Correspondent Tells Graphic Tale of the Terrible Happenings--Order is Now Restored--Troops Control the City and it is Certain the Authorities Will Not Permit a Repetition of the Outrage.

GHODNO, Western Russia, June 20.--Owing to the refusal of the censor at Balysook to permit the free telegraphing of the result of the investigation of the massacre of Jews there the correspondent of the Associated Press came here.

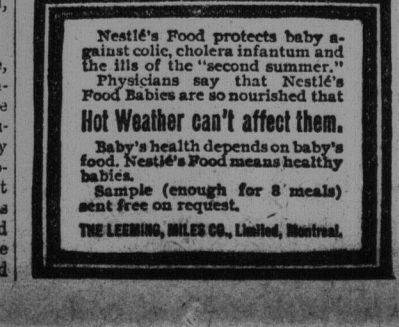

BUILD HOUSES FOR WORKINGMEN
