## Pernicious Literature.

A sixteen year old boy was lately convicted of murder in the first de. gree in New Jersey. It was the occasion of a terrible indictment by a high authority, the presiding judge, of the vie fiction with which our country is flooded. It should arouse public sentiment against the sale of a class of tales sold at almost every street coruer. After speaking of the character of the literature which the boy had read, Judge Deperw aaid that it was the first time he had ever seen such novela, and that he felt it was the most pernicions literature that could possibly fallinto the hands of children. He said, further, that upwards of twenty peonla in the city were engaged in selling such literature to boys and girls, and from an authoritative source he had obtained an estimate of the relative ages of persons brought before the courts for offences involving attempts to rob and steal and similar offences. The figures given were :-Persons charged with larcen 7 under eighteen years, thirty per cent; between eighteen and twenty-three, sixty per cent, making ninety per cent; over twentythree, ten per cent. It is safe to say that of persons charsed with some form of stealing, over sixty per cent are under eighteen years of age.
