The expenditures for the year ending June 1st were \$3,929.94, leaving a balance on hand of \$467.13.

The following delegates were appointed to attend the district meetings during the present month: Nos. 1 and 2, Rev. Dr. McIntyre, Nos. 3 and 10, Rev. J. H. McQuaid, Nos. 4 and 5, Rev. Dr. Phillips, No. 6, Rev. F. E. Bishop and Rev. B. H. Nobles, Nos. 7, Rev. Dr. McLeod, No. 8, Rev. W. Camp, No. 9, Rev. B. H. Nobles.
