

THE EXHIBITION.

The long-talked of Exhibition has come and gone, and Halifax has again settled back into its well worn groove from which it was slightly jostled by the influx of people from all parts of this and adjoining provinces, during the two past weeks. For us to attempt anything beyond the mere summary of the whole affair is impossible, considering our limited space, and the somewhat unfavorable circumstances under which we saw the exhibition. The handsome buildings and grounds were opened to the public on the 21st ult., but as the number of exhibits was not completed before the 27th, the date of the formal opening, many went and returned disappointed, and much dissatisfaction has been expressed, first, that there were two openings, and second, that more complete notice was not given of the nature of the two.
