Pine Deal—The demand is exceedingly quiet, and sales are difficult.

A St. Petersburg despatch of 18th inst.—General Kurapatkin in a long dispatch to the Emperor dated July 17th tells of an attempt by Lieut. General Count Keller to drive back the Japanese from passes in the neighborhood of Lian Shan Kwan. The Russian had to withdraw. Gen. Keller reported the Russian losses to exceed 1,000.

A Tokio despatch of 19th inst.—The Japanese losses in the fight at Mo Tien Pass and its vicinity Sunday were 299 killed or wounded. Gen. Kuroki estimates that the Russians lost more heavily.

Leicester is having a Japanese garden laid out in one of its principal parks. In London each day 400 children are born, and 250 enter school for the first time.

General Booth, head of the Salvation Army, is 75 years old, and wears as hard as ever. A new park of 21 acres was opened in the Abbey Hill district of Manchester on the 14th ult.

Of 100 samples of London's water analyzed last month all were found to be clear, bright and well filtered. The oldest practicing solicitor in London, Mr. John Thacker, has died at his residence, Newton Grove, at the age of 81.

The British Society's issues in 1903 were 5,700,000 copies, nearly 900 colporteurs and 700 native Bible workers were employed. Scarborough electric trams, which run to all parts of the town for a penny, carried over 1,000,000 passengers last week.

The largest sewing machine in the world, weighing 6,500 pounds, was shown at the exhibition in London. It is a South Lincolnshire workhouse inmate who has been an ex-convict for 12 years.

Of London's great halls one is to be used for the purpose of a museum. The late Sir Henry Thompson, the eminent surgeon, desired that his papers should be preserved in a museum.

Inspector of Gymnasia to the armies in India and Burma, died on the 18th ult. at Glasgow. He was a member of the Indian War of 1870-80, was on leave, and died at the residence of his wife in Glasgow.
