



THE picture shown is one dear to every mail, woman, boy and girl, on account of its meaning—"The Victoria Cross," given for conspicuous bravery. If only the soil of South Africa could voice the deeds performed upon it, how many Victoria Crosses would have been found to have been earned by Canada's sons! It is hard in the heat of action to notice every act of valor, and therefore only those which take place under the eye of superiors of sufficient rank can be noted.

The picture shows one of such deeds. Two troopers are closely pressed by the enemy. The horse of one is hit.
