1. That the Report now read be adopted and printed ; and that this Meeting gratefully rejoices in the success with which it has pleased Almighty God to crown the efforts of the Missionaries of this and other kindred Societies during the past year.

2. That this Meeting, recognizing the great principle of the Christian Religion, that, unaided by the Holy Ghost, man's best efforts are powerless in extending the Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ in the world, is resolved to be more frequent and fervent in its supplications for the promised outpouring of the Spirit on Missionaries themselves, and on the fields of labour occupied by them.

R E P O R T .

THE instrumentalities which the Lord is pleased to use in order to evangelize the earth, are very numerous, and greatly diversified; and as one star differeth from another star in glory, so these differ from each other in the aspect they present, in the degree of spiritual light they emit, and in the position they occupy. Ezekiel, in one of his marvellous visions, saw wheels of fire of various sizes revolving within one great wheel, and propelled by living creatures; so in the various means which the Almighty uses to enlighten and save the souls of men, there are wheels of fire of various sizes—these are the Tract Society, the Sunday School Society, and similar Institutions; these turn round upon the same axle, and revolve within the ample circumference of *one great wheel*; that axle is the *grace of God*—that wheel is the *Missionary Institute*; and the whole vast machinery is kept in motion by the energy of the *Lord the Spirit*.

Many of these means are in their outward form and appearance *very feeble*; and but poorly adapted for the great and mighty work they are appointed to do. Their inadequacy is apparent to every one;—between them and the effect they are intended to produce, there is no proportion whatsoever; but while we are indulging these allusions—while we are adverting to these circumstances of disparity—one of “the lively Oracles” utters its voice—and in an instant the mystery is *solved*; the incredulity of the sceptic is *rebuked*, and God is *glorified*, “*God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound*

the wise ; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty ; and the base things of the world and things which are despised hath God chosen : ye, and things which are not to bring to nought things which are, that no flesh should glory in his presence."

Since our last *District Report* was published, our Mission Churches have acquired a considerable increase, so that the total number of persons now enjoying "*the communion of the saints*" throughout our various Mission Stations, amounts to about 102,750. Another characteristic of the past year is, that during that period, several Missionaries have been sent out by "*the venerable Parent Society*" and hence, in almost every department of the vast field they are endeavouring to cultivate, their work of faith and labour of love are in full and vigorous operation.

We shall now, agreeably with the usual arrangement, present a brief sketch of the principal Stations occupied by the "THE WESLEYAN METHODIST MISSIONARY SOCIETY."

MISSIONS IN EUROPE.

IRELAND.—The sister kingdom continues to receive from the Parent Institution all the attention and support that its resources and the claims of other parts of the world, enables it to bestow. Here twenty-four Missionaries besides other paid agents are constantly employed. These perform the arduous and diversified duties involved in sustaining nineteen very extensive circuits, and fifty-four numerous attended and flourishing schools. At these schools 4,500 children and adults receive a moral and religious education ; and the Teachers being nearly all *Local Preachers or Exhorters*, employ their leisure in reading "*the Word of God*," and performing other religious duties among a scattered Protestant population slenderly provided with *Christian Ordinances*.

GERMANY.—*Winnenden* still continues to be the scene of Mr. Muller's unwearyed zeal and diligence. Upwards of six hundred individuals are united with him in Church fellowship ; and although some openings for usefulness have been closed against

him, he is cheered in his efforts to distribute the unsearchable riches of Christ, by the obvious sanction and blessing of *the Great Head of the Church*.

FRANCE AND SWITZERLAND.—The state of the work in France is very encouraging; and a review of it, if we had leisure for the performance of so delightful a duty, would furnish to all the friends of Missions a great cause of rejoicing. The English Chapel in Paris is regularly attended by a large and highly interesting congregation; this circumstance has a favourable influence upon the French department of the work, not only in the *metropolis*, but throughout the entire *District*. The Mission Press is in steady and vigorous operation, and by this peculiar agency, religious publications of various sizes and forms are dispersed over the whole country. From this seed, sown in hope, we expect, through the blessing of "*the Lord of the harvest*," to reap an abundant *increase*.

SPAIN.

GIBRALTAR.—Nothing remarkable has *occurred* in connexion with this *station* during the year. The Missionary is assiduous; and his ministrations in the Spanish, as well as English department, are rendered great and effectual blessings.

MISSIONS IN CEYLON AND CONTINENTAL INDIA.

Advancing activity and usefulness are observable at all points in SOUTH INDIA; and the diffusion of Scriptural knowledge, and the conversion of souls, are the happy results. In Jaffna, NORTH CEYLON, the Mission is now reaping the benefits of Mr. Percival's judicious and persevering exertions in the education and training of the children and young persons committed to his care. The Central School commission of the Island has signified its approbation of his labours, by an annual grant of £150 0s. 0d. In Batticaloa, one hundred and seventeen baptisms have been administered during the year. The Members of Society have increased to one hundred and forty-seven, and one hundred and eighty-five are on probation, among whom are

one hundred and forty-two of the reclaimed *Veddahs*, or wild men of *Bintenne*. A decided and very heart-cheering improvement characterizes all the society's operations at *Trincomalee*; and throughout this section of the Island, an acquaintance with the Sacred Scriptures is almost general. In SOUTH CEYLON there is a deepening and an extension of the work. The Government School Commission is co-operating with the Missionaries; seventy-eight Members have been added to the society; the indications of future success are distinct and numerous; and these induce us to hope, that BUDHISM and the other obstacles to the diffusion of Christianity, which still exist in SOUTH CEYLON, will be ultimately surmounted by THE RELIGION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST.

AUSTRALIAN AND POLYNESIAN MISSIONS.

NEW SOUTH WALES.—In this colony, the Missionaries have zealously prosecuted their labours during the year; and have been every where cheered with tokens for good. The intelligence transmitted from The Annual District Meeting is condensed in a single paragraph. "With heartfelt joy and gratitude," the Missionaries write, "we report the increasing prosperity of the Word of God at all our stations, as evidenced by the addition of three hundred Church Members during the last nine months, and by a decided improvement in the general state of our finances. A favourable change has taken place in the Mission among the Aborigines of BUNTINGVILLE; a school for the instruction of native families, has been commenced at ADELAIDE, in SOUTH AUSTRALIA. The Ministry of "*the Word*" at MELBOURNE, continues to be accompanied with the Divine blessing; and the native establishment in WESTERN AUSTRALIA furnishes abundant proof that the Aborigines are capable of instruction and susceptible of religion.

NEW ZEALAND.—The distressing events which have taken place at *Wairau* and *Cloudy Bay*, in this District, have excited in the breasts of the Committee the most painful anxieties. The record of these occurrences form a very gloomy page in our *Missionary annals*; and so fatal has their operation been, that in con-

sequence thereof, one of the society's most promising missions has been suspended, if not certainly destroyed. This station has not been formed more than three years ; but in that short period it had been eminently successful. The natives listened with eagerness to the instructions of the *Missionaries*. They speedily acquired the art of reading ; they evinced the deepest regard for the *Sacred scriptures* ; they had erected, chiefly by their own exertions, a large and commodious place of worship ; and at the date of the *Wairau* affair, 600 of the best instructed of them had been admitted as communicants. But all these promising and precious fruits of missionary toil and self-denying effort are scattered and apparently destroyed, and when we look upon the desolation and ruin occasioned by this untoward collision, our hearts cry aloud.—“*Arise O Lord, thou and the ark of thy strength*” and “*Scatter the people that delight in war.*”

With respect to the *Friendly Islands*, the state of the *Tongataboo* mission, is to some extent satisfactory. Many of all ranks have renounced their *idols*, and turned to the true and living God. The *Missionaries* have extended their labours to several new places. The lately resumed post of *Hihifo* has assumed a promising appearance ; and at *Vavau*, the King and Queen continue to evince a truly christian spirit ; and influenced by their example, the people generally are advancing in the knowledge and experience of their religion.

FEEGEE.—The latest intelligence received from this section of the great missionary field is of a very cheering character. Mr. Kent writes : A good portion of my time is occupied in dispensing medicine ; this is a direct way of attacking the gods of *Feegee* and of getting hold of the understanding and feelings of the people. Patients that have applied to the gods but in vain, come to us ; and after taking some medicine they recover, and are convinced, in spite of themselves, that their gods are false gods. “The whole of this country,” says another of our valuable *Missionaries* “lies before you ; the fields indeed are white unto the harvest and many are saying ‘*come over and help us.*’” In the *Lakemba* circuit heathenism is rapidly declining ; and christianity is going forth “*conquering and to con-*

quer." At *Rewan* the prospects are brightening: *Rewan* is likely to become the centre, from which the law and testimony will proceed with power and great glory; the only hindrance to the triumph of *the truth* in *Somosomo* is *war*, baneful *war*; but to remove that hindrance---to deliver *Feejee* from the power of *darkness* and bring it under the mild and gracious sway of the *Prince of Peace*, thirteen Missionaries, prepared to suffer and to labour, are indispensably necessary.

MISSIONS IN AFRICA.

In the Cape of *Good Hope*, *Albany*, and *Caffraria* Districts, the prosperity is unequivocal and decided. The increase in the membership during the last year is larger than usual; and in connection with this a spirit of enquiry has been extensively awakened among the people. This favourable state of things is attributable, in a great degree, to the divine blessing upon the native agency, trained up in "the *Watson Institution*." These valuable auxiliaries declare to their countrymen, in their own tongues and dialect, "*the wonderful works of God*."

The printing and translating department of the work is in a very healthy state; a marked improvement in both a temporal and spiritual sense characterizes the native population at *Farmerfield*, *Haslope Hills*, and other similar establishments. In the *Bechuana District* the missions have been extricated from the critical circumstances in which they were placed by the proceedings of the emigrant Dutch farmers, and in the District of *Sierra Leone* there has been an addition of three hundred communicants, leaving five hundred and seventy still on *probation*.

The accounts received from *St. Mary's, Gambia* are very satisfactory; the mission at the *Gold Coast* is in a promising state; the prospects of the mission at *Kumasi*, are very cheering; but night still hangs over the land, and the introduction of Gospel light has for the present thrown the surrounding darkness into *deeper shade*. At *Badagry* the Lord is obviously preparing a people for himself; openings are also presenting themselves in the *Yariba Country*, in *Hansu, Dahomi*, and

other places. Indeed, Africa, in its *length* and *breadth*, abounds in numerous and extensive fields which might be successfully cultivated by *missionary zeal*.

WEST INDIAN MISSIONS.

In *Jamaica*, measures have been recently adopted, to meet at an early period the entire local expenses, without any assistance from the funds of the Parent Society, and also to repay the loans towards the erection of chapels. There has been an increase of six hundred members; there are seven hundred and seventy on trial, the congregations are numerous and attentive, and the school department is very encouraging. Remarkable success attends the labours of the Missionaries in *Antigua*; the latest accounts give an addition of two thousand members, while upwards of four hundred remain on probation. In *Demerara* the Lord is reviving his work; the various circuits and stations comprised within the "*St. Vincents District*" exhibit a state of spiritual health and vigour; indications of moral improvement are beginning to appear throughout the extensive Island of *Hayti*, and in the *Bahamas* an increase of church members and an enlargement of the congregations, and the erection of new chapels, are the results of the divine blessing upon a faithful ministration of *the word*.

BRITISH DOMINIONS IN NORTH AMERICA.

In this portion of the British Empire the society employs about one hundred Missionaries judiciously distributed over the immense region, extending from the *Labrador Coast* to the *Hudson's Bay Territory*. Looking at the number of labourers and the immense fields they are endeavouring to cultivate, we are ready to say, as Philip did of the few *loaves* and *fishes*, "*What are they among so many.*" God, however, does not despise the day of small or feeble things; on the contrary, it is a period in missionary efforts that he regards with feelings of peculiar *tenderness*; and hence, the comparatively public agency

engaged in the North American Districts are, by the succours of his Holy Spirit, rendered eminently successful.

There are seventeen Missionaries engaged in *Eastern Canada*; and although they have, in common with their brethren in other parts of the globe, to endure trials and contend with adversaries, they are cheered by repeated manifestations of the divine favour. In Montreal, the principal station, two new chapels, large and beautiful, and capable of accommodating between three and four thousand persons, are now completed. The want of more commodious places of worship is painfully experienced in other Circuits; God is indeed, in this District, enlarging the borders of Sion, and multiplying her converts.

Let every one present resolve "*I will aim another weapon at the already wavering array of the enemies of God and man ; I will strive to give speed to the flight and strength to the pinion of the Angel who is now flying in the heavens, having the everlasting gospel to preach to all nations ; I will do all I can, God being my helper, to promote the extension and efficiency of Christian Missions, until the little one shall become a thousand, and the small one a strong nation.* Never was there a period, when the zeal and liberality of christians were more needed than at present. The aggressions made upon the territory of the common foe have roused his vigilance ; the light of truth has been carried into the recesses of *Pagan, and Popish, and Mahometan* darkness ; and the Globe is brought into a state of *hope and fear*. The Spirit of God has gone forth in the *Missionary chariot*. It is now going forth conquering and to conquer ; and the *awakenings, the heavings of feeling and opinion, the gatherings and conversions* effected by his mission, are only prelusive of that mighty flowing in of nations to the *Church of God*, predicted by the prophet ; and at the sight of whom, she shall "*fear and be enlarged.*" In the name of the Lord we have gone forth, and have not returned empty ; in his name let us go forth again, cheered by the assurance that He who has caused us to hope and to prosper will not suffer us to labour in vain or spend our strength for nought.

To him be honour, and glory, and dominion, for ever and ever. AMEN.
