



A BACHELOR'S CONSOLATIO From Saturday's Second Edition. ----FOREIGN FIRE PROSPECTUR (Special Telegram to the Tribune.) Mat hell Repudiates False Charges-Shipping ; Surveyors, for St. John

and Pictou. OTTAWA, May 23. Yesterday, in Public Accounts Commitec, Mr. Mitchell brought up a statement elegraphed to the St. John Telegraph refuting charges to be brought by Mr. Mc. Leod, with respect to the sale of property in Newcastle and Chatham for Custon Houses, and which alleged that exhorbitant prices had been paid. Mr. Mitchell mphatically denied the insinuations contained in the statement, and showed that the fact would bear the strictest investigation. With reference to the property of his own sold to the Government it was taken without his consent and valued by proper officers. The property was worth far more than he received for it. These are the same charges brought by Hutchinson two years ago, and which Mitchell effectually de-

olished in the Senate. His explana tions were so satisfactory to the committee that McLeod did not go on with the matter.


