## University of Toronto.

### HISTORICAL SKETCH.

The movement which ended in the establishment of the University of Toronto as the centre of the educational system of the Province of Ontario, originated in the mind of General Simcoe, the first Governor of Upper Canada, who was himself an old student of Merton, the most ancient of Oxford Colleges. He repeatedly expressed his conviction, both before his departure from England, and also during his term of office, that the best interests alike of the Government and of the inhabitants called for the establishment of a University in Upper Canada. It was not, however, during his administration that the project, thus for the first time formulated, took practical shape.

In the year 1797, the initial step in the path of higher education in Upper Canada was taken, when the home Government gave authority to the acting Lieutenant-Governor, the Hon. Peter Russell, to set apart for educational purposes five hundred thousand acres of the waste lands of the Crown; one-half to be applied to the establishment of a University. But the actual foundation of the University was not rendered possible until nearly thirty years later; when permission was obtained to exchange a portion of these unproductive lands for other lands still vested in the Crown, which had begun to acquire value from settlement

under lease. In consequence of this exchange, a revenue was created; and in 1827 a Royal Charter was granted by King George IV. for establishing at or near the town of York—as Toronto was then called—a college, “with the style and privilege of a University,” to be called King’s College.

But further delay ensued, owing to the attitude towards educational matters of the next Lieutenant-Governor, Sir John Colbourne. Under his influence the Royal Grammar School, then in existence at the capital, was transformed into Upper Canada College; in the belief that the educational necessities of the Province would be sufficiently provided for by such an institution. For twelve years, accordingly, a portion of University work proper was carried on, in conjunction with ordinary school training, by the Upper Canada College. After several changes in the administration of the Province, a Lieutenant-Governor of more advanced ideas in the matter of higher education, Sir Charles Bagot, concurred in the view that the long expected university should be organized; and on the 23rd of April, 1842, the foundation stone of King’s College was laid by Sir Charles Bagot himself, in the Queen’s Park, on the site occupied by the Parliament Buildings.

Until the new buildings should be ready for occupation, the old Parliament House, vacated by the removal of the seat of government under the Union Act of 1840, was appropriated for the carrying on of lectures and other University functions. Faculties of Arts, Medicine, and Divinity were established; and in 1843, the first matriculation of students took place, and inaugural addresses and lectures were delivered on June 8th and 9th of that year. A portion of the projected buildings in the Queen’s Park was soon ready for occupation,—the only portion ever completed

on that site; and thither the professors and students were transferred. A separate school for the Medical Faculty was erected further to the west. This building known in recent times as "Moss Hall" has, in its turn, been removed and the site appropriated for the building of the Biological Department and Museum.

In 1849 an important modification of the existing state of things was effected by an Act of the Legislature of Canada. In accordance with this Act the Faculty of Divinity was abolished, and the name changed from King's College to that of the University of Toronto. The University underwent a further transformation in 1853. The faculties of Law and Medicine were abolished. Under the name of the University of Toronto, the functions of a university, as limited to the determining the courses of study, appointing examiners, holding examinations, and admitting to degrees in Arts, Law and Medicine, were assigned to the Senate as then constituted. To the President and Professors in the Faculty of Arts, were assigned the teaching and the entire discipline and control of the students, with special powers as a distinct corporation, under the name of University College. ←

The model of the newly organized University was stated to be the University of London. The characteristic features of that University, which had then only recently been established, were its limitation to the function of examination, and its freedom from denominational restrictions. The University of Toronto, while retaining the latter characteristic unimpaired, has been enabled, by the subsequent progress of events, to resume what is indeed the main function of a university—the work of teaching.

During the early years of the University it experienced repeated changes in its local habitation as in other respects.

The faculty and students of King's College were temporarily accommodated in the Parliament House until the erection of the east wing of King's College admitted of the occupation of their own building. From this they were anew transferred to the old Parliament Buildings in 1853, when, by a special Act, the site of King's College was appropriated for the proposed new buildings for the use of the Parliament of Upper and Lower Canada. On the return of the Legislature to Toronto in 1856, the faculty resumed the occupation of the old King's College building, while one formerly in use by the Medical Faculty was being adapted for their occupation. There accordingly the work of the College was carried on, while the new University buildings were planned. This building was begun in 1856, and on October 4th, 1858, the top stone of the main tower being then placed in position by Sir Edmund Head, the Governor-General, an old Oxford professor, the value of whose sympathy and support at this critical period in the history of the University cannot be over-estimated.

For more than thirty years the constitution of the University and of University College remained unchanged. Other collegiate bodies, principally denominational schools of Theology, entered into affiliation with the University; and in deference to their especial requirements, the course of study in Oriental Languages was augmented; but the Faculty of University College continued to do the work of instruction for nearly all the students in Arts who presented themselves for examination. The candidates for examinations and degrees in Medicine were trained by medical schools in affiliation with the University, and in the Faculty of Law the examinations were based merely upon text-books prescribed by the Senate.

In 1887, both University and College were remodelled by the University Federation Act, under the provisions of which the University again possesses teaching faculties in Arts, Medicine and Law. The main object of renewed legislation was to secure a more uniform standard of higher education by the union of the various denominational universities of Ontario with the Provincial University. Since the proclamation of the Act, Victoria University at Cobourg, representing the Methodist body, has entered into federation with the University of Toronto. The governing body of this institution is now represented on the Senate of the University of Toronto; its graduates elect representatives to the same body, and by the removal of the faculty and students of Victoria University to Toronto, where college buildings are now in process of erection in the Queen's Park, the union of the two Universities has been effected.

Under the Federation Act, the theological colleges also, formerly in affiliation with the University of Toronto, have become federating colleges, and enjoy increased representation on the Senate.

The professoriate in scientific and historical departments has been transferred to the University, and so made equally available to all federating universities and colleges. The Faculty of University College consists of professors and lecturers in Classical Languages and Literature (including lecturers in Ancient History), in Oriental Languages, in English, French and German, and in Moral Philosophy. All other portions of an Arts course are assigned to the Faculty of the University. For the maintenance of certain of the departments of science on the scale demanded by modern methods of research special provision has been made by the erection of new and the enlargement of old buildings.

In the new Biological Building every facility is now provided for practical training in Biology and Physiology; further extensions are in progress for other departments of science; and the advantages of the well equipped Faculty of Arts are now available for the students in the Faculty of Medicine. The result cannot fail to elevate the standard of medical education in Ontario.

Since the passage of the Federation Act, also, a teaching Faculty of Law has been created in the University, consisting of three professors and several honorary lecturers.

The expansion of the University has not been limited to the time-honoured faculties of Arts, Medicine and Law. In 1888 a stimulus was given to the study of scientific methods of farming by the affiliation of the Ontario Agricultural College, and the adoption of a curriculum of study for the degree of Bachelor of the Science of Agriculture. Similarly an examination for the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery has been instituted, as a consequence of the affiliation of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario. The College of Pharmacy has subsequently been admitted to affiliation; and with the extension of the same privileges to the Toronto College of Music, a curriculum of study has been prepared for the degree of Bachelor of Music.

The School of Practical Science was affiliated in 1889. Graduates of the School are specially eligible on certain conditions for the degrees of B.A.Sc. and C.E. in the University.

On February 14th, 1890, the main University building was partly destroyed by fire. In the reconstruction thereby rendered necessary, opportunity has been afforded for important improvements in lighting, heating, and ventilation. Considerable extension has been effected in the numbers, capacity, and adequate equipment of the lecture rooms and

laboratories. The new library is being completed on plans embracing the most recent improvements derived from the experience of leading universities in Germany and the United States.

### PRESENT ORGANIZATION.

In treating of the constitution of the University and University College under the latest of the legislative enactments which have modified the Royal Charter, it will be convenient to take up separately the various bodies entrusted with the management of the finances of the University and its internal administration. These are the Crown, the Board of Trustees, the Senate, Convocation, the University Council, and the Council of University College.

#### I. THE CROWN.

The supreme authority in all matters continues to be the Crown, from whom emanated the Charter that created the University, and by whose bounty the lands destined to support the University were originally provided. Section 4 of the University Federation Act (R. S. O. 1887, c. 130), states this general authority :

"The Lieutenant-Governor shall be the Visitor of the University on behalf of the Crown, and his visitorial powers may be exercised by commission under the Great Seal; and the proceedings of any commission, having been first confirmed by the Lieutenant-Governor, shall be binding on the University and its members, and on all persons whomsoever." A similar section (69) applies to University College.

A more tangible mark of the supremacy of the Crown is supplied by section 5, where it is stated that "the president,

professors, lecturers, teachers, officers and servants of the University shall be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor, and shall hold office during his pleasure." As in the preceding instance, a similar section (78) makes a like provision in the case of University College.

In the way of direct supervision of the internal management, it is enacted by section 40 that all statutes of the Senate must be approved by the Visitor before they have any binding force whatever; and, as before, a later section (75) imposes the same restriction in the case of statutes of the University College Council.

In another sphere also, the Crown is supreme, viz., in the management of the finances. All the property of the University is vested in the Crown in trust for the purposes of the University and University College, and is to be "managed and administered under the orders of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, by an officer to be appointed by commission under the Great Seal of this Province, to hold office during pleasure, and to be called the bursar." (R. S. O. 1887, c. 231, s. 7).

## II. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

The last section quoted naturally leads to consideration of the second important factor in University administration, the Board of Trustees. By Order-in-Council, dated 16th May, 1878, a Board of Management was created, with general powers as to the management and disposition of the University endowment. The original number of members of the Board was five, viz., the Vice-Chancellor and two members of the Senate elected by that body, the President of University College, and one representative chosen by, but not necessarily a member of, the College Council.

Subsequently the representation from the Senate was increased and the Chancellor constituted an *ex-officio* member. In 1884 an Order-in-Council was passed, by which the name was changed to "Board of Trustees," and the membership constituted as follows: The Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, and the President of University College, *ex-officio*; five members elected by, but not necessarily members of, the Senate of the University; and two members elected by, but not necessarily members of, the Council of University College. The functions of the Board remain as before.

### III. THE SENATE.

The constitution of the Senate as the supreme authority, under the Crown, in the internal management of the University, has varied from time to time. At present, it consists of three classes of members: (1) *ex-officio* members; (2) appointed, and (3) elected members. Among the former are the Minister of Education, the present and past Chancellors and Vice-Chancellors, and the President of University College, and of each federating University or College. Members are appointed by the Councils of the University and University College, the Law Society of Upper Canada, and by the governing body of each federating or affiliated College or School, subject to certain restrictions in the case of affiliated institutions. The Crown has also the power to appoint nine members of the Senate. The elected members of the Senate are representatives of the graduates in Arts, Medicine, and Law of the University of Toronto and any federating University, and of the High School teachers of the Province. They number at present twenty-five out of a total of sixty-one members of Senate. The body thus composed is subject to change once in three years, when all except the *ex-officio*

members must retire, being eligible, however, for re-appointment or re-election.

The function of the Senate is the general administration of the University. Section 39 of the Federation Act gives it power to make statutes in reference to various particular matters, and "in general for promoting the purposes of the University, and touching all other matters whatsoever regarding the same or the business thereof; or for any purpose for which provision may be required for carrying out this Act according to its intent and spirit, in any case not herein provided for."

With regard to the Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor, although in function the latter is merely the deputy of the former, their election proceeds from totally different bodies. The Chancellor is the representative of the whole body of graduates, while the Vice-Chancellor is the Chairman of the Senate elected from actual members of the Senate on occasion of its inaugural meeting after a triennial election, and ceasing to hold office when the Senate by whom he was elected is dissolved.

#### IV. CONVOCATION.

Convocation consists of the whole body of graduates of the University, in all faculties. Except indirectly, no part of the management of the University can be exercised by it as a whole. It elects the Chancellor, and, in divisions according to faculty, it elects members of Senate as its representatives in Arts, Medicine and Law. Any question relating to University affairs, may be discussed by it and a vote taken, but the result of such discussion is only communicated to the Senate for action to be taken thereon.

## V. THE UNIVERSITY COUNCIL.

This body is composed of a president, who shall also be President of University College, and the professors in the University. Its functions are defined in the R. S. O. chap. 230, ss. 56-58, as follows :

"Such council shall have full authority and entire responsibility of discipline over all students in relation to the lectures and other instruction by the professors, lecturers and other teachers of the University ; and no lecturing or teaching of any kind shall be carried on in the University in the School of Science, by any others except the duly appointed professors and teachers, without the authority of the University Council.

"The University Council shall have entire authority and responsibility for all work carried on by the societies and associations of students of the University, provided always that all such authority and responsibility shall be limited to the conduct of the students in relation to such societies and associations as are organized in connection with the University.

"The University Council shall have authority over all officers and servants of the University, whose services are required in connection with the work of instruction ; and all curators, assistants or servants, engaged in the lecture rooms, laboratories or otherwise, in any department of instruction, shall be under the sole authority of the University Council.

"The laboratory fees to be paid by students or other persons for attending the University, or receiving instruction therein, shall be determined by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on the report of the University Council."

## VI. THE COUNCIL OF UNIVERSITY COLLEGE.

Like the University Council, the Council of University College has control over students of University College, and authority over the servants. It consists of the President and Professors in the College, together with the Dean of Residence. It has larger duties and powers, however, than the University Council, being constituted a corporation with a common seal, and power to hold property, and to sue and be sued as a corporation.

*Fellows.*

Fellowships in the subjects given below, of the annual value of \$500 each, are open for appointment each year. The selection is made immediately after the publication of the result of the University Examinations in May, from among graduates of the University.

Each Fellow is appointed annually; but he may be reappointed for a period, not exceeding in all, three years.

Each Fellow is required to assist in the teaching and practical work of the department; to pursue some special line of study therein; and to devote his entire time during the Terms to the work of the department, under the direction of the Professor or Lecturer. The Fellows are selected with a special view to their aptitude for teaching, along with their requirements in the work of the department to which each Fellowship is attached. Every Fellow on accepting his appointment comes under an obligation to fulfil the duties of his Fellowship during the Terms of the Academic Year in which he is appointed, unless specially exempted.

Candidates must send in their applications annually to the Registrar, not later than the first day of June.

## Faculty of Arts.

### ENTRANCE.

Candidates may enter this Faculty by passing the Junior Matriculation examination, (see appendix, p. 1) or the Senior Matriculation examination (First year), or at the examination of the Second year (see page 40).

Candidates for Junior Matriculation must have completed the fifteenth year of their age.

All candidates entering at the Junior Matriculation examination must take the pass subjects in Latin, Mathematics, English, History and Geography, and in one of the following groups: (a) Greek; (b) French and German; (c) French, and either Physics or Chemistry; (d) German, and either Physics or Chemistry.

Candidates intending to take, during their University course, any one of the following honor departments, viz.: Political Science, Mathematics and Physics, Chemistry and Mineralogy, Natural Sciences, are recommended to take French and German at Matriculation; since these languages must be taken in connection with the above-named honor departments. For a similar reason candidates intending to take, during their University course, either the honor department of Philosophy or that of Oriental Languages are recommended to take Greek, French and German at Junior Matriculation.

All candidates entering at the Senior Matriculation examination must take the pass subjects in Latin, English, History, Mathematics, either Greek, or French and German, and one of the three sciences—Chemistry, Biology, Geology, specified below under the title of First year. (Note: Hebrew may be substituted for French or German). Candidates who propose taking the honor course in Philosophy are recommended to take French and German as well as Greek, in view of the course for Second year prescribed on p. 46; and candidates who intend taking the honor course in Political Science are recommended to take French and German, either instead of or along with Greek,

in view of the course for Second year prescribed on page 45. Candidates for Senior Matriculation may present themselves either in May—and compete with the undergraduates for honors and scholarships—or at a special examination in September, at which no honors or scholarships are awarded.

An undergraduate in the Faculty of Arts, in any University in Her Majesty's dominions, may enter by being admitted "*ad eundem statum*," on special application to the Senate.

If such application be for admission to the standing of the Third or Fourth year in this University the Senate will, if it sees fit to grant the same, prescribe the subjects of examination in which such applicant shall be required to pass before proceeding to the Degree, having regard to the subjects in which he has already passed satisfactory examinations in his own University.

If such applicant be admitted to a lower standing in this University than he held in his own University, he may not compete for scholarships at the next ensuing examination; but if he obtain honors he shall, at the next succeeding examination, enjoy the same rights and privileges with respect to obligatory subjects, as an original undergraduate of this University who has passed an examination of the same merit.

The ordinary annual examinations for Matriculation (both pass and honor) will commence in the beginning of July, and applications therefor must be sent to the Education Department before June 1st.

Supplemental examinations for Matriculation will be held in the University about the middle of September, at which those who are rejected at the July examination, as well as new candidates, may present themselves; but no honors or scholarships will be awarded at such examinations.

The fee for Matriculation is five dollars, and must be paid when the application for the examination is made.

The special examination for Senior Matriculation, previously referred to, will be held at the same time as these supplemental examinations.

Candidates for entrance must produce satisfactory certificates of age and of good conduct.

The fee for admission "*ad eundem statum*" is six dollars, and must be paid to the Registrar at the time of application.

Until the Senate, by resolution, otherwise determines, the standing of candidates who have passed, or may hereafter pass, the ex-

amination of the Department of Education for First or Second Class Teachers' Certificates, is accepted *pro tanto* at any Junior Matriculation examination, provided always that all candidates for scholarships shall take the full Matriculation examination at Toronto, and shall notify the Registrar of their intention before the 1st of June.

First Class Teachers' Certificates, or Senior Leaving Certificates, or certificates of having passed portions of the examination for such certificates, may be accepted *pro tanto* at the Senior Matriculation and First year examinations. Teachers holding Grades A and B are allowed the options granted to honor men in the subjects in which these certificates have been granted; thus those having these grades in Mathematics will be recognized as in the honor department of Mathematics; those having Grade A. in Natural Science shall be recognized as in the honor department of Natural Sciences of the Second year, on passing the necessary additional subjects in the First and Second examinations; and those having these grades in English will be recognized as in the honor department of Modern Languages on passing in pass and honor French and German in addition to other necessary subjects.

Certificates of having passed the First examination in the School of Practical Science are accepted *pro tanto* at the Senior Matriculation and First year examinations, *i. e.*, the examinations in Mathematics and Chemistry are not required from the holders of such certificates.

Candidates who desire to compete at the First year examinations for scholarships or relative standing cannot exercise the privilege referred to in the two preceding paragraphs.

Candidates entering at the examination of the Second year, and Undergraduates of First year standing who desire to take the Second year's examination, must, in addition to the subjects required for it, pass examinations on the subjects of the First year, according to the following scheme:—

For all who intend to pursue the pass course:—*Mathematics, History, English and Chemistry or Biology or Geology.*

For those who intend to enter any of the honor departments, as follows:—

I.—REGULATIONS RELATING TO ALL UNDER-GRADUATES.

Undergraduates proceeding to a Degree are required to be registered either in University College or in a federating University—except in those cases in which the Senate, in consideration of peculiar circumstances, shall dispense with such attendance. All applications for such dispensation must be lodged with the Registrar before January 15th.

Every undergraduate who has not received such dispensation from the Senate for any particular year, must, before being admitted to examination, produce to the Registrar from the Head of the federated College which he has attended during the year, a certificate of attendance and of compliance with the requirements of that College.

Notice of the time of commencement of the undergraduate examinations will be given annually in January.

In Colleges in federation with the University, the Second and Third years' examinations are conducted by their respective professors, or lecturers, conjointly with associate examiners appointed by the Senate ; and such examinations are held at the same time as the examinations in the University.

Students of the Second or Third years of any federating University or College are examined on the subjects of the lectures by the professors or lecturers whose lectures are so attended, conjointly with the University associate examiners. Associate examiners are not appointed in the case of the theological options specified on pages 42 and 47.

Candidates in all the years are required to send to the Registrar of the University, at least three weeks before the commencement of each examination, an application for examination according to a printed form to be obtained from the Registrar, and such application must be accompanied by the fee of five dollars.

## II.—REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PASS COURSE.

The subjects to be taken by those pursuing the pass course, with the options permitted, are set forth in the following schedule :

FIRST YEAR . . . .	{	Latin ; English ; History ; Mathematics ; either Greek, or French and German ; and one of the three Sciences—Chemistry, Biology, Geology.
SECOND YEAR . . . .	{	Latin ; English ; History ; Philosophy ; Physics ; either Greek, or French and German.
THIRD YEAR . . . .	{	Latin ; English ; either Greek, or French and German ; any two of the three departments—History and Political Science, Philosophy, Physics.
FOURTH YEAR . . . .	{	Latin ; English ; either Greek, or French and German ; any two of the three departments—Political Science, Philosophy, Mathematics and Physics.

NOTE.— Hebrew may be substituted for French or German in each of the four years.

Undergraduates in the pass course in the Third and Fourth years may, in lieu of one or more of the subjects prescribed for each of these years, take certain of the following subjects, namely, Biblical Greek, Biblical Literature, Apologetics and Church History, according to the following scheme :

Undergraduates who exercise these options must present certificates of having attended lectures, and passed examinations in the subjects so selected at an affiliated or federating College or University other than University College. The minimum for passing at such examinations must not be less than the minimum required at the University examinations of the same year.

Undergraduates of any year, who have been rejected, or who have been prevented from attending the annual examinations in May by sickness, domestic affliction, or other causes beyond their control may present themselves for examination in September; at the time of the Senior Matriculation examination. But candidates who have failed to attend at the May examinations, must prove to the satisfaction of the Vice-Chancellor, before presenting themselves in September, the existence and sufficiency of the alleged cause of absence, and all such cases shall be subsequently reported to the Senate.

A candidate for examination of any year in the pass course who has failed in not more than two subjects of the examination, may be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing supplemental examinations in the subject or subjects only in which he has so failed; and a candidate for examination of any year in an honor department, who has failed in not more than one of the pass subjects attached to his honor department, may be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing supplemental examinations in that subject only in which he has so failed. No candidate whether in the pass or honor course shall be allowed to enter upon the next succeeding year of his course until he has passed the subject or subjects in which he has failed at the supplemental examination in September, or at the time of any succeeding annual examinations in May; but no candidate taking a supplemental examination at the time of the annual May examinations shall be allowed to present himself at the same examination in the subjects of any succeeding year of his course.

Candidates who were rejected must pay a fee of ten dollars before offering themselves for the supplemental examination.

A student who has been pursuing the pass course, but who has also succeeded in taking honors in some department in any year of his course, may apply to the Senate to be permitted to take such honor course, as if he had originally entered thereon; and such application may be granted, the Senate having due regard to the subjects on which he has already been examined.

### III.—REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE HONOR COURSE.

In this course there are eight honor departments, viz. : I. Classics ; II. Modern Languages ; III. Oriental Languages ; IV. Political Science ; V. Philosophy ; VI. Mathematics and Physics ; VII. Chemistry and Mineralogy ; VIII. Natural Sciences.

Candidates pursuing department II will be allowed at and after the examinations of 1893 to take either Teutonic or Romance languages in their Fourth year.

Candidates pursuing department VI are allowed to take either Mathematics or Physics in their Fourth year.

Candidates pursuing department VIII are allowed to take either Division I or Division II in their Fourth year.

An undergraduate is entitled to admission to the degree of Bachelor of Arts, if in each year of his course he passes the examination in the pass and honor subjects of one of these departments (except in the department of Political Science of which the honor subjects only are required), and also the pass examinations in the subjects, and at the respective times mentioned in the following schedule :—

Undergraduates in the honor departments of Philosophy and Oriental Languages may, in the Third year, substitute Biblical Literature or Church History for History. Undergraduates in the honor department of Philosophy may also substitute Biblical Greek for the pass classical Greek (Plato) to be taken in the Third year, and Biblical Literature or Apologetics for the pass Economics of the Fourth year. Undergraduates in the honor department of Oriental Languages may also substitute Biblical Greek for the pass classical Greek of the Third and Fourth years. Undergraduates in the honor department of Political Science may substitute Church History for the pass English of the Second year, and Biblical Greek for the Pass French or German of Third year. Those exercising these options must present certificates of having attended lectures and passed examinations in the subjects so selected at an affiliated or confederated College or University other than University College. The minimum for passing at such examinations must not be less than the minimum required at the University examinations of Third year. These examinations do not count for honors.

In the honor department of Philosophy two distinct examinations are held in the Fourth year upon the two systems of Philosophy taught in the confederating Arts Colleges.

A candidate for honors in any of these departments is required each year to take the pass papers set in the subjects of his department for that year, except in the department of Political Science, in which only the honor papers are required.

Candidates in the honor subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Mineralogy and Geology, will be ranked in the class lists on practical work done in the laboratories of the respective departments during the session; and no candidate will be allowed to proceed to examination in any of these honor subjects unless he presents to the Registrar a certificate from the Professor that he has attained honor standing in the practical work of that subject.

A candidate pursuing the honor course in any one of these departments may, after passing in honors the examination of any year, apply for leave to take the pass course during the remainder of his undergraduateship.

A candidate pursuing the honor course, who fails to take honors in his department, shall not be considered to have passed the examination of the year, excepting that in the departments of Modern Languages, Political Science, Philosophy, Chemistry and Miner-

alogy, and Natural Sciences, a candidate who in any one branch has failed to obtain the full percentage requisite for ranking in honors may, on the special recommendation of the examiners, be allowed to proceed as an honor candidate in the department in the following year. A candidate who has failed may at his option again present himself for the examination in which he failed; or, upon application to the Senate, may be permitted to take the ordinary supplemental pass examination in September, with such of the previous pass subjects as may appear requisite in view of the extent and character of the examinations he has already passed.

A candidate who competes for honors at the examination for B. A., and fails to obtain the requisite number of marks to entitle him to be classed in honours, may, on the recommendation of the examiners, be awarded a degree without honors; it being at the option of the candidate to accept the award of such a degree, or to wait until a subsequent examination and again compete for a degree in honors.

An undergraduate who has obtained honors in any one of these departments may transfer himself to any other department, and proceed therein, but as a prerequisite to obtaining the Degree of B. A., he must during his course have passed the examinations in pass-subjects annexed to the honor department to which he is transferred.

#### DEGREE OF M. A.

Candidates for the Degree of M. A. must have been admitted to the Degree of B. A., must be of the standing of one year from admission to the Degree of B. A., and must have sent in an approved thesis upon some subject in one of the departments in the Faculty of Arts.

Subject to one rebate of \$1 to an occasional student attending two or three courses, or partial courses, the aggregate fees for which would according to the aforesaid scale equal or exceed \$10 : and to one rebate of \$3 to an occasional student attending three or more of such courses, the aggregate fees for which would, according to the aforesaid scale, equal or exceed \$15.

The annual practical instruction fee for an occasional student attending a course, or partial course, of laboratory work, shall be ascertained by adding for the purpose of calculation, to the number of lecture hours in the same course, or partial course, the number of hours of laboratory work therein ; and by rating the aggregate lecture and laboratory fee for that course combined accordingly, as for example :—

Assuming the course of lectures to comprise fifteen hours, and the course of laboratory work to comprise fifteen hours, making thirty in all, the total fee for the course of lectures and laboratory work combined shall be that prescribed above for thirty lecture hours, namely : \$3.

The above provision for a rebate to an occasional student taking more than one course shall apply only to the combined courses and the aggregates so ascertained ; each course of lecture and laboratory work combined, being treated as one single course.

## CHARGES FOR LABORATORY SUPPLIES.

Charges for supplies shall include laboratory materials and instruments used by or for the student, and ordinary wear and tear of instruments ; but not charges for waste, neglect or breakage, which are to be met out of a deposit, to be fixed by the Professor.

"A matriculated student in Arts" means a student in Arts who is matriculated in the University of Toronto and enrolled in University College or a Federating University, and whose name is entered with the Registrar of the University of Toronto.

"An occasional student" includes every student in whose case the Senate is by law authorized to determine fees for courses of lectures in the University of Toronto.

An occasional student attending two or three courses, or partial courses, the aggregate fees for which would, according to the aforesaid scale, equal or exceed \$10, shall be entitled to one rebate of \$1; and an occasional student attending three or more of such courses, the aggregate fees for which would, according to the aforesaid scale, equal or exceed \$15, shall be entitled to one rebate of \$3.

4. Every matriculated student in Arts shall, during his undergraduate course, pay, at the time of the entry of his name with the Registrar, an annual library fee of \$2.

5. No occasional or other student of any class shall be admitted to the library, save upon payment of an annual fee of \$2.

N.B.—All the above fees are payable in advance, and in the case of fees for lectures, if not paid during the month of October (or in the case of students attending in Easter term only, during the month of January), an additional fee of one dollar per month will be imposed until the whole amount is paid.

The fee for each examination must accompany the application to the Registrar.

The fee for admission *ad eundem statum*, for change of faculty, for admission to a higher year on the certificate of the Head of an affiliated college, for dispensation from attendance at lectures, or for certificates of honor, must be paid to the Registrar at the time of the application for such.

#### TERM WORK.

Candidates in pass subjects in the Faculty of Arts shall be arranged in the annual class lists in three grades, A. B. & C.; the minimum for A. being seventy-five per cent. of the marks, and for B. fifty per cent.; all under fifty per cent. who pass shall be placed in C.

Reports of attendance at pass lectures in the First and Second years shall be made in all departments except those of Chemistry, Natural Science and Physics, and marks for such attendance shall be assigned in connection with the May examination as follows:

No student attending less than one-half the lectures shall receive any marks for attendance.

Reports on term pass work in the First and Second years shall be made in all departments except those of Chemistry, Natural Science and Physics. In the department of English five essays at least shall be required during the session from each student; and the reports on term work in that department shall be based on the essays. In other departments the report on term work shall be based on those parts of the work which the professor or lecturer may deem most appropriate as tests of proficiency. The maximum number of marks to be assigned for term work in connection with the May examination shall be thirty, and no candidate earning less than ten marks shall receive any marks for term work.

This scholarship is tenable in conjunction with any other scholarship or scholarships.

THE RAMSAY SCHOLARSHIP in Political Economy, of the value of \$60. The gift of Mr. William Ramsay. This scholarship is open for competition to all graduates or undergraduates who have been placed in the First Class in one of the Economic subjects of the Fourth year in the honor department of Political Science (Third year in the Faculty of Law); but not more than two years must have elapsed since the competitor passed the examination above named. The award is made upon an essay, the subject of which shall be some question in Economics or Finance of interest to the commercial community in Canada, to be announced in May of each year, and the competition shall close on the 15th of September thereafter, by which date the essays must be sent to the Registrar.

THE BANKERS' SCHOLARSHIP in Political Science of the value of \$70. The gift of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, the Dominion, Imperial, Standard and Traders' Banks, and the Union Bank of Lower Canada. Only such candidates are eligible as are of one year's standing and have passed the examination of the First year. A special examination on some special text-book of history or finance will be held at the time of the supplemental examinations in September. This scholarship is not tenable with any other.

As explained in the University College regulations, which the Board of Examiners appointing the professors, and the University Council constituted to the University of Toronto, have constituted the requirements for Matriculation in the University College. By the University Council, the functions of the Faculty of Arts, in English, French, Philosophy, and the other subjects, are to be performed by the University of Toronto, and the University of Toronto is to be the University of Toronto.

### University College.

As explained in the historical introduction, p. 9, University College was created by an Act passed in 1853, by which the determination of all requirements for degrees, appointing examiners, and conferring degrees, was assigned to the University; while the Faculty, embracing all the professors, lecturers, and tutors, in Arts and Science, was constituted a College for instruction in accordance with the requirements of the University, under the name of University College, Toronto.

By the University Federation Act, of 1887, the University functions of instruction have been revived in most branches of study in the Faculty of Arts, and in the Faculties of Law and Medicine; and the professors and lecturers in Arts and Science have, with a few exceptions, been reorganized into a teaching Faculty in the University.

The subjects of Greek and Latin (with Ancient History), English, French, German, Oriental Languages, and Moral Philosophy, have been excepted from those assigned to the University Faculty; and the professors, lecturers, and other instructors in these subjects constitute the Faculty of University College.

In 1853 James Formei, LL.D., was appointed Professor in Modern Languages, including French, German, Italian and Spanish. In 1866 this Chair was abolished and separate lectureships in each of the above subjects of French and German were established. Mr. vanderSmussen was appointed Lecturer in German, which position he still holds, and Mr. Emile Pernet occupied a similar position with regard to French, until his resignation in 1888.

Until the appointment of the present Professor, the subject of Ethics was united with the other branches of Philosophy in a single professorship, the first incumbent of which was Rev. James Beaven, D.D., appointed 1843, died 1871. Rev. George Paxton Young, M.A., succeeded him and died in 1889.

FELLOWS.

Fellowships in the subjects mentioned below of the value of \$500 each, are open for appointment each year. The selection is made immediately after the publication of the result of the University Examinations in May, from among the graduates of the University of Toronto.

The statute requires that each Fellow shall be appointed annually ; but he may be reappointed for a period not exceeding in all, three years.

Each Fellow is required to assist in the teaching and practical work of the department ; to pursue some special line of study therein ; and to devote his entire time during the College Terms to the work of the department, under the direction of the Professor or Lecturer.

The statute provides that "The Fellows shall be appointed from among the graduates of the University of Toronto, on the recommendation of the College Council, and shall be selected with a special view to their aptitude for teaching, along with their acquirements in the work of the department to which each Fellowship is attached." And also that "Every Fellow on accepting his appointment shall come under an obligation to fulfil the duties of his Fellowship during the College Terms of the Academic Year in which he is appointed, unless specially exempted by resolution of the College Council."

Candidates must send in their applications annually to the College Registrar, not later than the first day of June.

#### STUDENTS.

1. The regular students include undergraduates of the University, and matriculants, *i. e.*, students who, though they have not passed the prescribed matriculation examinations,\* are taking the full undergraduate course.

2. Matriculated students are required to attend the lectures and examinations, on all subjects necessary for students of their respective standings. Certificates of attendance, during one or more academic years, will be given to those matriculated students who have been regular in their attendance on the required lectures, and who have passed the prescribed examinations.

3. Matriculated students are required to reside, during the period of their attendance on lectures, in the College or in houses selected by their parents or guardians, or approved by the President.

4. All interference with the personal liberty of any student, by arresting him, or summoning him to appear before any tribunal of students, or otherwise subjecting him to any indignity or personal violence, is forbidden by the Council. Any student convicted of participation in such proceedings will forfeit the certificate required for admission to the University Examinations; and will render himself liable to expulsion from the University.

5. Non-matriculated students may be admitted to lectures on application to the Professors in the respective departments.

6. Certificates of attendance on lectures in any department during an academic year, may be given to non-matriculated students who have been regular in their attendance, and who have also passed the examinations in such department.

---

#### FEEES.

Graduates in Arts, who have pursued the undergraduate course in University College, may attend lectures free; but this privilege does not exempt them from laboratory and other special fees.

For regular students in Arts, "a course of lectures" means a continuous course of instruction offered to matriculated students in Arts in any one year in any subject.

"A partial course of lectures" means any special course or any sub-division, complete in itself, of a course of lectures as above defined.

"A matriculated student in Arts" means a student who is matriculated in the University, and enrolled in University College, and whose name is entered with the Registrar of the University.

"An occasional student" includes every student not being a matriculated student under the above definition, in whose case the Lieutenant-Governor in Council is by law authorized to determine fees for courses of lectures on the report of the Council of University College.

Every matriculated student in Arts shall, on each year's enrolment in University College, pay an enrolment fee according to the following table; which fee shall include all instruction for which fees are by law chargeable, except laboratory supply charges and library fees:—

TERMS.

1. The Academic Year consists of two terms; the first (*Michaelmas*) extending from October 1st to December 23rd; and the second (*Easter*) from January 2nd to May 31st.

2. The term will not be allowed to students who have been reported to the President by any of the Professors as neglecting to attend the required lectures, or who have not conformed to the statutes and regulations of the College; or have been reported to the Council for bad conduct.

EXAMINATIONS.

1. Matriculated Students are required to attend all examinations prescribed by the Professors and Lecturers in their special departments.

2. Prizes and honors are awarded on the recommendation of the Professors and Lecturers, in accordance with the requirements prescribed by them in their several departments.

3. The examinations for both pass and honors in the University for all students of the second and third years, attending lectures in the University and University College will be conducted by the Professors, and Lecturers, conjointly with associate examiners appointed by the Senate, at the same time as the University examinations for the First and Fourth years.

4. Non-matriculated students are not required to attend the examinations, unless they are candidates for prizes or honors, or desire to obtain certificates of attendance.

The College Residence, is under the charge of the Dean ; and it is earnestly desired to render it a pleasant home for orderly and diligent students, combining facilities for undisturbed study with the friendly social enjoyment of College life.

1. Every student on being admitted into Residence must undertake to conform to the statutes and regulations prescribed for resident students. The Dean is empowered to impose fines for infraction of regulations or disorderly conduct ; and persistent breach of order will be followed by expulsion.

2. All use of beer, wine or spirits in the students' rooms is strictly forbidden.

3. All interference by senior students with the freshmen ; or entrance of their rooms without invitation is strictly forbidden. Every student on entering into Residence must be assured of the enjoyment of undisturbed comfort and freedom from annoyance. Senior residents disobeying this rule will forfeit their rooms.

4. With the approval of the President, the Dean may dismiss any student convicted of persistent infraction of the rules ; or of otherwise conducting himself in any way tending to interfere with the orderly well-being of the Residence.

6. A register shall be kept of the attendance of the residents at prayers, and also of the hours of passing the gate.

7. Resident students shall wear their caps and gowns during term, both in and outside the College, at the discretion of the Dean.

8. They shall regularly attend morning and evening prayers, unless exempted from so doing in consequence of the objection of their parents or guardians.

9. They shall regularly attend their respective places of worship on Sunday.

10. No student shall be absent from the College after the closing of the gate except by permission of the Dean.

11. No stranger shall be admitted after the closing of the gate, nor remain in the building after 12 o'clock at night.

12. The first morning bell shall be rung at 7.30 A.M.; second morning bell and prayers at 8.10 A.M.; breakfast from 8.15 to 9 A.M.; lunch at 1 P.M.; evening bell and prayers at 6.30 P.M.; dinner from 6.45 to 7.30 P.M.; and gate closed at 9.30 P.M.

13. Students may occasionally invite their friends to any meal having previously entered their names in the book kept by the Steward, to whom they shall pay the charge fixed for such meal.

14. The officers of the College and non-resident students can purchase from the Steward tickets for meals.

15. The fee payable by resident students for board and rent of room varies from three and a-half to four dollars and a-quarter per week.

16. All fees of resident students are to be paid in advance, per month.

## CIRCULAR OF DEAN OF RESIDENCE.

*University College*.....

As your son (or *ward*) purposes coming into Residence in this College, I beg to inform you that it is the desire of the Council that, where there are no conscientious objections, all the students under their charge should be present in the hall at daily morning and evening prayers, with reading of the Scriptures. It is also their wish that they should regularly attend on Sundays their respective places of worship, and receive such other religious instruction as their parents or guardians may desire. I have to request that you will be so good as to let me know whether you desire your son (or *ward*) to attend such daily prayers in the College, and that you will also mention the Minister under whose charge you wish to place him.

The Council will afford every facility for the carrying out of your intentions, and with this view, will exercise such control over your son (or *ward*) during his residence, as may be best calculated to effect your wishes. In the event of your not informing me of your desire on the subject, the Council will assume that you have no objection to his being required to attend the daily prayers of the College, and will exercise an oversight as to his attendance on the ministrations of a clergyman of the denomination to which he belongs.

### Victoria University.

Victoria University was founded by resolution of the Conference of the Methodist Church in Canada, held in Kingston, in August 1830. The institution was opened for students on the 18th of June, 1836, with the Rev. Matthew Ritchie, M.A., as Principal. On the 12th of October, 1836, letters patent were issued incorporating the institution as a Seminary of Learning, for the Province of Upper Canada, under the name of "The Upper Canada Academy."

In 1841, the Parliament of the united Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, being now first constituted by Act of the Imperial Parliament with authority to grant such a Charter, at its first Session held in the city of Kingston, passed an Act to incorporate the Upper Canada Academy under the name and style of "Victoria College, with power and authority to confer the degrees of Bachelor, Master, and Doctor of the various Arts and Faculties;" which Act was assented to by the Governor-General, on the twenty-seventh of August, 1841.

On the twenty-first of October, 1841, the Rev. Egerton Ryerson, having been appointed Principal, opened the first College session under the enlarged charter.

In the year 1844, the Rev. A. McNab, D.D., succeeded the Rev. Dr. Ryerson, as Principal, and occupied the office till 1849. At the close of his term the number of students in the College was 140.

In 1850, the Rev. S. S. Nelles, M.A., was appointed Principal and addressed himself to the task of organizing and enlarging the college to the status and work of a Uni-

versity. In the year 1854-55, the Faculty of Medicine was added and established in Toronto. In 1860, the Faculty of Law was added, and in 1871, the Faculty of Theology.

In the years 1883-84, a commission appointed by the General Conference of the Methodist Church, arranged for the consolidation of Albert College, Belleville, with Victoria College, Cobourg, and legal effect was given to this consolidation by Act of the Legislature of Ontario, 47 Victoria, chap. 93.

The corporate name was, by this Act, changed to "Victoria University." The Government of the University was vested in a Board of Regents, Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor and Senate. To these bodies was given power to affiliate outlying colleges, and full University powers in all Faculties were continued. Rev. S. S. Nelles, D.D., LL.D., as President was *ex officio* first Chancellor, and William Kerr Q.C., LL.D., was elected Vice-Chancellor.

In 1887, the Rev. S. S. Nelles, D.D., LL.D., died, and the Rev. N. Burwash, S.T.D., was appointed President and Chancellor.

Under the provisions of the present charter the following colleges are affiliated in Arts with Victoria University: Albert College, Belleville; the Wesleyan Ladies' College, Hamilton; the Ontario Ladies' College, Whitby; Alma College, St. Thomas.

On the twelfth of November, A.D. 1890, under the provisions of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, chap. 230, and the Acts amending the same, Victoria University was by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor federated with the University of Toronto.

Arts become members of the Senate of the University of Toronto.

Five hundred and seventy-six graduates of Victoria University have been admitted to the standing and privileges of the degree of B.A., two hundred and twenty-five to those of M.A.; nine hundred and seventeen to those of M.D.; eighty-six to those of LL.B.; and twenty-nine to those of LL.D.

On the first of October, 1892, it is expected that the Faculty of Victoria University will occupy their new buildings in the Queen's Park, Toronto, and the federation of the Universities, be practically consummated. The curriculum in Arts for all students of Victoria University will be that prescribed by the Senate of the University of Toronto. The Faculty of Arts in Victoria University will provide instruction in all subjects assigned by the Federation Act to University College. In other subjects the students of Victoria University will attend the lectures and laboratory practice of the University of Toronto.

SECTION I.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

All students are expected to attend the public worship of God on the Lord's Day, at such churches as their parents or guardians may prefer. Morning prayers will also be held daily in the Chapel at which all students are expected to be present.

Other religious services will be held at suitable times, to which all students are cordially invited.

SECTION II.

RESIDENCE.

It is expected that a residence constructed upon approved modern principles, and affording healthful and comfortable accommodation for one hundred students will shortly be erected on the Victoria University grounds in the Queen's Park. In the meantime, carefully selected boarding houses will be licensed in which board and rooms may be obtained at prices varying from \$3 to \$5 a week.

## SECTION IV.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. Students are admitted to registration in the Faculty of Arts on having passed the Matriculation examination prescribed by the University of Toronto, or on giving the Faculty satisfactory evidence of their ability to pursue the courses of study proposed.

2. All students are required to observe the general regulations of University of Toronto and of Victoria University in regard to attendance on lectures and examinations.

3. Students are required to board in such houses as are licensed by the faculty, except students residing with their parents, or with friends designated by their parents or guardians.

## SECTION V.

## EXAMINATIONS.

All students of Victoria University desiring to take the examinations in Arts or the final examinations for the degree of B.A., will present themselves at the annual examinations of the University of Toronto. Such students are required to conform to all the general regulations prescribed by the Senate.

At the end of the second year, and also of the third year, students will present themselves for examinations in Victoria University, and at the examinations of the University Faculty in all subjects on which they have attended the lectures of that faculty.

Certificates of having passed these examinations will be issued to all students whose papers are satisfactory to the Board of Examiners on presentation of which they may be admitted to advanced standing in the University of Toronto.

## SECTION VI.

## SCHOLARSHIPS, MEDALS AND PRIZES.

All scholarships and prizes of the University of Toronto are open to students of Victoria University on the general terms prescribed on p. 56, etc. This includes exemption from fees in Victoria as in University College.

In the class the leading characteristics of these authors, their connection with one another and with their time will be exemplified by lectures and by the study of selected works. It will be impossible to read in class all the works mentioned above, but the lecturer will assume that the students have, in private, made themselves familiar with the specified selections.

The work in the class will be devoted chiefly to the study of the selections mentioned above; there will be occasional lectures on the general tendencies of literature during the period.

In addition the class will have one or two sessions a week devoted to seminary work, when essays (required, according to the new regulations of the University, from candidates for honors) on topics connected with the course will be read and discussed, and when, also, a critical study of *Cymbeline* will be made by the members of the class in succession.

§ 16.

#### BIOLOGY.

The lectures and practical instruction in this subject are given in the University Biological Department.

The following arrangements will be in force for 1892-93 :—

1. A course of elementary lectures on Biology will be given three days a week to prepare candidates for the University examination of the first year.

2. A course of lessons involving 100 hours instruction given in connection with the above course of lectures for students entering the Honour Department of Natural Sciences. A Laboratory supply fee of \$2 will be charged to members of the practical class for the use of microscope and material for study. But each member will be required to provide himself with a case of instruments and an engraver's lens, both of approved patterns.

3. In addition to attending the course of lectures under sec. 1, candidates for Second year honor examinations will attend a special course on the Zoology of the vertebrata during the Michaelmas Term, and a series of demonstrations on selected topics in Physiology during Easter Term.

4. The practical course for honor students of the Second year will be devoted to the study of typical forms of plants and animals, such

as are treated of in *Huxley and Martin's Elementary Practical Biology*, new edition. There will also be opportunities for the study of the Canadian vertebrate fauna (Text-book *Jordan's American Vertebrates*), but the student is expected to have familiarized himself with the Canadian flora during the preceding long vacation. (For reference, *Spotton's Canadian Flora*, or *Gray's Manual*).

5. Honor students of the Third year will study the Zoology of the Invertebrata three days a week during the Michaelmas and part of the Easter Terms, and during the remainder of the Easter Term, Cryptogamic Botany and Vegetable Physiology.

## POLITICAL ECONOMY.

## FIRST YEAR. (SECOND YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

## ELEMENTARY ECONOMICS.

*Subject of examination:* The elements of Political Economy: Value, Price, Wages, Interest, Profits, Rent.

*Lectures:* The lectures in this course will give a general introduction to modern Political Economy, and are intended to assist both the honour students of the second year in Political Science, and the pass students of the fourth year. While, for the sake of the pass students and of those who cannot take a later course in the subject, the lectures will deal in outline with all the main subjects usually included under the head of Political Economy, the honor students are requested to give their chief attention to the subjects specified above.

The lectures will deal with the following topics among others: The Use of Text-books; Definition and Division of the subject; Wealth; *Production*:—Labour, Causes of Increase in Productivity; Supply of Labour; Land, Law of Diminishing Returns; Capital, Definition and Division; Function of Capital in Relation to Labour; *Distribution*:—Assumptions; Number of Shares; Parenthesis on Supply and Demand; Agricultural Rent, Statement and Criticism of Ricardo's Doctrine; House-rent; Interest and its Causes; Profits and their Analysis; Wages; Criticism of various Wage Doctrines—Iron Law, Wage Fund, Residual Claimant, Share of Product; Organisation of Labour; Excursus on Co-operation, Productive and Distributive; *Exchange*:—Value; Money; Fluctuations in Prices; Gresham's Law; Bimetallism; Paper Money; Foreign Trade; Balance of Trade; Protection and Free Trade; Functions of Government; Methods of Governmental Action; Taxation, Direct and Indirect.

*Books recommended:* The chief text-book will be that of Symes. For the application of Economics to the practical life of the time Ely's *Introduction* will be found interesting. Among other manuals which the student would do well occasionally to consult are those of Cannan, Gide, Walker and Andrews.

## SECOND YEAR. (THIRD YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

## HISTORY AND CRITICISM OF ECONOMIC THEORY.

For examination students are required to give special attention to (i) Adam Smith, *Wealth of Nations*, Bk. I, chap. 10, part 2; Bk. IV, chaps. 1, 2, 3, part 2; chap. 7. (ii) Malthus, *Essay on Population*, Bk. I, chaps. 1, 2. (iii) Ricardo, *Principles of Political Economy*, chaps. 1-6. (iv) List, *National System of Political Economy* (trans. Sampson Lloyd), chaps. 10, 11, 12.

The *Lectures* : will follow in chronological order the development of Economic Theory down to the present time. They will deal with the following topics among others : The Economic Ideas of Plato and Aristotle ; the Influence of Roman Law ; the Teaching of the Mediæval Church as to Usury and Just Price, with special regard to Aquinas ; the Genesis of Modern Conceptions ; the Doctrine of Interest ; Balance of Bargain and Balance of Trade ; Earlier and Later Mercantilism ; Mun ; Child ; Petty ; the Physiocrats, Quesnay ; David Eume ; Adam Smith—his Relation to later economists, his Method and Assumptions ; Freedom of Industry and Trade ; Malthus—his doctrine of population in its earlier and later forms ; Ricardo—his Doctrines of Value, Rent, Wages, Profits, List and Nationality ; John Stuart Mill ; the Historical School ; State Socialism ; Jevons and the Austrian School.

*Books recommended* : The chief text-book will be Ingram's *History of Political Economy*. Students are also requested to read Ashley, *Economic History*, Preface and §§ 15-17, 20-23, and Tynbee, *Ricardo and the Old Political Economy in The Industrial Revolution*. The following books will also be useful : Cliffe Leslie, *Essays* (especially those on Adam Smith, and German Political Economy) ; Bagehot, *Adam Smith as a Person* (in *Biographical Studies*), and *Essays on Adam Smith, Malthus, and Ricardo* (in *Economic Studies*) ; Bonar, *Malthus and his Work*, Bk. ## THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

## ECONOMICAL HISTORY.

The *Lectures* will trace economic history from the early middle ages down to modern times, with especial reference to England. They will deal with the following topics among others: The History and Constitution of the Manor and its relation to Medieval Husbandry; Medieval Trade and the Gilds Merchant; Medieval Industry and the Craft Gilds; Medieval Foreign Trade—the Teutonic Hanse, the Staple and the Merchant Adventurers; the Domestic System of Industry; Tudor Legislation; the Trading Companies of the 16th and 17th centuries; the Enclosures of the 16th and 18th centuries; the Elizabethan Poor Law and its subsequent history; the Beginnings of Modern Finance; the Industrial Revolution and the rise of the Factory System; Poor Law Reform; Factory Legislation; the Organization of Labour and Capital; National Insurance in Germany.

*Books recommended* The chief text-books will be Ashley, *Economic History*, chaps. 1, 2; Tonybee, *The Industrial Revolution*. ## PUBLIC FINANCE.

The *Lectures* will deal with National and Local Finance, and with important questions of modern economic policy from a financial standpoint. They will discuss, among other topics: the History of Public Finance and of Financial Science; the Currency and Banking

System of Canada, Great Britain and the United States; Public Debts and the Policy of National and Local Governments in relation to them; Methods of Extinction of Debt, Sinking Funds; Public Domain—Lands, Forests, Minerals; Railroad Policy, its history in Europe and America; Postal Service; Municipal Monopolies; Business Licenses; Taxation; Repercussion of Taxation; Ethics of Taxation: Direct and Indirect Taxation; Tariff Policy—outline of its history in Great Britain, Canada and the United States; Local Taxation in Canada and the United States.

*Books recommended:* The most useful books for this course are Cossa, *Taxation*; Dunbar, *Theory and History of Banking*; Walker, *Money, Trade and Industry*; Adams, *Public Debts*; Ely, *Taxation*; Hadley, *Railroad Transportation*. Among the works which it will be advantageous to consult are Bagehot, *Lombard Street*; Jevons, *Money*; Leroy-Beaulieu, *Science des Finances*, Livre II, chaps. 4, 5, 9, 10; Giffen, *Essays in Finance*, 1st series, IX; Taussig, *Tariff History of United States*; Sinclair, *Municipal Monopolies* (University of Toronto Studies in Political Science, 1st series, II).

#### SEMINARY.

The seminary will meet weekly during the session of 1892-3 for the study of Public Finance, under the presidency of the Professor of Political Economy. All students of the Fourth year who are attending the lectures in Public Finance, and who are ready to take their share in the work of the Seminary, can attend its meetings. Each meeting will begin with the reading of an abstract of the papers presented the previous week; two essays will then be read on different sides or aspects of some particular problem; and these will be followed by a general discussion. A programme of essays will be drawn up at the beginning of the session, so that members will have adequate time for preparation. Attendance is strongly recommended; though the Professor in charge cannot engage that all the work will be directly useful for examination purposes.

## § 2.

## POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY.

## THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

*Subject of examination and lectures:* History and Criticism of Political Theories.

Candidates are expected to give special attention to (i) PLATO'S Republic, Bks. II and V. (in the translation of Jowett or Davies & Vaughan); (ii) ARISTOTLE'S Politics, Bk. I, Bk. II up to chap. 6, Bk. III, Bk. V (in the translation of Jowett or Weldon); (iii) HOBBS, Leviathan, chaps. 17, 18; (iv) LOCKE, Two Treatises on Government, Bk. II; (v) ROUSSEAU, Contract Social; (vi) BURKE, Appeal from the New to the Old Whigs; (vii) BENTHAM, Fragment on Government; (viii) HERBERT SPENCER, Man v. The State; (ix) T. H. GREEN, Lectures on Political Obligation; Lectures A, M, N, in Philosophical Works, vol. II.

*Books recommended in addition to the specified texts:* Pollock, *History of the Science of Politics*; Ritchie, *Principles of State Interference*; Maine, *Ancient Law*.

## § 3.

## CONSTITUTIONAL HISTORY.

## FIRST YEAR. (SECOND YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

## ENGLISH CONSTITUTIONAL HISTORY.

*Lectures:* The lectures in this course are intended to assist both the honor students of the second year in Political Science, and the pass students of the third year. They will deal with the following topics among others: The Hundred and County Courts; the Witenagemot; the Feudal System; the Angevin Administrative Machinery; the System of Estates; the Growth of Parliament; the History of Taxation; Lancastrian Constitutionalism; the Yorkist and Tudor Strong Government; the Rule of the Council; the Struggle between the Stuarts and Parliament; the Growth of the Cabinet; Responsible Government; George III and the Whigs; the Reform Bills; Modern Forces and Modern Practice.

Honor students are required to show at the examination a textual knowledge of the following documents: *Assize of Clarendon*, *Magna Charta*, *Parliamentary Writs of 1295*, *Petition of Right*, *Habeas Corpus Act*, *Bills of Rights*, *Act of Settlement*, (Stubbs' *Select Charters*).

*Books recommended*: Taswell-Langmead, *English Constitutional History*; Bagehot, *English Constitution*; Wakeman & Hassall, *Constitutional Essays*, (omitting Essay 1); Introduction to Stubbs' *Select Charters*.

#### CANADIAN CONSTITUTIONAL HISTORY.

The lectures will deal with the following topics, among others: Character of French Settlement; Nature of European Claims to Territory; Government by Trading Companies; Excursus on Nature and Growth of Provincial Administrative System of France; Growth of Rule by Colonial Policy as distinguished from Trading Company Policy; Displacement of Trading Company Policy; Formal Establishment of Provincial Organization in 1663; Condition and Population at this time; the Sovereign Council; Growth of the Superior Council; Local Government; Land Tenures; Church and State; the Conquest; Rights Guaranteed the French at Capitulation; Treaty of Paris; Proclamation of 1763; Constitutional position of English Colony at this time; Growth of English Colonial Policy, — copied from Counties Palatine; Quebec Act; its Policy; Administration of Justice; Constitutional Act; Struggle for Responsible Government; Growth of Parties in Upper and Lower Canada; Lord Durham's Report; Union Act; Colonial Policy of Lord John Russell and Earl Grey: Policy of Sydenham, Metcalfe, and Elgin; Clergy Reserves; Growth of Responsible Government in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick; Quebec Conference and Resolutions; Confederation; Relation of Dominion and of various Provinces to Great Britain; Relation of Provinces to Dominion; Comparison of B. N. A. Act with Constitutions of United States and of England; Growth of Local Government in Ontario.

N.B.—Two or three lectures of this course will be occupied with the British North America Act, and will be arranged so as to assist the Pass students of the Fourth year in the Faculty of Arts. They will be announced a week beforehand.

## § 4.

## THE HISTORY OF ENGLISH LAW.

## SECOND YEAR. (THIRD YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

In tracing the history of the English law an attempt is made to ascertain its condition from the Roman Conquest until the Norman Conquest; to discover if any of the original Celtic or Druidical laws continued in force during the Roman occupation; and to what extent, if at all, the Roman law continued after the Saxon invasions; and what were the laws of the Confessor so much cherished after the Norman Conquest by the conquered race.

The change effected in the law, especially of real property, by the Conqueror and his successors,—the introduction or extension of the feudal system,—the special difference between that system as existing on the continent and in England,—the creation of new tenures,—the great charter and its frequent renewals as showing the condition of the people, and the evils to be remedied.

The great changes effected by the legislation of Edward I and Edward III. The creation of entailed estates,—the long struggle to obtain power to alienate them and its final success. The legislation to restrict alienations in mortmain,—the continuous and skilful means taken to evade the law, and their final defeat. The law giving power to devise lands, and the legislation of Elizabeth to prevent frauds upon creditors and purchasers. The abolition of feudal tenures by Charles II, and the laws of his reign for the prevention of frauds and perjuries—for the distribution of intestates, personal estates—and in favour of liberty by rendering the remedy by *Habeas Corpus* more effective. The efforts in the reign of George III to ameliorate the criminal law, and the English Statutes after 1792 that have their counterpart in our Colonial legislation are discussed and explained.

*Books recommended:* Reeve's History of English Law; Hale's History of English Law; Blackstone's Commentaries. Consult also a collection of English Statutes, and the Revised Statutes of Canada, and of Ontario.

## § 5.

## ROMAN LAW.

## SECOND YEAR. (THIRD YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

The lectures on Roman Private Law comprise a rapid sketch of the history of the law from the time of the decemviri to the death of Justinian; giving an account of the growth of the unwritten law; of judicial legislation to the suppression of the formulary system by Diocletian, and from that time to the death of Justinian; and treating of the statutory legislation during the Republic and under the Empire; and of the several attempts to form a code, finally terminated by the work of Justinian.

The larger number of lectures is devoted to the substance of Roman Law during the reign of Justinian; embracing a description of the persons and things recognized by the law; and as to the creation, extinction, and exercise of rights, and to the performance of duties; as to the rights of ownership, and the qualification of them; as to the modes of acquiring ownership, and the modes of protecting it. The nature and objects of obligations, the parties to them, and the extinction of obligations by fulfilment or otherwise are discussed. The constitution of the Roman Family is explained, and the laws applicable to its different members, as husband and wife, parents, children, and slaves, are noticed and commented on. The offices of guardians and trustees, and the rights, duties, responsibilities, and liabilities of guardians and trustees are stated and explained.

The rules of succession to an intestate, the selection of an heir in such case by operation of law, and the changes in the law at different periods, ending in the final legislation of Justinian, are stated and explained. The law of testamentary succession, the various kinds of wills, the duties of the heir, the gift of legacies, and the history of trust gifts and codicils are explained.

The remedial processes for the protection and enforcement of rights are traced from the *legis actiones*, the changes effected by the formulary system, the summary jurisdiction of the prætor, the abolition of the formulary system, terminating in the *extraordinaria cognitio*. The system of judicial administration in the time of Justinian, and the progress of a suit in his time are explained.

The series is closed by a discussion of the law as to specific performance of contracts ; of the law as to frauds upon creditors ; and an examination of the influence of Christianity upon Roman legislation.

*Books recommended :* Muirhead's Historical Introduction to the Private Law of Rome ; Sandars' Justinian ; Institutes of Gaius, translated by Muirhead. The Digest, the Code, and the Novels should also be consulted.

§ 6.

JURISPRUDENCE

THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

In lecturing on this subject the attention of the student is directed to the definition and analysis of *law* and of *rights*,—to the sources of law,—to the classification of rights,—to the consideration of antecedent rights *in rem* and *in personam*, and to remedial rights, and to adjective private law,—to the nature of public law and its various divisions,—to international law, and to the application of law.

*Books recommended :* Holland, Elements of Jurisprudence ; Austin, Elements of Jurisprudence (Campbell's Students' edition) ; Maine, Ancient Law ; Maine, Early History of Institutions, Lectures XII, XIII.

§ 7.

THE ENGLISH LAW OF CONTRACTS.

THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

A course of lectures will be given on the English Law of Contracts. Reference will be made, as occasion requires, to the Statutes of Ontario, and to cases decided in the Courts of Ontario, as well as to English Statutes and to cases in the English Courts.

*Books of Reference :*

Anson's Law of Contracts.

The Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1887, and the Statutes of subsequent years.

The Law of Contracts is an alternative to the Ethnology of the Fourth year in Arts (Third in Law) and is a necessary part of the LL.B. course.

§ 8.

CONSTITUTIONAL LAW.

ENGLISH CONSTITUTIONAL LAW.

SECOND YEAR.<sup>1</sup> (THIRD YEAR IN FACULTY OF ARTS.)

The lectures on this subject comprise a discussion of the Royal Prerogatives; the constitution and functions of the two Houses of Parliament, the constitution of the different departments of executive government; the rise of the cabinet and its relation to the Crown and the two Houses of Parliament; the military forces of the Crown and their subordination to the Civil Government, the constitution of the judicial department of government and its relation to the Crown and to Parliament, and the rights and obligations of the subject, including the naturalization of aliens; the leading cases, the constitutional statutes, and the conventions of the constitution are discussed.

*Books recommended* :—Dicey, *Law of the Constitution*; Hearne, *Government of England*; Traill, *Central Government*; Boutmy, *Studies in Constitutional Law, Part I.*; Broom, *Constitutional Law.*

---

COLONIAL CONSTITUTIONAL LAW.

The lectures on this subject trace the sources of Colonial Constitutional Law; The prerogatives of the Crown in the constitution of colonial governments; different forms of government; colonies by occupancy; colonies by cession and conquest; powers of parliament in respect to the colonies; conventional limitations arising from local self-government.

*Books recommended* : Creasy, *Constitution of the British Empire*; Forsyth, *Cases and Opinions on Constitutional Law*; Todd, *Parliamentary Government in the Colonies, as far as page 318*; Tarring, *Law in Relation to the Colonies.*

## FEDERAL CONSTITUTIONAL LAW IN CANADA AND IN THE UNITED STATES

### THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN THE FACULTY OF ARTS.)

The lectures on this subject deal with the origin of the United States Constitution and the relation of the federal government to the States; the federal institutions, legislative and executive and Judicial, and the leading decisions of the Courts in reference to the same. The Constitution in Canada, in what respect it is similar in principle to that of the United Kingdom; and in what respect similar to that of the United States; rules of interpretation applied by the Supreme Court of the United States; rules of interpretation applied by the Judicial Committee in construing the Constitution in Canada.

*Books recommended:* Houston, Constitutional Documents of Canada; Todd, Parliamentary Government in the Colonies, page 318 to the end of the volume; O'Sullivan, Government of Canada or Munroe, Constitution of Canada; Cartwright's Decisions on the B.N.A. Act; Cooley, Principles of Constitutional Law in the United States; Pomery, Constitutional Law; Boutny, Constitutional Law, Part II and III.

### § 9.

## INTERNATIONAL LAW.

### THIRD YEAR. (FOURTH YEAR IN ARTS.)

Besides the elementary principles of International Law, the lectures comprise a discussion of the growth of International Law, its sources, and the characteristics which distinguish it from international morality. Also a discussion of the doctrine of nonintervention, of the Monroe Doctrine, and of the various treaties and conventions relating to Canada. Controversies raised by the Civil War in the United States. The Geneva Arbitration and the rights of neutrals.

*Books recommended:* Wheaton's International Law, Boyd's edition; Hall's International Law, or Kent's International Law, Abdy's edition.

## PRIVATE INTERNATIONAL LAW.

Lectures comprise Person, Domicile, Marriage, Divorce and Legitimacy, Contracts, Torts, Bankruptcy, Succession and Distribution, Property, Foreign Judgments.

*Books recommended* : Westlake, Private International Law ; Foote's Private International Law, or Guthrie's Von Savigny, and Nelson's Selected Cases illustrative of the principles of Private International Law.

(For subject of Ethnology in Third year see 110.)

The subjects of examination in the Fourth year are as follows :

Graduates in the Faculties of Arts or Medicine are allowed to substitute for the requirements in the first, second and third years, an examination in the following subjects :—

3. The Law of Contracts.
4. General Jurisprudence.
5. English and Colonial Constitutional Law.
6. Federal Constitutional Law.
7. International Law.

8. Political Economy (either the examination in the elementary Political Economy of the second year in the Political Science course or that of the fourth year in the Pass course), unless they have already passed one of these examinations as part of their B.A. course, in which case they shall pass the examination in English Constitutional History of the second year in the Political Science course.

Graduates availing themselves of this alternative are allowed to divide the work here prescribed, taking a portion in one year and the residue in a subsequent year.

Graduates availing themselves of this second alternative are not permitted to proceed to any part of the examination in the fourth year in Law, unless they have already passed in a previous year or in previous years, the examination in at least five out of the eight subjects here prescribed.

**ANATOMY.***Professor* : J. H. RICHARDSON.*Associate-Professor and Demonstrator* : A. PRIMROSE.*Lecturer* : H. W. AIKINS.*Assistant-Demonstrators* : G. A. FÉRÉ, W. B. THISTLE,

Lectures:—A course of lectures will be given in the Biological Department for students of the first and second years : in this course the structure of the human body will be described in a systematic manner ; the various organs of the body will be examined with their more important relations and connections. In order that the course may be more comprehensive certain principles in general morphology and development will be elucidated. The lectures will be illustrated by recent dissections, by wet and dry preparations and by drawings and diagrams.

Tutorial instruction will be given to limited classes for the purpose of studying osteology, and for demonstration of the central nervous system and special sense organs.

A course of lectures will be given at the University Medical building, on Gerrard street, for students of the third and fourth years. This course will consist of a systematic study of the regional anatomy of the human body as applied in the practice of medicine and surgery. The lectures will be illustrated by suitable preparations and a series of demonstrations of landmarks will be conducted on the living subject.

Demonstrations :—A series of demonstrations will be conducted daily for students of the second year. In this class the main facts in gross human anatomy will be demonstrated from recent dissections.

Dissection :—The dissecting-room will be open daily from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday. Students will be required to conduct their work in a systematic fashion and to conform to the regulations in force in the dissecting-room. One or more of the Assistant-Demonstrators will be in attendance at all times for the purpose of superintending the work of the students, and for giving instruction. Examinations will be conducted from time to time on the parts dissected and marks allotted for the work done.

A pamphlet will be issued containing directions for the guidance of students of the class of anatomy, with the regulations for the dissecting-room. This should be procured by all students enrolled in the anatomical department.

SURGERY.

*Professor of Surgery* : W. T. AIKINS.

*Professors of Clinical Surgery* : { L. MCFARLANE.  
I. H. CAMERON.

*Associate-Professor of Surgery and*

*Clinical Surgery* : . . . . . GEORGE A. PETERS.

A course of lectures will be devoted to a consideration of the principles involved in the practice of surgery, and the commoner forms of surgical injuries and diseases will be discussed in all their aspects. The lectures will be illustrated by plates and specimens from the museum, and by operations on the cadaver.

A course of clinical instruction will be conducted at the Toronto General Hospital, and will include : I. A series of clinical lectures delivered in the large theatre ; and II. Bed-side instruction in the wards. Special attention will be paid to the consideration of surgical diseases and injuries at the bedside of the patients ; the symptoms and diagnosis will be discussed, and appropriate treatment suggested and, as far as possible, carried out in the presence of the students. The surgical dressers are required to do a large share of the work in applying suitable dressings, reducing fractures, etc.

PATHOLOGY.

*Professor* : JOHN CAVEN.

*Demonstrator* : GEO. ACHESON.

The course will embrace lectures on general and special pathology, surgical and medical ; together with demonstrations in both gross morbid anatomy, and pathological histology. The lectures to the third year will be mainly upon general pathology, and those to the fourth year upon special

pathology. Gross demonstrations will be so arranged that students of both years may attend. The course will also embrace lectures and demonstrations in bacteriology; for which the new laboratory affords all facilities.

---

MEDICINE.

*Professor of Medicine and Clinical Medicine:* J. E. GRAHAM.

*Lecturer in Clinical Medicine:* W. P. CAVEN.

The subjects of medicine and clinical medicine being under the same teachers, every possible effort will be made to combine the work of the lecture-room with the clinical work in the wards of the hospital, so as to illustrate, as far as possible, the lectures by observations and discussions of cases at the bedside.

In the lectures, all the internal diseases met with in this country will be discussed, and every opportunity taken to demonstrate them in the wards. Their pathological anatomy will be demonstrated by morbid specimens from the University museum, as well as by fresh material furnished by the pathologist from the *post mortem* room.

In the hospital work, both third and fourth year students will be taken daily into the wards, where instruction will be given to classes at the bedside and each student required to take part in the examination of the patients.

Students will act as clinical clerks, and will be required to keep accurate and complete histories, which will from time to time be criticised before the class. Fourth year students will be called upon to examine all new patients before the class, and to interpret the significance of the conditions found.

Small classes will be formed of the junior students for the study of the methods of examination and the interpretation of symptoms, the utmost care being taken to develop accuracy of observation and of interpretation.

#### PHARMACOLOGY AND THERAPEUTICS.

*Professor of Pharmacology and*

*Therapeutics*: ..... J. M. MACCALLUM.

*Demonstrator of Materia Medica*

*and Elementary Therapeutics*: O. R. AVISON.

Pharmacy and therapeutics includes the course in the following, among other special topics: 1. The physiological action of drugs (or pharmacology), therapeutical uses and modes of administering remedies; 2. Food and drink, considered generally and in reference to disease; 3. Heat and cold; 4. Electricity; 5. Massage.

The following subjects will be included in the course of materia medica and pharmacy:

1. The physical characters of drugs. Provision will be made for all students of the class to secure a complete set of specimens.

2. Other information concerning drugs of interest or value, as

- (a) The nature and percentage of their medicinal constituents, and their solubility in various menstrua.
- (b) Their general medicinal properties, and the ordinary and poisonous doses.
- (c) The various pharmaceutical forms in which they are usually kept for dispensing purposes.

3. Such a consideration of pharmacy as will enable the student to form a correct judgment of the value of the many forms in which medicines are prepared for dispensing.

This will require a discussion of the general principles of pharmacy, the comparative values of the various solving menstrua and the effect upon drugs of the different pharmaceutical methods used.

4. Instruction in the art of prescribing, indicating the means of ensuring that mixtures may be therapeutically effective, free from incompatibility, and pleasing to the eye and taste.

---

#### GYNÆCOLOGY AND OBSTETRICS.

*Professor of Gynæcology:* UZZIEL OGDEN.

*Professor of Obstetrics:* A. H. WRIGHT.

As such very ample means are now furnished in other departments for the study of the anatomy, physiology and pathology of the parts concerned, the Professor of Gynæcology will devote his time altogether to the various methods of examination and diagnosis; the use and application of instruments; and the symptoms, diagnosis and treatment of diseases peculiar to women.

The disorders of menstruation, leucorrhœa, chlorosis, parametritis and perimetritis, tumors and displacements of the uterus, diseases and displacements of the ovaries, lacerations of the cervix uteri and perineum, and abdominal surgery will be treated of and illustrated by large plates, casts and morbid specimens in the didactic course, while operative gynæcology will be fully demonstrated by the Professor in his clinic in the Toronto General Hospital.

The course in the science and art of obstetrics will consist of lectures and recitations. It will be illustrated by diagrams and operations on the phantom. Special attention will be paid to the emergencies of obstetric practice.

---

OPHTHALMOLOGY, OTOLOGY, LARYNGOLOGY AND  
RHINOLOGY.

*Professor of Ophthalmology and Otology:* R. A. REEVE.

*Clinical Lecturer in Ophthalmology  
and Otology:* ..... G. H. BURNHAM.

*Clinical Lecturer in Laryngology  
and Rhinology:* ..... G. R. McDONAGH.

In addition to a short course of didactic lectures on diseases of the eye and ear at the College, practical instruction will be given four times in the week at the clinics at the Provincial (Mercer) Eye and Ear Infirmary, Toronto General Hospital.

In the department of laryngology and rhinology, a course of practical lectures on the commoner forms of disease of the throat and nose will be given and, where possible, illustrated by cases.

---

HYGIENE.

*Professor:* WM. OLDRIGHT.

The student is recommended to obtain from one of the works mentioned in the list of "text books," an elementary knowledge of the subject of each next succeeding lecture. The information thus obtained will be supplemented in the lectures, and fuller consideration will be given to those points

which require special attention on account of differences of climate, population, occupations, social and political organization, and other circumstances in Canada. Students will also be guided in regard to sources of information and current literature relating to health work in this country.

In addition to the theoretical teaching, practical demonstrations will be given by means of various instruments, and the following subjects will be embraced in the course: air, impurities and their effects, ventilation and heating; hygienic architecture; climatology; sewerage and disposal of refuse; water supplies; foods, dietaries, adulterations; occupations; exercise and overwork; clothing; baths; contagion and infection, management of epidemics, quarantine; duties and functions of medical health officers and boards of health; vital statistics; sanitary legislation,—federal, provincial, and municipal.

#### TOXICOLOGY.

*Lecturer:* W. H. ELLIS.

A series of lectures and demonstrations on the subject of toxicology will be included in the work of the class of practical chemistry.

---

#### MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE.

*Medical Lecturer:* BERTRAM SPENCER.

*Legal Lecturer:* HON. DAVID MILLS.

The course will embrace the discussion of the following subjects in their medico-legal aspects:—

Reports and written opinions; expert evidence.

The identity of the person—living and dead.

Death; its causes, signs, and period of occurrence. Apparent death; autopsy; exhumation.

Injuries to the person,—in connection with which will be considered wounds and other external injuries; blood-stains; suffocation, hanging and strangling; drowning and starvation.

Offences against chastity, including rape, concealment of pregnancy, criminal abortion and infanticide.

Live birth, legitimacy, congenital defects and feigned diseases.

Suicide.

Nuisances; arson; forgery.

#### MEDICAL PSYCHOLOGY.

*Extra-Mural Professor:* DANIEL CLARK.

The course of lectures will be chiefly clinical, and given at the Asylum. The subjects discussed will be of a practical nature as far as possible, and may be classified as follows:—

- 1st. Definitions and errors arising therefrom.
  - 2nd. The brain and its exceptional construction and functions.
  - 3rd. The brain as an organ of the mind.
  - 4th. Sanity and insanity in their relation to one another.
  - 5th. Different forms of insanity, illustrated by patients.
  - 6th. The moral treatment of the insane.
  - 7th. The medical treatment of the insane in the various forms of their disease.

THE FOLLOWING CLASSES OF THE ARTS FACULTY OF THE UNIVERSITY WILL BE ATTENDED BY STUDENTS OF MEDICINE:—

BIOLOGY AND PHYSIOLOGY.

*Professor of Biology:* R. RAMSAY WRIGHT.

*Professor of Physiology:* A. B. MACALLUM.

*Assistant-Demonstrator in Biology:*

1. Students of the First year will attend a course of lectures on general biology and elementary physiology, to be given three days a week throughout the session.

2. A practical course, of fifty hours' duration, illustrating the above and serving as an introduction to the use of the microscope, will be conducted by the Assistant Demonstrator under the supervision of the Professor of Biology. A supply fee of \$1.50, covering the use of a microscope and the necessary materials for study, is to be paid in advance to the Registrar.

During the Easter term there will be given a series of thirty lectures and demonstrations on special topics in physiology.

3. The students of the Second year will attend throughout the session a course of lectures and demonstrations in advanced physiology. The demonstrations, which will cover such a wide range of the subject as the largely increased number and variety of the instruments at the command of the department will permit, will be specially illustrative of the points advanced in the lectures. Arrangements will also be made for holding, during the session, weekly class reviews on the subject matter of the lectures.

4. The instruction in embryology and histology will consist of twenty lectures during the Michaelmas term, and a practical course involving fifty hours' work in the laboratory.

The latter will be conducted by the Assistant-Demonstrator, and the student will have the opportunity of providing himself with a set of fifty typical illustrative preparations, as well as of becoming acquainted with the methods of histology. The supply fee for this class, including the use of microscope, reagents, etc., is \$2.75, and is payable in advance to the Registrar.

---

CHEMISTRY.

*Professor* : W. H. PIKE.

*Lecturer* : W. H. ELLIS.

*Demonstrator* : W. L. MILLER.

The students of the first year attend the lectures of the professor of chemistry. A second course of lectures on organic chemistry is given to students of the second year.

The instruction given in practical chemistry includes : a systematic course of laboratory work in qualitative chemical analysis ; the practical examination in the laboratory of the more important and commonly occurring constituents of the animal body and of the secretions, and a series of lectures and demonstrations on the application of chemistry to toxicology, sanitary science and clinical medicine. A supply fee of \$3.00 is to be paid in advance each year to the Registrar.

PHYSICS.

*Professor* : JAMES LOUDON.

*Lecturer* : C. A. CHANT.

An introductory course of experimental lectures on physics will be given to students of chemistry, of natural sciences, and of medicine.

Tickets of admission to any of the courses of lectures or practical instruction shall be issued by the Registrar of the University on payment of the fees for such courses, and the attendance of the students at such courses must be certified on the backs of such tickets by the professors, lecturers, demonstrators or instructors, before such tickets shall be received by the Registrar as entitling the possessors to proceed to examination.

All fees shall be payable on or before the first of November of each year, and thereupon the Secretary shall enroll as students of the Faculty all who have paid the prescribed fees.

Matriculated students or graduates in the Faculty of Arts, who have attended during the Arts course any course of lectures or of practical instruction of the character, and duration required by the curriculum in medicine, may obtain certified tickets for the same from the Registrar of the University on payment of the ordinary fees demanded for students in medicine.

Matriculated students or graduates in Arts in the department of Natural Science who have taken honors in any examination in the Faculty of Arts which is or shall be held equivalent by the Senate to any of the examinations prescribed in the medical curriculum, may

obtain tickets for the qualifying classes attended by them without the payment of the corresponding fees.

Certificates of attendance on such lectures or demonstrations shall only be given on the presentation of such tickets.

All the patients in the hospital are, as a rule, suffering from acute medical and surgical diseases; the chronic cases are generally sent to the Home for Incurables or House of Providence, and the convalescent patients are sent to the new Convalescent Home, recently erected on Wells' Hill.

#### CLINICAL TEACHING.

Clinical instruction is given in the various departments of the hospital on all classes of patients.

I. *Theatre Lectures*:—Clinical Lectures are given daily, over patients brought from the wards to the large theatre, by the professors of clinical medicine and of clinical surgery to the students of the Third and Fourth years.

#### II. *Instructions in the Wards*:

(a) *Medicine and Surgery*:—A systematic course of bedside instruction is given to limited classes of students. Arrangements are such that each physician and surgeon or his assistant is in daily attendance for the purpose of imparting instruction at the bedside; by this means provision is made for continuous daily work in the ward, and students of both Third and Fourth years are required to avail themselves of it.

(b) *Gynæcology*:—Small classes of students receive instruction, in diseases peculiar to women in the pavilion specially devoted to the treatment of such patients. These classes meet twice a week.

(c) *Obstetrics*:—In the Burnside Lying-in-Hospital, in which there are over 150 births a year, final students are permitted to witness and assist in the conduct of *labors*. Students are also allowed to make engagements with out-patients and to attend them in confinements at their own homes.

(d) *Ophthalmology, otology, laryngology and rhinology*:—Diseases of the eye, ear, throat and nose are studied in the wards of the Andrew Mercer Infirmary.

III. *Surgical Operations*:—Surgical operations are performed in the large theatre on Saturday afternoons, or in cases of emergency at any time during the day or night when required. The theatre, which has been recently altered and enlarged, is capable of seating 600 students, and in the completeness of its arrangements is not excelled. The facilities afforded the students situated in all parts of the room for witnessing operations in all their details are unusually good.

IV. *Out-patient Clinics*.—The new addition to the hospital for the accommodation of out-patients affords ample facilities for instruction in the important class of diseases which here pass under observation. A physician and a surgeon are in attendance daily, and instruction is given on the patients. The cases presenting themselves in the special departments of the hospital devoted to disease of the eye, ear, etc., are available in the same manner. There will also be an out-door clinic in gynecology.

V. *Pathology* :

(a) *Autopsies* :—These are performed at stated hours by the Professor, or the Demonstrator of Pathology. The examinations are conducted in a systematic way, and instruction on the morbid conditions found, is imparted to the students. The bearings of the gross post-mortem appearances on the conditions previously found at the bedside, are carefully investigated, and, when necessary, arrangements are made for further examination, microscopical and chemical.

(b) The examination and analysis of the various fluids, excreta and pathological products of patients in the wards, are conducted in the University Hospital laboratory. Students are required to keep systematic records of the results obtained by these examinations.

CLINICAL CLERKS AND SURGICAL DRESSERS.

Clinical clerks and surgical dressers are appointed to act for limited periods. They are required to take complete histories of cases allotted to them, and receive certificates for the same as required by the Ontario Medical Council. Post-mortem clerks are appointed, and are required to make complete reports of all autopsies made in the post-mortem room, which is situated in the hospital grounds. Clinical clerks and surgical dressers are also appointed in the departments of gynecology, and ophthalmology, and otology.

RESIDENT ASSISTANTS IN THE HOSPITAL.

Four resident assistants are appointed annually from the graduates of medicine in the University, and hold their positions for one year. They will have full opportunities for acquiring experience in the general and special wards of the hospital, but during the session they will have charge under the physicians and surgeons in the general wards.

## REGULATIONS RELATING

TO THE

## EXAMINATIONS AND GRANTING OF DEGREES.

## DEGREE OF M.B.

There are two ordinary modes of proceeding to the Degree of M.B., viz., (1) by taking a Pass Course; or (2) by taking an Honor Course.

## ENTRANCE.

Candidates for a Degree must pass the Matriculation examination, unless (1) they possess a degree in Arts not being an Honorary Degree, from any Dominion or British University; or (2) have already matriculated in the Faculty of Arts or in the Faculty of Law in this University; or (3) have passed an examination entitling them to be registered as Matriculants in the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

Before presenting themselves for examination, candidates must produce satisfactory certificates of good conduct, and of having completed the sixteenth year of their age.

The ordinary annual Matriculation examinations (both pass and honor) will commence in the beginning of July.

Supplemental examinations for Matriculation will be held in the latter part of September, at which those who were rejected at the July examinations, as well as new candidates, may offer themselves; but no honors or scholarships will be awarded at such Supplemental examinations.

The fee for Matriculation is five dollars, and must be paid when the application for the examination is made, according to the regulations issued by the Education Department, under whose superintendence this examination is now conducted. The fee for registration of exemption from the Matriculation examination is five dollars.

Candidates may delay presenting themselves for the Matriculation examination until any time before the Final examination for the degree of M.B. ; but no candidate will be allowed to compete for relative standing, prizes, or scholarships, until he has passed the Matriculation examination.

Candidates intending to compete for scholarships are required to notify the Registrar of the University to that effect before June 1st, in addition to the application required to be made as above stated to the Education Department.

No fee will be charged for transferring from the Faculty of Arts to that of Medicine.

For subjects of examination at Junior Matriculation, pass and honor, see Appendix, p. 53.

#### REGULATIONS RELATING TO UNDERGRADUATES.

Undergraduates are required to attend lectures, and receive practical instruction during each of four years, at any of the Schools of Medicine recognized for this purpose by the University. The certificates of attendance upon lectures must mention the precise number of lectures given in each course, and must certify the attendance of the candidates at two-thirds of these at least. The certificates of practical instruction must certify that the candidate has diligently pursued the studies in question for the whole of the time required, and these must be signed by the teachers in the immediate charge of the laboratories where the instruction was obtained.

Each undergraduate, at the end of each of the four years of his course is required to present himself at the annual examination of that particular year, except in the case of those who elect to take Primary and Final examinations; and those so electing will not be allowed to compete for honors or scholarships.

The annual examinations are styled the First, Second, Third and Fourth examinations, and are to be passed in separate years in the order named. But candidates may, under special circumstances, be allowed to present themselves at the examination for M.B., or at any of the intermediate examinations, without having passed the preceding examination or examinations in the University.

Undergraduates below the standing of the Fourth year, who have been rejected or who have been prevented from attending the annual examinations by sickness, domestic affliction or other causes beyond their control, may present themselves for examination in September at the Supplemental examinations. Candidates of any year who have passed a creditable examination in the majority of the subjects required, may present themselves at the Supplemental examinations next ensuing, in the subjects in which they failed, and upon passing at such examinations shall be allowed their year. Candidates who failed to attend at the annual examinations must prove to the satisfaction of the Vice-Chancellor before presenting themselves in September, the existence and sufficiency of the alleged cause of absence. Candidates who were rejected must pay a fee of ten dollars, and those who did not attend, a fee of five dollars, before offering themselves for the Supplemental examination.

Graduates in Arts of the University may enter at the Second examination, but will be required to take such subjects of the First examination as they have not taken in their Arts course, though in these subjects they shall not be required to take an honor standing. (For list of equivalent examinations see page 165).

Undergraduates who elect to take the Primary and Final examinations, may take the Primary at the end of the Second or Third year, and the Final at the end of the Fourth year of their course. Graduates in Arts who elect to take the Primary and Final examinations may take the Primary at the end of the second year, and the Final at the end of the third year of their course.

No candidate will be allowed to pass any of the examinations who has not obtained at least one-half of the marks allotted to such examination. Nor will a candidate be considered as having passed in any individual subject who has not obtained at least one-third of the marks allotted to such subject.

The fee for each examination is five dollars, payable when the candidate notifies the Registrar of his intention to present himself.

Notice will be given annually, in January, of the days on which the examinations for the year will commence. Every undergraduate who proposes to present himself at an examination must send in to the Registrar a statement (according to a printed form which will be furnished) of the course he is taking, whether pass or honor, and such other particulars as the printed form may indicate, together with the original certificates referred to in this statement.

6. Of having attended twelve autopsies.

PRIMARY AND FINAL EXAMINATIONS.

The Certificates required for the Primary examination are the same as those required for First and Second examinations. The Certificates required for the Final examination are the same as those required for the Third and Fourth examinations.

ANNUAL EXAMINATIONS.

Candidates taking honors will be entitled to first class honors if they obtain seventy-five per cent. of the aggregate marks allotted to such examinations. Those who obtain sixty per cent. of the aggregate marks will be entitled to second class honors.

Extra papers on all pass subjects will be set for honor candidates.

Candidates who proceed to the degree of M.B., by taking the honor course will be grouped in two classes according to their success in the honor examinations. Only those candidates will receive their degrees with first class honors who have obtained first class honors in the Second, Third and Fourth examinations.

Undergraduates who have taken the First and Second examinations may transfer to the Primary and Final course, the First and Second examinations being considered equivalent to the Primary.

In addition to the mode heretofore provided whereby candidates may proceed to the degree of M. B., candidates may, under special circumstances, and on the recommendation of the committee on the Faculty of Medicine, be allowed to present themselves for examination for such degree or at any intermediate examination.

The committee shall have power to allow any applicant desirous of presenting himself for any of the examinations in the Faculty of Medicine (except the Final examination), any examination which he may have passed in any other University or School of Medicine, upon production of proper certificates showing his standing in such University or School of Medicine.

No undergraduate in the honor course, who shall have degraded into a lower year, shall be permitted at the next ensuing examination, to compete for medals, scholarships, or relative standing, except by special permission of the Senate, to be granted only in case of illness, or for other grave reasons.

Wherever possible, practical as well as written examinations will be required.

EQUIVALENT EXAMINATIONS.

Courses of lectures and examinations in the Faculty of Arts, in the department of Natural Sciences, are accepted in the place of courses and examinations in the Faculty of Medicine according to the following scheme :—

FACULTY OF ARTS.

1. Honor course and examination in Second Year Biology. } equivalent to { course and examination in First Year Physiology, and First Year and Primary Botany and Zoology.
2. Honor course and examination in Second Year Chemistry, and Pass Physics of the honor course in Natural Sciences. } equivalent to { course and examination in First Year and Primary Inorganic Chemistry and Natural Philosophy.
3. Honor course and examination in Third Year Chemistry. } equivalent to { course and examination in Second Year and Primary Chemistry (with the exception of Chemistry applied to Medicine).
4. Honor course and examination in Fourth Year Physiology and Normal Histology. } equivalent to { course and examination in Second Year and Primary Physiology and Normal History.
5. Attendance at the honor course in the Fourth Year Physiological Chemistry, in the Faculty of Arts, is equivalent to attendance at the course of Chemistry applied to Medicine of the Second Year in the Faculty of Medicine; but the examination in the latter subject must be taken.

N. B.—Candidates who desire to compete for scholarships and medals are required to submit to the annual examinations in all the subjects of each examination, though otherwise entitled to partial exemption according to the preceding scheme; and candidates not competing for scholarships or medals, who are entitled to exemption according to the preceding scheme, will hold the same rank in honors in these subjects as they obtained in the equivalent examinations in Arts.

## DEGREE OF M.D.

The following are requisites for admission to the degree of M.D., viz. :—Having been admitted to the degree of M.B., being of one year's standing from admission to the degree of M.B. and having composed an approved thesis upon some medical subject.

The writing of a thesis shall not be required of any candidate for the degree of M.D., provided that he shall have been engaged in the practice of Medicine for a period of three years; and any time spent in the post-graduate course at any British, foreign, or Canadian university shall be regarded as equivalent to time spent in the practice of Medicine.

## DEGREES "AD EUNDEM."

A graduate of any of the Universities in Great Britain or Ireland, if his degree be not an honorary one, may be admitted to the like degree in the University of Toronto. He must send in his certificate to the Registrar at least two weeks before the first meeting of the session of the Senate at which this application is to be brought forward. A graduate in Medicine of any University in Canada, residing in Canada, if his degree be not an honorary one, may be admitted to a like degree in the University of Toronto, if he have taken such a post-graduate or other course after receiving his degree as the Senate shall approve of, or have been engaged in active practice, for a period of not less than ten years.

Every student taking a scholarship is required to sign a declaration that it is his intention to pursue his medical studies for one, two, three, or four years, according to the year in which he has taken such scholarship, and to proceed to a degree in the University of Toronto, and that he is not an undergraduate or graduate in the Faculty of Medicine of any other University.

No scholarship will be awarded to any candidate who has not obtained first class honors in the examination for which it is conferred.

Each scholarship is tenable for one year only, but a scholar of one year is eligible for the scholarship of a succeeding year.

The scholarships or medals are not open to those who are at the same time undergraduates or graduates in Medicine of another University.

#### THE GEORGE BROWN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP IN MEDICAL SCIENCE.

Dr. A. H. F. Barbour, of Edinburgh, having signified his intention to place a sum of money at the disposal of the University of Toronto, for the purpose of founding a Scholarship in Medical Science in memory of the late Hon. George Brown, the following regulations have been adopted with regard thereto :—

This scholarship shall be called the George Brown Memorial Scholarship in Medical Science, and shall be awarded annually at the convocation for conferring degrees in medicine to the Bachelor of Medicine, who shall have distinguished himself most during his undergraduate course in the subjects of anatomy, biology, physiology and pathology.

The award shall be made by a committee composed of the Professors in these subjects, and of the examiners for the time being therein, who shall report as to the successful candidates, after having given due attention to the results of the annual examinations, and to the character of the work done by the candidates in the University laboratories.

The comparative value of the several subjects is to be estimated according to the following schedule :

1st year—Biology .....	200
Anatomy .....	100
Physiology .....	100
2nd year—Anatomy .....	200
Physiology .....	200
Histology .....	100
3rd year—Pathology .....	100
4th year—Pathology .....	200
Total .....	1200

The holder of the scholarship during the year of tenure is required to engage in original research in any one of the laboratories of the University, on some subject bearing on the advancement of medical science—the laboratory providing the material for the investigation.

The scholarship is to be paid in two portions, two-thirds at the time of award and one-third six months later, on the holder giving a satisfactory report (to whomsoever the University may appoint) of the work he has already done.

A report of the research, when completed, is to be given to the University.

The value of the scholarship consists in the proceeds of one thousand pounds sterling, invested at the rate of interest secured by the University for such benefactions.

The scholarship is tenable for one year.

#### MEDALS, PRIZES, AND CERTIFICATES OF HONOR.

A gold medal and three silver medals are offered annually for competition among those students of the Medical Faculty who have succeeded in obtaining the degree of M.B., with honors, and will be awarded on the recommendation of the examiners.

Certificates of Honor will be given those students, who, at any of the examinations, have been placed in the first or second class in Honors in any Department. The fee for such certificate is one dollar.

STARR MEDALS.

The late Richard Noble Starr, M.D., devised certain property for the encouragement of the study of the subjects of Anatomy, Physiology, and Pathology. In fulfilment of this object, the Senate have established one gold and two silver medals, called the "Starr medals." These medals are awarded annually and are conferred upon the three Bachelors of Medicine who have attained, in the course of their annual professional examinations, the highest marks in the above subjects; the relative rank of each candidate being determined by the aggregate number of his marks in all his examinations, written and practical, pertaining to these, viz :—

The examinations in Anatomy for the First and Second years, and in Surgical Anatomy of the Third year.

The examinations in Physiology, Histology, Physiological Chemistry, and Practical Physiology of the Second year.

The examination in General Pathology and in Morbid Anatomy and Histology of the Third year.

Every recipient of the medal must have attained the standing of First-class in each of the above-mentioned subjects, and must have been classed in honors in the Fourth examination.

In awarding the medals and scholarships, the comparative value of the several subjects is to be estimated according to the following schedule :

The Royal College of Dental Surgeons was affiliated with the University of Toronto in 1889, and shortly thereafter an examination for the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery was instituted in the University, and the following curriculum of requirements for admission to such degree instituted.

## CURRICULUM IN DENTISTRY.

## MATRICULATION.

Candidates for the degree of D.D.S. must pass the matriculation examination hereinafter mentioned, unless they,

1st. Possess a degree in Arts (not being an honorary degree), from some recognized University; or

2nd. Have already matriculated in the Faculty of Arts, or the Faculty of Law, or the Faculty of Medicine in this or some other University in Canada; or

3rd. Are matriculants in the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario; or

4th. Have passed the 1st, 2nd or 3rd class Departmental non-professional examinations in which the Latin option has been taken.

Candidates not possessing any of the above named qualifications, will be required to pass the examination prescribed for matriculants in the Faculty of Medicine in this University, provided always that candidates registered as matriculants of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, on the first day of November, A. D. 1888, shall be admitted as matriculants in the Department of Dentistry.

## UNDERGRADUATES.

Undergraduates (candidates for the degree) residents of the Province of Ontario, must have complied with all the requirements, prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario for admission to examination for a certificate of license to practise Dentistry in Ontario.

Undergraduates (candidates for the degree), not resident in Ontario, must :—

(1) Have devoted at least three full calendar years (not being engaged in any other business) to the study of Dentistry.

(2) Must have attended at least two full courses of lectures, embracing all the subjects of the curriculum, of not less than five months each (exclusive of the time occupied in examination), and including the daily clinic at a dental school recognized by this University ; the last of which must be at the School of Dentistry of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario.

(3) Must have spent that portion of time, when not in attendance at lectures and clinics at the School of Dentistry, as students in the office of an approved dentist.

## EXAMINATIONS.

Candidates for the degree must pass two examinations : an intermediate and a final ; an interval of not less than one year intervening between them. Until further provision be made a certificate of having passed the intermediate examination of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario, will be accepted by this University.

Applications for the final examination, which will be held at the same time as the annual examinations in the Faculty of Medicine, must present to the Registrar satisfactory certificates, covering all the requirements relating to undergraduates as given above, and of having passed the intermediate examination.

- (a) Theory and Practice of Operative Dentistry.
- (b) Theory and Practice of Dental Prosthetics.

No candidate shall be considered as having passed the examination who has not obtained 50 per cent. of the marks allotted; nor shall a candidate be considered as having passed in any subject who has not obtained at least  $33\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. of the marks allotted to such subject.

#### FEEs.

The fee for matriculation examination shall be five dollars.

The fee for registration of a certificate accepted in lieu of said examination shall be five dollars.

The fee for final examination shall be five dollars.

The fee for the degree of D.D.S. shall be twenty dollars.

No fee shall be charged for transference from any Faculty of this University to the Department of Dentistry.

### Ontario College of Pharmacy.

The Council of the College of Pharmacy, the annually elected governing body of the practising pharmacists of the Province of Ontario, began in 1882 to give instruction in the various subjects necessary for license for druggists. The College building, situated on St. James' Square, was erected in 1886, and the Faculty re-organized and extensive additions made to the buildings in 1891. In the same year affiliation was entered into with the University of Toronto.

#### CURRICULUM IN PHARMACY.

##### DEGREE OF PHM. B.

There shall be a degree in Pharmacy offered in this University. The degree—Bachelor of Pharmacy (Phm. B.)—shall be granted to all who have conformed to the regulations hereinafter given.

## MATRICULATION.

Candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Pharmacy must either :—

- (1) Possess a degree in Arts (not an Honorary degree) from some recognized University, or
- (2) Have already matriculated in the Faculty of Arts or the Faculty of Law, or the Faculty of Medicine in this or some other University in Canada, or
- (3) Be matriculants in the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, or
- (4) Have passed the 1st, 2nd or 3rd class Departmental Non-professional examination in which the Latin option has been taken.

Provided always that all candidates registered as apprentices of the Ontario College of Pharmacy, or who have received the diploma of the College of Pharmacy up to the first day June, A.D. 1893, shall be admitted as matriculants in the Department of Pharmacy on payment of the registration fee of five dollars.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE DEGREE OF PHM. B.

Undergraduates (candidates for the degree), residents of the Province of Ontario must have complied with all the requirements prescribed from time to time by the Council of the Ontario College of Pharmacy for admission to examination for a diploma licensing to practice Pharmacy in Ontario, and must have received from the Registrar of the Ontario College of Pharmacy a certificate of having passed the final examination of that College.

Candidates for the degree, not resident in Ontario, must have devoted at least four years (not being engaged in any other business) to the study of Pharmacy, being apprenticed during that time to a regularly qualified Pharmaceutical Chemist ; must have attended the full courses of lectures, embracing all the subjects of the curriculum, the length of each course being not less than that required from time to time by the Council of the Ontario College of Pharmacy and including practical work at some College of Pharmacy recognized by this University ; the last of which courses must be at the Ontario College of Pharmacy.

All candidates who have, prior to August 15th, 1892, received the diploma of the Ontario College of Pharmacy shall not be required to conform to the above, but shall be allowed their degree on passing the examination on the subjects hereinafter given.

## EXAMINATIONS.

Candidates for the degree must pass an examination to be held in the month of May of each year—hour and date of commencing to be hereafter given—must present to the Registrar satisfactory certificates covering all the requirements relating to undergraduates as given above, and of having passed the final examination of the Ontario College of Pharmacy.

The subjects of the examination shall be as follows:—

1. Botany and Microscopy.
2. Theory and Practice of Chemistry and Toxicology.
3. Materia Medica, including Posology and Pharmacognosy.
4. Theory and Practice of Pharmacy, including Interpretation of Prescriptions and Dispensing.

These examinations shall be partly written, partly oral and partly practical.

No candidate shall be considered as having passed the examination who has not obtained fifty per cent. of the marks allotted; nor shall a candidate be considered as having passed in any subject who has not obtained at least forty per cent. of the marks allotted to such subject.

### St. Michael's College.

St. Michael's College was established in 1852 by the Basilian Fathers from Annonay, France, at the request and under the patronage of the Most Rev. Dr. De Charbonnel, then Bishop of Toronto. For four years the College occupied the wing of St. Michael's Palace, on Church Street. In 1856, a more suitable edifice was erected on the present site, part of which was the gift of the late Hon. John Elmsley. Since that time the building has been more than doubled, and the chapel enlarged and improved.

The object of the institution is to impart a thorough Catholic training, moral and intellectual, so as to fit young men for any position in life which they may wish to occupy.

The studies advancing steadily with the educational progress of the country, it was deemed advantageous for those studying for the liberal professions to have the College affiliated with the Provincial University. In 1881 this affiliation was effected upon a basis similar to that of several of the Catholic Colleges of England and Ireland with the University of London.

The course of study comprises, besides an Elementary department three others, viz., Commercial, Classical and Philosophical. In the latter department lectures are delivered in the subjects of the department of Philosophy as prescribed by the curriculum of the University of Toronto.

Special lectures are also delivered upon the History required in the curriculum of the University.

### Knox College.

Knox College was established at Toronto in 1844, as a theological seminary in connection with the Synod of the Presbyterian Church in Canada or Free Synod, which had been organized in the same year. In 1858 it was incorporated by Act of Parliament. In 1861, in consequence of the Union of the Synod of the Free Church and that of the United Presbyterian Church, as the Synod of the Canada Presbyterian Church, the Theological Institute of the United Presbyterian Synod and Knox College were united.

After many changes of habitation the present buildings on Spadina Avenue were erected in 1875. It was affiliated with the University of Toronto in 1885, and in the University and University College its students receive instruction in the subjects of an Arts course prescribed for them as preliminary to the special work in Theology. These subjects are English, History, Logic and Rhetoric, Chemistry, Mental and Moral Philosophy, and Hebrew. The course in Theology extends over three years. A number of scholarships and prizes are offered for competition in each year.

### Wycliffe College.

This federating College was founded 1877, and known at first as the Protestant Episcopal Divinity School. As that name implies, it is a Church of England Theological College, and its work and methods are based upon the position of "distinctive evangelical teaching." It was affiliated with the University in 1885; and upon the passage of the University Federation Act became, in accordance with the terms of that Act, a federating College, with additional representation on the Senate. The present building, completed in 1891, stands to the north-east of the main University building.

The Theological course proper extends over a period of three years; the preparatory work consisting of the First year's work in Arts of the University, or its equivalent.

The first two years of the Theological course may be taken concurrently with the Arts work of the University by means of the Theological options, and by following the schedule laid down in the Calendar.

Graduates in Arts may so combine the three years' work as to take the full Theological course in two years.

### The School of Practical Science.

The School of Practical Science was founded by Act of the Legislative Assembly in 1877. An arrangement was entered into with the Council of University College whereby the students of the School received instruction in those University subjects which were included in the work of the School. In 1889, the School was affiliated to the University of Toronto. In 1890, very large additions were made to the original building. The latter was set apart for the work in Chemistry, Mineralogy and Assaying, while the Engineering and Architectural Departments were accommodated in the new building, a large portion of which is occupied by the Engineering Laboratory. This laboratory has been equipped with the most modern machinery and apparatus for carrying on original investigations in steam engineering, hydraulic and electrical engineering, strength of materials of construction, standards of length, etc.

The Department of Chemistry is provided with laboratories for qualitative and quantitative analysis, toxicology, etc.

In the Department of Mining Engineering there are laboratories for assaying, blowpipe analysis, microscopic lithology, etc. For instruction in Surveying and Practical Astronomy the School is supplied with a good collection of the ordinary field instruments—transits, levels, etc.—and also with a ten-inch theodolite for astronomical and geodetic work.

## DEGREE OF C. E.

By a Statute of the University of Toronto, passed in 1884, graduates of the School of Practical Science in the department of Civil Engineering may be admitted to the degree of C. E. upon the following conditions :—

1. Candidates for the said degree shall hold the Diploma in Civil Engineering of the Ontario School of Practical Science.
2. Candidates shall have spent three years after receiving the said Diploma in the actual practice of the profession of Civil Engineering.
3. Candidates shall have spent at least two years of the said period in the construction and operation of engineering works as distinguished from surveys merely.
4. Satisfactory evidence shall be offered as to the periods spent on the different classes of engineering employment, and intervals during which the candidate was not engaged in the construction or operation of engineering works, or in the prosecution of surveys, shall not be included as portions of the aforesaid period of three years.
5. It shall not be necessary that the several intervals required to make up the period of three years be consecutive.
6. Each candidate shall prepare for the approval of the Senate, an original essay on some engineering subject, accompanied with detailed explanations, drawings, specifications and estimates; he shall also be examined on the subject of the essay, as well as on the work or works on which he has been engaged, unless exempted therefrom on the special recommendation of the examiner.
7. The subject of the said essay shall be forwarded to the Registrar for the approval of the Senate not later than the first day of February.
8. Candidates shall notify the Registrar of their intention of proceeding to the degree of C. E., not later than the first day of April.
9. The evidence required in section 4, together with the essay, drawings, and estimates, shall be sent to the Registrar not later than the first day of May.
10. The examination of the essay, drawings and estimates and any further examination of the candidate that may be considered necessary, may be held in May.

11. The fee for the degree of C.E. shall be \$20, and shall be paid to the Registrar not later than the first day of May.
12. The essay, drawings and estimates submitted by the candidate shall be the property of the University.

 DEGREE OF B.A.Sc.

Candidates who have fulfilled the requirements of the Fourth year in the School of Practical Science are eligible for the degree of Bachelor of Applied Science in the University of Toronto, in accordance with the following statute passed by the Senate in 1892.

BY THE SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO.

*Be it enacted:*

That the degree of Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.Sc.) be hereby established to be granted subject to the following conditions and regulations:—

1. Candidates for the said degree shall hold the diploma of the School of Practical Science in any one of the regular courses of the said school, or shall be of the standing of the Fourth year in the honor department of Chemistry and Mineralogy in the University of Toronto.
2. They shall have fulfilled the conditions relating to the Fourth or post-graduate year in the School of Practical Science, and shall present certificates of having done so to the Registrar of the University.
3. Each candidate shall prepare a thesis based on the results of his Fourth year work in the said School of Practical Science for the approval of the University examiners. This thesis is to be accompanied by all necessary drawings, specifications, tables and estimates.
4. Candidates will be required to pass such written and oral examinations as may be prescribed by the University Examiners in any two of the following subjects:—
  - Method of Least Squares and Theory of Observations.
  - Practical Astronomy.
  - Geodesy.
  - Strength and Elasticity of Materials.

Hydraulics.

Thermodynamics and Theory of Heat Engines.

Electricity and Magnetism.

Industrial Chemistry.

Sanitary and Forensic Chemistry.

Inorganic and Organic Chemistry.

Mineralogy and Geology.

Metallurgy and Assaying.

History of Architecture.

5. Candidates shall notify the Registrar of their intention to proceed to the degree of B.A.Sc. not later than the first day of April.
6. The examination for the degree shall be held in May.
7. The fee for the degree shall be ten dollars and shall be paid to the Registrar not later than the first day of May.
8. The ordinary time for conferring the degree shall be at the University commencement in June. The degree may be conferred at any meeting of the Senate.
9. The thesis, drawings, and other papers accompanying them, shall be the property of the University.
10. In case any change be made in the conditions referred to in the second clause, such change shall be submitted to the Senate and shall have no force so far as the said clause is concerned, unless approved by resolution of the Senate.

### Ontario Agricultural College.

The Institution known as the "Ontario Agricultural College and Experimental Farm," is situated about a mile to the south of the city of Guelph, in the centre of an extensive agricultural and noted stock-raising district, readily accessible by rail from all parts of the province. The farm consists of 550 acres, about 400 of which are cleared. It is composed of almost every variety of soil, and hence is well suited for the purpose for which it was selected.

The instruction given at the institution is embraced under two heads, a course of study and a course of apprenticeship. The latter is intended for special students who come in from practical farming for the autumn, winter and spring terms, during which they are employed in rotation in each of six departments of practical farm labour. The course of study is for two years, at the end of which time a diploma is granted. Holders of the diploma, who have obtained a certain standing in the theoretical and practical work of the first two years, may remain for a third year. In 1888 the College was affiliated with the University of Toronto, and an examination for the degree of Bachelor of the Science of Agriculture was instituted, to which only students of the Third year in the Ontario Agricultural College may be admitted.

## UNIVERSITY LIBRARY.

On the evening of February 14th, 1890, the Library of the University, together with the greater portion of the main University Building, was destroyed by fire. The Library then contained about 33,000 volumes, including many rare and valuable books and sets of scientific periodicals.

The destruction of the University was no sooner known than active measures were taken to replace what was lost. At a special meeting of Convocation a committee was formed to solicit subscriptions and donations of books from friends of the University and higher education. In England a similar movement was organized, and a committee formed, under the Marquis of Lorne as Chairman, Mr. Staveley Hill, M.P., as Honorary Treasurer, and Sir George Baden-Powell, M.P., as Honorary Secretary. In Germany, also, a committee of learned men, interested in University education, was formed for the same purpose, with Herr John Landauer, of Braunschweig, as Secretary. The appeals sent out met with a prompt and hearty response. Among the many donors may be mentioned Her Majesty the Queen, their Majesties the German Emperor, and the Kings of Saxony and Württemberg, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the late Duke of Devonshire, the Duke of Argyle; the Governments of Great Britain, France, Italy, Sweden, of the Dominion of Canada and its provinces, of the Australian Colonies, of the United States, and many of the States of the Union; the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Edinburgh, Aberdeen, Dublin, Strassburg, Vienna, Upsala, Harvard, Columbia, Cornell, Melbourne and Laval; the cities of London, Birmingham, Bremen, Toronto, New York, Boston and Melbourne; the leading publishers of Great Britain, the United States and Germany; learned societies and very many private persons in all parts of the world. The number of books thus presented has exceeded 30,000 volumes. Among them are several of bibliographical interest. The late Duke of Devonshire presented several sets of publications of chemical societies, with the book plates of the Hon. Henry Cavendish, the great chemist. From other friends were received valuable volumes formerly in the libraries of Gibbon, the historian, of Edmund Burke, and of Guizot, the French statesman and historian.

A manuscript of great interest was also presented, being a contemporary report of the trial of the seven Bishops in the reign of James the Second, with corrections and annotations by Sir William Williams, the Solicitor-General of the day.

For the last two years the Library has found a home in the School of Practical Science, by the kindness of the Minister of Education and the Principal of the School. During this time has been in progress the erection of a fire-proof Library building, separate from the restored main building. The books will be moved to this, the permanent quarters of the Library, by the beginning of October, 1892. The distinctive features of the building are the following:—First, a fire-proof room to accommodate 120,000 volumes. Second, a reading-room to accommodate 200 students. Third, seminary rooms for various departments of instruction.

The hours during which the Library is at present available for readers are from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. A proposal awaits the sanction of the Senate that the reading-room of the new building shall be open, during term, in the evening as well. It is confidently expected that the students will avail themselves of the increased advantages for study thus placed within their reach.

A card catalogue, on what is known as the Dictionary System, is in preparation, and it is hoped will be completed by the end of the ensuing year. Special assistance has been engaged in order to complete this indispensable key to the contents of the Library as soon as possible.

The total number of volumes in the Library up to 1st July, 1892, is 41,510. The unbound pamphlets exceed 5,000.

THE UNIVERSITY BIOLOGICAL MUSEUM.

The University Biological Museum forms the central portion of the buildings belonging to the Biological Department. It is as yet unfurnished, but it is hoped that the rooms will be ready for use early in October. To the new museum will be transferred the various collections rescued from the old museum, together with the specimens and collections recently presented to the University.

In addition to the damage done by removal and by water to the mounted specimens (mammals, birds and skeletons), of the former museum, the most serious losses were in the direction of the collections contained in the gallery cases.

It is hoped that in the near future donations from friends of the Institution will assist in replacing the losses. Already considerable contributions have been received, and it is intended to issue shortly a rough list of the collections with the view of indicating the gaps which exist therein.

Fortunately, the extensive and valuable series of preparations and models used for illustrating the lectures in animal and vegetable morphology and embryology had been removed to the Biological Department before the fire, so that the teaching of the department is not crippled in this respect.

UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO, Y. M. C. A.

This company was formed during the excitement caused by the Trent affair in 1861. which may be said to have given birth to the present volunteer system of Canada. At the news of the possibility of war between Great Britain and the United States, offers of military service came from all parts of the country. Among the companies then formed was one consisting of professors and students of University College. The meeting at which the resolutions for the organization of such a company were passed was held in the Convocation Hall, and presided over by Rev. Dr. McCaul, then President of University College. The first officers chosen were Professor H. H. Croft, as Captain, Professor J. B. Cherriman as Lieutenant and Mr. Adam Crooks (afterwards Minister of Education for Ontario) as Ensign ; and among the privates enrolled were Sir Daniel (then Professor) Wilson, now President of the University, Professor Buckland and Mr. W. Mulock, now Vice-Chancellor of the University. The first uniform chosen was light gray, the company being then independent. In the year 1862 the company was incorporated with the 2nd Battalion, Queen's Own Rifles, when the present uniform was adopted.

In the year 1864 the company obtained the first prize, offered by Col. Mountain, Inspecting officer, for the most efficient and complete company in Canada.

When the Fenians invaded Canada in June, 1866, the company sent to the front forty-nine officers and men, of whom, however, only twenty-nine were present at the skirmish which took place at Limeridge on the 2nd of June, the greater portion of the members having left Toronto for their various homes at the close of the examinations in May. They were led into action by the late Lieutenant Whitney, both Professor Croft and Professor Cherriman being

detained in Toronto by order of the Government. They advanced farther towards the enemy than any other portion of the force in action, driving the enemy's left flank before them, and thus being the last to whom the order to retire reached. They lost three killed, four wounded, and three prisoners as shown in the following list :—

*Killed.*—Privates Malcolm Mackenzie, J. H. Mewburn, William F. Tempest.

*Wounded.*—Privates W. H. vanderSmissen, R. E. Kingsford, E. G. Patterson, E. T. Paul.

*Taken Prisoner.*—Corp. T. D. Delamere, Lance-Corp. W. H. Ellis, Private David Junor.

The prisoners not wounded were taken to Fort Erie where they were abandoned on the approach of the troops.

The University company also took part in the suppression of the rebellion in the North-west of 1885. The Queen's Own Rifles formed part of the column dispatched under Lieut.-Col. ## APPENDIX.

## JUNIOR MATRICULATION.

NOTE.—All candidates for Junior Matriculation must take the pass subjects in Latin, Mathematics, English, History and Geography, and in one of the following groups : (a) Greek ; (b) French and German ; (c) French and either Physics or Chemistry ; (d) German and either Physics or Chemistry.

A choice of questions may be allowed on each Pass paper.

Candidates intending to take during their University course in Arts any one of the following Honor departments, viz. Political Science, Mathematics and Physics, Chemistry and Mineralogy, Natural Sciences, are recommended to take French and German at Matriculation ; since these languages must be taken in connection with the above-named Honor departments. For a similar reason candidates intending to take during their University course either the Honor department of Philosophy or that of Oriental Languages are recommended to take Greek, French, and German at Junior Matriculation.

The preparation, characteristic properties, and principal compounds of the following elements : hydrogen, chlorine, bromine, iodine, oxygen, sulphur, nitrogen, phosphorus, carbon, silicon.

## BIOLOGY.

## 1. ELEMENTS OF BOTANY :—

The examination will test whether the candidate has practically studied representatives of the flowering plants of the locality in which the preparatory school is situated, and representatives of the chief subdivisions of cryptogams, such as a fern, a lycopod, a horse-tail, a liver wort, a moss, a lichen, a mushroom, and a chara.

A knowledge of structure is required, such as can be obtained with the use of the compound microscope. Attention will be given in the examination to drawing and description of parts of plants supplied, and to the classification of these. Comparison of different organs, morphology of root, stem, leaves, and hair, parts of the flower, reproduction of flowering plants, pollination, fertilisation, and the nature of fruit and seeds.

## 2. ELEMENTS OF ZOOLOGY :—

Practical study of the subject as defined in *The High School Zoology*, but limited by the author's syllabus of work.

The percentage required for pass standing shall be 25 per cent. on each paper, and 40 per cent. on the whole examination.




