An Act to provide for the succession of Trustees of the Church and Marise property belonging to St. Andrew's Church, Fergus, and to rectify the titley thereto; as also to authorize the Trustees of the Glebe of the said Cburch to sell the undisposed of residuc thereof.

$V_{1}$HEREAS, on or abnut the twenty-eighth day of June, in the year Preamble: of our Lord, one thousand eight Lundred and thirty-seren. the late Monorable Adam Ferguson, torether with James Webster, Esquire, Mid exceute two certain Deeds for the purpose of conveying to certain 5 Trustees, therein named respectively, the lands following, that is to say: Firstly, all and singular, that certain parcel or tract nf land, and premises situate, Iying and being in the Village of Fergus, in :l.e Township of Nichal, County of ILalton, Gore Dist:ict, and Provisce ef Upper Canada, now in the said Village of Fergus, Counly of Wellington, and
10 Province of Canuil:, and known and described as that piece of ground on which the then St. Andrew's Church stood, as the sante vas thais enclosed, and on which the now St. Andrev's Cherch Las sinee ben erected, and sitiate on the north-west side of St. G.oorge Street, fronting Tower Strect, and butted and bounded as follnirs, that is to say: com-
15 mencing at the southerly angle of the said enclosure, thence north sixty degrees, thinty minutes west, two chains seventy eight links, more or less, to where a post has been planted, thence north tweuty-nine degreos thirty minutes east, two chains, more or less, to where a post has been planted; thence south sixty degrees thirty minutes east, two chains
20 seventy-eight links, more or less, to where a post has been planted on the north-west side of St. George Street; thence south twenty-nive degrees thirty minutes west, tro chains, more or less, to the place of beginning, and containing, by admeasurement, two roods, eight ierches and twenty-nine square yards, he the same more or less; And, Secondiy,
25 all and singular, that certain other parcel or tract of land and piemises situate, lying and being iu the said Village of Fergus, and known and described as the manse lot attached to St. Andrew's Church, Fergus, on the north-west side of North St. George Street, and butted and bounded as follows, that is to say: commencing where a post had been
30 planted at the southerly angle of said lot at the junction of St. David Street and North St. George Strect, thence north twenty-nine degrees thirty minutes cast, two chains and fifty links, more or less, along the north west side of North St. George Suree to where a post has been planted, thence north seventy degrees thirty minutes west, four chains, mnre or
35 less, to where a post has been planted; thence south twenty-nine degrees thirty minutes west, two chains and fifty links, more or less, to where a post has been planted on the north-east side of St. David Strect; thence south sixty degrees thirty minutes east, two chains, more or less; along the side of St . - To hoid with the appurtenances $t$ ) such Trustees and their succersors in office for ever; but the manner of the appointment of such suc-
cessors in office is not specified in such deeds of conveyance, and it is desirable to provide therefor, and to rectify such deeds accordingly:

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legisioit:o Council and Assembiy of Canada, enacts as follows:

Mode. de., of 1. The successors in office of such Trustees as aforesaid shall be apappointment of Saccessors pointed in mamer following, that, is to say: The body of Trustees shall te present Trustees. be composed of the said James Webster and of Thomas Williams Valentine, Esquire, (they being tae only members of the original body of Trustees of the said lands who are now living and in connection with the said church) and of Gilbert Meriot Todd, John Moffatt, Thomas Milne, 10 Nloxander Dingwall Fordyce, John Watt, Alexander Sherriffs Cadenhead, and Archibald Mcintyre, (being, in all, nine in number). On occasion of a vacancy of office by either of the said remaining original Trustees, James Webster or Thomas Williams Valentine, whether by death, incapacity, resignation, or ceasing to adhere to the said church, 15 such racancy shall not be fillew up, but the mumber of the body of the Trustecs shall be reduced accordingly io eight, or to seven, as the case may he; of the other Trustees, the two whose names follow next in order after those of the said two remaining original Trustees, shall cease to hold office as such at the muual moeting of the congregation of the 20 said church, in the year of sur Lor!, one thousand eight hum sed and sixty-three, and two other Irustces, in their place, shall be cl sen by the said congregation at such annual meeting, or at some other subsequent mecting thereof, to be specialiy held for the purpose. The Trustees so racating office shal' be eligible for re-election. The names of 25 the Trustees so to be chosen by such congregation shall be placed at the foot of the list of the general body of such Trustees. The like general practice shall, from time to time, be continued thereafter in each succeeding year, the two Trustees (other than the two remaining original Trustees) at the head of the list at the time of every such 30 annual mecting ceasing thercupon to hold office as such, and others being chosen in their place in manner aforesaid, but those ceasing to hold office being re-eligible as a.oresaid. If any vacancy in such borly of Trustees (other than in the case of such tro remaining original Trustees as aforesaid) shall occur, whether by death, incapacity, resignation or 35 ceasing to adhere to the said chorch, between any two such annual mectings, a Trustee shall be appointed by the remaining Trustees, to fill such vacancy until the next annual meeting. At such next meeting, or at some other subsequent special meeting to be held for the purpose, the appointment of such new Trustee shall either be confirmed or disal- 40 lowed, and if disallowed another shall be appointed in his place. Such new Trustee shall stand in the same order on the general list of Trustees, and be subject to the same conditions relative to vacating office and reelection as the person in whose place he has been appointed would have done.

New Deeds 2. It shall not be necessary, in the case of any change in such Trusnot necessary teeship, for any deeds of the said lands to be made by any former Trustec or Trustees to any succeeding such.
