John F. Farrar of Lincoln, Mass., had a bad

Just as the city clocks in Waltham were

striking four, a man on horseback was seen

statements it appeared that while cultivating in

At the same moment a man on horseback

emerged from a clump of willows at the road-

side. The driver cracked his whip and in a

idly toward the main highway to Waltham.

The father entered the house, and, leaving

his horse where it was, he rushed across the

clearing, jumped the stone wall and placed

up and down the street. In the distance was

seen a man on horseback who was riding

in the same direction which could be seen

any trace of the boy.

The man was paralyzed with fear. He

believed his sudden disappearance of his

CHARLOTTETOWN.

BRUTAL MURDER.
An Old Man Thrown into the River and Drowned.
The Murderer and His Accomplices Look on and Refuse Assistance.
(Special to THE SUN.)
BRIDGEWATER, N. S., July 14.—There is great excitement here over the drowning yesterday afternoon of an old man named Connelly, who lives near this place. As Connelly was walking across Davidson's boom on his way home to his wife, he was thrown into the water by a young man named Joseph Fenner, of Lunenburg, and it was rumored when Connelly arose he stretched out his hands toward Fenner, but the latter rendered him no assistance whatever. The body was found, and a coroner's inquest held this morning. The following verdict was given:—
That deceased came to his death by being willfully thrown off the boom into the water at Davidson's mill by one Joseph Fenner of Lunenburg. The remains of the deceased were shown no signs of violence and were buried this evening by the poor district.

NEWFOUNDLAND.
The Codfishery to be Revolutionized—Great Distress at St. Johns—The Government Asked to Provide Work.
(Special to THE SUN.)
HALIFAX, July 15.—Mail advices from Newfoundland show that there is a great backward for the season and at present appearances will be very little if any improvement over last year, but a new era has been inaugurated in the codfishery that promises to revolutionize the business. The great fish exporting houses of Job Brothers and Johnston & Co. of St. Johns, and John Munn & Co. of Harbour Grace have each decided to send a steamer to the Grand Banks to fish for salmon and sail direct for the Mediterranean markets.

BRITISH POLITICS.

HORRIBLE MURDER.
A Chinaman Perfectly Butchered in Boston.
A Murderer Without an Equal—The Murderer at Large.
BOSTON, July 18.—Bin Chong, a Chinese laundryman, was brutally murdered this morning by an unknown murderer. In the man's head and body were a dozen wounds, and one of which would have been sufficient to have caused instant death. His throat was cut from ear to ear, the head being nearly severed from the body. The body was found in a narrow alleyway, and the murderer has not been identified.
