## TWO WEEKS LATER FROM CALIFORNIA!

The steamship *Prometheus*, from San Juan, arrived at New York on Saturday evening, with San Francisco dates to the 10th September.

The steamer *Lafayette* on her first trip from New York to China was totally destroyed by fire at the British port of Foochow on the 1st September. The *Beaumont* had to have proceeded

When the populace were informed of this act, the wildest excitement was manifested, and they soon gathered around the Association building, and in an incredible short

space of time the instruments of execution were adjusted, and they were launched into eternity,

at a shout of justification from the crowd.

All the gallows God saving himself, and

McKenzie being hanged and died by this

physician in attendance, he was again hoisted

into the air; till life was extinct—when the

crowd dispersed quietly and order was restored.

Some shots were fired at the rescue, but nothing

happened.
