

#### REPORT.

The Trustees and Managers of the Toronto House of Industry, in accordance with their Act of Incorporation, beg to submit the following report of the affairs of the charity for the past year, to the subscribers and the public.

Since the last annual meeting, as will be seen from the accompanying statements, a large amount of relief has been afforded by the institution to the poor of the city. The winter of 1859-60 having proved one of great severity, and consequently called for unusual exertion on the part of the Board, who while anxious to grant relief to all truly deserving applicants, were yet equally anxious to guard against The system of ward visiting adopted imposition. by the Board, and alluded to in a former report, has been kept in successful operation, by which means each family applying for relief is personally visited, and a report made to the Weekly Committee thereon. Of such importance is this plan considered by the Board, that they can scarcely imagine any organisation for the relief of the poor could be successfully conducted without it.

The Trustees and Managers would again express a desire, that all who take an interest in the working

of this charity would visit the house, and make themselves familiar with its objects and management.

During the year 1860, no less than 825 families have been on the books of the house, receiving outdoor relief for the winter months, and in some cases for the whole year; this being in addition to the usual number of inmates, averaging over 100 in the house, and also of the casual poor relieved.

In a former report, the Trustees and Managers expressed a hope that the Industrial Farm purchased by the City Council, together with the House of Refuge about to be erected thereon, would ere long be in successful operation, as they were satisfied that if properly conducted, it would tend greatly to meet the wants of a large class of poor, and also be the means of putting an end to vagrancy and street begging so common in our streets.

As in former years, the Board have again made arrangements for granting the usual out-door relief, as far as practicable, during the present winter. A soup kitchen has also been again opened in connection with the house, and which has heretofore been found a great boon to large numbers of applicants.

The Trustees and Managers cannot refrain from alluding in grateful terms to the liberal contributions made by our citizens to the funds of this charity, and continued so cheerfully from year to year, as also to the liberal grant from the City Council, and to which must be attributed in a great degree the present very satisfactory state of the funds.

The Superintendent and Matron of the house continue to discharge their duties to the entire satisfaction of the Board.

Annexed will be found a detailed statement of the Treasurer's accounts for the past year, duly audited, and also a report from the Superintendent, shewing the amount and nature of relief afforded to applicants during the year, as also of the numbers in the house, &c.
