Grasett, Examining Chaplain, their intention to offer themselves, and they are requested to be present for examination in the Lecture Room of St. James' Parochial School, on Saturday, the 27th October, at 9 o'clock A.M., with the usual testimonials and the Si Quis duly attested.

#### MISSIONARY MEETING.

The Lord Bishop of the Diocese having been pleased to approve of a meeting being heid during the ensuing meeting of Synod, for the purpose of bringing before the Church the wants of the Indians in this Diocese, a meeting will be accordingly held in the Music Hall, in this city, on Thursday Evening, the 20th inst. The Bishop will preside. Several Missionaries to the Indians, and others interested in their welfare, will address the meeting.

# TRINITY COLLEGE, TORONTO.

THE ANNUAL EXAMINATION FOR MATRICULATION and for SCHOLARSHIPS, will commence

## ON MONDAY, OCTOBER 1st 1866,

The following Scholarships will be open to competition:— Tenable for one year:

One Foundation Scholarship, of #50 Currency

One Bishop Strachan Scholarship of 30 "

One Dickson Scholarship of

One Cameron Scholarship, of £25, restricted to the sons of Clergymen.

The holders of these Scholarships will be required to attend Lectures and Examinations in the Arts course.

All persons presenting themselves for Examination must produce testimonials of good conduct. Candidates for Matriculation must have entered on their sixteenth, and Candidates for Scholarships on their seventeenth year.

The subject of Examination may be learned by application to the Provost of Trinity College, who will furnish any information which may be required.

One Wellington Scholarship of £50 currency per annum, one Allan Scholarship of £45, and one Burnside and one Dickson Scholarship, each £30, will be awarded to Students commencing their College Course in October next, according to the result of the yearly Examination in the following June.

These Scholarships are tenable for one year, but will be open again for competition to the same candidates at the end of their second year.

One Jubilee Scholarship, of the annual value of £40 currency, and tenable for two years is open annually to the most deserving Bachelor of the year, who, having graduated in honours, shall have expressed his intention of studying for Holy Orders.

The Corporation has provided that four Bursaries shall be open every year, tenable from year to year, for a period not exceeding three years, of the value of £15 los. per annum. Any Student who has passed the Matriculation Examination, and shall have satisfied the Corporation that he cannot, without the aid thus afforded, avail himself of the advantage of a University education, shall be eligible for a bursary, provided, that he be not the holder of a Scholarship, ceteris paribus, the sons of clergymen will be preferred.

Provision has been made for admission to Degrees in Medicine. The particulars may be learned by application to the Provost.
