## HISTORICAL SKETCH.

In the Fifth Chapter of the "Jesuit Relations" for 1668 will be found the earliest reference made by them to the existence of any Indians in the neighborhood of Kingston. The precise locality is not mentioned; the band, however, is stated to have been of the Cayuga Nation, and it appears that they were accompanied from their former housen the New York Iroquois Country by Messieurs Fenelon and Trouve, two fervent Missionaries. In 1673, Frontenac arrived in command of a French squadron, consisting of two batteaux and a large number of canoes. On approaching the first opening of the lake, (off the Point of Cedar Island) it was formed into line of battle. proceeding on its way inwards for about a mile and a half it was met by the chiefs of the Five Nations and the Abbé d'Wolfe. who had previously intimated to the gallant Frenchman that the "Captains of the Five Nations were coming to meet the Governor." These preceded him as guides, and conducted him to a Bay, which forms, says the Chronicle, "One of the most beautiful and agreeable harbors in the world, capable of holding a hundred of the largest ships, with sufficient water at the mouth, and in the harbor, with a mud bottom, and so sheltered from every wind that a cable is scarcely necessary for mooring." The fort was built in 1673, and the seigniory of Cataraqui, consisting of Wolfe Island, Howe Island, two adjacent Islets and four leagues of country along the border of Lake Frontenac (Ontario), were granted to La Salle in 1675, subject to certain conditions. From the building of the Fort until he sailed for France in the year just mentioned, he commanded the garrison, and was: to some extent successful in his attempts to induce the Indians tolead lives less savage, than, as a matter of choice, they would be inclined to adopt. On his return from France he was accompanied by several colonists. Shortly after this, La Salle's loyalty being questioned, Fort Frontenac (as well as Fort St. Louis in Illinois, which he held) were sequestrated, but he returned to the French Court, successfully defended himself against his detractors and obtained the restitution of his possessions. 1684. De la Barre was at Fort Frontenac with a force of 700

Canadians, 130 regulars and 200 Indians. It was his intention to proceed on an expedition to Oswego against the Iroquois. With that object in view he remained for two weeks; owing, however, to the conclusion of a treaty of peace, war wasobviated. But for all this it seems that the Iroquois required watching, for within a year DeNonville appears on the scene for that especial purpose. He wished to impress them with the idea that they should respect the territory of the Illinois and other tribes, in whose territories France was endeavoring to establish her sovereignty. But they were not susceptible of new impressions, and so his mission was a failure. As to the Fort, it seems at this period to have received new consideration from the Government, who were more than ever disposed to consider it as a very important frontier post. Acting on thisbelief they sent to it more troops, as well as additional munitions. of war. In 1687, a number of Indians, who had been induced. to come to Cataraqui as deputies through the mediation of Père-Lamberville, were, by DeNonville's directions, siezed, put in chains and sent to France. Owing to the activity of the Iroquois, who were assisted in their counsels by Colonel Longan, a British officer, the position of the garrison at the Fort became precarious. In 1687-8 we find DeNonville negotiating for permission to re-victual Cataraqui. In 1688 the celebrated Huron chief, "The Rat," styled the Machiavel of the West, arrived with his warriors to aid the French against the Iroquois. But on his arrival he found that his assistance was not required as a treaty of peace had been concluded. From this period until 1756 no events of particular importance occurred at the Fort. In this year a large force was concentrated at Cataraqui, by the famous Montcalm, preparatory to an attack upon the English Garrison at Oswego. On the 14th August the assault was made, and was successful. The victors captured the defending force, 1780 strong, 7 vessels carrying from 8 to 18 guns each, 200 batteaux, 107 cannon, 14 mortars, 730 muskets, stores of all kinds, 5 stands of colors, and the garrison chest containing 18,000 francs; one hundred women and children were also taken prisoners. The besieged lost one hundred in killed and wounded; that of the French was trifling. This event had an important bearing on the future history of Canada. The smart which it occasioned stimulated the British to great exertions, and led to a series of events the final result of which was the capture of Quebec and the overthrow of "La Nouvelle France". Niagara to Quebec numbered 30,000 men, exclusive of sailors and marines. At this time the native Canadian census of males between sixteen and sixty numbered only 15,000, while the regular troops in the country did not exceed 5,000. The greater part of the booty taken at Oswego by Montcalm, and at Bradstreet's defeat in 1755, was stored at Fort Frontenac, but the force left for the defence of the post was a mere handful of men, said to be only 50 in number. When, therefore, they were attacked in August, 1758, by a force of 2,700 men under Bradstreet, it is not surprising, though they did have the temerity to resist the assault, that they were compelled to surrender. terms of the capitulation were signed on the 27th of the month and in the year just named. Shortly after this event the conquest of Quebec, the chief stronghold of French power, was achieved by the young and brilliant General Wolfe: the whole country then became a British possession.

Passing on to 1784, the advent of the United Empire Loyalists, which took place in that year, should not be passed over in silence. This gallant band of refugees, under the direction of Captain Michael Grass, commenced anew the struggle of life against what must have been the most adverse circumstances, rather than continue to exist in a country where the public sentiment was opposed to their well-defined, thorough and conscientious principles of loyalty.

Those who sacrifice their personal welfare for a noble principle are certainly worthy of the highest respect; they not only acquire honor themselves, but reflect it upon their descendants. Kingston was founded the year of their arrival, and such was its prosperity that it held, and for a considerable period continued to hold, the first position in the colony.

During the war of 1812 the fortifications at Kingston were greatly improved and enlarged; it was also the principal depot for the concentration of naval and military stores. The safety of the situation inspired confidence; this, with other causes, gave a marked impetus to business, so that during the continuance of the war it advanced rapidly. In 1840 Lord Sydenham, who occupied the position of Governor, selected Kingston as the capital of the United Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada; but, owing to his unfortunate and unforeseen death, Kingston lost its opportunity, and the expectations of its citizens—expectations of solid advancement and certain prosperity—were in 'this particular doomed to remain unfulfilled. In 1845 the seat of Government was removed to Montreal, and afterwards, for reasons too well known to require to be mentioned here, it

continued its eastward course as far as Quebec. After this the expensive perambulating system found favor for several years. The fact is that a great deal of sectional jealousy existed in various portions of the Provinces in reference to this question. Montreal, Quebec, Toronto, Hamilton, Kingston, and Ottawa all advanced claims in this direction, but the rather unexpected selection of the last-named place extinguished the hopes of the others, and settled the matter definitely. Kingston was disappointed, but so were Montreal, Quebec, Toronto, and Hamilton. Considering the natural advantages possessed by Kingston for purposes of trade and commerce, and that the selection of Ottawa in reality took nothing away from it, the check which the progress of the city received from this cause seems to have been greater than was rendered necessary by the event. Be this as it may, it was a disappointment which for some years injuriously affected the business prospects of the place.

There are considerably over five thousand cities, towns and villages in the Dominion of Canada, and of this large number, Kingston, which was incorporated as a city in 1838, is exceeded in population by eight cities only. The order of precedence is as follows:—Montreal, P.Q., 160,000; Quebec, P.Q., 75,000; Toronto, Ont., 70,000; St. John, N.B., 32,000; Halifax, N.S., 30,000; Hamilton, Ont., 27,000; Ottawa, Ont., 26,000; London, Ont., 20,000; Kingston, 16,000. With the exception of Quebec and Halifax, which is the military headquarters of the Dominion of Canada, and the chief naval station for the whole of British North America and the West Indies, Kingston is the most strongly fortified place in Canada. It is very pleasantly situated at the head of the far-famed Thousand Islands, River St. Lawrence, where the waters of Lake Ontario, the Bay of Quinté and the great Cataraqui Creek are united with that river. compares favorably in appearance with the most important places in either of the Provinces, being built in a very solid and substantial manner, principally of stone and brick. Many of the public buildings are very fine; amongst others, the City Hall buildings, Court house, Post office, Custom house, Queen's University and College, and notably the following, which, however, strictly speaking, are not within the city limits:—The Kingston Penitentiary, the Asylum for Insane and the C nada Military College. All the business streets, and, with a few exceptions, the remainder of the others, are of a good width. Princess, the chief business thoroughfare, is one of the handsomest streets, in the Province; it slopes upwards from the harbor, and extends to the city limits. It is intersected first

by Ontario, then, in the following order, by King, Wellington, Bagot, Montreal, Sydenham, Clergy, and Barrie, where the principal business portion of it ends, although beyond the lastmentioned street there are quite a number of business houses. But throughout the length particularly specified it is lined on both sides with stores. The other principal business streets are Ontario, Wellington, King, Clarence, Brock, and, in a lesser degree, South Market square, Queen, Bagot, and Montreal; lesser not as regards the standing, but the number of mercantile or manufacturing establishments.

Commercially speaking, Kingston, the chief town of the county of Frontenac, is one of the soundest places in the Dominion. Failures are of comparatively rare occurrence; no kity or town withstood more successfully the late very recent and very general depression in all branches of commerce, and, allowing that that depression, in a more moderate degree, still exists, no place, judging from the past, is more likely to withstand its effects. One of the causes, and not the least of them, of so many business houses coming to grief, is that, in the majority of our cities, towns and villages, business is entirely overdone; the supply being greatly in excess of the demand, but this does not seem to be the case in Kingston, where all business houses, possessing adequate capital and experience, do, at the least, a paying, and, in a large number of instances, a very profitable business. The situation of Kingston for purposes of trade is so advantageous that it must always be a place of considerable importance. It possesses at the present time a very large grain shiping business, for which it has excellent wharfage accommodations. For steamboat and ship building it also enjoys the most ample facilities. Opposite the city are Wolfe and Garden Islands, between these and it lies the bay which, so long ago as 1373, was declared to be one of the finest in the world. Since the building of the Grand Trunk Railway Kingston has had the advantages of railway facilities, and within the past year a marked impetus has been given to the trade of the city by the opening of a certain portion of the Kingston and Pembroke Railway. For the following facts in reference to this important. undertaking we are chiefly indebted to the kindness of the President, C. F. Gildersleeve, Esq.:—The railway is now completed and running from the City of Kingston to the Mississippi River, a distance of sixty-one miles. The line, as far as built, passes through the townships of Kingston, Portland, Hinchinbrooke, Olden, Oso and Palmerston. tion, Hinchinbrooke, Parham, Olden, Sharbot Lake, Oso and Mississippi. There are still about forty-five miles of the line to be built before it reaches the Canada Central Railway in the vicinity of the village of Renfrew, over which it has running powers to Pembroke. The line was projected to open up the country between the City of Kingston and Pembroke to the north of the Ottawa River, a distance of about one hundred and thirty-five miles, a considerable portion of which is still unsettled. The timber and mineral resources of this country are large. The principal lumbering rivers tapped by the railway are the Mississippi, the Clyde, the Madawaska, the Bonnechere and the Ottawa. They drain the largest and best of the pine tracts of Ontario. A commencement has been made in working the iron ore deposits, principally at Glendower, thirty miles north of Kingston, where the ore is of a very superior quality resembling Swedish iron. Sharbot Lake (where there is a good hotel) and the other back lakes abound with fish and game, and are attracting large numbers of sportsmen. beneficial effects of the railway are apparent in the improved appearance of the City of Kingston, into which it brings large quantities of cordwood, grain, bark, hop poles, railway-ties, rafting material, sawed lumber, square timber and iron ore; taking back supplies for the settled portions of the country as well as the lumbering districts.

A line drawn from the intersection by the Rideau Canal of the eastern boundary of Frontenac, thence to Richardson Station on the Kingston and Pembroke Railway, is the southern boundary of a region rich in iron ores, phosphate of lime, plumbago, soapstone, galena, baryta, and mica. The quantity of phosphate of lime taken out during the past year is stated to be 3,000 tons. The galeniferous veins have been only partially explored, and the Frontenac lead mine is the only enterprise as yet in which extensive operations for this mineral have been conducted. It is believed that the mineral resources of Frontenac will yet win an extensive interest. The fitness of its very superior iron ores for the manufacture of steel has been fully proved. mense extent of forest within the county, whence an abundant supply of charcoal is obtainable, should render the manufacture of charcoal, pig-iron, blooms and steel matters within the enterprise of iron masters. White lead, notoriously connected with several golden fortunes, should be one of the manufactures of Kingston, while its neighborhood to the phosphate mines should also lead to the location of chemical works within the city. In view of the impetus given to the city's growth by the construction of the

Kingston and Pembroke Railway, the expenditure of half a million of dollars for needed facilities for the Grand Trunk Railway would be well spent money, bringing, as it would, to the city a coal trade of 60,000 tons a year, a live stock transhipment trade with New York, and the tide of western travel yearly seeking the St. Lawrence and New England seaboard.

The introduction of street railways into Canada is of comparatively recent occurrence, and Kingston has availed itself of this great modern convenience. The Kingston Street Railway was formally opened on June 15th, 1877, and from that date to Oct. 20th it carried not less than one hundred and fifty-five thousand eight hundred and seventy passengers. The line runs from the city boundary on Princess street to the head of Penitentiary Hill, embracing in its course the principal avenues of travel and their tributaries. Its length is eight thousand five hundred and sixty yards, or nearly five miles, including sidings. Eight cars run at intervals of twelve minutes from each end; the number of horses required is forty-five. The capital stock of the Company is fifty thousand dollars, subscribed capital forty thousand dollars. The cost of the whole was about thirty-nine thousand five hundred dollars. The president of the road is J. L. Morrison, Esq., and the above particulars were furnished by the courteous and obliging secretary-treasurer, John Taylor, Esq.

Foremost amongst the educational institutions of the Domion is Queen's University and College, which is very pleasantly situated in the west end of the city. In affiliation with the University is the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons, and the Kingston Collegiate Institute. Full accounts of these, as well as of many other important institutions in Kingston, such as the Canada Military College, the School of Gunnery, the Asylum for Insane, the Kingston Penitentiary, etc., will be found in the Miscellaneous Directory.

Kingston is distant from Ottawa 95 miles; Toronto, 161 miles; Montreal, 172 miles; Hamilton, 199 miles; St. Catharines, 230 miles; London, 276 miles; Quebec, 344 miles; Detroit, Mich., 386 miles; St. John, N.B., 752 miles; Halifax, N.S., 828 miles; Charlottetown, P. E. Island, 1052 miles; Liverpool, England, 2,414 miles.

are placed in an adjoining engine house, also built of stone. A drying-kiln with capacity of about 20,000 ft. is in one of the spacious cellars. Either wet or dry steam can be employed; but all the lumber used is weather-seasoned for one or two years before undergoing the kiln-drying process, which lasts for one or more months longer. All the machinery in service is of the latest improved kind, and consists in part of a "Daniel" planer, surface planer, band-circular and scroll saws, jointer, turning lathes, iron and wood-drilling machines, etc., etc. The premises are heated and glue boiled by the same agency—steam pipes, of which there are some 10,000 feet throughout the whole building. The steam, as it condenses, flows back to a tank and thence finds its way again into the boiler. There is also every facility for raising and lowering the pianos from one floor to another.

In short, the object of the proprietors has been to produce a model factory, one in which the economization of labor will improve instead of injuring the quality of the article manufactured. ### BARRIEFIELD.

### CATARAQUI.

A VILLAGE containing about three hundred inhabitants, on the Kingston and Napanee road, in the township of Kingston, county of Frontenac, three miles from the city of Kingston, with which place it has daily stage communication. It is at the junction of the Perth, Portland, Napanee and Stormont roads. Its chief buildings are the Town Hall, Episcopal church, Methodist church, and the newly-erected Masonic hall.

The principal places of business are the brick yards, very extensively worked by Mr. J. Day and the Cataraqui nurseries. A remarkable feature of the place is the Protestant cemetery, which contains nearly one hundred acres.

It is situated on a succession of gradually ascending sand hills, the great natural beauty of which has been highly enhanced by the admirable manner in which the grounds, which are beautifully adorned with trees, have been laid out.

Appended is a brief sketch of Christ church. About ten years ago, in order to meet the wants of the people of the village, a service was commenced in the Town Hall. The attendance rapidly inreased, and it was resolved to build a church, on an acre of ground in the cemetery bequeathed by Mrs. Akinson. The Rev. H, Wilson, B. D., set to work with a will, collected three thousand dollars, and the building was completed and consecrated by the bishop of the Diocese, on October 16th, 1870. The congregation still continuing to increase at a rapid rate it became necessary to enlarge the edifice and, through the liberality of G. A. Kirkpatrick, Esq., M.P., this was accomplished, at a cost of about two thousand two hundred dollars. Twenty feet were added, and a handsome tower erected, and the new part was consecrated Advent Sunday, 1877. The church, in which service is held regularly every Sunday at 4 p. m. by the Rev. H. Wilson, is capable of seating three hundred, and is always well filled. It is considered to be the prettiest church in the diocese, and is, in fact, a perfect model of ecclesiastical architecture.

It possesses a deep and well sheltered harbor, has a daily mail and contains a population, exclusive of the Penitentiary and Asylum of about one thousand.

This celebrated penal institution is situated in the village of Portsmouth, on the shore of Lake Ontario, at the embouchure of the St Lawrence, two miles distant from the Kingston city hall. The buildings, consisting of workshops, dormitories, dining hall, chapels, female prison, etc., are constructed of cut stone, forming three sides of a square surrounded by high and massive stone walls, with corner towers, enclosing eleven and a half acres; extensive wharves run along the west and south sides, with depth of water from 16 to 30 feet. The warden's house, fronting on the east side, is a large and commodious residence of cut stone, which, with its surrounding gardens, green house, graperies, etc., were constructed by convict labor, every

The male convicts are employed as foundrymen, blacksmiths, carpenters, tailors, shoemakers, quarrymen and farm laborers.

thing connected with the house being prepared in the Penitentiary.

The blacksmith department consists of the foundry, finishing, lock and blacksmith shops, employing 80 men. A large amount of work has been done in this department for the public buildings at Ottawa, Canadian Pacific Railroad and St. Vincent de Paul Penitentiary.

The carpenter department employs 90 men in carpentry and furniture work. Here also much work has been done for the Department of Militia and Defence and Military College of Kingston.

The tailoring department gives employment to 62 men. Besides the clothing required by the institution large Government orders have been ful-Yilled.

The shoe department of 30 men are employed in work required for the Penitentiary, and last year supplied the boots, etc., for the Northwest

The quarries, connected with the Penitentiary and wharves by a tramway recently constructed by convict labor, are worked on an extensive scale, supplying all the stone for the work required in the Penitentiary, a large quantity for Government and for private sale.

A farm of 60 acres is under cultivation; another farm of 119 acres has been recently purchased, and on the two sufficient farm produce is raised to supply the wants of the entire establishment. The farms and quarries give employment to 156 men.

The female convicts are employed in household work, needle work and

This constant employment tends greatly to relieve the necessary irksome confinement, whilst the perfect ventilation, cleanliness, ample allowance of good plain food, entire absence of cruel, harsh or irritating discipline, keeps the convicts healthy and comparatively reconciled to their lot, and at the same time the profit arising from their labor contributes largely to the support of the institution.

Whilst physical labor is amply provided, mental employment is not neglected. Daily instruction is given in the school by competent teachers; copy books, slates, books, etc., are allowed in the cells for evening practice, and, to quote the chaplain's report,—" the school is producing the best possible result." There is also an extensive library for the convicts' use.

### KINGSTON GAOL.

This Gaol has been occupied eighteen years, and is one of the most complete in the country, being very secure, and is well laid out for the proper classification of criminals. The average number of prisoners in confinement is between thirty-five and forty.

### EDUCATIONAL.

### QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE.

This institution, one of the oldest and most celebrated in Canada, is situated in the west end of the city, the grounds being bounded by Union, Arch and Stuart streets. The houses of the Principal and Professors command a fine view of Lake Ontario and the surrounding country. The college buildings are handsome and substantial structures, though, on account of the increasing number of students, an extension of them is greatly required. The Astronomical Observatory of the institution, which is situated very inconveniently in the public park instead of in the college grounds, was founded in 1855, and was deeded to the University in 1861. It contains an equatorial by Mr. Alvan Clarke, with an object glass 61 inches aperture, a small transit by Troughton & Simms, and an astronomical clock constructed by the assistant observer; also the Beaufoy transit, lent by the Royal Astronomical Society, England, a reflecting telescope by Mr. Short, with a speculum of 7½ inches in diameter, and a refracting telescope.

The library contains nearly 11,000 volumes, and receives considerable additions, annually. Donations are sent to it from all quarters. The museum is varied and extensive. Its Mineralogical and Palæontological collections are particularly valuable.

Queen's College was incorporated with the style and privileges of a University by a Royal Charter, dated October 16, 1841. A complete curriculum of study leads to the degrees in Arts of B.A., B.S.C., and M.A.; in Theology, of B.D.; and in Medicine, of M.D. These degrees are conferred on those who have gone through the required curriculum and passed the prescribed examinations. The Senate, however, is empowered to confer, besides these, the Honorary Degrees of D.D., and LL.D., for literary, scientific, or professional distinction.

The Session in Arts begins on the first Wednesday of October, and closes on the last Thursday of April; the Session in Theology begins on the first Monday of November, and closes at the same time as the Arts Session. There are twenty scholarships in Arts and eight in Theology, ranging in value from
