### GRAND MASTERS ANNUAL ADDRESS.

BRETHREN OF THE GRAND LODGE OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

In the Providence of God you are again permitted to assemble in our Third Annual Communication, and I much regret that my unavoidable absence from the Province will prevent my meeting you on that occasion. My regret at not being able to meet you proceeds more from personal than other motives, as I feel satisfied the interests of our beloved order will not in any way be materially affected by my absence, but speaking for myself, I always look forward to the meetings of Grand, Lodge with pleasure; hence I feel much sorrow at not being able to exchange fraternal greetings with you on the occasion referred to.

Since our last Annual Meeting the Quarterly Communications of Grand Lodge have been held in May, at Tryon; in August at Souris; and in November at Alberton.

You will learn from the report of the R. W. Grand Secretary the business transacted on these occasions. The kind and hearty reception given us by the Brethren of "True Brothers," "Orient." and "Zetland" Lodges far exceeds my most sanguine expectations. The attendance at each of these meetings was large, and I trust the same good feeling and brotherly love which were then shown, may always attend the meetings of our Grand Lodge.

I have recommended the following appointments:-

Bro. B. Wilson Higgs, as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia near this Grand Lodge; Bro. Herry W. Attken, as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Illinois; Bro. Adam Murray, as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Florida, and Bro. George A. Aitken, as the representative of the Grand Lodge of Texas.

I respectfully ask Grand Lodge to confirm these appointments and recommendations. I have been so much occipied during the past year that I have been unable to visit as many of the Lodges as I should have desired, but in these few visited I found them working very fairly, and the Brethren in all the Lodges have expressed the determination of making themselves acquainted with the Ritual recommended by Grand Lodge. I have every hope, ere the end of another year, that a uniform system will obtain in all our Lodges. This is much to be desired, and will, I feel assured, have good results.

Eight Dispensations to confer degrees at shorter periods than authorized by our Constitution have been issued.

At our last Annual Communication we had, in this jurisdiction, nine chartered Lodges; to-day, we have to report eleven. Of the two last mentioned Lodges one is located in Victoria, and named. "Westmoreland," and the other, "Orient," and located in Souris East; and here I have with you to sympathize with our Brethren in Souris, for the loss they have met with in the month of December last by fire, when nothing was saved from the devouring element but the charter, (it not being in the Lodge at the time of the accident.) Our Brethren of Souris had expended a considerable sum in furnishing their Lodge, Boom, and in a few short hours everything was lost. From the solid material that compose Souris Lodge, I have no doubt, like the Phœnix, it will soon rise in greater splendor. It will be for you, Brethren, to say what assistance you can render our Worthy Brothers in this their time of distress.

In the month of June last a very large portion of the city of St. John, New Brunswick, was destroyed by fire, and, in common with other citizens. many of the members of the Craft in that commercial city suffered heavy loss, and no doubt many were left destitute. Our sister Grand Lodge and its subordinates lost nearly all of their property, but it is pleasing to record the fact that contributions from all quarters poured into St. John, not only for the general fund, but also from many Masonic jurisdictions, and our esteemed Brother, the M. W. Grand Master, Robert T. CLINCH, says in his annual address to the M. W. Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, in October last: "Our deep distress awoke the kindliest sympathy, and former rivalries were forgotten, and sectional differences disappeared from every part of the Dominion. from

In this great distress our beloved fraternity had its full share, the city Lodges having with their place of meeting, lost all their regalia and Masonic property.

If seel proud of the effort put forth on behalf of the fraternity in St. John by the members in this jurisdiction, and I feel it my duty at this Communication to thank them for their contributions.

During the past year death has been in our midst, and one of the representatives of this Grand Lodge Past Master Neil Rankin, has been called from labor to refreshment. Our deceased Brother was one whom we all held in high esteem, and was an active and worthy member of "Victoria" No. 2. I would suggest that a suitable memorial page be published with our proceedings.

The sad and untimely death of Brother Frank Gouley, Grand Secretary of the M. W. Grand Lodge of the state of Missouri, was, I am sure deplored by us all. Brother Gouley was one of the victims who lost his life by the fire that destroyed the Southern Hotel at St. Louis. It is considered by many well qualified to judge, as a teacher of Masonic law Brother Gouley had no superior.

An invitation was extended to myself and other members of Grand Lodge to be present at the opening of the Masonic Hall at Halifax, Nova Scotia. I was reluctantly compelled from want of time to decline this invitation, and various reasons of a like nature prevented others from attending.

At the Quarterly-Communication held in Alberton, in November last Past Deputy Grand Master MacLean gave notice of a resolution that he would submit at the next Annual Communication, asking for certain amendments in our constitution viz: abolishing Quarterly Communications, increasing the initiation fee in subordinate lodges outside of Charlottetown, and a clear ballot for all candidates. As regards the abolishment of the Quarterly Communications, I am of opinion that the time has not arrived for such a change; let us Brethren get better acquainted with each other, and after a few more fraternal greetings, such as we have enjoyed at Summerside, Georgetown, Port Hill, Tryon, Souris, and Alberton, we will be in a better position to dispense with our Quarterly Communications.

The amendments asked for will be submitted for your careful consideration and whatever conclusion you arrive at I am satisfied your only desire will be for the advancement of Masonry in this Province.

Grand Master of old Virginia, United States of America, in his annual address to the Craft, mentions India in the following terms: "But a few days ago a Brother, the prospective Sovereign of an Empire on which the sun never sets, performed certain Masonic rites in the distant land of India. Parsee, Hindoo, Mohammedan, Jew and Christian, European and Asiatic, thronged in full clothing of the Craft to participate in the ceremonies of the occasion. And whilst the native Princes had been slow to honor the heir expectant to a throne the native Masons were emulous and eager to pay respect and homage to the Grand Master and Prince of England. What an illustration of the conservatism of Musonry."

At a Quarterly Communication of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Scotland held in Edinburg on the 4th instant the M. W. Grand Master Mason, Sir Michael R. Shaw Stewart, on the throne \* \* "The minutes of Grand Committee brought up the question of the recent change in the constitution of the Grand Orient of France. whereby a profession of belief in God and in the immortality of the soul is not now essential to admission as Freemasons in that body; and stated that Grand Secretary had intimated to the Grand Orient that should it be the case that such a radical change in the fundamental principles of ancient Freemasonry had indeed been confirmed by that body, Grand Committee would be under the necessity of recommending to Grand Lodge to sever the fraternal relations that have for so long a period subsisted between it and the Grand Orient of France. In connection with this subject, the Depute Grand Master had called attention to the letter, which as he thought, had been very properly addressed by Grand Secretary to the editor of the *Courant* pointing out that, instead of requiring to be urged by a subordinate lodge to its duty in regard to the obliteration of religion from French Freemasonry. Grand Lodge as represented by the Grand Master and Grand Committee, had. some weeks previous to the resolution of Mother Kilwinning on the subject, communicated with the Grand Orient; and Grand Secretary had been thanked for his letter, and instructed to put on record that it was beyond the province of Mother Kilwinning or any lodge holding of Grand Lodge to communicate direct with any Foreign Grand Lodge on the subject of Freemasonry. A reply was submitted from the Grand Orient expressing great astonishment at the proposal for the rupture of fraternal relations, and remarking that there seemed to be a belief that the Grand Orient. in modifying the first article of the French Masonic Constitution, wished to profess atheism and materialism; but holding that this was an erroneous interpretation of the vote-an interpretation which there had already been occasion to protest against-and declaring without hesitation that nothing was more contrary to the feelings which dictated the revision of the article of constitution. In concluding the letter from the Grand Orient expressed the hope that the considerations set forth therein would be weighed by Grand Lodge, which counted among its members so many distinguished men, that when better informed on the question now occupying its attention it would refuse to take part in an act of intolerance which would be at complete variance with the real sentiments of the Masonic brotherhood, and that the fraternal relations now existing between Grand Lodge and Lodge Orient would be continued. Grand Committee had expressed an opinion that the reply of the Grand Orient was not satisfactory, and this was confirmed by Grand Lodge."

For the Statistics and Finances of this jurisdiction, I must refer you to the reports of the R. W. Grand Secretary and R. W. Grand Treasurer, which I have every confidence will be full and complete.

I again tender you my sincere thanks for my election as your Grand Master for the third time. From the first I undertook the duties of this high position with great reluctance, feeling myself unequal to it. but the kind consideration and assistance which have been extended to me by all the members of the Grand Lodge, have made my task an easy one, and my past associations with you must always be most kindly remembered by me. I trust in electing my successor you may select one better qualified and able to devote more time to the good of the Craft than I have had at my disposal.

Brethren, we are members of an Institution, to say the least, dating back many centuries, of which we may well be proud. Let us go forward and work out the sublime principles laid down on our Trestle board and with the blessing of the G. A. O. T. U. our lodges will prosper in this jurisdiction.

Trusting that your deliberations may be characterized by that feeling of harmony and good will which has hitherto existed, so that the honor and reputation of our noble Order may be fully sustained.
