BYE-LAWS
OF THE
Board of Home Missions.

1st. At all the meetings of the Board or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be Chairman of the Board, and the Very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be, ex-officio, Vice-Chairmen. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

3rd. The Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairmen, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the Board, who shall fill the same offices in the Committees; of all clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, together with twenty Laymen, to be chosen by the Diocesan Synod. At each ordinary meeting of the Synod, one-half of the whole number of lay members of the Board shall go out of office, but they or any of them shall be eligible for re-election; the new members, having been proposed, seconded and elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list. No one shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its funds of at least one dollar.

4th. The Board shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July, or at the time of meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the general meeting of members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or, in his absence, by a Vice-Chairman.

5th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the Board, by forming Local Committees

under the direction of their respective clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the Board.

6th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Board as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention :—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Board, shall then have received the approval of the Board; and lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Board, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid for the objects.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects.

7th. The Accounts of the Board shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from the time, by auditors to be appointed by the Board.

8th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at an Ordinary Meeting of the Synod; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
Board of Home Missions.

It is not a very agreeable duty which is imposed upon the Board, in presenting their Fifth Annual Report, to continue the lament of the past few years that the condition of the Funds is far from satisfactory. Unhappily the truth must be told, and while there has been some improvement in the amount of the year's deficit, in contrast with the two preceding years, it has been due to a reduction of the Expenditure and not to an increase in the Receipts, which have been found, even with the strictest economy, very inadequate to meet the needs of the Diocese, and, consequently, a further indebtedness has had to be incurred. It is a simple matter of arithmetic that \$4125 of Receipts cannot pay \$5152 of Expenditure.

Recognizing that it would be folly to add still further to the accumulated debt, which now, after allowing for the special efforts that secured \$1050 towards its liquidation, amounts to about \$3500, the Board were compelled to give notice that after the 31st December, 1881, the Missionaries' Grants must be subjected to a ten per cent reduction, thus diminishing their liabilities at the expense of the already poorly paid clergy, who are now suffering from that unavoidable reduction.

The financial difficulties of the Board have been increased by the withdrawal of £700 stg. from the Block Sum S. P. G., which was £2000 stg. last year, and is now £1300 stg., so that nearly \$3500 a year has, in this way, been lost to the Diocese. It was understood when an agreement was made between the Society and the Diocese that the reduction should be £100 stg. a year, but this amount not having been withdrawn regularly, justifies the S. P. G., so it thinks, in making the larger reduction at the present time. The Board think otherwise, and through His Lordship the Bishop of the Diocese protested against this action, but the appeal, they regret to say, has proved unavailing. Serious as this loss is, the Board fear that the work in

other lands and in our own North-West may lead the Society, at no distant day, to still further reduce the Block Sum.

There is this very serious consideration which the Board fully recognize, but which they have felt themselves powerless to deal with, namely, that any further diminution of the Missionaries' Incomes will probably lead to the removal of some of the most excellent of our clergy from the Diocese, the Incomes here not being sufficiently large to give them and their families an adequate support, and being less than those obtainable elsewhere. The Board issued an appeal to the Missions whose clergy were sufferers by the reduction, naming the amount of loss in each case, and urging the Parishioners to make it good. They are glad to know that in several cases their appeal has already borne fruit, and they trust that it will do so in all.

It cannot be expected that this Diocese will be able to retain its best men if the smallness of the Incomes make it impossible for the clergy to live in any decency and free from debt, while in other places the stipends are larger and are being gradually increased, and the Board hope the Laity will consider this important feature of the subject before it be too late. It remains for the Church people of the Diocese to put forth greater efforts than heretofore to increase the funds, so that the work of the Church may not be seriously and permanently injured. There are now seven vacant Missions in the Diocese which His Lordship the Bishop cannot fill for want of funds.

The Board have amended the "Quebec Scheme" in a few particulars, which they trust will be mutually acceptable and advantageous to the Missionaries and their people. It will be found in its proper place, and they ask for it the careful attention of all.

The Board have again to call attention to the seventh Bye-Law, the intention of which they cannot but believe is still misunderstood; and they also wish to repeat their suggestion of last year, that the Annual Collections be made before the 31st October in each year, as the whole amount ought to be in the Treasurer's hands before the 31st December. The Board also wish to urge upon the clergy the importance of having regard to the fifth Bye-Law, which refers to a local Committee in each Parish for the purpose of furthering the interests of the Fund.

The Board have pleasure in acknowledging a Legacy of \$240 from the late William Hierlihy, of Antigonishe, towards the Clergy Superannuation Fund, and have to regret that the members of the Church do not more frequently in their Wills remember the important work in which they are engaged, either generally or in some one of their branches.

- The Report of the Widows' and Orphans' Committee will be found

appended, and its careful perusal is urgently requested. It laments that the Pensions have had to be reduced from \$100 to \$75 for the past half year, and is in other particulars an important document.

The Treasurer's statements of the several Funds, as also the Investments held for each, are herewith submitted, and will be found in its proper place.

It will be as well, perhaps, to state that any apparent discrepancy between the Lists and the Statement of Receipts arises from the fact that all monies paid to the Treasurer between the 31st October of one year and the 31st October of the next year constitute the Receipts for the General Purposes of the Board for that year, while the Treasurer's Financial Statement is made up to the 31st December of each year.

It will also be well to explain that as there are vacancies to be filled and other changes to be made in the Board and Committees, the publication of the Report has been delayed this year until after the meeting of Synod, otherwise it would have been issued in February.

REPORT OF THE

Widows' and Orphans' Committee

TO THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS.

The Committee beg to report that they have been obliged to reduce the Pensions for the past half year from the rate of \$200 to \$150 per annum, owing to the insufficiency of the receipts to pay more. They cannot but feel that the clergy themselves are to blame for this unfortunate state of affairs. Out of the ninety-five clergy of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island but forty-five, or less than one-half, are insured in the Fund; and while the number has materially increased this year, still only forty have felt sufficiently interested to take up collections in their Parishes in its behalf. It seems far from right that so little interest should be taken by the Clergy generally in this Fund, and that they should allow the small Pensions on which, in some cases, the widows and orphans of their deceased brethren largely depend, to be reduced.

There are now thirteen widows who have a claim on the Pensions, requiring at \$150 a year \$1,950, and at \$200 a year \$2,600.

The Interest on Invested Funds amounts to about \$1,250 a year, Premiums of the Clergy about \$500 more, so that not more than \$850 is required to pay the larger amount. If the whole of the Clergy were insured the Premiums would amount to about \$1,200 yearly, and an average of \$10 each from the Parishes would enable the Committee to increase the Pensions to \$250 or \$300 a year.

Every Clergyman in the Diocese ought to be on the Fund, and in every Parish *at least* one collection each year should be taken up for its benefit.

The available Funds for 1881 were \$3,134.03, derived from the following sources:—

The charges upon the Fund were \$2,567.78.

The amount received for Premiums of the Clergy was exceptionally large, owing to two new applicants having to pay back Premiums to quite a large amount. The Collections and Donations were also this year very much larger than usual, due to Special Collections and a very liberal response having been made in St. Luke's, St. Paul's, and the Bishop's Chapel, Halifax, and in a few of the country churches.

NOTE.—The following memo. may help to explain the present position of the Fund :

We began the year 1881 with a balance of \$292.61. There were several special collections and donations during the last half of that year. There was a balance left at the end of 1881 of \$566.25. This sum, together with the Premiums, &c., coming in during the first part of 1882, enabled the Committee to pay the Pensions in advance, though at a reduced rate, up to the end of June, 1882. There is now in hands about \$800, which, with the probable income due from Investments, &c., during the last half of 1882, will, it is hoped, be sufficient to meet the Pensions, without reduction, payable in July next, up to December 31st, 1882.

REPORT OF THE

Board of Foreign Missions.

The Board of Foreign Missions have to report that since the last meeting of Synod, very important changes have taken place in relation to their work. At the meeting of Provincial Synod in 1880, two Mission Boards were appointed, one called the Board of Domestic Missions, to include Algoma and the North West, the other, the Board of Foreign Missions, with special reference to work among the Heathen outside Canada. Your Board were asked to co-operate with each of these new organizations, but much as they felt disposed to do so, they made answer that having been appointed by the Synod of the Diocese a Board of Foreign Missions, with certain aims and powers, they felt in duty bound to do nothing in the matter without first consulting the Body which gave them existence, and whom they represented.

They, therefore, first, desire to present a statement of Receipts and Expenditures for the past year, which shows \$441.76 received, being a decrease as compared with the previous year, and \$474.03 expended; and a balance in the Treasurer's hands on the 1st January, 1882, of \$712.58. With reference to this balance it may be said, that it does not belong to the General Fund, but the largest part of it has been contributed by a few persons for the support of the "living voice," in the Foreign Field, and may at any moment (soon we trust) be asked for and withdrawn for that purpose. The Board regret the decrease in the income, but trust that under the proposed new arrangement a stimulus will be given to the cause of Missions which will greatly increase the receipts in the future. They further would suggest that the Board of Foreign Missions as now constituted, act as the two Committees asked for by the Central Board in Montreal, to represent the corresponding Committee of Domestic Missions for the Diocese of Nova Scotia, and that the funds now in the Treasurer's hands, which have not been named by the donors for special objects, be equally divided between the two Boards.

The Board also recommend that a missionary sermon should be

preached in every Parish each year, after which a collection shall be made on behalf of Foreign Missions, including Algoma, and that steps should be taken by all the Clergy to bring before their congregations from time to time the bounden duty of the Church, and of every member thereof, to take part in the propagation of the Gospel among the heathen.

The Board recommend the Synod to guarantee the \$300, assessed upon the Diocese for the support of the Bishop of Algoma, and the Board will undertake to raise the required amount. The Board cannot close their report without referring to the almost sudden removal of the first Missionary Bishop of the Canadian Church, the late Rt. Rev. Frederick D. Fauquier, Bishop of Algoma, whose lamented death, they fear, was greatly accelerated by the many difficulties which he had to encounter in obtaining the support necessary for his work, added to the arduous duties of his extensive and difficult Diocese.

Thank God his work remains, and his noble self-devotion, unwearied labors, and premature death, have aroused, let us hope, the whole Canadian Church to a larger sense of her responsibility. Already have they borne fruit, and his mantle has fallen upon a worthy successor, whose self-sacrifice in accepting the position augers well, under God for his future career. The Rev. Dr Sullivan, Rector of St. George's Church, Montreal, has now been consecrated and set apart for his work as Second Bishop of Algoma, let it be our aim to help him to the utmost of our ability both with our prayers and means.

RETURNS FROM PARISHES AND EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS.

Albion Mines—Increase, \$14.35. Mr. Moore writes :

“ Learning that it is the wish of the Board that its Missionaries should do something more than send up Statistics, I have much pleasure in stating that during the past year this Mission has done better than could have been expected. Our loss by the explosion of the Foord Pit in November, 1880, was less than that of any of the Denominations, and although we have lost Mr. Hudson and his family by his resignation of the Manager's berth, we have cause to be thankful that his successor (Mr. Rutherford) and his family are members of the Church, and take also an interest in its growth and prosperity. More than \$1,600 have been collected and spent over and above the Missionary's income. About \$900 on a chancel to the Parish Church, \$600 and over on the unfinished Church in New Glasgow, and over \$150 have been remitted to Halifax for the Board of Home Missions, Board of Foreign Missions, Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and Superannuation Fund. There is credible talk of opening new mines of iron and coal; if this come to pass I shall have to ask the Board to help to provide an Assistant Missionary. My time is fully taken up now, and I can only give Westville (a large village) two week-day services a month, and for the Vale Colliery I have as yet been able to do nothing; therefore, for any new settlements that grow up (and grow up I am convinced they will) more clerical labour must be provided, Mr. Pritchard does good service as Lay Reader when I am away from New Glasgow, and has undertaken a Depositary to the S. P. C. K. His work as Lay Reader is entirely gratuitous, and I beg leave here to express my heartfelt thanks for his help.”

Out of this, the sum of \$4.45 is for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the remainder for general purposes."

Bridgewater—Increase, \$23.52. Mr. Gelling writes:

"Notice having been given that a further reduction in the grants may be necessary, in sending our annual report, we are led to review our money matters. Bridgewater is sending in this year the sum of about \$120, which is largely in excess of any former year. In the last report we have a list of Parishes where the Church property has been insured. This Parish is omitted, although we have an insurance of \$2,000; and at the request of the Board, St. James' Church is now also insured for \$300. Every friend of the Society will be very sorry to find that we have a decreasing income, and hence there has been a reduction of grants, and an appeal for increased subscriptions. There appears to be a twofold remedy, to make our expenses less and our income larger. We would beg leave to suggest that a clergyman be appointed annually to each Deanery to speak to the people on the duty of giving. As this work could be done free from expense, and be a labour of love, not pleasant but profitable, we would thus fill up the place now left vacant by the former secretary, and save a large sum, and that with the prospect of an increased income. The clergyman thus commissioned by his Lordship the Bishop, would be able to enforce money matters in a manner not always done at present. It would tend to make the reports of more interest, and tend to their own careful preservation, if the rules were only occasionally printed, and the intermediate reports made the means of describing the Parishes and their wants."

"Your post card came duly to hand informing me that you had not received our subscription to the B. H. M. for this year;—if by this year you mean 1881, I think you are mistaken; if you mean 1882, you are quite right. The most of my parishioners are ship carpenters, poor farmers and labourers, and it is utterly impossible to collect money from them at this season of the year. I explained to the former Secretary, Archdeacon Gilpin, long ago that it was quite useless to attempt a subscription list in my Parish in January. I think for a poor Parish we have done all that ought to be expected of us. Since 1865, with very little help, there has been built a Church at Tatamagouche at a cost of about \$2,500, and Church on Tatamagouche Road worth about \$2,000, the Rectory worth about \$3,000, and this present year we have finished and consecrated the new Parish Church at River John, which has cost us not less than \$3,500. So I do think that (when what has been done is taken into consideration, viz., that within the last 17 years there has been added to the property of the Parish the sum of \$11,000, besides the amount contributed to the expenses of the Parish and the minister's salary, and since my incumbency about \$25.00 annually to the D.C.S. (or B. H. M.) the Board of Home Missions will not forsake us in the hour of our greatest need, and at a time when we have a brighter future I believe ahead of us. I will do all in my power early in the Spring to send in a larger list of subscriptions to the B. H. M. than we have ever sent. I think we can make up about \$40.00 or \$50.00, if all is well. I assure you that it is not for want of interest in the B. H. M., or for want of zeal on my part, that we have not sent our subscriptions' for 1882, but on the contrary I know that we can do much more in a few months than at the present time."

they are, for the most part, not in funds, and however willing, are not able to give. For this reason we are late in forwarding names and money,—I hope, however, not too late to have them inserted in your Report. Our Mission has been divided by Lockeport, &c., having been erected into a separate Parish; that of course makes a difference. It at the same time takes something from our contribution to the B. H. M., and adds upwards of \$180.00 to the financial burdens of this Parish for the support of a Curate. The B. H. M. will be glad to learn that their Missionary, my Curate, in this Parish is most indefatigable in his labours in season and out of season, is doing a good work, and is gaining, or rather has gained, the esteem and confidence of his people. And for myself I feel very thankful for such a Curate and Coadjutor. I beg leave to state that our Church and Parsonage are insured for \$1,500.00, a small sum indeed but we could not manage to do more this year. Of course my work is well nigh done, being now 79 years of age, and having laboured in the ministry 52 1-2 years, 44 of which have been spent in this Parish wherein I was born. On New Year's day, the anniversary of my Incumbency, in order to give the people some idea of the changes that had taken place during that long period, I mentioned another things that there had been 2837 baptisms, 871 burials, 655 marriages, and that of the 60 communicants that were on the Roll when the present Rector took charge, not one is now alive. A merciful GOD still spares me to do something in His Vineyard for His Glory and the good of souls. During the past year I have said prayers 196 times, and preached 135 times, administered Holy Communion 24 times in Church, and in private to the sick and infirm 26 times, made 99 visits to families, and 88 to outstations, with baptisms, marriages and burials, and travelled 1750 miles. The Mission, when it came into my charge, had one church, and extended over the whole County. Now there are five good buildings and another in progress, wholly *our own*, besides two others of which we are *part* owners; and the Mission itself into three."

Several have doubled their donations, others have increased theirs, but, unfortunately, we

sustain a loss of about \$11 by deaths and removals, so that the actual increase will be about \$30; and if we were to add the \$11 collection when you were here, and the \$22 towards the Deficiency Fund, the total sent by Weymouth will be about \$175.00. This amount, you can well understand, is not obtained without considerable exertion on the part of collectors."

APPENDIX.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND, DIOCESAN SYNOD.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased clergymen, but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special account for this object, to be called the Widows and Orphans' Fund. This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all premiums received under these Rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object and no other.

2nd. A Standing Committee of seven members shall be appointed in whom, together with the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions (who shall be paid as Secretary of this Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this matter, subject to an appeal to the general Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay out of this Widows and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following Rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese, wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall within one year from taking Orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a Certificate of Pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant after such period of time shall only be permitted to receive such Certificate at the option of the Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every Clergyman applying for a Certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application. It being understood that any Parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the Minister or Ministers for that year.

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time, he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a Certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within 40 days after the payment becomes due, all claim to the pension under his Certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desires to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to re-admit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Removal of the Clergyman from this Diocese, except in the case of any Clergyman who shall become a Missionary of the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese, or who undertakes work in Algoma while a Missionary Diocese, forfeits all claim to the pension: Seventy-five per cent. of the amount of premiums paid by the holder of the Certificate himself, shall be returned to him upon the surrender of his Certificate.

11th. If any Clergyman shall go beyond the limits of Europe, or of North America 35° North latitude, without the leave of the Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of \$100 per annum during widowhood.

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

It shall be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object, and none other.

No. 2.—A Standing Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as Chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund shall make application to the Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension (not exceeding \$200) as they think expedient. But should the Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the General Meeting of the Board.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from the falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner resides out of this Diocese, sufficient proof of his identity should accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at an ordinary meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

W. AND O. FUND RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Continued from page 48.

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the Sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their so doing, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again, the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if female; while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

15th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall at his death receive the pension, under the above limitation as to ages.

16th. The pension shall be payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year; and shall commence on the first of these days which shall happen after the decease of such person holding a Certificate, and terminate on the first of those days

which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The Clergy of Prince Edward Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The Certificate to be granted shall be in the following form, under the seal of the Synod and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules or Regulations shall be altered except at a regular meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

The Widows' and Orphans' Committee do not consider the fund responsible for the payment of a larger pension than the \$100 named in the certificate.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following rules for the guidance of the Endowment Committee were adopted May 17th, 1850:—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent, or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance of trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Synod.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or

Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission during the continuance of such suspension.

V. The Endowment Committee shall hold any sum contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission: and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Committee, such opportunity or proposition for endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the General Meeting of the Board, at their meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Committee for aid shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Board of Home Missions in its favor, in such Mission: and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Committee to form a correct judgment; all such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions, who is *ex officio* Secretary of the Endowment Committee.

The Endowment Committee, in a Report May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

“That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its *Reserved Fourths* and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Board and the interest be payable to the incumbent.”

“With reference to the control of the Board over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in

any way with the rights of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved Fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Board to be held under the same Rules and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment."

The first recommendation was adopted; the second is still under consideration.

QUEBEC SCHEME

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Clause 1.—Where there is no special condition, all grants shall be made for three years, from the first of the month preceding or following the date; yet the Board may, for what it considers good and sufficient reasons, discontinue a grant after six months' notice. In every case the grants shall cease at the expiration of the three years, unless renewed at least six months before their termination.

Clause 2.—All Parishes or Missions receiving aid from the Board shall, by their Wardens or other Representatives, pay into the funds of the Board, through the Secretary, at least one month before the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 30th December, in each year, such amount as may by mutual consent be arranged between themselves and the Board. Provided always, that the Board, if in any case it is satisfied that half-yearly payments would be more for the interests of all parties concerned than quarterly, may frame their agreement with the Parish accordingly.

Clause 3.—At the beginning of every quarter, to wit, on 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, and 1st January, the Secretary shall accept the order of the Missionary for the preceding quarter's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties. But where half-yearly payments have been allowed, the Secretary, at the expiration of the six months, if the amount due from the people has not been paid up, shall only accept the order for the amount of the Society's grant for that period.

remittances when due, the Secretary shall at once make enquiries by letter, or, if thought necessary, shall visit in person; or a deputation may be sent to enquire into the cause of such default, and report to the Board. Should the amount due from the Parish not be paid within three months from the date at which it becomes due under the agreement with the Board, the grant shall cease, and it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to make no further payments; nor shall the grant be renewed until the arrears due at the time of the cessation be paid up.

Clause 5.—The aim of the Board is, and it should be that of the Missions themselves, to make the Missions as quickly as possible self-sustaining, in order that the funds of the Board may be applied to the opening of new Missions, and to the extension of the work throughout the Diocese.

Clause 6.—In furtherance of the objects of the Board, it requires that each of its Missionaries shall take care that every eligible person within their respective Missions be solicited to contribute to the General Fund of the Board, and that quarterly returns of the amount of such contributions shall be made by the Missionary to the Secretary in Halifax.

Clause 7.—The Board, for reasons which it shall deem good, may allow a Parish or Mission to pay a certain specified amount of their Incumbent's salary in kind, at *cash* prices, and his receipt for the sum in the form of a bill of items, shall be counted by the Wardens or Representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the Parish or Mission; and may also allow the receipt of the clergyman for money given at the offertory to be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Board from the people.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information:—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.

4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.

5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.

6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Board of Home Missions that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from the Board without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Board to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Committee receive and hold any money given in trust for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Board.

"The Board will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

"All subscription lists received before the 31st December in each year will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

"If the reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Board."

The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

"All applications for aid from this Board are proposed at one meeting of the Board and considered at the next."

"No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Board, nor to be elected a member, who has not been a subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

At the General Meeting in 1839 the following Resolution was adopted:—

“The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz.: one by the parish, one by the Board of Home Missions, and another by those two.”

AN ACT to vest in the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia the Funds held by the D. C. S.

Whereas, At a meeting of the D. C. S. held in the month of July, 1876, it was resolved, &c., &c.

And whereas, At the General Session of the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, held in the same month, the said resolution was adopted by the Synod.

And whereas, It is considered expedient in order to carry such (resolution) into effect, that an Act be passed to vest in the said Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia all real and other property held in trust by or for the said D. C. S.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows:

1. All property, real and personal, held by or in trust for the D. C. S. or other funds respectively connected therewith, are hereby declared to have become vested in the Diocesan Synod of N. S. in trust, to be held and managed for the several purposes for which they have heretofore been held and managed by the D.C.S., as fully and effectually as the same were previously vested in or held in trust for said D. C. S.

2. The said Synod shall be bound to fulfil all engagements made by the said Society previous to such transfer, and to observe all the conditions under which the several funds may have been held in trust by the said Society.

3. In all cases where moneys of D. C. S. have been loaned on mortgage in this Province for the benefit of any trust funds in connection with said Society, and in all like cases it shall and may be lawful in case of the payments of the amounts due on such mortgages, for the said Synod to discharge such mortgages, by writing under their seal, and thereby the mortgagers, their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns shall be fully discharged from all further liability on account of such mortgages.

4. The receipt of the Treasurer of the Synod shall be a sufficient discharge to the Treasurer of the said Society for all moneys and securities transferred by him
