# HISTORICAL SKETCH

OF THE

CITY OF LONDON, C. W.

PRIOR to the year eighteen hundred and twenty seven had a spectator been able from a sufficient elevation to survey the extensive location occupied by what is now the city of London, he would have beheld a scene of unbroken wilderness, as it had been from ages unknown. So early as 1796 this district was reserved for a town, to bear its present name, by Governor Simcoe; but for many years it remained in its primal condition till human industry disturbed the solitude. Where the Court House stands the timber was heavy,—Oak, Elm, and Maple being the prevailing kinds; below Dundas Street towards the river, were swamps, shaded more or less by black ash; while generally to the north, the soil abounded with Pine trees, diminishing in stature as the eye travelled eastward. Originally the district was an Indian hunting ground, and though the Copper Skins had no permanent encampment in the forest, they visited it occasionally, and a rich hunting and fishing region it was. Pitching their rude tents about the location of the Court House, or Post Office, they made successful raids on the bears, wolves, deer, otters, racoons, and other wild animals that abounded in the quarter. Where the Garrison is situated, is remembered by Pale Skins, who enjoyed a venison feast no less than the Indian, as being a capital ridge for killing bucks.

A stranger would run into an error were he to determine the ages of towns in this country by their relative population and material bulk. London itself furnishes an apt illustration of this remark, for it is younger than St. Thomas and Port Stanley, and still younger than Delaware, the first village in this portion of the Western Province.

It was in 1826 that the first, commonly called the old, survey was made. Col. Burwell, a good man, who then lived on Talbot Street, near Port Talbot, was the engineer employed by the Government to map out its earliest streets and blocks. That survey gave but a circumscribed dimension to the place, for it was bounded on the north by North Street, on the east by Wellington Street, and on the south and west by the river in its two branches, now styled the North and South branches, then the East and the North.

By the appointment of government, the late Col. Talbot, a person of an imperious, excitable and eccentric disposition, though honest withal, had the granting of the town lots; the price of the patent was thirty dollars, and the only other condition required was the erection of a tenement of moderate proportions, in name of settlement duty.

London is now in its 36th year, having been founded in 1827 by the building of a small log shanty on the corner of King and Ridout Streets, just about the spot where Mr. McLeod's stables are erected. The owner of the little dwelling, not exceeding sixteen feet square, was Peter McGregor, a native of Scotland. Some three or four assisted in the undertaking, cutting down the trees, and forming them into a rude human habitation. Peter's shanty was designed to be a tavern, but as they had no room inside for visitors, a bottle of whisky and a tumbler used to stand on a stump outside the door, where travellers were refreshed on reasonable terms. The clearance for this tavern was the first in the woods, and even when it was completed the tall trees covered it with their branches. Looking forward from that day, few would have imagined

that so large a city would have displaced the forest within less than forty years; but on this Continent changes are so rapid that they appear more like magic than the results of plodding industry and heroic toil. The older city—the Metropolis of the British Empire,—called by the same name, did not reach the same expansion in so brief a time, and though this one will never rival it in grandeur, commerce, and wealth, it, situated in the centre of an extensive and fertile agricultural district, is destined to become an important field of industry and of human influence.

Just about the locality where Dr. Anderson's laboratory used to be on West Dundas Street, Abraham Carroll, from Oxford County, reared in the fall the second house,—a frame tavern in front, with a log dwelling behind it. When nearly finished, it took fire and was reduced to ashes. But not discouraged, Carroll immediately began another structure on the same lot, and by next summer he had fairly commenced business.

The call for taverns presupposes a certain amount of traffic in the district, and as stores soon made their appearance, some one may inquire who travelled here, and who were to support the stores before an immediately local population collected themselves on this virgin territory? These questions can best be answered by glancing for a moment at the condition of the adjoining townships, when the city was in its infancy. There were many residences within a limited distance from Peter McGregor's tavern. London township had already been well settled. It was first entered by emigrants in 1817, and rapidly filled up after 1820, though the improvements were, as might be conjectured, on an humble scale; Westminster was thickly settled along the Commissioner's road and for two concessions back; at the same period Dorchester, Nissouri, and Lobo, seven miles from London, were each partially inhabited, and fresh arrivals were continually taking place. Thus there was a considerable population in the adjoining country to foster the incipient hamlet and to receive supplies from its coming stores.

Contemporaneous with the origin of London was the building of Westminster Bridge, the earliest of the three wooden structures that cross the Thames. It was finished in the summer of 1828. The first crime in the annals of the place connects itself with this bridge; it consisted in stealing an axe from one of the hands employed at the works. The thief's name we have failed to discover, else it should here have been handed down to posterity. In these days police officers were unknown in the region, and the base wretch was pursued by Mr. Levi Merrick, the architect of the rising structure, and brought back to the scene of his offence. It was late when they returned, and the culprit was chained all night to a stump, with a blanket mercifully contributed for his comfort. On the morrow Judge Lynch presided over the extemporised open-air tribunal, and after a regular examination of witnesses, the jury found the culprit guilty. The sentence was that he should receive so many lashes or clear out, never again to make his appearance. Accepting the latter alternative, he "skedaddled" in haste, and public indignation was appeased.

In 1827 the Court House and Jail were commenced where the present public buildings are. It would not do to risk criminals as the axe-thief had been confined by merely chaining them to a stump, and an apartment had to be provided for their better custody. But that incident was not exactly the cause of a lock-up being furnished, though it showed the necessity for such accommodation. Before this date justice and law had been dispensed at the Court House in the township of Woodhouse, near Long Point,—for Norfolk, Elgin, Oxford, part of Brant and for Middlesex; but by accident the public offices were burnt, and Parliament, then in session, ordained, in spite of the earnest opposition of St. Thomas, that the County Buildings should be erected in London, even then expected to become the centre of a large community. The first Court House erected here was a frame building, and the jail, its necessary accompaniment, consisted

of two small apartments inside of the main erection, built of logs; the floors were logs, the roofs were logs, and the walls were upright logs, so that the rooms were log boxes, the one being for debtors and the other for offenders against the peace and safety of the Sovereign's loyal subjects. This fabric, however, was but temporary in its character, and in 1828 the existing brick edifice was begun; the logs, when it was finished were, we suppose, committed to the flames, and the old Court House was converted into a Grammar School, and is the same fabric in which Mr. Bayly officiates as a public instructor at the present day. As we are dealing with primitive times, and times likely to have some interest in future years, it may be put on record that Mr. Heward of Toronto was the contractor for the erections, the architect was Mr. Thomas Parke, now Collector of Customs at St. Catharines, and the bricks were made by Mr. William Hales of the London township.

The construction of the County Buildings gave an importance to the place, and formed a considerable guarantee that it would swell into some magnitude, more especially as the neighboring country was so fruitful and likely to be so entirely occupied by a vigorous agricultural population. But the growth of London was slow at first, and its inland position and the difficulty of transport tended to check its expansion. It began to increase sensibly in 1828, but this became more apparent after the extensive emigration of 1832, five years after it had sprung into existence. English, Scotch, Irish and American settlers began in goodly numbers to take up the lots, and a decent village at length presented itself to the view. In the interval the original Robinson Hall, called after the late Chief Justice Robinson, a two storey frame building, had been erected on the ground where the large brick structure, bearing still the same appellation, may be seen at the west end of Dundas Street. There was now a market also;—it was situated on the South East corner of the Court House Square, nearly opposite the

American Hotel; stores had been opened by Mr. (since the Hon.) George J. Goodhue, Mr. Dennis O'Brien, and Mr. John Jennings: Mr. L. Lawrason, a settler at an early date, when he first arrived entered into partnership with Mr. Goodhue. Mr. Simeon Morrill, who located here in 1830, was one of the earliest mechanics, and still follows the business with which he started in life. The place grew with the Robinson Hall as its centre, though, till after the disastrous fire, some eighteen years from its origin, but very few brick buildings could be counted on its streets.

In these dawning days the Post Office was kept by Major Schofield, away in the forest, in a small log house on North Street, a little east of the entrance to Mr. L. Lawrason's residence, and on the same side of the street. There it can be seen to this day, and every one must be struck with the contrast between that humble log erection, and the fine structure on Richmond Street, that forms one of the ornaments of the city. The office in the woods, where Mr. Schofield had squatted, was far from being convenient for the Londoners, and on their petitioning Government, the Post Office was transferred to the village, and Mr. Goodhue, whose store was on the corner of Dundas and Ridout Streets, received the appointment as second Post Master. There was a mail only once a week, which was carried on horseback, and the denizens had to exercise what patience they could in their outlandish situation.

Things in these days were primitive enough at the Forks, for that was the designation the place bore for fully two years after its commencement.—The name was suggested by the union of the two branches of the Thames, but it passed away and its proper designation came into use. The country roads were dreadful, and people visited the "Forks" mostly in wagons drawn by oxen; money was scarce, and barter was the ordinary mode of traffic. Everything brought from a distance was at a high ransom; a bushel of wheat for a yard of factory cotton is a specimen of the prices. The storekeepers then, it is affirmed, put on

somewhat independent airs, and the poor farmers and their wives met with little of the deference to which they are accustomed since wealth made them important customers and keen opposition in trade softened the manners of the city merchants. Whatever a resident or rural settler may now require can readily be obtained, but many in these comparatively struggling times had to deny themselves indulgences which have come to be classed among the necessities of life. Tea was one of these indulgences. A substitute for the refreshing leaf was found in what was called "Plains Tea," that grew on the flats, on the hill side where Eldon House stands, and up along the river side. They would travel long miles to gather the "tea" and many are still alive who drank it. The plant, so the writer is informed, has for some time quite disappeared from the neighborhood.

As is still common in our rural districts, it was the practice of the inhabitants to lend mutual help when any 'raising' was to take place, or any heavy work to be done. On such occasions there was a regular turn out of the able bodied. Neighborly and friendly feelings prevailed in the little community, and its isolated position compelled the people to discover social enjoyment in each others company.—Strangers, as was to be expected, were more freely welcomed to hospitality than in our day; and on leaving, they departed on their journey with the impression that the Londoners in this corner of creation were a right hearted sort of people. For a few years there were a small class of rather rough inhabitants, lumberers and laborers, who on Saturday night would occasionally indulge in a fight among themselves; but with this exception, the place was orderly, decent and agreeable. Indeed, to take Col. Askin's opinion—an opinion that seemed to tickle that worthy old settler amazingly:—The people were happy among themselves till responsible government came, when the rule was introduced—every man for himself!

In the early part of the city's history, before public schools were established, education was left entirely to private

enterprise, and upon the whole the want was tolerably well supplied. As a matter of course the teachers depended exclusively upon fees, and under the free-trade principle, while the pupils received a useful amount of education, their instructors, male and female, were not without a fair return for their labors. There was instituted at an early date a Grammar School, showing that the more prosperous families were ambitious for their sons to receive something beyond an ordinary English education, so as to qualify them, if they felt inclined, for entering on a professional career.

No where in Christendom do a number of human beings take up a permanent abode, but sooner or later places of divine worship present themselves on the spot. The Wesleyans, so often the pioneers in the work of evangelization, were the first to institute gospel ordinances in the locality, and in the year 1830 the first church was built, and built by them, on the ground where the Montreal Bank now stands. It was a frame building and served its day. Next, in the same year, followed the English Episcopal Church with religious services. They reared at length a frame church on the site of St. Paul's Cathedral; in 1845 that church was consumed by fire, and the present more enduring structure was completed in 1846. The third denomination that appeared was the Roman Catholic in 1834. Like the English church, they first occupied a frame building that met a similar fate, after which was erected the spacious brick edifice in which the rites of the Roman Catholic communion continue to be observed. We are not forming a catalogue of the several persuasions and their places of worship, and hence we must stop, our object being merely to note initiatory events in a sketch that must be retained within reasonable bounds. There is now, it may be added as a general observation, an ample variety of denominations,—Methodist, Episcopalian, Catholic, Presbyterian, Congregationalist, Baptist—and many of their chapels are amongst the striking fabrics in the city.

In 1832, the population numbering

400 souls, the place was visited by the Asiatic cholera, which in the same year cut off so many human beings on both sides of the Atlantic. In London the pestilence was virulent. The medical men themselves,—there were only three of them—were, with one exception, so overcome with fear that they fled into the country and left a few of the more courageous inhabitants to minister to the sick and to bury the dead. It was an awful period, and those who remember it look back with painful reminiscences.

Up to 1835 the population of the town was combined, without any separate notification, in the annual census with the London Township. This renders it impossible to discover from documents, the exact number of inhabitants in either, prior to that date; then, however, for the first time a distinct return is made—the Township being 3,533, the Town 1,037. The assessed value of the town property in that year was \$34,380, and when the assessed value of the real estate for last year, 1862, which was \$261,664, giving a difference of \$227,284 in twenty seven years, is taken into account, it will be admitted that the "Forest City" has made, all things considered, pretty rapid advancement. Having attained in 1835 a population of 1,000 the town was entitled, according to the law as it then stood, to return a representative to Parliament. It had formerly voted with the county, now it was to vote independently, and Mr. Mahlon Burwell, father of Mr. L. Burwell, now member for East Elgin, was the successful candidate. His opponent was a local merchant, Mr. John Scatcherd, father of Mr. Thomas Scatcherd, barrister, the representative of West Middlesex in the present House of Assembly.

London will ever be associated with the Rebellion which commenced in 1837 by an armed invasion of Toronto, headed by William Lyon MacKenzie, but more for the vengeance here inflicted in the succeeding year on many who had taken part in the insurrection, than for any co-operation by the immediate residents. In fact as a community, they sided warmly with Sir Francis Bond Head and his advisers,

under whose mal-administration the unhappy crisis was superinduced.—But they sided with him not out of love for his dominion, which was the reign of toriyism. They prudently thought it better to defend the government, than to incur the evils of civil war. Nearly the whole population of the town, as a consequence, took up arms in defence of the country, and in a short time, after engagements at Gallow's Hill, at Windsor, at Point Pelee, the insurrection was suppressed, and the invaders from the opposite shore, who had sympathised with the Canadian rebels, and had been led to suppose the people in the Province were waiting to rise in mass, fled precipitately to their native soil. But all did not escape, for after the skirmish at Windsor, seven persons, brought hither for safe keeping, were executed at the Court House as traitors, some of them Canadians and some of them Americans. Here, among the rest, perished Hiram B. Lynd, an American, and a refined and educated gentleman; here perished Daniel Davis Bedford; here, Cunningham, from Beachville; here, Purley, formerly of Nova Scotia, though brought up on the other side; and here, Joshua Doan—hanged in company with Purley, a member of a most respectable Quaker family in the Township of Yarmouth. Beside these great numbers were doomed on this spot to transportation, and the sentences were carried into effect with unrelaxing rigor. For two months trials by Court Martial were going on, and the relentlessness of the reigning dignitaries had unbounded scope. No citizen of London was hanged, however; none of the citizens were banished. At one time no less than a hundred persons were confined in the Jail and Court House, and among them not a few both from the town and country, who had been as innocent of crime as the babe unborn. But suspicion, sharpened by vindictiveness, impelled some in diminutive local authority to seize those blameless subjects and ordain them to confinement, expecting thereby, we may presume, to get a superlatively loyal mark to their magisterial names. But for the opportune arrival of Lord Durham,

likely more would have been consigned to the gallows here and in other places; but in this locality, as in other districts, the sacrifice of political martyrs reached its close, and the concession of responsible government brought tranquility to the land, by investing the people with their rights and checking those administrative abuses that had occasioned such deep-rooted discontent over this royal dependency.

In 1838, London for the first time became a military post; two companies of the 32nd arrived in January, and were followed by the residue of the regiment. The commander of the regiment was Col. Maitland, son of the Earl of Lauderdale, who did not live long after his arrival. Originally the ground on which the Barracks is built belonged to the Agricultural Society; but it was handsomely delivered over to the Ordnance Department for the location of the Garrison. With more or less regularity soldiers were stationed in London till the breaking out of the Crimean War. By the arrival of the troops a decided impulse was communicated to the town; in fact, it started the place in earnest, and it continued afterwards to advance till the commercial crisis which reached its climax in 1858.

London, with a population of 1716, was incorporated as a village in 1840, presided over by a Board of Police, of which the Hon. G. Goodhue was the first president and Dr. Lee the last, in 1847. In the latter year it was constituted a town, and elected in 1848 Mr. Simeon Morrill as its first mayor.

In 1844-45, two memorable fires happened:—the second one threatened for a time to destroy every tenement within the corporation. With few exceptions the stores and houses at that date were frame, and on both occasions a large amount of property was laid in ashes. The first fire, which occurred on October 16th, commenced in North Street, about the middle of the block between Talbot and Ridout Street, and extending round burnt up the tenements on Dundas St. The next, commonly called the "Great Fire," burst out at the Robinson Hall on Sunday, April 18th, 1845. It totally consumed that building and

burnt down to the river southward, and east to the neighborhood of Richmond Street. The wind was high when it commenced, and carried the flames rapidly from dwelling to dwelling and shop to shop. The people were called out of the churches, and so furious was the conflagration that efforts were fruitless to hinder its steps. They looked on and saw their houses consumed, and their most precious family treasures enveloped in the resistless element. Burning shingles and leaves of books fell at a distance of five miles to the southward, having been whirled along amid the clouds of smoke by the driving gales. Fortunately the wind allayed, else in a few hours every tenement left would have vanished. About three fourths of the town was destroyed, but fortunately not a human life was lost. These burnings had this good result,—the town rose up anew of more solid material and a Bye-Law required that in future, buildings, within specified limits, should be of brick, not half so liable to be overthrown in a kindred manner. With its extensive brick blocks, and numerous private dwellings; with its Town Hall, its churches, its hotels, and other conspicuous public buildings of the same materials, London, as now seen, indicates a growth of substance that must arrest the stranger as it gratifies its own industrious citizens.

The census roll having risen above 10,000 in 1855, it was numbered among the cities of Canada. Mr. Murray Anderson was the first mayor after this important change in its history; and when it arrived at this dignity, Mr. John Wilson, Q.C., was its parliamentary representative.

From the first the value of real property had steadily augmented, but it made ominous leaps from 1852 to 1858. In 1853 the assessed value of real estate in the city was \$146,020; in 1854 \$228,160; in 1858 \$426,966. Then the collapse occurred. The frenzy of speculation had effectually worked off, and the assessment barometer stood next year at \$234,976. When the crash happened very few escaped, and a large number who had yielded to the allurements of the time and had

rushed into unheard-of schemes, were ruined. There was for a time a busy counting of wealth by thousands—thousands being often amassed in a day; but the riches in most cases were purely imaginary, and the figures so great in the ledger turned out very small in fact. All sensible men hope that a similar period of delusion, with its bitter consequences, may never again be known. At this period property is rated about its actual value—a sign that sobriety rules, and if the taxes were not so burdensome, a comfortable thing for the community as a whole.

Before the railways were opened travelling to the great marts of commerce was tedious and disagreeable; the transport of freight was effected under manifold disadvantages. Goods had to be teamed from Port Stanley and Hamilton; produce had to be conveyed to the lake shore. But the iron road changed all this, and now there is every facility for locomotion and for the transportation of freight that could have been desired. Four railways are at the door of the citizen;—the Great Western opened in 1853, Port Stanley in 1856, the Grand Trunk in 1858, and the Sarnia branch of the Great Western in 1858. These give ready access for produce to the world's market, and large quantities have hitherto been delivered at the respective stations, especially at those of the Great Western and Grand Trunk.—Last year, 1862, no less than 677,906 bushels of wheat; 37,261 of barley; 114,192 of oats; 66,973 of peas, were sold in the London market, the most of which was sent off for consumption to distant and foreign markets. Besides this, there were sold likewise, 772,773 lbs of pork, and 188,437 lbs of wool, borne away by the cars to supply food for thousands, and to keep looms busy in manufacturing regions. These figures abundantly show how productive the country is all around, and of what service the iron horse must have been to the farming districts as well as to the citizens themselves.

On the 14th September, 1860, the city enjoyed the memorable distinction of a visit from His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and man-

ifested its devotion to the British Crown by every suitable demonstration. His Excellency was attended by the Duke of Newcastle, Earl St. Germans, the Honorable General R. Bruce, His Excellency Sir Edmund Head and other gentlemen of note.—London was thronged with visitors. Thousands upon thousands greeted his arrival by the train and testified by their cheers as the cortege passed along the streets, how welcome he was in this part of Her Majesty's dominion. Loyal addresses were presented by different bodies to the Prince; at a levee in the City Hall a long list of citizens and visitors from the country had the honor of a presentation; and a grand ball was held in celebration of his presence, at which he attended and made himself agreeable by his gentlemanly deportment.

Twice has the Provincial Agricultural Fair been held in the city; the first time in September, 1854, the second in the same month of 1861. Extensive preparations were made for the display of 1854, reflecting the utmost credit on the energies of the people of London and the surrounding district. Different and appropriate structures, though of a temporary character, were reared on the grounds, and the enclosure, embracing fully thirty acres, was fenced round and ornamented with trees and other decorations. Lord Elgin, then Governor General, came expressly from Quebec to honor the Exhibition with his presence, and was welcomed on his arrival with enthusiastic demonstrations. Two addresses were presented to his Excellency, one by the Mayor and Municipal Council, in the name of the citizens; the other by the President of the Agricultural Society, on the high day of the Show. Lord Elgin's visit gave an eclat to the annual event, while it gratified the people, who entertained for him sentiments of the highest esteem. No less than 30,000 persons entered the gates on the principal day, and the impression left upon every mind was that this, the eighth Provincial Exhibition, was a spectacle such as had never been witnessed in Canada on any similar occasion. The stock, in particular, sur-

passed what had previously been entered for competition in the country.

The preparations made in view of the second Exhibition were on a far more costly scale than those of 1854. A permanent building had to be provided, and after much deliberation on the part of the local committee, of which Mr. James Johnson of Sunnyside was the indefatigable chairman, it was commenced on the scene of the former Show, and carried on to completion with no less energy than judgment. The architect was Mr. W. Robinson, city engineer; the contractor, Mr. Alexander Campbell. Both of them earned the thanks of the town, and of all interested in the structure, for their respective services. The Crystal Palace, as it is styled, rises on the grounds with an imposing appearance, and in the opinion of those who are allowed to be judges, it is admirably adapted for the design of its erection; it is spacious, lofty, and substantial. Considering its purpose, it was wise that utility and economy should be the two leading ideas regulating its formation. The expense of the Palace was \$9,000, which, of course, does not include outlays for sheds and other subordinate erections connected with the Exhibition. The total receipts by the local committee for structural purposes were \$14,886; and the entire outlay amounted to \$14,811. In providing the funds, the City, the County of Middlesex, the East Riding Agricultural Society, and the Provincial Association, were the chief contributors. For this display of stock, agricultural products, manufactures and such other articles commonly exhibited, the entries were equal to the highest ever attained,

comprising the best of their respective kinds. On the Friday 28,000 visited the Fair, of whom 23,000 paid the twenty-five cents admission fee. This, the sixteenth Provincial Exhibition, was eminently a successful one. Disinterested strangers and foreigners spoke of it in the highest terms, and the city and the agriculturists of the peninsula had every reason to be proud of the triumph. When compared with the one formerly held on the same spot, nothing was so clearly manifested as the mighty strides made by western agriculture and industry within a few years, and how rapidly wealth and comfort were remunerating western farmers for their toil.

The Peninsular Metropolis, with a population now between 14,000 and 15,000, including the military, is highly favored with educational opportunities, and no healthier spot is to be found in the world. It has every advantage for sewerage; the soil on which it stands being for the most part sandy, moisture is rapidly absorbed. An area of nearly 1,800 acres is embraced within the municipal bounds, of which necessarily a large portion remains unoccupied. It is a rising place, but to what extent it may be increased is not for the author to predict. Any one, however, who passes along its streets, or even turns over the leaves of the following Directory, will soon discover its variety of occupation—its professions—its newspapers—its wholesale and importing houses—its stores—its foundries—its machine shops—its manufactures—its agencies—and may thereby reach some appreciation of its enterprise and its means of comfort and of wealth.

**NOTE.**—Few, perhaps, on reading the brief Sketch can form a correct idea of the labor it involved, which consisted mainly in the patient inquiry for facts at a large number of persons who were likely to furnish the requisite materials. The different, and sometimes conflicting, accounts had to be compared, and what seemed to be the story of London, framed out of the best supported testimony. It has been the writer's aim to discover the truth, and he hopes that the preceding pages are not unworthy of confidence. For facts and figures he has necessarily, in almost every case, to depend upon others, and these are supplied to him in the full belief that they are correct. After all the care expended in the compilation, some errors may be found in the narrative; it is hoped they will only be trivial ones. Many thanks are due to those who so obligingly furnished details with a view to the composition, and though the list of their names would be too long to publish, the author assures them of his gratitude.







### Rates of Postage on Letters, Newspapers, Periodicals, &c.

**RATES OF POSTAGE ON LETTERS.**---Letters posted in Canada, addressed to any place within the Province, pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., but if posted unpaid, such letters are charged 7 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. On letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., with optional prepayment. The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet, not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents; exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. and not exceeding 1 oz., 25 cents; exceeding 1 oz. and not exceeding 2 oz., 50 cents, and so on, increasing two rates of postage for each additional ounce. And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., &c. Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery. Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, *via* England, must be prepaid. The rate on letters for the United States (except California and Oregon) 10 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.; To Cuba, 20 cents per do.; For California and Oregon, 15 cents; The Postage rate to British Columbia is, Letters 25 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.; Newspapers, 2 cents each.

**CHARGE OF REGISTRATION.**---The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, *viz.*: On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America, 2 cents; on Letters for the United States, 5 cents; on Letters for the United Kingdom, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents; on Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent *via* England, 25 cents.

**MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.**---The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Province, is 25 cents per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered.) One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage Stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage), Prices Current, Hand Bills, and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States. The charge on Books, &c., by Book Post to England, is 7 cents on packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents additional for every additional  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. These charges must be prepaid. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to England at the Book rate of Postage. Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance, by either the publisher at the Post Office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering Post Office: For a paper published 6 times a week, 40 cents per quarter; for a paper published 8 times a week, 20 cents per quarter; for a paper published twice a week, 13 cents per quarter; for a paper published once a week, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents per quarter. **TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS**---That is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or reposted in Canada, must be pre-paid 1 cent each by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded---except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents---such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

**NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES**---Newspapers received from England by the Candian Packet Mails are delivered free. Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.) United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged 1 cent each on delivery.

**PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS**---The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not exceeding 3 ounces in weight, 1 cent; over 3 ounces, 4 cents. If prepaid by postage stamps from the office of publication, Periodicals *published in Canada*, weighing over 3 ounces, may pass for 2 cents each. Periodicals, *printed in this Province*, other than Newspapers, when specially devoted to the Education of Youth (both religious and general), to Agriculture, to Temperance, or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the office of publication, to be transmitted to any Post Office in this Province, are exempt from charge.

**COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.**—*Judges.*—Hon. Sir John Beverly Robinson, Bart.; Hon. P. M. Vankoughnet, Chancellor of Upper Canada.

**COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.**—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Upper Canada. *Chief Justice*—Hon. Archibald McLean.  *Puisne Judges*—Hons. Joseph C. Morrison and Robert Easton Burns.

**COURT OF CHANCERY.**—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, accounts, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. *Chancellor*—Hon. P. M. Vankoughnet. *Vice-Chancellors*—Hon. Jas. Christie Palmer Esten and John Godfrey Spragge. *Master*—Andrew Norton Buell; *Master at London*—James Shanly.

**COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.**—This Court has the same powers and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, as the Court of Queen's Bench. *Chief Justice*—Hon. W. H. Draper, C. B. *Puisne Judges*—Hons. William Buell Richards and John Hawkins Hagarty.

**HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.**—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favor of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clerk of Commissions*—W. B. Heward.

**COUNTY COURTS.**—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

**SURROGATE COURT.**—The jurisdiction of these Courts relate to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estates or effects in Upper Canada. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts.

**COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.**—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of larceny, misdemeanor and other offences.

**RECORDER'S COURT.**—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston and Ottawa, the Recorder's Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—The care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions are held on the first Monday in March, June and September, and on the third Monday in December. *Recorders*—George Duggan, Toronto; Archd. J. McDonnell, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.
