

MALCONTENTS EVERYWHERE.

The Laurier Government Will Have Difficulty in Posture, It is Said.

MR. DELISLE ON SCHOOL QUESTION.

The Portment Member Scores Sir Henri Joly—Sir M. Bowell is Criticized.

Montreal, Aug. 17.—(Special)—The Government, it appears, will have difficulty in posture. Mr. Delisle, who is to be found everywhere, said the ex-minister for that country yesterday, Mr. Arthur Delisle, "Yes," he added, "I know them from experience, the present leaders of our party. In 1897 I wanted, while remaining liberal, to vote with Sir Charles Tupper, the only man who spoke from conviction on that famous school question, and believed it to be my duty to do so. Such a position was made for me, because of that vote at the elections following I had to make way for Hon. Mr. Joly, who today is Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia, and who cares very little for the interests of the party."

"Well, today," added Mr. Delisle, "I am still a Liberal of the old school. I will be a candidate in the county of Portment at the coming elections. I declare this, and I will run against all comers. I will run as an independent Liberal, ready to give support to fair play according to its merits to the party in power. I do not wish to say any more," added Mr. Delisle, "but do not forget that if I am a Liberal I am not a 'Liberal' of the Liberal Conservative, in any case I can judge myself with the experience of a man who has been in the House of Commons for twenty years."

"I have given the subject a good deal of study in the past, and my opinion is unfavorable to state ownership of railways." This statement was made yesterday by Sir Mackenzie Bowell, who was interviewed just previous to leaving for St. John's, Nfld., in company with Hon. Senator O'Brien.

The ex-premier was asked what he thought of the Liberal Government, and that a movement was on foot to sell the Dominion, and he replied that he knew nothing of any movement of the kind, with the exception of a letter in this direction about two years ago.

As far as political support is concerned, Sir Mackenzie believed the I.C.R. employed as well as the civil service would generally support the Government in 1896.

The Government will be defeated, he said, if the Liberal Government is not supported by the I.C.R. employees as well as the civil service.

"Yes, I heard the rumor," Sir Mackenzie replied, "but I hope it is not well founded. Mr. Foy has done excellent work in the local field, and I would be very sorry to see him leave Mr. Whitney."

THE INTERNATIONAL TYPERS

Will Probably Object to the Stereotypers Forming a Union of Their Own.
