AS TO PROVINCIAL CLAIMS

Ottawa, May 17.—Provincial claims came before the House this morning, and the question of jurisdiction over the three-mile limit developed. Sir Louis Davies said it was a very intricate constitutional question as to whether the Dominion or Provincial authorities had jurisdiction over the three-mile area. The subject is before the Privy Council, and a decision is anxiously awaited.

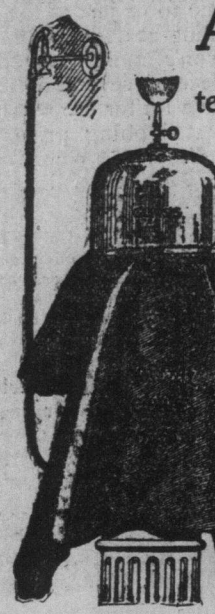
