A MORGANIZED OCEAN. To Morganize the ocean costs money, lots of it. The White Star shareholders are to get from the International Mercantile Marine Company \$50,000 in cash and stock for each \$5,000 share of their holdings, a ratio of ten dollars for one.

The production of coal in Nova Scotia has shown a steady development year both in connection with the smelting industry and for export, while the mines of British Columbia and the Crow's Nest mines in the Rocky Mountains and the mines on Vancouver Island have shown unusual activity.

In agriculture Canada has been far from idle. There has been a large increase this year in the cereal production in Manitoba and the rich prairie fields of New Ontario, undertaken at the Canadian "Sox" to show what could be done in the same way in the West.

The future of the West is full of promise. Canada is establishing branches in the large business that will become a year or two hence, manufacturers are raising capital and increasing their capital by increasing production of business in that part of the Dominion by the opening of branches.

In Ontario there has also been a marked expansion in industrial operations this year. The increase in agricultural operations of this province has been very large. The total crops of wheat, barley, rye, buckwheat, oats, peas and corn amount to 1,000,000 bushels, which is the largest production of grain in Ontario so far recorded for one harvest.

The export trade of Canada is steadily increasing, and this is giving Canadians large sums of money to invest in other enterprises. During the year ended June 30, 1902, the aggregate exports of Canada, taken on a basis of goods entered for consumption and Canadian produce, were \$28,811,000, an increase over 1896 of \$107,000,000, an increase per head of the population of six years of \$30, which is a claim, exceeds any growth shown in similar period by any other country.
