WORK OR BREAD DEMANDED.

Hundreds of Laborers Parade the streets Demanding Employment or Food.

A spectacle, happily never before witnessed in Toronto, started the citizens yesterday morning. Several hundred workmen met in St. Andrew's square in response to this notice:

All laborers out of work are requested to meet at St. Andrew's square at 11.30 sharp, tomorrow, Wednesday, morning.

Over 800 workmen formed in line headed by two of their number, Messrs. Britton and Lamb. Preceded by a drum and a black flag bearing the inscription "Work or Bread," the unemployed marched along King-street to the City Hall.

The market square was quickly filled, nearly 200 being present. After a few remarks from Mr. Italian, who expressed his sympathy, a deputaion went in to the Mayor to speak to the crowd.

Mayor Clarke said he regretted to see so many of his fellow-citizens unemployed. He thought the number greatly in excess of that of any other city in the world.

After some of the unemployed men hit upon the idea of a "work or bread" strike, the police dispersed the crowd, a large number of whom were taken to the police station.

CANADIAN LORE.

Preservation of Interesting Papers Read and Discussed by Toronto Savants.

The Canadian Institute is an organization that is quietly doing an important work for Canada. Organized in 1857, it has during all these years been amassing and arranging facts about Canadian history—not writing history but preparing materials for the historian who will some day blaze the trail through the recently-issued first part of volume one of the Institute's fourth series.

The objects of the institution are more than historical. Quoting the words of Huxley, "In nature there is nothing more or less than the result of a long and arduous struggle."
