Our coal sales in London for \$5 a ton, and in Philadelphia for \$4, yet put in precisely three times as dear in the latter city as in the former. And it is the same in nearly all American cities. Who is the somebody that is swelled on these illegitimate profits?

There are half a million more women than men in England, and a movement has been set on foot to promote the emigration of the surplus females. But a difficulty has been pointed out, namely, that the homes of women are stronger than those of men, and they are not so animated by the spirit of adventure. The Echo suggests, however, that women should prefer independence in a colony to pauperism at home.

It is noticeable that British statesmen are just now paying more than ordinary attention to the subject of colonial relations. Justin McCarthy, in his history and in review articles freely admits that the present relationship is transitional, and does not hesitate to express his preference for an imperial federation. The same idea was expressed by Lord Kimberley and the Lord Mayor of London at the colonial banquet Saturday.

THE RAILWAY QUESTION in Manitoba tests all others for the present. The success of the Southwestern company in the New York money market gives the people of the Northwest reason to hope that the syndicate will not be given the whole country to itself. The rival line will give them a limited measure of competition, and there seems to be no doubt now that it will be built. The delay in submitting the \$200,000 by law to Winnipeg some days ago was due to the difficulty of getting a satisfactory report of the new arrangement, the telegraph lines being out of order. But by this time Messrs. Pew and Schultz must have arrived in Manitoba, and with the assurance they were prepared to give the council may be expected to act promptly. The company has an exceptionally favorable charter and a valuable land grant, and the wonder is that it was so long a time in completing its financial arrangements.

GOVERNMENT TELEGRAPH LINES. What will we do with our telegraph lines? It has been suggested that the government buy them up and lease them to a working company. It is a very good idea, and is possibly the best solution of a problem yet offered. At the same time the government would hardly be justified in paying for them at the rate of \$100,000 a mile. New lines could be built for half the money, and the government might find it desirable in the public interest to build new lines if the proposed amalgamation of the three Canadian companies with Jay Gould's have near been carried out. There is no telling how near we are to a revolution in our telegraph system. With the government owning the lines, as they own the canals and some railways, they might either be leased to one company or the "running powers" idea might be applied. Why should not every newspaper and every business man have a telegraph instrument as they now have a telephone? The improvements and inventions of Edison and others make this quite feasible, and with the lines owned by the government there seems to be no reason why every business man who desired it might not have an instrument in his own office—ensuring him greater privacy and despatch, and possibly economy also.

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND THE PRESS.
