## CIPHER CODE.

Having been frequently asked to introduce a "Cipher Code" for the use of our members, we have taken considerable pains to arrange a code which will not only serve the purpose of ordinary mercantile reports, but have so enlarged it as to make it serviceable—both as to secrecy and economy—that it will be found to be of great advantage to our members in their ordinary business transactions.

The economical manner in which telegraphic messages may be transmitted by the aid of this Code will be sufficient inducement for members to the Association, aside from the ordinary benefits to be derived from it, as by use of the "Code" lengthy communications may be reduced to their limits of an ordinary despatch, thereby affording opportunity for obtaining full information at small expense, and saving the time incurred through ordinary correspondence.

The Code can also be utilized in telephonic communication or correspondence by postal card, where secrecy more than despatch is desired.

## DIRECTIONS FOR USING THE CODE.

The sentences have been classified under different headings as much as possible, and should be used wherever applicable, whether under proper heading or not.

Every letter of a word and every word of a message must be spelled and plainly written, as this will save both time and trouble.

In using the Code sentences should be selected regardless of grammatical construction, as the object is "to be understood economically." Sometimes there must necessarily be a word or words too many in a sentence, at other times words may be wanting which will be understood by the context, when translated.

When the singular should be plural and *vice versa*, will be understood between correspondents. Where a dash occurs between the words in a sentence, as in No. 775, on page 20, the omitted word will follow the sentence.

At the end of every classification there are blank spaces for words or sentences that may be required for special use.

The Cipher words contained in the *fifth* column are only to be telegraphed or used.

The *first* column contains the numbers by which the sentences contained in the second column are designated in transmuting them "substitute" or "Cipher word" to a literal meaning.

The *fourth* column contains the numbers by which the "Cipher words" contained in the *fifth* column are designated in transmuting sentences, or words, or figures to Cipher language.

The figures or numbers (1st and 4th column) are only for combinations in working the Cipher, but may be used on postal cards if desired.

The *third* and *sixth* blank columns afford correspondents (by previous understanding and arrangement) the opportunity of having their own private Code to suit themselves, by selecting Cipher words indiscriminately from the fifth column and entering the *numbers* of such words in the *third* column, opposite the sentences which the Cipher words are intended to represent; then entering the *number* of such sentences in the *sixth* column, opposite the Cipher words selected. This is both as to secrecy known as the "Double Code."

Thus sundry persons may even use this same Code, and yet be unable to decipher each other's messages, unless they are in possession of the same combination.

Examples of the different ways the Code may be used :—

1st. In the ordinary way, in which all communications must be made with our Attorneys, unless by special arrangement to the contrary.

*versa, i.e.*, counting a certain number of words forward or backward. For instance, in Example 1, instead of using "Hanger" the sender add five to the number of Hanger (1168), which would make the cipher word Hap; the receiver would deduct five from the number of the Hap (1173), the remaining number would be 1168, the number of the original sentence. The number agreed upon may be varied as often desired.

**Example of the Use of the Double Code.**

If 1664 be written in the *third* column opposite No. 1610, "We can advise you as we are unable to get any reliable information," and be written in the *sixth* column opposite the Cipher word "Laird," the party desiring to telegraph the above sentence will find the written number 1664; then by turning to the *printed* No. 1664 the Cipher word will be found to be "Laird," which being telegraphed the receiver finds the number opposite "Laird" 1610, the number of the original sentence.

In this case correspondents will have to be *sure* that the alterations are exact duplicates. There are other combinations which could be used, but the above will be found quite sufficient for all ordinary purposes.

When any of the subscribers of the Association telegraph to any of our Attorneys for information to be sent by mail, *immediately* send the necessary postage by mail, as they are not expected to pay postage.

Always give *address* and *business* of party enquired about.

Our correspondents will not answer enquiries unless requests are made on our blanks, or per Code,

In corresponding with *Attorneys* the Code can only be used in the Dominion,
