The Archbishop has appointed the Rev. Abraham James Broughall to be a Canon of St. Alban's Cathedral.

The subscriptions for the East Window have reached an amount sufficient, in Mr. Turner's opinion, to warrant proceedings being taken towards the execution of the work, and Mr. Lyon has been commissioned to prepare a cartoon, or completed design. About \$100 will still require to be subscribed. There are many members of the Congregation from whom contributions may be reasonably expected. Those who are desirous of having a part in this beautifying of the Cathedral are requested to communicate with Mr. Herbert L. Dunn. The individual subscriptions given have been for the most part in sums of \$5 and \$10, with a few of larger amounts including two of \$100 each. A majority of the donors are not members of the Cathedral congregation, and it is therefore hoped that our own people will fully make up the sum now required.

The 25th Annual Service of the Sunday School Association of the Diocese of Toronto held in the Cathedral on Monday 29th ult., was attended by a larger Congregation than usual, yet withal one missed many prominent Clergy and Teachers of City Parishes who might have been expected at such a service. The Archbishop was present and gave the final prayers and Benediction. For the first time in S. Alban's the Metropolitan Cross was carried in procession before His Grace reminding us of the fact that the Dean of Toronto Cathedral now bears the same rank as His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury who was with us a couple of years ago. The Service was intoned by the Precentor, Canon Cayley, and the sermon by Rev. A. G. H. Dicker, Rector of S. Luke's was a masterly and helpful exposition of the duties and responsibilities of the Christian teacher.

On Tuesday evening April 30th, the Cathedral Branch gave the annual Reception to the Officers, Life Members, Delegates and Hostesses of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Diocese. The Crypt was decorated with

much taste for the occasion with palms, flags and flowers, the arrangement of tables was perfect and reflected much credit on those who had the management. On the raised dais the company was received by the Archbishop, Mrs. Swannan, and the W. A. President Miss Tilley. Canon Macnab in the name of the Clergy and Congregation of the Cathedral welcomed the guests to their Diocesan Cathedral home. The official W. A. welcome was given by Mrs. S. G. Wood in a very touching and forcible speech, reminding all of their obligations and spiritual privileges. Mrs. de Pencier, whom we were very glad to see among us again, made a graceful reply. A charming programme of music, vocal and instrumental had been provided, which gave much evident pleasure. This was followed by choice refreshments for which the Cathedral branch is already famous. The cordiality of the welcome extended to the guests was a source of comment to the many visitors who numbered between five and six hundred.

The following letter has been received by Canon Macnab from a well wisher, and generous supporter of the Cathedral.

TORONTO, MAY 1907

Dear Sir,

In the last issue of the MONTHLY NOTES mention is made of the discouragement some of the members of the Cathedral League feel at the supineness of the men attending St. Alban's, towards doing something definite in the way of furthering the extension of the fabric.

Without perseverance and unanimity we shall accomplish nothing. True the Cathedral should be the concern of every Churchman in the Diocese, yet it is much more to those who now make it their spiritual home, consequently it behoves us to do our share. Make it a personal question of "What have I done for the furtherance of this work? What prayers have I said? What have I given? What direct interest do I take? Can we exclaim with the Psalmist 'Lord I have loved the habitation of Thy house and the place where Thine honour dwelleth.'" There is nothing to prevent the present congregation raising at the very least \$2000 a year for the building fund. We have the means. All that is lacking is the will. Do not wait until warmer weather scatters us to our summer homes, but let us take immediate steps to remove the reproach that dampens the enthusiasm of the Ladies, whose untiring efforts we already owe so much. Do not calculate how little you can give. You are giving to God. The King's business requires haste. Don't wait to see what your neighbour gives. GIVE IT NOW.
