2nd—An annular Eclipse of the Sun on the first of February, and visible only in the Southern Ocean, Australia, and part of Africa.

3rd—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, July 13, visible in Nova Scotia, as follows :

First contact with Penumbra,	0h. 20m. morn.
First contact with the Shadow,	1 36
Middle of the Eclipse,	3 7
Last contact with Shadow,	4 38
Last contact with Penumbra,	5 54

There will be $8\frac{1}{2}$ digits eclipsed on the southern limb.

4th—A partial Eclipse of the Sun, July 28th, visible in Nova Scotia :—

There will be 4 digits eclipsed on the northern limb.

Planets.

VENUS will be a Morning Star from the commencement of the year 'till the last of September, when she will be in superior conjunction with the Sun, and become a Morning Star for the rest of the year.

MARS will be a Morning Star throughout the year.

JUPITER will be a Morning Star from the commencement of the year till April, when he will be in opposition to the Sun and become an Evening Star to the end of the year.

SATURN will be an Evening Star till April, when he will be in conjunction with the Sun and become a Morning Star till October, when he will be in opposition, and then an Evening Star till the end of the year.

Explanation.

The time of Moon's Rising, Southing, Setting, and Phases ; also, that of High Water, is Halifax mean time. The Equation of Time, and Sun's Declination, are given for apparent noon at Greenwich. The Sun's Rising and Setting are in apparent time.

The time of High Water at other places can be known by that given for Halifax. It takes place—

At Pictou, 1 hour earlier ;	At Sambro $\frac{1}{4}$ hour later ;

Cap I—Grants to Her Majesty certain Salaries for the Lieutenant Governor, Chief Justice and Puisne Judges, Master of the Rolls, Attorney and Solicitor Generals, and Provincial Secretary.—Also, pensions to Miss Cox and Sir Rupert D George.—Salaries and sums to be borne on Civil List and to be payable in Sovereigns at 25s. currency ;

and to commence from 1st January, 1849.—Casual Revenue arising from lease or sale of Crown Lands or Minerals, Fees of the Lieut Governor and Provincial Secretary, and all fines and penalties to be paid into the Treasury.—All Mines surrendered to the Province.—Judges to receive travelling fees only.—Certain arrears of salaries provided. To continue in force until 18 mos. after the demise of Her Majesty.

Cap II—Provides for certain amendments of the Law, and enables the executors or administrators of a deceased to maintain an action for injury to the Real Estate of such person committed in his life time.—Regulates proceedings, &c.

Cap III—Provides for the mode of appointing Sheriffs.—Repeals 1st sec Act 35 Geo 3.

Cap IV—Extends to the Town of Sydney, CB., the several Acts respecting Firewards.

Cap V—Extends to the Town of Sydney, CB., the Act, 10 Vic, relating to Streets and Highways in certain Towns and places.

Cap VI—Provides for the prosecution of any Collector of County Rates improperly retaining money.

Cap VII—Continues the Acts in force for Billeting Troops.

Cap VIII—Applies to the public service of the year 1849 certain monies.

Cap IX—Authorises the Governor in Council to appoint five Commissioners for erecting and building the Trunk Line of Railway from Halifax to Quebec—Defines the powers and duties of Commissioners—Breadth of way given, and Crown lands 10 miles on each side of the Railway vested in Her Majesty, on the line being laid down.

Cap X—Grants Duties of Impost for the support of H M Government in the Province, from 1st April, 1849 to 1st April, 1850.

Cap XI—Continues and amends part of 4 Wm 4, and Act 8 Vict as altered—Regulates importations, &c.

Cap XII—Provides for the collection of the Revenue.

Cap XIII—Further amends the Acts for the more easy Redemption and Foreclosure of Mortgages.

Cap XIV—Incorporation of Halifax—Repeals Acts 4th, 9th and 11th Victoria, with the exception of matter now pending—Regulates the Municipal Elections, Assessments, and control of City property—Repeals Act 3 Vic and Bye-laws for 2 years. To continue in force for 2 years from 1st April, 1849.

Cap XV—Authorises the Governor in Council to appoint one Chief Inspector of Pickled Fish in each County—Regulates their duties—Prescribes the mode of packing and selecting Fish, recovery of penalties, &c.—Returns to be made quarterly.

Cap XVI—Enables the Court of General Sessions of the Peace, upon the application of 20 Rate-payers within any county or district for the support of the Poor, on notice given, to divide such district into so many as may be advisable.

Cap XVII—Amends the Act concerning the performance of Statute Labor on Highways.

Acts of General Assembly—Continued.

Cap XVIII—Includes the Road from Liverpool to Mills Village, and thence to Bridgewater and Mahone Bay, in the provisions of 2nd sec Act 5 Vic.

Cap XIX—Incorporates the Windsor Temperance Hall Company—Not to hold Real Estate of greater value than £5000—Capital to be

held in shares of 50s each—Payment of subscriptions, meetings of the Society, election of officers, and general business of the Society regulated.

Cap XX—Continues and amends the Law regulating the Survey of Timber, Lumber and Shingles—Repeals the Acts 5th Wm 4, except 8, 9, 10, 12, 13 and 18 clauses, and the 11th clause Act 2 Geo 3, and the Act 6 Vict.

Cap XXI—Improves the Law of Evidence, and enacts that crime nor interest shall not incapacitate witnesses.

Cap XXII—Further improves the administration of the Law—Regulates the Sittings for Trial by Jury in Supreme Court, Return of Writs, Judgments, &c.

Cap XXIII—Commissrs. of Bail in the absence or illness of the Judges, invested with full power in relation to the rendering by Bail of the principal.

Cap XXIV—Legalizes certain irregularities in returns of Jurors made under the 2nd section of the 11th Vic.

Cap XXV—Enables the Inhabitants of King's County to raise, by assessment, a sum of money for rebuilding Lock-up-house, Jail, Court-house, &c.

Cap XXVI—Regulates the Pilots and Rates of Pilotage at Pugwash and Wallace, Pictou and such other Ports in the County of Pictou, as shall

Cap XLVII—Vests the legal title to a Baptist Meeting House at Bridgewater in certain Trustees.

Cap I—Applies to the public service of the year 1850, certain monies.

Cap XVI—Enables the Lieutenant Governor, in Council, to regulate Postal arrangements with other Countries, and to establish an uniform rate of Postage in Nova Scotia.

Cap XVII—Amends the 16th section of Probate Law, and causes a reduction in the Fees of the Judges and Registrars.

Cap XVIII—Abolishes the office of Registrar of Deeds for this

Province, and Governor may appoint County Registrars—All other Acts, except those as herein amended, to remain in force.

Cap XXII—Prevents the introduction of convicted felons into this Province.

Cap XXIII—Incorporates the Halifax Mechanics' Institute.

Cap XXIV—Incorporates the Commercial Wharf Company of Yarmouth—Provides that said Company shall not hold at any one time Real Estate over and above £5000—Shares to be personal property.

Cap XXVI—Incorporates the Kerosene Gas Company—Capital 40,000*l.*, to be held in shares of 20*l.* each—Company may supply Dartmouth as well as Halifax with Gas.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Light Duties.

These Duties are levied and allowed under authority of Acts of the
 Provincial Legislature, and are considered very proper exactions; the
 amounts so collected being appropriated to the maintenance of Light
 Houses along the coast. In 1849 these duties amounted to £4297.
 Under these Acts H.M. Ships of War, and vessels employed as Trans-
 ports or Storeships for the conveyance of Troops, or Military Stores,
 or otherwise in the service of H. M. Government, are exempt.

Every ship or vessel, registered in the Province, when cleared at any Custom House in the Province, per ton, 4 4-5d.

A certificate of the payment of which will exempt from any further payment to 31st March following the date of the certificate.

No duties payable when the vessel shall be departing for sale on her first voyage.

Every ship or vessel coming into any port or place out of the Province, per ton, 4 4-5d.

The Commissioners having control of this branch of the public service, expended, in 1849, the sum of £5,458 7 8; amount of duties, &c. received, £5119 13 2. The deficiency was paid out of the general Revenue of the Province.

The Impost and Excise Duties collected in 1849, under the authority of an Act of the Provincial Legislature, amounted to £57,577 14s. 5d. sterling. The sum of £3,193 14s. 6d. sterling, tonnage duties, in support of Light Houses, was also collected—making a gross Revenue of £60,771 8s. 11d. sterling, or £76,964 6s. 1¾d. currency.

Product of Coal Mines.

The Coal raised by the General Mining Association, from the several Mines in Nova Scotia, including Cape Breton, in 1849, ending Decr. 31, amounted to : of large coal, 53,003 chaldrons and 9½ bushels, Newcastle measure ; and of siftings or slack, 6945 chaldrons and 8½ bushels—making in all 59,943 chaldrons and 11½ bushels. Of this amount nearly 35,000 chaldrons were shipped to the United States. The consumption of the Province appears to be under 14000 chaldrons.

in all, upwards of One Hundred Thousand Pounds - that one year with another they have expended in the Province upwards of Eighty Thousand Pounds per annum, making more than a Million and a half Pounds during 20 years ; and that the establishments are equal to the production of four times the quantity of coal they can find sale for."

The Fisheries.

IMPORTS.—The Pickled Fish imported into the Province, in 1849, amounted to 17,181 barrels ; of Dry, 80,963 qtls. ; of Smoked, 4,570 boxes ; of Fish Oil, 297 tierces.

EXPORTS.—The Exports amounted at the same time to 236,028 barrels of Pickled Fish ; of Dry, 245 620 qtls. ; of Smoked, 27,431 boxes ; of Fish Oil, 825 tuns.

From Halifax alone 87,355 barrels Mackarel (various brands), 3,537 ditto Herrings, and 1893 of Salmon, were shipped to Ports in the United States.

The Fisheries in 1849 were not near so productive as in former years. During the Spring and Summer of 1850 the catch was large, and of excellent quality. We have no means, however, at this time, of ascertaining the amount.

Judicial Establishment.

The united Salaries of the Chief Justice, Puisne Judges, Master of the Rolls, Attorney General, Solicitor General, and Clerk of the Crown, including contingent and accidental expenses, amounted, in 1849, to £5,129 10 5 sterling, or £6412 3 0½ currency.

Ecclesiastical Establishment.

The total expenditure in support of this Establishment, in 1849, was £6,187 10 sterling, or £7,734 7 6 currency. No portion of this amount was borne by the Colony, nor is the Colony chargeable with any expense on such account. Of this amount—

Pensions and Pensioners.

The whole amount absorbed by Pensions is £1560 sterling-- which in the opinion of the Editor of the "People's Almanack," is £1560 too much.

The fortunate individuals among whom this amount is divided, are :
Miss Cox, daughter of the late Rev. Dr. Cox, formerly President of King's College, Windsor, receives £200 sterling a year, in consideration of the services of her father.

John George Marshall, Thomas Ritchie, and William Q. Sawers, late Judges of the Courts of Common Pleas in the Eastern and Western Districts of Nova Scotia, and Cape Breton, under an Act of the Provincial Legislature, receive a pension of £240 sterling a year, in consideration of the abolition of these Courts.

Mrs. Lavinia Burnyeat receives £50 sterling, under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of H. M. Treasury, as Widow of the late Rev. Mr. Burnyeat, Episcopalian Missionary in this Province. Pension granted 1st July, 1843.

Mrs. Eliza Veits, £50 sterling a year, for a like consideration.

Sir Rupert D. George, Bart., receives £400 sterling, per annum, for services as Provincial Secretary—he having been forced to retire from office through political considerations.

Thomas Crawley, Sydney, C. B., receives £100 sterling, per annum, for services as Surveyor General of Cape Breton, he having been compelled to retire from office by the re-construction of the Land Department; and

Henry W. Crawley, Sydney, C. B., receives £240 sterling, per annum, commuted allowance as Commissioner of Crown Lands for Cape Breton, incident to the change in the Department.

Civil Establishment.

The united salaries of the Lieutenant Governor and all the Civil Officers, exclusive of those of the Customs' Department, but including contingent and accidental expenses, amounted, in 1849, to £13,692 8 1 sterling, or £17,115 7 7½ currency.

Customs' Establishment.

Total expenditure in this Establishment, in 1849, £5,122 1 2 stg., or £6,402 11 5½ currency. This expense is borne by the Imperial Government, and is paid from funds over which the Colony has no control.

Consolidation of the Laws.

This long and ardently wished for reform, has at length found favor in the eyes of the people's Representatives. An Act was passed in 1846, authorising the revision and consolidation of the Laws of the Province. Commissioners were appointed, viz : William Young, Crofton Uniacke, John W. Ritchie, and Joseph Whidden, Esquires ; and Hon. Jonathan McCully, to perform this onerous and responsible labour ; and we are happy to learn that the work is now well nigh ready for the final action of the Legislature and Government.

Taxes.

No part of the Revenue of Nova Scotia is derived from direct taxes. The Revenue arises from duties levied upon articles imported into the Country. Until recently they were of two kinds—Customs and Impost—the former collected under the Act of the Imperial Parliament 8 & 9 Vict. cap 93, for Regulating the Trade of the British Possessions abroad, and the Act in amendment thereof ; and the latter by authority of an Act of the Provincial Legislature, passed 21st March, 1848. By an arrangement with the Imperial Government this distinction has ceased to exist—the Impost now being entirely Colonial.

CAPE BRETON

The Mails for Sydney, CB., are made up and forwarded by the Steamers bound to Newfoundland.

MEMORANDUM.

All Letters conveyed by Post in British America are rated according to weight, commencing with half an ounce at one rate, one ounce at two rates ; and doubling on every ounce.

Newspapers to and from the United Kingdom, Bermuda and Newfoundland, free. Newspapers, not exceeding two ounces in weight, conveyed by Mail, overland, through Nova Scotia, Canada, New Brunswick, and P. E. Island, subject to a postage of one half-penny.
