BILL.

An Act to repeal the Thirty-first Section of the Fishery Act.

WHEREAS the Fishery Act has not attained the objects for which Preamble.
it was passed, and the 31st section of chapter 62 of the Con-
solidated Statutes of Canada, one of the sections of the said Act has
proved prejudicial to the interests it was intended to protect, and
5 has placed fishermen in a false position as regards their interests:
Therefore, Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows:—

I. Hereafter the thirty-first section of chapter sixty-two of the 31st section
of cap. 62
Con. Stat.
Canada re-
pealed.
Consolidated Statutes of Canada, as hereinafter cited, namely:
“ Except, as aforesaid, no one shall catch maskinonge, pickerel, nor
10 black bass, between the fifteenth of March and the fifteenth day of
May,” shall be deemed to have been always void and of no effect, and
the said section is hereby repealed.

II. This Act shall be deemed a public Act.
