YOUR EXCELLENCY.

I have the honour, at the request of His Majesty's Government in Canada, to notify you that His Britannic Majesty desires, in accordance with article 14 (b) of the Angle Relgion Civil D 14 (b) of the Anglo-Belgian Civil Procedure Convention of June 21, 1922, extend the convention to that Dominion.

## ARTICLE 7

No fees of any description shall be payable by one State to the other in respect of the Service.

These charges are calculated in accordance with the tariff in force for nationals of the State applied to. Repayment of these charges is claimed by the judicial authority applied to from the consular authority making the request when transmitting the certificate provided for in Article 3 (e).

## III.—Taking of Evidence

## ARTICLE 8

When a Court in one of the contracting States orders that evidence is to be taken in the territory of the other State, this may be done in either of the ways prescribed in Articles 9 and 11.

## IV.—General Provisions

Any difficulties which may arise in connection with the operation of this vention shall be settled through the dialog to Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

### ARTICLE 14

(a) The present Convention shall come into force three months after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three Jeans after its coming into force. In case neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other six months before the expiration of the said period of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

(b) This Convention shall not apply to any of the Dominions, Colonies, possessions or Protectorates of the two High Contracting Parties, but either High Contracting Party may at any time extend, by a simple notification, this

Contracting Party may at any time extend, by a Protectorate.

Each of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of the extension of this Convention to any of its Dominions, Colonies, Possessions or Protectorates, terminate such

extension on giving six months' previous notice. This Convention shall also not apply to Scotland or Ireland; but His Britannic Majesty shall have the right to extend the Convention to Scotland or the land in the preceding paragraph in respect of Teland on the conditions set forth in the preceding paragraph in respect of Ominions, Colonies, Possessions or Protectorates.
