CONSTITUTION

OF THE

TORONTO EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY.

ARTICLE I.

This Institution shall be called "THE TORONTO EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY."

ARTICLE II.

All Annual Subscribers of One Dollar and upwards shall be Members, and entitled to Vote at General Meetings and Elections.

ARTICLE III.

Any person subscribing and paying at one time Fifty Dollars, shall be a Member for Life, and entitled to the same privileges as Annual Subscribers.

ARTICLE IV.

The Annual Meeting shall be held in October in each year, or as soon thereafter as practicable, to receive the Report of the Directors for the previous year (ending on the 30th September), and to appoint a President, a Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Nine Directors, and to transact any other business which may be necessary.

ARTICLE V.

Regular Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held in January, April, July, and October. Special Meetings of the Directors shall be called at other times by the Secretary, at the request of the President or any three of the Directors. Five Directors shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI.

An Executive Committee of three shall be annually chosen by the Directors from their own number, who shall, in conjunction with the Senior Surgeon, make such arrangements and regulations for the management of the Infirmary as shall by them be deemed best

RESOLUTIONS

PASSED AT THE EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE TORONTO EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY, HELD AT THE INFIRMARY, ON TUESDAY EVENING, THE 2ND JANUARY, 1877.

Mr. A. T. McCord, late City Chamberlain, occupied the chair. The report of the Directors was read by Mr. T. C. Thomson, and that of the Surgeons by Dr. Rosebrugh.

Moved by Rev. Dr. Castle, seconded by Dr. Fulton.

"That the report just read be adopted, and that it be printed for circulation, with the list of the subscribers, and a list of the intern patients maintained in the Institution during the year ending September 30th, 1876," and "That the following Officers and Directors be appointed for the ensuing year—viz. : Messrs. A. T. McCord, President ; A. Dredge, Vice-President ; Thomas C. Thomson, Secretary and Treasurer ; and Messrs. Wm. Elliott, Robert Wilkes, ex-M.P., E. J. Palmer, W. J. Macdonell, J. H. Mason, John McBean, Samuel Platt, and G. M. Evans, Directors."

Moved by Dr. Workman, seconded by Dr. Slater.

"That whereas, the statistics of the Infirmary show that of the \$15,488 spent during the last seven years for the maintenance of the intern or hospital patients, \$12,000, or more than four-fifths of the entire amount, was spent in behalf of non-residents of Toronto; it is, therefore, the opinion of this meeting that the Provincial character of the Institution is thereby fully established, and should be so recognized by the Ontario Government."

Moved by J. H. Mason, seconded by A. Dredge.

"That whereas, both Mr. Langmuir, the Inspector of Asylums

for the Province, and the Board of Directors of the Infirmary, have again urged the necessity of providing more suitable premises for the Institution—

"*Resolved*, That this meeting authorizes and requests the Board of Directors to again bring the matter under the notice of the Ontario Government, and to take such further steps as may be necessary for the purpose of securing premises more adequate for the requirements of such an institution."

Moved by Rev. Wm. Briggs, seconded by G. M. Evans.

"That whereas, the Toronto Eye and Ear Infirmary is more provincial than local in its character, it is desirable that the name of the Institution should be more comprehensive; therefore

"*Resolved*, That the name be changed from the Toronto Eye and Ear Infirmary to the Ontario Eye and Ear Infirmary, and that the Directors be authorized to take the necessary steps to carry this resolution into effect."

Hearty votes of thanks were then tendered to Mr. A. T. McCord, as President; T. C. Thomson, as Secretary; and to the Surgeons, Drs. Rosebrugh, Reeve and Coleman, for their valuable services, rendered gratuitously, during the year.

The meeting then adjourned.

At a subsequent meeting of the Board of Directors, Messrs. T. C. Thomson, A. Dredge, and W. A. Macdonell were re-appointed members of the Executive Committee; Dr. Rosebrugh was appointed Senior Surgeon; Dr. Reeve and Dr. Coleman, Surgeons; Dr. Parsons, Dr. Hobley, and Dr. G. S. Ryerson, Clinical Assistants; and Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Phillips, Superintendent and Matron.

DIRECTORS' REPORT.

The Directors have great pleasure in once more presenting to the Annual Meeting a review of the statistics, and of the financial condition of the Infirmary for the past year.

This charity still continues its good work of relieving such of the very poor as are afflicted with diseases of the eye and ear, and the Directors are glad to acknowledge the continued liberality of the citizens of Toronto in supporting so purely benevolent an institution.

The Directors deeply regret that Mr. W. T. Mason, who has filled the office of Secretary to the Board for the last nine years, was compelled through illness to tender his resignation in February, which the Board very reluctantly accepted. Mr. Thomas C. Thomson was appointed to act in his stead until the next Annual Meeting.

Mr. Mason was one of the earliest friends of the Infirmary; he took an active part in its organization, and much of its success is due to his energy and perseverance. In this affliction both he and his family have our warmest sympathy, and we trust that in due time he may be fully restored to his wonted health and strength.

On the first of June the lease of the house on Adelaide street expired, and the premises now occupied being vacant, the Directors decided to move into them, believing that the change would be beneficial. The present premises afford no additional accommodation for intern patients, but it was supposed that the surroundings of the building would prove to be more wholesome than the situation on Adelaide street. In this, however, the Directors have been somewhat disappointed, having found that the back yard was undrained, owing to the want of a sewer on Dalhousie street, but as a sewer has since been constructed they trust that within a short time the back premises will be put into a thoroughly wholesome state.

During the year the Directors had the offer at a moderate price of a very desirable property on Elm street. Mr. Langmuir, Inspector ot Asylums, reported in its favour, and the matter was brought under the notice of the Attorney-General, but as no aid was guaranteed by him on behalf of the Ontario Government, the Directors did not feel justified in undertaking its purchase, and the property passed into other hands. The Directors regret very much not having been in a position to buy this property, as they fear that a similar opportunity may not soon occur again.

The Directors call special attention to what has been stated in former reports, namely, that the Toronto Eye and Ear Infirmary, though local in name, is clearly Provincial in its character, as is shown by the register of the intern or hospital patients, whose board and lodging, are the chief expense in the management of this institution. Out of a total of 436 intern patients who have been maintained in the Infirmary since its opening in 1870 only 76 were from Toronto, the remaining 360 being either emigrants or from different parts of the Province. The 76 patients from Toronto were supported in the institution 2,979 days, at a cost of \$2,490, whereas the remaining 360 were kept 15,500 days; at a cost of \$12,998, or about five times as much as the latter. That is for every dollar spent on a Toronto patient over five dollars are spent on patients from the country. Nevertheless the Directors are willing to bear this unequal burden provided that the Government will give them assistance in providing a suitable building in which the work of this Infirmary may be carried on with greater efficiency.

SURGEONS' REPORT.

The Surgeons of the Toronto Eye and Ear Infirmary, in presenting their Ninth Annual Report regret that they have again to complain that the efficiency of the institution is still very much restricted on account of the small and ill-adapted building in which its operations are carried on.

The number of beds for patients is limited to twelve—six for males and six for females. The number of female patients occupying beds in the institution is usually less than that of the males, and six beds in the female department would probably be sufficient for some time to come, but accommodation for male patients should be at least double what it now is. We are frequently obliged to refuse admission to proper subjects on account of the male department being already full.

As some time must necessarily elapse before a suitable isolated building can be erected, the surgeons would suggest that it might be well for the Directors to consider the propriety of taking such further steps as may be necessary for the purpose of securing premises more adequate for the requirements of such an institution, which will admit of proper classification of the patients, more efficient system of heating and ventilation, construction of bath rooms, and afford more accommodation for the treatment of *extern*, or dispensary patients. The medical statistics for the year are as follows :

The total number of cases under treatment was 462, divided as follows :—*Intern* or hospital patients 96 :—*Extern* or dispensary patients, 366 being an increase in the number of *Intern*, and a decrease in the number of *Extern* patients as compared with the previous year.

Of the total number of 462 patients, 467 were eye, and 95 were ear cases; 366 were out and 96 were in-patients; 350 were from the city of Toronto, 14 were from the county of York, 95 from other counties in the province of Ontario, and 3 from other countries. 260 were males, (159 boys and single men, 90 married men and 11 widowers), and 202 were females, (115 girls and spinsters, 63 married women and 24 widows).

The 462 patients professed to belong to the following churches: Episcopalians 173, Roman Catholics 136, Methodists 68, Presbyterians 53, Baptist 15, Plymouth Brethren 2, Congregational 5, Lutheran 4, Unitarian 1, Menonite 1, not registered 4.

adapted to promote the objects of the charity ;—the President to be an *ex-officio* member of this Committee. These arrangements and regulations to be reported to the Board of Directors at their stated meetings, and to be adopted or rejected at their discretion.

ARTICLE VII.

The Medical Staff shall consist of two or more Surgeons (one of whom shall be called the Senior Surgeon).

ARTICLE VIII.

The Senior Surgeon of the Infirmary shall be an *ex-officio* Director. The Surgeons shall have control of the admission and treatment of *extern* patients, and such *intern* patients as have complied with the published conditions of admission. The admission of free patients shall be subject to the approval of the Executive Committee, or a member thereof acting in their behalf. They shall see that the statistics are accurately recorded, and shall assist in preparing the Surgeons' Annual Report. Meetings of the Staff shall be held from time to time to consider matters affecting the Medical Department.

The Clinical Assistant or Assistants shall perform such duties as may be directed by the Surgeon.

ARTICLE IX.

The Senior Surgeon and other Surgeon or Surgeons, and the Superintendent and Matron shall be appointed annually by the • Board of Directors. One or more Clinical Assistants may be appointed by the Executive Committee on the nomination of the Senior Surgeon; such appointment to be subject to the approval of the Board.

ARTICLE X.

One of the Surgeons shall be present at the Infirmary every day (Sundays excepted), at 9 A.M., to examine the patients, to prescribe for them, and to perform such operations as may be considered necessary.

ARTICLE XI.

Students of Medicine attending the Infirmary shall be subject to such regulations as the Surgeons shall from time to time direct and prescribe, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XII.

This Constitution may be revised or altered at an Annual Meeting, on the recommendation of the Directors.
