Next it lay the tender on its side and then

were overturned, planting the unrecog-
nized remains of the train on the bot-
tom of the river.

The searching for the bodies
of the train which went up to 8 o'clock

Lambert, general conductor of the train,
was taken out of the wrecked
passenger coach on Thursday, and was
unrecognizable and badly disfigured.
