ALCOHOL ENEMY OF PROGRESS OF HUMAN RACE, IS CONCLUSION

World's Congress Report Made Public—Judges Say Liquor is Responsible for Most of the Crimes Committed

Washington, Nov. 7.—Alcohol and alcoholism are two of the real and substantial enemies of moral, artistic and commercial progress of the human race, according to the report of the United States delegates to the twelfth international congress on alcoholism, made public by the state department today. The delegates were appointed by Secretary Knox as one of his first official acts. The congress was held last July in London, and twenty-five governments were represented. The delegates of each country in the general finding that alcohol not only was unnecessary in human life and comfort but was inimical to both.

Three departments of the United States government were represented by delegates, state, navy and treasury. Twelve representatives went abroad, and the delegates unanimously signed the report made public today. The finding of which is to condemn the drinking habit as dangerous to public health and morals and a source of national, moral, commercial and military greatness.

According to the report, the interest shown in the congress was greater than ever was known before. Because of the information evolved at the congress, the delegates accepted the invitation of the Queen of Holland to hold their next meeting, two years hence, at The Hague in conjunction with the conference of the committee that is working for international peace.

While the congress urged the necessity of imposing the most vigorous restrictions on the sale and traffic in alcoholic liquors, it regarded as equally important the need of educating the younger generation to a true knowledge of what alcohol is and what its effects upon the human system are.

TWO WERE KILLED

Hornell, N. Y., Nov. 7.—Engineer Chauncey Green and Fireman Christopher Ryder, were killed, F. O. Tracey, a brakeman, was probably fatally injured, and two other employees were slightly injured in a wreck on the Erie railroad near Belmont early today. Two engines were hauling a fast freight when the boiler on the forward engine blew up.

DOVER OPENED AS NAVAL PORT

Will Furnish Anchorage for the Biggest Dreadnoughts—Scheme Planned Away Back in the Days of Raleigh

The formal opening of the naval harbor at Dover, Eng., was a source of great satisfaction to the advocates of naval expansion, as it furnishes anchorage for the largest Dreadnoughts. The work had been in progress for eleven years.

The formal opening of the Admiralty Harbor at Dover by the Prince of Wales marks the completion of a national scheme which in its origin dates from the Elizabethan era. It was Sir Walter Raleigh who first drew attention to the national and commercial importance of Dover, "situated on a promontory next fronting a puissant foreign king and in the very straight passage in Christendom."

TURKEY TO BUILD WARSHIPS

Washington, D. C., Nov. 7.—The Turkish ministry will urge upon the Ottoman parliament soon after it reconvenes Nov. 15, the adoption of a naval programme, providing for the expenditure within the next seven years of \$100,000,000.
