, and the same hopeless and apathetic state of things go on.

IV. And lastly. We are unanimously of the opinion that a new method of procedure (of which we give the following outline) would tend to produce the objects so earnestly desired by the Board, the increase of the stipends of our present missionaries and the occupation of new fields.

1. A remodelling of the Board on the lines of the Dioceses of Ontario and Toronto.

2. The selection of a stated Sunday such as Easter, Trinity Sunday, 1st Sunday in Advent, or first Sunday in Lent, for the annual collection on behalf of B. H. M. At present this collection is either taken at haphazard, or confused with the collection taken by the B. H. M. missionary deputation, or not taken at all—generally not taken at all.

3. The actual visitation of every church, mission schoolhouse in the Diocese annually by a Deputation to be sent by the Board, with the double object of arousing interest, and taking a collection. Chiefly taking a collection. This could be worked on rural deanery lines, or better perhaps on lines drawn out by the Board, and either in October or February.

4. The remodelling of the methods of procedure now adopted in parishes with regard to the Parish collection. Instead of leaving it to a couple of young girls an endeavour should be made to put it into the hands of responsible men. If this is not possible in the case of the large cities and towns, into the hands of a collecting deputation. Their 25cts. should be dollars, and their ones fives. This would give three stated definite sources of income, and would if systematically worked, at least double the present income of the Board.

It is our opinion also that *much more* might be done for the B. H. M. by the Parish clergy themselves. Their standard is altogether too low. They are too content with the present disgraceful proportion contributed by the people, and too much given to supposing that the people are doing fairly well, if not indeed doing all they can. Again and again the clergy repeat the antiquated assertion that the people have not been educated to

give, and cannot contribute more, thereby becoming aiders and abettors of this pitiable state of affairs.

Mr. Wilcox sends in a special report in which he says :—

Looking carefully over this matter from a business man's standpoint, I am of opinion that a systematic effort carefully thought out and earnestly applied could be made to revolutionize the whole system of Church contributions, and to result in quadrupling our Mission Funds. The Laity of our parishes hold an enormous power in their property and possessions and ability to earn money loaned them as a trust from God. Send to every parish and congregation or out station in each parish *annually* a deputation composed of the strongest men in our Church, cleric and layman working together, who will fearlessly tell the people the plain truth, that that man's religion is simply a *sham* who will surround himself with the comforts of life and tender any such pittance as the proportion above referred to represents. If this deputation work was honestly performed the country clergy would take heart and raise the standard of giving to something like the pitch set by the deputations. With reference to the city parishes and the parishes in the large Provincial towns a special effort should be made by a deputation composed of the most earnest and eloquent of our clergy with the Bishop at their head and accompanied by laymen of the highest standing to endorse the claims of our church for honest treatment at the hands of her children.

DEPUTATION REPORT.

DEANERY OF ANNAPOLIS, November 18th, 1893.

TO THE LORD BISHOP OF NOVA SCOTIA AND THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS.

My Lord and Gentlemen,—In accordance with arrangements made by the Secretary, I had the pleasure of visiting the Deanery of Annapolis, and holding meetings in several of the parishes, viz, Annapolis Royal, Moschelle, Granville Ferry, Clementsport, Round Hill, Weymouth and Bridgetown, at all of which places I was most cordially received by the clergy, and most hospitably entertained. I delivered addresses urging the claims of the Missions and Widows and Orphans Funds, but at only one place, Weymouth was there an offering made for the fund, amounting to \$3.84.

I would suggest that greater interest might be aroused in the meetings by their being arranged for and advertised well beforehand, and that an offering should always be made. If a systematic effort were made I have little doubt that the contributions to the funds might be largely increased throughout the Diocese.

GUYSBORO.

I visited the parish of Guysboro in November. My stay there and in the adjoining missions extended from the 13th of the month to the 27th. The parish of Guysboro has had no rector for many years, and consequently church life there, is practically dead. There are, however, a few faithful church-people, who have remained true to the church and who would heartily welcome the clergyman who should settle in their midst. They have not forgotten the words of the poet:—

“ Why should I wonder from the ways,
My wise forefathers trod ;
Or in these cold degenerate days
Forsake the Church of God.”

But there is scarcely anything to depend upon which would induce a man to station himself there. There is a small endowment of \$60 or thereabouts and in addition to this the few remaining people could raise about \$70 or \$80 more. All, without a single exception, of the rich people have died or gone away, such as the Marshalls, Hartshornes, Cutlers, Carritts, Russells, Pearts and Campbells. Yet I am firmly convinced by conversation and observation that quite a fair congregation might be worked up, provided the right man was sent there, and sufficient means found for his support.

I think that if a clergyman is appointed to this parish by his Lordship the Bishop, he ought to be until church life is thoroughly revived, not only Rector of the parish but missionary as well for the surrounding settlements.

During my visit I held 11 services (4 of which were held in Christ Church, Guysboro,) celebrated the H. C. twice, performed two baptisms and made 41 visits.

I humbly trust that the services I held, and the visits I paid, may be the means of awakening some to love their church more, and that their souls may be blessed through the ministration of the Word. I know and acknowledge my inability to do justice in so great a work as that undertaken by a deputation but I have faith enough to leave the result in God's hands.

The last census returns shew a church population in the County of Guysboro of over 3000. What would be the number now if the church's interest had been looked after in the county, town and adjacent settlements ?

It seems to me that parishes like this ought to be attended to, and that the money spent for so good a cause would be money well laid out, for I do not know that I ever came across such a distressing state of affairs as church matters are in in the County of Guysboro.

I found throughout the whole country that it was entirely destitute of Sunday schools. This is one of many reasons why the church does not prosper. The Methodists and Baptists get hold of our children and they become connected with them when they grow up. I have got some of them to take hold of this idea, and I earnestly trust that before long Sunday Schools will be established in each place.

I may be wrong, but I think it would be a wise plan to either :—

(1.) Concentrate our prayers at the B. H. M. meetings on some individual parish or mission.

(2.) To ask the Rectors and other or officiating clergymen of the diocese on a given day to pray for parishes going behindhand or in destitute circumstances such as the one I lately visited.

I believe that God would bless such prayers in a remarkable way.

ANNAPOLIS.

We had the great pleasure of a visit from the Lord Bishop of Algoma. The offertory (\$22.00) at his inspiring missionary Meeting was sent to the Treasurer of his mission. Our Dorcas Society also forwarded to Algoma a bale of winter clothing, valued at \$130.00 (one hundred and dollars), together with a handsome gold brooch. I do not know the sum collected for the Sabrevois Mission by Rev. H. Jeckyll. He had strength enough to deposit it however. We now pay an annual sum of \$225.00 to St. Paul's, Rosette. This has been done. So that the total raised for extraneous purposes by this parish during the year has not been less than \$625.00 (six hundred and twenty five dollars.) We have also had offertories of \$45.26 for parochial charity : and reduced the debt on the new church in LeQuille to about \$235.00, and made repairs on the church in Persotte. That at Graywood has been repainted and looks very neat. I have no returns for the amounts raised for Sunday School purposes. At the public services held by the Masons and Oddfellows offertories for their charitable funds were taken up and paid over.

We propose to start a branch of C. W. M. A. at once, and we trust that we may be able to report some tangible proof of our interests in Diocesan Missions.

We also had a surplus at Easter of some few dollars. We have a bonded debt however of \$418.00. We will be making extensive repairs on St. Luke's during this season, and if we fall short in our gifts to others you will have one reason in this fact.

ST. PAUL'S, RAWDON.

With this I send \$59.79, the subscriptions and contributions for the year 1893. Though small I have tried to raise as much as possible even under difficulties. The condition of the Parish is such that makes it harder than in former years, first, because a number of our best churchmen have gone to their rest, and others removed from our midst. Secondly, on account of the parish having to raise \$60.00 a year more than it did three years ago. Lakelands and East Uniacke Mines now receive the Ministration of the Rector in addition to the Parish of Rawdon. Next year we may hope for increased contributions from those places. The services have been regularly held with few exceptions, I have endeavoured to get a regular attendance at the services, but it often appears that trifles keep many away from the worship of God. There are many draw-backs and discouragements in a scattered country parish like this, and were it not for the kind and hospitable way in which the missionary is received, and the ready way in which some try to help and encourage the work, one would almost despair. I am sorry to find that the B. H. M. has put \$10.00 more on the parish. As it was, the utmost limit seemed to have been reached. I trust it may be lighted as we have now to raise funds for church repairs. However, with faith and hope the new year will be begun.

SHIP HARBOR AND JEDDORE.

SICK AND OTHER VISITS.—Our Diary Shows a record of 642 visits paid during the year. This includes many celebrations of Holy Communion for the sick, of which there is no separate record.

THE MIMEOGRAPH.—Has been busy, 6600 sheets of Music, Childrens Papers and other matter having been printed and mailed in the twelve months.

WORK DONE ON CHURCHES AND PARISH BUILDING.

S. MATTHEW'S.—The boarded frame has been finished and painted. An Altar of polished Ash. Credence, Desks, Closet for vessels, Alms plates of Oak with embroidered mats, and a Silver Alms dish, have been offered by friends and placed in the Church. A new stove and pipe with a ventilating chimney of galvanized iron have also been provided.

S. STEPHEN'S.—A pair of oak Alms plates plush lined, and a pair of Vestry towels have been presented by members.

THE RECTORY.—A new fence is being built round the Rectory grounds, (warranted sheep proof) the roof is being repaired.

S. JOHN'S.—Has acquired a good pipe organ. Two fount lamps of sufficient power to light the whole nave, new fire ladders, a ventilating chimney of galvanized iron, and the roof shingled anew on the south side.

THE RECTORY.—Has been painted a stone color with the finishings of a warm umber tint. When the roof is finished in red, the building will appear a credit to the Parish.

The road up the hill is being raised and graded. This is a heavy undertaking, but the work will be a double profit as the stone for the road is taken from the pasture, leaving that much the better.

PETPESWICK.—A site has been offered for the New Church, and some money collected for building. A number of hymn and prayer books have been bought for the use of the people.

REGISTERS.—A new and proper book for the Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths has been ordered for each Church and Chapel in the Parish. And a large book for the same purpose, to be kept always by the Parish Priest, so that every entry, being written in two different books, may be safer in case of fire or accident.

A chart is also in preparation, showing the location of every Church, Hall and House in the parish. This will be a great help in laying out work, or making visitations.

We desire to thank GOD for the prosperity of the past year, and especially for this, that the above record of twelve months work leaves no debt upon us, and has been done by the help of pure offerings alone, no pic-nics, bazaars or any quid-pro-quos. There will be plenty of room for exertion on the part of our good Church workers however during the next season, to keep us all pleasantly occupied.

CHURCH NEEDS.

S James. I am happy to report an effort already on foot to paint and repair this, the oldest Church in the parish. New lights are also needed here.

Petpeswick Mission, where our people have for so many years met to worship GOD after the manner of their fathers under the kindly roof of Captain Conrod (to whom, and to Mrs. Conrod, we Church-folk owe a debt we can never over-estimate), here we desire to build a Mission Room or Church, where we and our neighbors may meet "before the Lord," for at present we have not space to kneel in prayer the room is so full. We hope that those whom GOD has blessed with the privilege which our brethren here desire, will help us heartily in our work when invited to do so.

IRON CROSS.—A Branch of this Guild was formed at S. James with ten members, all of whom have kept their cross and pledge, and have been quietly doing some work on the lines of the order.

SILVER CROSS.—We hope to extend the Guild work this winter, and to found a branch for women and girls, working single handed I did not feel justified in attempting an addition to work which was already too great for one to do well. Now however I think we may venture to add this society to the agencies of the Church in this parish, as several have expressed a desire to join such a Guild for Christian work among women.

In concluding this Report, I desire to add a few words on one or two matters of some importance, and first of all to offer to the Rev. E. H. Ball thanks, for bringing to our notice the Tangier Scheme which has worked so successfully. Now we purpose (and specially ask all Wardens and Vestrymen to note this) to take up the scheme more fully next year. We do this with the assent and consent of our wardens, and in compliance with the desire of the Very Rev. Dean Gilpin, who recommends the appointment of a central Parish Secretary-Treasurer. This Plan will be as follows :—

Every Sunday the Minister at any public service, shall take from the Alms dish after service, any envelopes which have been offered, and without opening them carry them back to the Central Office at Jeddore Rectory, where on Monday in each week, the Vestry Clerk shall attend and open them, duly recording their contents in the book provided and shall at the same time make a duplicate entry on a Post-card, which shall the same day be mailed to the Parish Wardens at Ship Harbor who shall enter the same in the parish accounts and file the post-cards for reference. The money shall be forwarded to the Bank of Nova Scotia whenever the sum in hand shall amount to ten dollars, to the credit account of the Priest in charge until the sum agreed upon as salary for the year be reached, and after that to the account of the Church Wardens of the Parish, and the vestry Clerk shall furnish to the Wardens of each Chapel in the Parish, a statement of accounts connected with said Chapel, every three months.

KENTVILLE.

Two events of A.D., 1893, are worthy of being chronicled in this brief record. (1.) The localization of the "Canadian Church and Mission News," edited by the Rev. Dr. Mockridge, as a Magazine for the eight parishes constituting the Deanery of Avon, under the title of the "Avon

Deanery Magazine." In the Parish of Kentville there were 76 subscribers for 1893, the list for 1894, after the loss of 8 subscribers, has been made up to 90. It is appreciated by many as an excellent medium of parochial information. The local part is edited and printed in Windsor, N. S., and is a great credit to the management.

The other event has been the division, after a lengthy and careful consideration of the whole matter and much correspondence and negotiation, by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, of the Parish of Horton: This was consummated, April 24 1893: on that day the Rev. Canon Brock, having placed in the hands of the Bishop his resignation of the Parish of Horton, was unanimously elected Rector of Kentville. The eastern end of the township with St. John's Church, Wolfville, as its centre, retains the name of the Parish of Horton. After some delay, owing to the gentleman who was first elected declining, the Rev. K. C. Hind, M. A., was elected Rector of Horton. He was inducted by the Bishop, Oct. 26, 1893. By this division Wolfville will gain the services of a resident clergyman, and have two services every Lords Day instead of one as formerly. Wolfville, as the great educational centre of the Baptist body for the Maritime Provinces, certainly needs what the Church-people there have now secured, a resident Priest of the Church.

During the past year the electric light has been introduced into St. John's Church, Wolfville, and into St. James' Church, Kentville. The contributions from the Parish of Kentville for 1893 for outside objects amounted to \$131.00, a slight increase on the year 1892. For the first time a contribution appears towards the Church Womans Missionary Association. This was given by the Church-Workers Association of St. James' Church.

ST. PAUL'S, HALIFAX.

FAMILIES.—There are at present about 570 families upon the Rector's list, additions being made each month.

Besides the Rector and his assistant, the Rev. N. Irwin Perry, the Licensed Church Lay-Evangelist, Mr. Winfield, works in the Parish, visiting every house in the parish bounds, reporting the names of all who belong to the church, and conducting services in the Mission Hall the year round. The church of St. Matthias in St. Paul's Parish is at present in charge of the Rev. F. W. Archibald who is licensed under the Rector of St. Paul's.

ORGANIZATIONS.—The works of the church are the Sunday school with 48 teachers and officers, and a total of 525 including five large Bible classes in separate compartments; the St. Andrew's Brotherhood, the Band of Hope and Church of England Temperance Society, the Young People's Society, the Dorcas Society, the Woman's Missionary Society,

There is a Glebe income of about \$900.00 and a Rectory Fund of \$118.00 in addition to the above.

ST. GEORGE'S, HALIFAX.

This old parish has suffered much from removals to the south end of the city and to the United States. It has still about 350 families upon the roll and over 260 in the Sunday School ; including two Bible classes, one for elder boys and one for girls. The teachers are faithful to their duties and the school is flourishing.

There are the usual organizations incidental to a populous parish. The Ladies Sewing Circle, the Young People's Sewing Circle, the Daughters of the King, the Brotherhood of St. Andrew, the Mite Society, the St. George's Glee Club, the Guild of the Sanctuary, the Choir Singing Classes, the Scripture Union, the Willing Workers for the Poor, the Children's Temperance Society, all are conducted with efficiency and zeal.

In October last we were thankful once more to obtain the services of a Curate, and in Rev. H. H. Pittman, M. A., a graduate of King's College, we have a fellow helper in whom all have confidence, and whose ministrations are generally acceptable.

On Easter day the choir was vested for the first time. Some anxiety was felt as to the effect of including the lady singers in the surpliced choir, but the event has justified every hope, and we now have a large and effective body of singers, able to lead the congregation in the praises of God with reverence and godly fear.

The services in Holy Week and Good Friday were especially impressive and edifying. The three hours service was held, as is now the custom with us, from 12 to 3 on Good Friday; and the very large attendance showed the desire of our people to derive as much blessing as possible from the contemplation of our Saviour's passion. This was followed, as it always is, by an increased number of communicants on Easter Day. The three hours is a distinctively English service, and is rapidly becoming popular in the best sense of that term.

In spiritual matters I trust we are going humbly forward, and are doing our share in the evangelization and training for Heaven of the souls committed to our charge. The utmost harmony prevails in the parish, and if we are poor, we are striving to be zealous in our Master's cause.

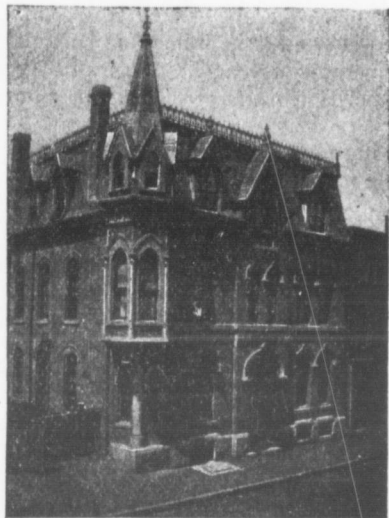

SOME REASONS FOR SUPPORTING KING'S COLLEGE.

THE CHURCH UNIVERSITY of the Maritime Provinces is King's College. This College belongs to the members of the Church of England. It was founded with great wisdom and foresight by the first Bishop of Nova Scotia, as a necessity of the Church then and always. The College has had many vicissitudes; has been sometimes flourishing, sometimes in the back ground, and like all institutions insufficiently endowed, has varied in its success. It has now many competitors, and has hard work to maintain its position. Some reasons follow why Church people should maintain and stand by their College.

1. It has a staff of most competent professors, capable of imparting a thoroughly sound education, and equal in ability and zeal to those of any similar institution.
2. It has a splendid Library of between twelve thousand and thirteen thousand volumes, of which a new catalogue has just been published, and containing many rare and valuable books. This Library is open to students for their use.
3. The College building has been thoroughly renovated and modernized, being now heated with hot water, and all the students' rooms being comfortable and pleasant. Board is furnished by the College, and all profits therefrom accrue to it.
4. It has a large list of scholarships and prizes, by which needy and clever students may derive helps for their College course, thus reducing the necessary expenses to a minimum. There are also existing many "Nominations," a list of which is published in the Calendar, by means of which students receiving them may pass through College free of fees, including that for the B. A. Degree.
5. There is a beautiful and commodious chapel, in which the morning and evening prayers of the Church of England are conducted.
6. There are no religious tests to be subscribed to of any kind except for degrees in Divinity, so that the advantages of the College Courses are free and open to all.

7. Students may reside out of College, though the resident system is preferred.

8. Last, but by no means least, there is attached to the College, and a feeder to it, a Collegiate School, which is now in first-class order. Its staff consists of three resident and three non-resident masters. The resident masters are all graduates of Cambridge or Oxford, the Head Master being a Wrangler of the former University. This School is rapidly growing in public favour. The buildings and grounds have been recently improved, and everything is provided which is needed by a school of high intellectual standard: while the fees for board and tuition are very reasonable. The New Calendar has just been issued and can be obtained from Dr. H. Y. Hind or Rev. Dr. Bowman, Windsor, N. S. All these are reasons why the College should be supported by Churchmen.

The buildings and endowments are worth together nearly \$200,000; the income being between \$9000 and \$10,000. At the present about \$5000 a year more is needed, which could easily be raised if the people would do it. And it is now the ardent hope of the Governors and Alumni that good reasons are shewn to the Church for advancing and improving their own Institutions, which can ably justify their existence by their success.

The Church School for Girls.

Every Church person is earnestly urged to procure and circulate the last Calendar of the Church School for Girls, which is in a highly successful condition. The Church is thus fully equipped for her educational work, and will make her mark upon the rising generations. The Church people of the Maritime Provinces should feel proud of their College and Schools, and seek to spread their influence as widely as possible.

The work of conducting a nursing hospital for paying patients begun in August, 1890, was taken up by the Association on its formation and continued until March 1893.

The opening of a number of private rooms in the Victoria General Hospital in the summer of 1892, not only largely increased the accommodation for paying patients, but created such a serious competition with our institution, that not feeling able to compete with the "Victoria General," with the resources of the Providence at its back, the Committee reluctantly decided to cease receiving patients—and have suspended operations until definite arrangements can be made—for taking up some distinctly charitable branch of work as set forth in our objects—say a Hospital for Incurables—or what has been recently suggested as a real need, a Home for Convalescents.

As the work of the Association is calculated to enlist the sympathies of the benevolent throughout the Diocese, further information will be gladly furnished as to the plans for payment of the property—privileges to those contributing to Endowment, &c. on application to the Secretary. Aid for the Work either by Bequest—Endowment, Donation or Annual Subscription, is greatly needed and will be gratefully received.
