What the Mother Country needs in the way of foodstuffs, can be supplied by the colonies, while the Old Land can furnish such manufactures as the colonies cannot produce themselves.

In many instances the depression has been from 20 to 50 per cent. It is generally believed, says an English exchange, that the companies are handicapped with such an immense unproductive capital that a return to the old-time dividends is impossible.

The London and North-western Company, for instance, which is the largest carrier of mineral traffic in the United Kingdom, coal furnishing over 60 per cent. of its freight traffic, last year reports an average coal train load of 100 tons only.

This is only a little over one-fifth of the train load carried by the United States coal haulers, which are being built in London and France.

The charges on the London and North-western are nearly three times as much as the charges that prevail on this continent.

Concurrently with the adoption of the American trolley idea it will pay the people of the United Kingdom to introduce our big trains and our motor engines.

"Commodore Schley was the senior officer of our squadron of Santiago when the Spanish fleet attempted to escape on the morning of July 3, 1898. to fight the battles of the Empire revives again the interest of Canadians in the conflict. That there should have been four or five times as many volunteers as were called for is an indication that whatever hardships were undergone by the former contingents have not had the effect of dampening the loyalty of the young men of the Dominion.

The call for soldiers must strike the government as something of a rebuke for its tardiness in opening the way for the practical expression of loyalty. Once the movement has got under way, however, it appears that 50 per cent. more men and horses than at first intended will be allowed to go, and it goes without saying that the force will be one of the best-looking and best fighting corps ever turned out in any country.

The news from the seat of conflict yesterday was of a cheering kind, and indicated that the resting power of the enemy is gradually but surely being broken.

Gen. Bruce Hamilton is the hero of the hour, his force having recaptured one of the guns taken from Col. Benson's command. He is the gallant officer who, his death. Further, the Boer force was scattered, and a good many prisoners were taken after a sanguinary fight, in which the enemy suffered heavy loss.

From present appearances the Canadians now departing for South Africa are likely to be "in at the death," and it is to be hoped and believed that their presence in the war-torn country will have the effect of impressing the deluded burghers and their mercenary allies with the futility of any further recruiting for prolongation of the struggle.

The desire in the Old Land that the King may be crowned amid peace through the Empire will meet a fervent response in the colonies, and it now seems possible that the six months' recruiting before the coronation will be sufficient for the closing of the war.

NOT A SATISFACTORY INCREASE. Editor World: In your published report from Ottawa, referring to Toronto factories, you give the following figures from the census and in the paragraph you remark that it "shows a very satisfactory increase over the figures of two years ago."
