KEEPING KOGS FRESH.

A poultry fancier writes: The common mode of keeping eggs amongst farmers is either to pack them in straw, sawdust, chaff, oats or bran. none of which ways will keep the eggs fresh for any length of time as they will perspire. You must find some method that will entirely close the pores of the egg, and keep then closed. My plan was simple and not at all expensive; I melted together tallow and mutton fat, then took wing feathers of the fowl and greased every egg, being careful to replace them in the same position as at first, and keep them




