

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Special Telegram to the Tribune. Railways-Bale Verte-The Friends of the Bale Bill Affirmed. OTTAWA, April 10.

Hon. Mr. Langensiepe replied to Mr. Donville that the Government intended putting a sum into the estimates for increasing the sidings and adding to the locomotives and cars of the E. & N. A. Railway.

Mr. McDonnell, of Cape Breton, made a long speech against the Bale Verte Canal, asserting that there would be no adequate return for the immense amount it would cost, and saying the money should be spent in extending the railway system to Lousburg and other points.

Mr. Mills made a speech against the appointment of Senators, arguing that they should be elected by the Local Legislatures of the people. He moved a resolution in accordance with his views, and the debate was adjourned.

The Bill was again taken into consideration, and Mr. Palmer made a speech in its favor. He said the bill had been introduced so early, as there would be ample time for perfecting a law that would meet all the requirements.

Mr. Wallace (Ontario) thought the bill would encourage lying and cheating. Persons would promise to vote for pay, take the money and vote differently, and defend the candidate of his money.

Mr. McDonald (Pictou) argued that the class of persons needing protection by the ballot was very small. Farmers were independent, and laborers dependant of capital. It may prevent fighting, by having numerous polling places bribery was encouraged by the fear of detection being lessened.

Mr. Dodge (North York) believed the ballot system had lowered the standard of public men in the United States. He did not think it would work better in Canada, but he was the employer of two thousand men and, wishing to give them every freedom, he would vote for the bill.

The principle of the bill was adopted at 12 o'clock—yeas 79, nays 78, Mitchell, They and all the New Brunswickers voting yea.
