Indications of Prosperity all Along the W. & A. Line.

(Notes by our own Correspondent.) Having had occasion to make a visit to Wolfville last week, we give our readers a few lines in this issue on what we saw and heard during the trip.

At Paradise we saw a large lot of lumber at the mill, recently bought by Mr. John Haley, awaiting shipment, and understood that the amount to be sent and shipped from this station by him this spring will be over two million feet.

Middleton is now fast taking its place of importance. The completion of the N. S. C. Railway has imparted new life into the place, and must eventually make the town much larger than it is at present.

No change of any note occurred on our way to reach Newville; but here we find evident signs of thrift and prosperity. New houses are being put up and old ones repaired and painted.

At Newville we saw the steam mill operated by F. Clark & Sons as in full blast turning out the material for several new station houses for which they have contracts from the W. & A. R. Company.

Bringing to a close this somewhat protracted session of parliament, I desire to convey to you my best thanks for the diligence and industry with which you have discharged your duties.
