CANON XIX, PROVINCIAL SYNOD,

ON THE CONSTITUTION OF THE DOMESTIC AND FOR EIGN MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND IN CANADA.

ART. I.—This Society shall be called The Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada.

ART. II.—This Society shall consist of all persons who are mem-

bers of this Church.

ART. III.—This Society shall be under the control of a General Board of Missions, consisting of the bishops of this Ecclesiastical Province, and the clerical and lay delegates for the time being of the Provincial Synod, together with the Board of Management as hereinafter described.

On the third day of each triennial session of the Provincial Synod the business of the Synod shall be suspended to allow the business con-

nected with this Society to be transacted.

ART. IV.—There shall be a Board of Management which shall consist of all the bishops of this Ecclesiastical Province and the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, members ex-officio, together with two clergymen and two laymen from each Diocese, to be appointed by the General Board on the nomination of each Diocesan Synod, which nomination shall be made by such Synod at the meeting next preceding the triennial session of the Provincial Synod, and this Board shall have as far as possible the collection and administration of the General Missionary Funds of the Church (subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth) and shall remain in office until their successors are appointed, and shall have power to fill any vacancies that may occur in their number. Eight members shall constitute a quorum. The Board of Management shall, when the General Board is not in session, exercise all the powers of the General Board, and shall report to the General Board of Missions on or before the third day of such triennial session of the Provincial Synod. The Board shall meet at such times and places as they shall think fit.

ART. V.—The Board of Management is authorized to appoint such Committees as it may deem desirable, and such officers as shall be needful for carrying on its work, and may frame such rules and regulations (not inconsistent with the Constitution and Canons of the Provincial Synod) as may be necessary for the transaction of its business.

ART. VI.—It is recommended that the funds collected in the several Dioceses for Mission work under this Canon be sent in to the Board and the appropriations therefrom on behalf of Domestic Missions

ceses to which such appropriations shall have been made.

Appropriations on behalf of Foreign Missions shall be made to the Great Missionary Societies of the Mother Church in England, or in such other manner as the Board of Management may direct, provided that contributions specially appropriated shall be paid in strict accordance with the wishes of the donors. Nothing in this Canon, however, shall be held in any wise to interfere with or affect the several Diocesan Mission Funds or with any other existing agreements made by any Parish for special missionary aid.

ART. VII.-In connection with the Board of Management there shall be in each Diocese of the Province a Corresponding Committee, or Board of Missions, to be constituted as such Diocese may determine, who shall report all statistics and other information relating to the gen-

eral purposes for which the Society is organized.

The Diocesan Board of Missions, as at present constituted, shall be the Corresponding Committee, or Boards, until other Committees, or Boards, shall have been appointed under the Provisions of this Canon.

The first Board of Management shall be appointed by the Provincial Synod at this session.

REPORT OF THE BOARD.

To the members of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada:

Your Board, consisting of all the bishops, and of two clerical and two lay delegates from each of the dioceses, have the satisfaction of reporting:

That their organization and method of working enable them to

reach every congregation in this Ecclesiastical Province.

Twice in each year—at Epiphany and at Ascensiontide—a letter is sent out to every congregation, giving some information concerning the vast field for missionary work presented by the heathen and the non-Christian nations of the earth, and the nearer field in Algoma and the Northwestern dioceses, drawing us by the close ties of kindred and nationality, and by the equally strong claims of the Indian tribes which originally occupied the soil.

Your Board are of course dependent upon the clergy to present these letters to their congregations, and to enforce them with all the power which attends a warm personal interest in the extension of the kingdom of Christ upon earth. These letters are prepared in each case with the greatest care, and after being reviewed and revised by the Board, are mailed to each clergyman. A certified list of the clergy in each diocese with their post office addresses is obtained, so as to insure the delivery of the letter in good season for its communication to the

people on the appointed day.

Your Board, deeply sensible of the extent to which they must ever be indebted to the clergy, would respectfully ask them to consider the responsibility which the Canon of the Provincial Synod constituting your Board, lays not merely upon the members of the Board itself, but upon every clergyman and lay member of our Church in Canada. All, without exception, as members of the Church are members of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society, which is co-extensive with the Church of England in the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada. If the Church is the living body of Christ, with power to legislate and bind her people, then no loyal member of our Church can divest himself of the responsibility of aiding in the extension of the priceless blessings of Christianity in the way provided by this Society, and promoted through your Board of Management. In addition to this responsibility resting upon all alike, the clergy are under solemn promise to carry out the Canons of the Provincial Synod, by which the Board of Management is constituted, and under which it acts. Your Board earnestly hope that their letters will always reach the ears of the people, and that none will withhold their contributions because they may be small. If they

are as God hath blessed each community and family, they will not be small in His sight, and His blessing can surely make them productive of vast results. The summer rain that fertilizes the earth reaches us in little drops, but they are not withheld because they are little. The number of them, insignificant though each is in itself, suffice to moisten the ground, and to quicken vegetation everywhere. The contributions of all the families, and of each individual in every congregation throughout these nine dioceses, if only they are in proportion to the blessing which God, our Father, our Saviour, our Sanctifier affords to us, will become, however insignificant each offering may seem in itself, such a sum as will readily effect all that God requires of us.

THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

have been well attended, notwithstanding the vast distances from which many of the members have to come, at no little cost of time and money to themselves. They have so far been held in Montreal, Toronto, Ottawa and Kingston. The public missionary meetings held in each place where your Board has met have been attended by large numbers of people, and it is believed that the instructive and effective addresses delivered on these occasions have not merely quickened a passing interest, but have led many to the determination that for the future they will try to do their part in the great work of supporting missions at home and abroad.

THE CONTRIBUTIONS

sent in by each diocese, and by each congregation will be found in the treasurer's statements. Your Board hope that you will not turn away from these figures. They are not dry, forbidding statistics. The form into which they are thrown will enable everyone to see at a glance what they mean, and to discover without difficulty what each and all in this ecclesiastical province are doing.

The limited experience of your Board does not warrant them in building up any theories, or drawing positive conclusions from these statistics. They indicate, however, a few facts which are full of interest.

ist. All congregations are not contributing in response to the two appeals. There is a fault somewhere. Your Board cannot decide whether it is with the people or the clergymen. They repeat their earnest hope that the opportunity will be afforded to every congregation of hearing the two annual appeals for foreign and domestic missions, and that every congregation and, as far as possible, each individual member will give annually to both objects as God has blessed them. If we are all doing this regularly year by year, according to our ability, we are carrying out our Lord's directions that we should make disciples of all nations. If any of us are neglecting this we cannot be sensible of the great privileges and the weighty responsibilities of our position as members of the Church of England in this country.

unt under th for forgrowing in your Board generally and particularly in the advantages which they enjoy of considering carefully the claims of all the departments of missionary work and therefore of distributing judiciously the needful aid.

THE OFFICERS

of your Board are honorary. No remuneration is paid to them. Only their unavoidable expenses are met. The General Treasurer has given your Board security in the form of a bond from the Guarantee Company of North America tor \$5,000, the premium on which is met by your Board. The auditors have examined and certified the accounts.

Your Board, sensible of the amount of labor and attention to details undertaken by the various secretary-treasurers, have prepared and issued to them blank forms which it is believed will greatly simplify and reduce their work. One is a tabular form ready to be filled up with the name of each clergyman and of each congregation under his charge and the amounts forwarded by each, whether for any diocese in the domestic field or any part of the foreign mission field or as left to be appropriated by your Board of Management. The other is a formal letter to be sent two weeks after the day for the Epiphany and Ascension-tide appeal to each clergyman whose congregation or congregations have sent in no contribution, respectfully requesting attention to oversight, etc.

* WOMAN'S AUXILIARY COMMITTEES.

Your Board have great satisfaction in announcing that before they could in justice to the matters claiming attention immediately after their organization, consider how their work might be aided by auxiliary committees, they received offers from some devout women to co-operate with them in whatever way might be indicated to them. The honor of this movement is due to the women of the churches of the city of Ottawa.

Already a Constitution has been drafted under the sanction of a committee of your Board for the organization of a Woman's Auxiliary Committee in each parish, acting through a similar committee for each diocese and this again combining with the committees from all the dioceses in a Woman's Auxiliary, for the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada.

The organization under this constitution may not in all cases be carried out in all its details and fulness, but its form will indicate how the women in each parish and diocese may organize so as to co-operate most effectually with your Board. Already it has shown the promise of practical results in the funds which have reached the General Treasurer since the accounts of the year were closed.

Your Board would respectfully and earnestly invite the clergy to aid in the formation of a Woman's Auxiliary Committee in each of their congregations, either under the constitution which has been prepared for their use or in any more simple form which may recommend itself to them. The great object is to interest all and to unit all in some

effort proportionate to their numerical and financial strength in the great work of missions. The missionary magazines of the church can through these auxiliary committees, be introduced into every home and acquaintance with the work and extension of the church—the kingdom of God-made a part of the family life in every home.

Your Board recognizing the opportunity which the form of auxiliary committees affords of carrying the church's missionary efforts into every home through the untiring, enthusiastic efforts of women, feel that they cannot urge too strongly upon the clergy the importance of using their position and influence to promote the formation of a Woman's Auxiliary Committee in each congregation. A copy of the constitution proposed for the Woman's Auxiliary Committees is printed in the Appendix of this

Report.

In conclusion your Board of Management would give expression to the confidence which they feel in the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada as organized under the Canon of the Provincial Synod to unite all the congregations in the several dioceses in missionary work, to cultivate and quicken their interest in it, and to induce them to contribute towards it regularly and as a religious duty. The response that has been made so far to the efforts of the Board of Management is, it must be admitted, on the whole, disappointing. It must, however, be borne in mind that the Society has only just completed its second year, and that any new organization has many difficulties to overcome and some prejudices to meet. If the clergy each and all in every one of our nine dioceses, will work with the Society and its Board of Management, there is no reason to fear that the information which will reach their congregations and the appeals which will be addressed to them year after year will begin to tell, and that this Church of England in Canada will soon have her clergy established in the foreign mission field and all the wants of the bishops engaged in the work of domestic missions amply supplied. To attain this, every clergymen must persistently, lovingly and enthusiastically, co-operate with your Board.

REPORT OF PROVISIONAL COMMITTEE.

The Provisional Committee, authorized by the Domestic and Foreign Mission Board to take steps toward the formation of a Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada, have much pleasure in submitting to the Board the following Report:

The first meeting of the Committee was held in Ottawa, April 17th, 1885, at which meeting Mrs. Pollard was chosen to preside, and Mrs. Tilton to act as Secretary.

At the request of the Lord Bishop of Ontario, a meeting of the Churchwomen of Ottawa was held on Tuesday, April 21st, at St. John's Church School Room, the Rev. H. Pollard in the chair.

The desirability of uniting the Church women of Canada as a Mission Auxiliary, together with the aim and proposed plan of work was laid before this meeting. The Rev's, H. Pollard and J. D. Cayley speaking most favorably and encouragingly on the subject.

Through the kindness of Dr. Morrison, of Ogdensburg, the Committee has received several contributions and valuable Reports, by which Reports the Committee was convinced that the Church women of the United States, as an Auxiliary to the Missionary Society, had not only been the means of augmenting the funds, but had accomplished much by their organized and systematized work in awakening and extending the true missionary spirit of the Church, and that the effort to help perfect the work of a similar organization in the Canadian Church would commend itself to every earnest worker present. This meeting took the initiative, and the Committee had great pleasure in organizing the first branch of the Auxiliary in Canada. Mrs. Lewis was elected President and Lady Tilly Vice-President, of the Ottawa branch.

After carefully looking over several Constitutions, kindly furnished by Miss Emery, General Secretary of the Women's Auxiliary in the United States, the accompanying plan of organization and constitutions was proposed, and with the approval of the Lord Bishop of Ontario, (that the constitutions were sufficiently practicable as a basis of work), the Committee ordered 1,000 copies printed, together with the circular drawing attention to the work. Nearly 700 copies were sent to the Bishops and Clergy of the sveral dioceses in Canada. The response to these circulars was not all that could have been desired in view of the importance of the work, but letters of encouragement and approval were received promptly from the Lord Bishop of Algoma, the Venerable Archdeacon of Kingston, Chairman of the Mission Board of the Diocese of Ontario, and Dr. Mockridge, General Secretary of the Domestic and Foreign Mission Board. The plan of a Woman's Auxiliary was presented to the Synods of Toronto and Ontario, at their sessions in June last, the Synod Journals publishing the action taken.

At a meeting of the Committee in September, the Secretary was requested to communicate with the different Bishops who had not responded to the circular, drawing their attention to the desirability of securing their opinion of the proposed Auxiliary in view of this report,

required of the Committee.

Replies from all the Bishops but those of Nova Scotia and Ouebec were promptly received, and the Committee has pleasure in stating with one exception the replies were all favorable. The Lord Bishop of Montreal feared that another organization would interfere with existing committees appointed for the same purpose, -an objection which the Committee feel could be easily removed by further acquaintance with the objects of the Auxiliary.

Their Lordships, the Bishops of Ontario and Algoma have each authorized a Diocesan Committee of four ladies for the purpose of

opening up the work of the Auxiliary in their Dioceses.

The Secretary of Ontario has reported to this Committee the result of her work so far. The Clergy of Ontario Diocese have been communicated with, and many encouraging replies received. Three parochial branches have been organized, and the Secretary has been

informed that others are organizing.

The Board is aware that the Provisional Committee have had but five months' work, and so far, comparatively, only the clergy have been reached, their sympathy and encouragement is a cause of great thankfulness to God for permitting the effort to be made, and to Him be all the praise and glory for whatever has been accomplished in this first step towards the formation of a Woman's Auxiliary in the mission work of the Church of England in Canada.

TO THE

CONSTITUTION FOR THE ECCLESIASTICAL PROVINCE OF CANADA.

1. This Association shall be called "The Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada."

2. The objects of this Association shall be: By means of united and systematic efforts to diffuse missionary intelligence and increase missionary activity among the women of the Church; to unite previously existing societies in one interest, and to endeavor to organize Diocesan and Parochial Branches throughout the Ecclesiastical Province.

3. All women of the Church who shall contribute to the funds annually, either through a Diocesan or Parochial Branch, shall be considered members of this Society.

4. The business of the Auxiliary shall be conducted by a Board of Managers, consisting of the Diocesan Branches, a Secretary-Treasurer, and Assistant Secretary, and such other members as may be nominated by the Bishops of the Province.

5. The wife of the Metropolitan shall be the President of this Society; she shall preside at the General Meeting, or in her absence, her place may be supplied by one of the Diocesan Presidents.

6. The Secretary-Treasurer and Assistant Secretary shall be appointed at the General Meeting of the Auxiliary.

7. A General Meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary shall be held once in three years, at the time of the Provincial Synod.

8. A special meeting may be called at any time at the request of two-thirds of the Board, three of whom shall form a quorum.

BY-LAWS.

1. The President shall take general supervision of the Diocesan Branches, and request the wives of the Missionary Bishops to represent the Auxiliary as officers thereof in their respective Diocesan Missions.

2. The Secretary-Treasurer shall give notice of all meetings, and keep a record of such meetings; shall receive reports from Diocesan Branches; shall receive and account for all contributions to the Auxiliary, and forward all moneys as authorized. She shall also prepare for publication an Annual Statement, and shall present a Financial Report of the General Meeting of the Auxiliary.

3. The Assistant Secretary shall attend to all correspondence with the branches of the Society; and to her all applications shall be made for information connected with the work of the Auxiliary.

4. Diocesan Branches shall be required to make an Annual Report to the Woman's Auxiliary.

DIOCESAN CONSTITUTION.

1. This Association shall be called "The — Diocesan Branch of the Womans' Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada."

2. The objects of this Association shall be: To awaken missionary zeal among the churchwomen in the Diocese; to diffuse missionary intelligence; to raise money for missionary objects, and to encourage the formation of Parochial Branches throughout the Diocese.

3. The officers of the Diocesan Branch shall consist of a President (who shall be the wife of the Bishop of the Diocese), Vice-Presidents (who shall be the Presidents of the various local branches), a Treasurer, a Recording and Corresponding Secretary, and a Board of Management, consisting of —— members, to be nominated by the Bishop of the Diocese.

4. The Diocesan Branch shall have charge of all Parochial Branches, and shall be the medium between the Parochial Branches and the Woman's Auxiliary to the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

5. The Parochial Branches shall be required to report annually to the Diocesan, and shall be represented by delegates at the Annual Meeting.

6 The Board of Management shall hold quarterly meetings for arranging plans of work, and for the transaction of such general business as may come before the Board.

7. The Annual Meeting shall be held....., at which meeting all reports shall be presented, and officers elected for the ensuing year.

8. A special meeting of the Diocesan Board may be called at any time by the President upon the request of any three members of the Board.

BY-LAWS.

- 1. The President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, shall preside at all meetings. She shall take the general supervision of the Parochial Branches and urge the formation of such Branches in all parishes of the Diocese.
- The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Diocesan Branch, and furnish the Parochial Branches with all possible intelligence concerning the work of Domestic and Foreign Missions.
- 3. The Recording Secretary shall give notice of all meetings of the Branch; record the proceedings of such meetings, and prepare an Annual Report.
- 4. The Treasurer shall receive all subscriptions and offerings, and forward to the Treasurer of the Woman's Auxiliary such amounts, and for such purposes as may be determined by the Board.

LOCAL AND PAROCHIAL CONSTITUTION.

- 1. This Association shall be called the [Ottawa]* Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society of the Church of England in Canada.
- 2. The objects of this Branch† shall be: To aid the Woman's Auxiliary in its work of interesting churchwomen in missionary work by one common bond of harmonized effort: to diffuse missionary intelligence and to infuse missionary zeal amongst the children of the Church. To receive contributions towards the fund of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society.
- 3. All women of the Church who desire to be members of this Association may become such by the payment of an annual subscription of [from 10 cents to \$1.00.]
- 4. The officers of the Branch shall be a President, Vice-President, a Recording and Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, and a Board of Management consisting of [two members from each parish.]
- 5. By a two-thirds vote at any General Meeting, this Branch shall be qualified to receive contributions for Diocesan Missions.
- 6. The Annual Meeting shall be held on the last Tuesday in April.
- 7. Monthly meetings shall be held on the last Tuesday of each month, at which the Order of business shall be:—

*The words in brackets [] refer to the Ottawa Branch only. †The plan of work is left to each Board of Management.

- This constitution may be amended by a two-third vote at the annual meeting, notice in writing having been given at a previous meeting.

BY-LAWS.

- 1. The President, or, in her absence, one of the Vice-Presidents shall preside at all meetings.
- 2. The duty of the Recording Secretary shall be to give notice of all meetings, and to keep a record of such meetings. She shall prepare the Annual Report, and send a statement of the work of the Branch to the Secretary of the Diocesan Auxiliary.
- 3. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society, and shall prepare an Annual Report of such correspondence.
- 4. The Treasurer shall receive and forward all money offerings, and keep an account of all money and articles contributed for missionary purposes. She shall present a monthly statement, and prepare an Annual Report; and shall also send to the Diocesan Treasurer a yearly Financial Report.
- 5. The Managers shall endeavor to increase in the Church a missionary spirit; shall decide on the best methods of augmenting the funds; and shall promote in every way the efficiency of the Branch in its labors of love and mercy.
- The collectors shall visit in the several congregations, explain the objects of the Society, enroll new members, and solicit regular subscriptions.
