LAWS AND REGULATIONS
OF THE
UPPER CANADA BIBLE SOCIETY,

*As adopted at a General Meeting of the Society, held in the City
of Toronto, on the 3rd day of August, 1855.*

[UNDER THE ACT OF INCORPORATION.]

ARTICLE I.—This Society shall be denominated the “UPPER CANADA BIBLE SOCIETY,” having the same object in view as the British and Foreign Bible Society, that is—the circulation of the Bible, without note or comment.

II.—This Society shall endeavour to unite all the different Societies in the Province, and to concentrate their operations, in order to give more efficiency to the whole.

III. This Society shall maintain in the City of Toronto a general depot of Bibles and Testaments, from which all the Auxiliaries and Branch Societies in connection with it shall be supplied with the Scriptures, at the lowest price at which they can be afforded.

IV.—The business of this Society shall be conducted by a Board of Directors, to consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, together with twenty lay members, fifteen of whom, who shall have most frequently attended, shall be eligible for re-election each year, five of whom to form a quorum. All ministers of the Gospel, who are members of the Society, shall be entitled to a seat, and to vote with the Directors.

V.—The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Secretaries, and Agents of all Auxiliaries and Branch Societies in connection therewith, shall be *ex officio* members of the Board. (See last page of cover to this report.)

VI.—At any meeting of the Directors, the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list then present, and in the absence of such Vice-President, the Treasurer, and in his absence such member as shall be chosen for that purpose, shall preside.

VII.—Each person paying annually one dollar, shall be a member of this Society; and persons paying fifty dollars at any one time, either to this Society, or to any of the Societies in connection therewith, or through them to the British and Foreign Bible Society; or who may have rendered important services, shall, at the discretion of the Directors, be declared Life Members.

VIII.—That each Life Member of this Society shall be furnished with a Certificate of Membership, under the Corporate Seal of the Company, duly signed by the President and Secretaries for the time being, and shall be allowed to receive from the Depositary annually, for distribution, Bibles and Testaments to the value of one dollar.

IX.—That the Board of Directors for the time being, shall have the appointment of Agents, Depositary, Colporteurs, Book-keeper, and Assistants

of the Society, and the fixing of all salaries and allowances; and shall have the superintendence and management of all the property, real and personal, of the Corporation, as well as the management and control of its general affairs, and the appropriation of its funds, with full power to enact such rules as may be requisite to affect the objects contemplated by the Act of Incorporation.

X.—The Board of Directors shall meet for the transaction of business once in each quarter, and at any other time when called together by the Secretaries, or any three of the Directors.

XI.—A general meeting of the Society shall be held in the month of May in each and every year, or at such other times as the Directors for the time being may deem best for the interests of the Society; when the Officers and Directors for the ensuing years shall be chosen; a report of the proceedings for the foregoing year presented; together with the Treasurer's and Depository's accounts, duly audited.

XII.—In the Annual Report of the Society, the efforts of the several Societies in connection with it shall be distinctly mentioned, as respects the circulation of the Scriptures and the contributions to the funds, together with such other matter connected with them as may be generally interesting.

XIII.—That the general meetings of the Society shall be opened by reading a portion of the Sacred Scriptures, and with prayer.

XIV.—That no alterations in this Constitution shall be made except at a General Meeting of the Society, and after one month's notice of the same has been given to the Board.

RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS RELATIVE TO GRANTS TO SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

That in all applications for grants of Bibles to Sunday Schools, the applicant be requested to furnish the Secretaries with an account of the state of the School; the number of Scholars and Teachers; the amount of Funds at the disposal of the Managers; who are its officers; and why it is necessary to make such application:—all which should in every case be certified by a Minister of the Gospel, or some person of known respectability. And further, this Board recommends that the Secretaries be instructed to make grants in future only to destitute settlements; reporting the same to the next General Meeting of the Board of Directors.

RULES

RECOMMENDED TO BRANCH SOCIETIES.

- I. That a Society be formed in connection with the British and Foreign Bible Society, through the medium of the Upper Canada Bible Society, for the purpose of contributing to the circulation of the Holy Scriptures without note or comment : the English copies being of the authorized version *only*.
- II. That the Society be denominated "THE _____ BRANCH BIBLE SOCIETY."
- III.—That all persons subscribing one dollar annually, or five dollars at one time, shall be members of this Society.
- IV. That the business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, Secretaries, and a Committee consisting of not less than _____ other members ; five to constitute a quorum.
- V. That all Ministers of the Gospel who join the Society shall be reckoned members of the Committee.
- VI. That the Committee shall meet quarterly, or oftener ; the time and place of meeting to be fixed by themselves.
- VII. That the Committee divide their sphere of operations into Districts, and appoint two of their own members for each district, to solicit subscriptions and donations from the inhabitants, and also to ascertain the wants of the people regarding the Word of God.
- VIII. That the whole of the subscriptions and donations received by this Society shall, after deducting incidental expenses, be remitted, yearly, to the Upper Canada Bible Society, for the purpose of translating the Word of God into the Indian languages, and for supplying other nations, through the Parent Institution, with the pure Word of God ; or for the purchase of Bibles and Testaments to supply the neighbourhood *at cost price*, or gratuitously to those who cannot purchase.
- IX. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on the _____ day of _____, in each year, at _____, when the accounts shall be presented, the proceedings of the past year stated, a new Committee appointed, and a Report agreed upon ; the Report to be published under the direction of the Committee, if required.
- X. That on the formation of a new Committee, the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, Secretaries, and such three-fourths of the other members of the Committee as have most frequently attended, shall be eligible for re-election for the ensuing year.

THIRTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
UPPER CANADA BIBLE SOCIETY.

Another year of the Society's history having closed, we are called upon to review its operations, and report to its members and friends the results of the work so far as they can be seen. We regret that we cannot do so in a tone of unmixed congratulation, as not only is there a falling off in our receipts, but also in the number of copies of the sacred Scriptures issued by our Society during the past year. These are, it is true, several circumstances to account for these disappointments, but we shall speak of them more fully under their proper headings.

It has been a time of mourning for the Society. Two of the Vice-Presidents have been called away, and in them the Society have lost two of its oldest and most faithful friends and counsellors.

Mr. John Tyner, who had been a member of the Board for over forty years, was always a most constant and thoughtful attendant at its meetings, and therefore will be much missed by the Directors.

The Rev. Bishop Richardson, D.D., was the first person appointed by the Society as its travelling agent, the duties of which office he discharged for eleven years with the zeal and energy so characteristic of him, and which showed his heart was truly in the work. The Rev. Dr. Gill, the representative of the Parent Society, who visited most of our branches in 1864, says in his report:—"In looking at the position of the Bible Society in Upper Canada, I do feel that in former years some one must have worked hard in planting our Bible standard." The Directors are glad to know that this can be said of all our agents, and some might be mentioned as pre-eminent in the good work; yet they feel sure that all will gladly award the first niche of honour, as well as of time, to our venerable standard bearer who has so lately left us, esteemed by all as a Christian and a patriot, and of whom even the world will join us in saying:—

"We do not think a braver gentleman;
More active-valiant or more valiant-young;
More daring or more bold, is now alive
To grace this latter age with noble deeds."

We cannot but miss these good men, and we should like to have had larger issues and increased income to report; yet we would not be unthankful, for doubtless praise is due from us to the Father of mercies for countless unrecognized benefits, and He who maketh all things work together for good to them that love Him, will not fail to overrule these bereavements and disappointments to His own glory and the welfare of His people, it may be by stirring us up to greater zeal in this very duty of spreading His life-giving Word among our fellow sinners. We Canadians are wont to boast that our winters, which some in other lands so much dread, are far from destitute of advan-

tages, and we trust this temporary check in the growth of our Society will eventually prove beneficial.

Besides the loss the Society has sustained by the death of two of its senior counsellors, the Board has to report that the Rev. John Gemley, who had so zealously filled the office of Permanent Secretary for the last five years, felt himself called to return to pastoral duty, and last September terminated his official connection with the Society, but not his sympathy and active co-operation. Of this we had proof during the past winter, when he kindly met several engagements which one of our agents was unable to fulfil. The Board, in recognition of his services, have nominated him one of its Vice-Presidents, and earnestly pray that he may be abundantly blessed in the preaching of the Word, as he has been zealous in promoting its distribution.

Availing themselves of the presence in Europe of the Rev. Dr. Taylor, the Society's former able and eloquent Agent, the Directors have requested him to represent our Society at the meeting of our great Parent and other kindred Bible Society meetings in the old land.

AGENCY.

Among causes of thanksgiving, not least are the journeying mercies vouchsafed to our agents. Twenty-six in number, they have been travelling under the most trying circumstances, yet none have met with any serious accident. Our sympathy, however, is due to the Rev. D. Smyth, who was laid aside by a serious illness just when about to start on his work, and thus prevented from finishing it before the close of our year. We would also express our heartfelt condolence with the Rev. J. M. Douglas, who was also stopped for a time by a visit of death to one of his household.

As we have just said, the travelling of our agents was performed under great difficulties, and this has been one of the chief causes of the falling off in our receipts for the year. They nearly all left their work to be done in January and February, when they expected to have good sleighing, and perhaps also thought there would be more money among the farmers at that season, than there would be before Christmas. They were not disappointed by a lack of snow, but there was such a superabundance of it as to render the roads almost impassable, and this not only made it difficult for the collectors to get through with their work, but very much diminished the attendance at the various meetings, and the collections were in consequence much smaller than in former years.

The Agency Committee have for some time past been considering the propriety of suggesting to the Board that the visitation of the Branches in the coming year should be done between the 1st September and the middle of December, that is if the incoming Board decides on continuing the present system of agency.

The total cost of agency in the past year has been \$4,245; but \$534 of this properly belonged to the previous year. Nearly all the branches have been visited. Not a few have had a second visit, and some even a third. In a few cases these visits were unavoidable, but in others they were necessitated by delay on the part of the Branches, which often caused additional expense to the Society, and much extra trouble and labour to the agents. We hope our friends will bear with us, and not be offended at our calling their attention to this matter. We know that some of them have many and constant demands upon their time, but we feel sure that if they reflect on the importance and dignity of their work, they will be more than willing to make great efforts and even sacrifices to help in sending God's Word to every fellow creature, for we should never forget that this is what we have in hand, and not the mere building up of a society.

The agents' reports are most interesting in their character, but of course there is a good deal of similarity in their experiences. Nearly all speak of the unusual difficulties of travelling, of the intensely cold weather, and the correspondingly warm hospitality they have met with.

It would be impossible, or at least very expensive, to give them at length; but we cull a few extracts as samples, which will be found on pages 24-27.

AUXILIARY AND BRANCHES.

The London Bible Society, which is our only Auxiliary, has lost the services of its late Secretary, the Rev. J. Natrass, who has retired on account of poor health. We believe no one has yet been appointed to succeed him, and the annual meeting has not yet been held. They have sent us \$1,120.79 on purchase account, and \$1,092.69 as free contributions, which is \$722.19 less than last year. We hope that in the coming year they will be able to do better.

Besides the seventy-seven Branches which belong to the London Auxiliary, we have 370 in direct communication with our own society, making, in all four hundred and forty-seven (447). This is thirteen more than we had last year. Seventeen new Branches have been formed, but four have been struck off the list. The condition of the Branches varies greatly. Brantford maintains its pre-eminence, and is a fine illustration of the Divine promise that those who water others shall be watered also themselves, and a proof that, whether we look at communities or individuals, we generally find those who do most for the dissemination of God's Word throughout the world, are the same that do most for the cultivation of their own field. The people of Brantford who have nobly sustained the Bible Society, have also put up a beautiful building for their Young Men's Christian Association which they have named "Wycliffe Hall," in honour of the translator of the Bible, and which is probably the largest and most convenient building devoted to similar purposes in any town of the same size, not only in our own Dominion, but even in the neighbouring States or in the Mother country. Ingersoll, Paris, Elora, Galt, and Oshawa, with a few of the smaller Branches, have, increased their remittances in spite of the stringency of money, and the great majority are steadily persevering in the good work. We are sorry, however, to have to report of some fifty of our Branches that they have fallen much behind, and some indeed are almost ready to perish. Although duly visited they have remitted nothing during the past year. We trust that in the coming year they may be stirred up to fresh life and energy.

It is refreshing to turn to our most distant Branch, New Westminster, in British Columbia, and to find it full of vigorous life. We have had a most encouraging Report from them, and they have decided on trying colportage in the mining districts this summer. To help them in this good work your Directors have voted a grant of \$300.

We have not yet heard from Manitoba, but are daily expecting to get news from them which we trust will be encouraging.

FINANCES.

As one result of the combined efforts of Agents and Branches we come to our receipts, which, for causes already referred to, have fallen \$2,984 60 short of last year.

In addition to the above contributions, the Board has voted the following grants :—To the British and Foreign Bible Society, £200 sterling ; to the Quebec Bible Society, \$500 ; to the Manitoba Branch, \$500, and to British Columbia, \$300.

On purchase account £2,000 sterling have been sent to the Parent Society, and £850 are still due.

For further particulars we refer to the Treasurer's account on pages 22-23.

COLPORTAGE.

The difficulties which our agents had to meet were still more felt by our colporteurs, and hindered their operations very seriously. United with the prolonged illness of two of them, and the temporary laying aside of another, we have here one of the causes of the decrease in the number of issues. Mr. Lowry, our senior colporteur, laboured with great success during the month of May, in the Township of York and in the City of Toronto. After that he was working in connection with the London Auxiliary, until he returned to the city to do his work as one of the collectors. Mr. McPhail and the Rev. R. Stephenson have continued their labours as in the past year. Mr. Badger, under the directions of the Committee of the Parry Sound Branch, worked during February and March with his accustomed zeal and endurance, visiting the remotest parts of the Free Grant District. Mr. Joseph Strain has been unable to do anything since December, and now feels himself obliged by infirmity, and also on account of his wife's delicate health, to retire from this arduous work, in which he has been engaged for sixteen years. The directors, in consideration of his long service, have voted him a gratuity of three months salary. Mr. McIntyre laboured with much zeal and acceptance in the eastern part of the Society's field until the end of September, when he felt himself called to other work. Mr. William Strain was shortly after appointed, and directed to proceed to the northern townships of the County of Bruce. Between ill health and severe weather, he has not yet been able to accomplish anything, but hopes soon to occupy his interesting field. On page 29 will be found a tabulated review of their labours, and also a few extracts from their reports, which will convey some idea of the character, difficulties and importance of their work.

DISTRIBUTION.

The number of Bibles, Testaments, and portions issued from the Society's House during the year, is 35,710, which is 6,530 less than last year. In addition to the causes already referred to under the head of Colportage, the fact that less has been done in all kinds of business throughout the country, has of course had its effect upon this part of our work. And it must also be borne in mind that the number of issues last year was exceptionally large, as a considerable accumulation of the Ketchum Trust Bibles were then distributed. Of the above 35,710 copies, 1,292 were in other languages than English, and 46 were portions in raised characters for the blind. The total number of copies issued by the Society since its foundation is 935,633. Further particu-

lars will be found elsewhere. But we cannot forbear speaking in this place of an evil which we believe might be remedied, and which is reported to us both by agents and colporteurs. They tell us that in some of the Branch Depositories, the Bibles are kept in the back of the shop, quite out of sight, so that the people of the neighbourhood are unaware of the presence of a stock of cheap Bibles in their midst. We earnestly hope that the officers of such Branches will look into this matter, and have their depositories placed in prominent positions, so that the beauty, convenience and cheapness of the Bibles may be noticed.

Dr. C. B. Hall has kindly continued to see that the trains are supplied with copies of the Scriptures. He reports that the Great Western and the Northern Railways have put racks in their cars, and that the Scriptures placed in them are well used and appreciated by the public. The Toronto, Grey & Bruce and the Toronto and Nipissing Railways have promised to put up racks, but have not yet done so. The Grand Trunk authorities have heretofore declined to do so.

BIBLE SOCIETY RECORDER AND ANNUAL REPORT.

The circulation of the *Recorder* has been about the same as in the previous year, when it had reached nearly 8,000 of each number. The Board have decided to issue a regular annual Report in one compact pamphlet, as in years previous to the publication of the *Recorder*. It has been found that the double May number was not sufficient to contain all the lists, some of which had to be left to July and even September, which was not satisfactory to the Branches, and was not so convenient for reference. The annual report, however, is to stand in lieu of the May *Recorder*.

SISTER SOCIETIES.

Accounts will be found in the January and March numbers of the *Recorder* of the operations of the Kingston, Quebec, and New Brunswick Bible Societies. We have since had a letter from Mr. Lamb, the Secretary of the Quebec Society, telling of considerable success having attended the labours of one of their two French colporteurs, and asking for a continuance of our grant in support of this good work, which grant your Directors were very willing to vote. We have received the report of the Nova Scotia Bible Society, which is very encouraging. Their agent, Mr. Russell, says, "In many parts visited, money has been less plentiful than in former years. But never have I seen contributions more willingly given." We regret that we have not yet received reports from the other Societies of our Dominion.

Our noble sister, the American Bible Society, is continuing to work with her wonted vigour. The Rev. Dr. Gilman, one of their Secretaries, has kindly forwarded some of their statistics for the year just closed. In his letter, he says, "The falling off in our receipts is quite marked (nearly \$87,000 less than the previous year,) and our experience is that of other benevolent societies. The volumes issued from the Bible House were 726,683 in number, as compared with 832,070 in the preceding year. I presume that the foreign work will show some decrease also. In foreign lands, Mexico, Reval-Esthonian provinces of Russia, Uruguay and Brazil, and the Turkish Empire, including Syria and Egypt, are fields of special and exceptional importance. We have just completed the printing of the Bible in the Mandarin colloquial dialect at Pekin, and are about to print Dr. Schaufli's Turkish Old Testament at Vienna. The translation of the gospels and epistles is going on in Japan, and important revisions of Chinese versions in China. New portions of Scripture in Indian languages of America (Cree and Dakotah) have been prepared, and new editions of Seneca, Objibwa, and Cree have been

printed. The Gospel of St. John for the blind in a new character, has attracted much attention, and promises to be useful.

In the April number of their *Record*, they say, "the total receipts of the fiscal year were \$577,569, the amount being more than \$86,000 less than that reported at the last annual meeting. In view of commercial embarrassments, and the depression of trade, some such diminution was to be expected; but it is also evident that in consequence of the pressure of denominational enterprises in the several churches, the interests of the Bible cause, which is common to all, are in danger of being disregarded."

THE BRITISH AND FOREIGN BIBLE SOCIETY.

Last, but not least, the operations of our great Parent Society demand our attention, and it adds to our regret for the smallness of our donations this year to find that other auxiliaries are also sending her less. In a letter lately received from them one of the Secretaries says:—"I greatly fear that when our receipts are made up in six day's time our free money will fall some thousands short of the amount received under the same heading in 1873-4, so many of our Auxiliaries having remitted less. This is somewhat disheartening. Our free contributions should be an increasing and a dependable source of income, and I am afraid that if the amount received from the Auxiliaries still fails to show the increase it should have done during the last few years, the Committee may reluctantly be compelled not only to refuse to occupy countries now opening for the Gospel which have hitherto been inaccessible, but to contract the field already possessed. Our issues will probably equal in number those of last year and the reports at present received give a somewhat encouraging view of the work done. Vast strides are being made in Russia, and it is difficult to judge how far our operations there are likely to expand. Considering the terrible state of confusion which has prevailed in Spain, and the fanaticism of its people, it is a matter of thankfulness and wonder that a large number of copies of the Word of God have been put in circulation."

In the condensed report of the District Secretaries, we find that there were in England and Wales on the 15th of February last 866 Auxiliaries, 380 Branches, and 3,244 Associations, in all 4,490 Societies. There are ten District Secretaries, corresponding to our former permanent Agents. They have nine colporteurs, whose salaries and expenses are paid wholly or in part by the Parent Society, besides others employed by the Branches, and much distribution is done by the "Missions to Seamen," and such Societies. There have been 52,643 copies circulated by colportage in the year 1874; (the Society's year ends like our own on the 31st March, but these condensed reports of the District Secretaries appear to be for the calendar years.) Of these 52,642 copies, 23,907 were among sailors and emigrants. The issues from the London Depot to the various societies in England and Wales numbered 643,339.

We find in the last Annual Report that the Hibernian Bible Society had in 1873-4, issued 74,622 copies, and contributed £600 to the British and Foreign Bible Society, and that the National Bible Society of Scotland was advancing with steady progress.

We are delighted to see in the same Report very encouraging accounts of our fellow subjects at the Antipodes. The labours of Mr. Backhouse, an Agent of the Parent Society, who had been visiting the Auxiliaries and Branches in Australia and New Zealand, appear to have been marvellous in amount, and also successful in results.

PROGRESS IN THE WORK OF TRANSLATION AND REVISION.

If we recall the intense interest with which we read of the labours of

Wycliffe, Tyndale, and others, to whom, under God, we are indebted for the Holy Scriptures in our own tongue, it will help us to realize, in some measure, the immense and deeply interesting work done by our great Parent in England, and also by our noble sister the American Bible Society, in assisting those men who are rendering similar services to the nations still in darkness.

New translations of whole or part of the Scriptures were printed by the British and Foreign Bible Society, during 1873-4, in the following languages:—Amharic, Ararat Armenian, Bengali, Breton, Bulgarian, Cauton Colloquial or Punti, Cree, Danish, Japanese, Judæo-Polish, Judæo-Spanish, Kafir, Lettish, Malagasy, Malayalim, Nias, Niue, Norwegian, Ojibway, Portuguese, Pushtoo, Rouman, Russ, Sesuto, Syriac, Telugu, Tinne or Chipewyan, Tukudh, Turkish.

The translation, printing, or distribution of the whole or part of the Bible has been promoted by the Society:—

Directly in 157 languages or dialects.
Indirectly in 53 “ “

Twenty-eight versions have been prepared by other kindred Societies, but there still remain quite a number of translations to be made before every tribe on this earth can read in their own tongue the wonderful works of God.

But as our sight is limited, so is our faculty of being interested, and as large objects afar off do not fill so large a space in the field of our vision as much smaller ones that are near, so we cannot help feeling more interested in those nations with whom we come in contact more frequently, and with whose history we are better acquainted.

France.—The Report of the Agent in France, Mr. G. Monod, is deeply interesting. We wish we could give it in full, for it is difficult to choose what parts to leave out, but we can here only give the merest outline. The work of the Society in France is chiefly done through the agency of Colporteurs, who in that year were 54 in number. This number might be greatly increased if Mr. Monod had less regard to quality than quantity. A conference of nine of these devoted men with Mr. Monod at St. Quentin, was very refreshing. There were also present two of the Scotch Bible Society's Colporteurs, who had been invited and heartily welcomed. When the time for separation came they could not but feel sad, and it is quite touching to read of the departure of Dehon, the senior Colporteur. He has been labouring in this work for forty years, and is thought to have distributed nearly 50,000 copies of the Holy Scriptures. The sales by colportage during the year were 47,051. In addition to this were the sales at the depots and 7,000 in free grants, making the total number circulated in the year 98,316 copies.

Spain.—Perhaps the eyes of most are anxiously watching Spain, a country that has as yet been open for so brief a period to the operations of the Bible Society, and to which the return of a Bourbon king makes many fear lest the door should be about to close. During 1873-4 eighteen colporteurs were employed and succeeded in selling 55,312 copies. In addition to these 15,671 were sold to the Scotch Bible Society, and probably the greater part distributed by their colporteurs, 3,722 were sold in the depots, 2,495 to correspondents, and 2,576 were given away, making a total of nearly 80,000. We have seen from the correspondence of some of the religious periodicals that the friends in Spain were more than usually earnest and active in distributing at the time of King Alphonso's entry, fearing lest their opportunity might be nearly over, and we gather that most Protestants in

Spain are uneasy about their prospects. Some, however, hope better things of the young king on account of his English education. And although he somewhat ostentatiously offered to make himself useful to the Pope, who is not likely to bid him promote the circulation of that which is truly infallible, yet he has promised not to interfere with religious liberty. God grant that he may have learned while in England from the example of our beloved Queen, that the throne is established by righteousness, and the secret of England's greatness is in the possession of a free Bible. We know from the history of Father Hyacinthe, that it is possible for this to be recognized by one who as yet sees not the heinousness of Popish error, so as to separate from the Church of Rome.

Italy.—The accounts from Italy are not cheering, and undoubtedly one of the chief hindrances to the work has been a sectarian spirit among Protestants, who should have been particularly careful to manifest true Catholicity in the presence of those who usurp the name.

Germany.—The bloodless yet severe struggle that is going on in the German Empire, has produced a considerable amount of bitterness, and in districts where the population is largely Romanist the colporteurs have met a great deal of opposition and even some violence. "But the only chart by which the Church of Christ can steer her course with safety over the troubled waters, is the inspired Word of God. Let her only oppose the shield of faith, and wield the sword of the Spirit against every foe, whether papal or infidel, and she must prevail. The Rev. G. P. Davies, who continues to work with all the zeal and efficiency of Christian intelligence, records a total circulation of 318,026 copies. This is a somewhat smaller total than that of the previous year; but only 3,539 were given gratuitously, whereas the previous year 17,512 were thus distributed. Another proof of the increased value which attaches to the Word of God in the estimation of at least a portion of the German people, is that the distribution of whole Bibles during the past year exceeds that of the previous year by 5,327, and is the largest recorded in any single year in the German and Swiss field of the Society's labour.

Russia.—We have already seen what a promising field is opening in Russia, but as those who read the March number of the *Recorder* are aware of much that is going on there at a much later date than any news given in the Report, we will not repeat it here. But we do hope that the Bible Society will not be prevented from entering upon this important field by want of support.

Syria and Palestine.—There is a special interest attaching to these countries as the lands of the Bible, but there were no features of special interest in the operations of the Society in this field, during the year 1873-4. The circulation in Syria has amounted to 1028 copies, which have been sold chiefly at the depôt at Beyrout, and by Colporteur Butros in Mount Lebanon. The circulation in Palestine is effected from three centres: Jerusalem, Jaffa, and Nazareth, and has reached a total of 1,507 copies.

India.—The reports of the Indian Auxiliaries, are both interesting and encouraging. They may not always have been able to maintain an equal standard of circulation to that which they reached before, but the variation of local circumstances will sometimes account for such a change, whilst steady progress and undiminished zeal are the characteristics which stand out with greatest prominence, and which call for most devout praise. The Rev. A. Theophilus who superintends the colportage of the Madras Auxiliary, states that though a variety of motives may often influence the heathen to

purchase the Christian Scriptures, still the number of those who buy them from a sincere desire to search after truth, is gradually increasing.

China.—"It is not probable that the great enemy of mankind, who ever seeks to rivet more firmly the chains of spiritual bondage on the souls of his captives, will see such a fair province as that of China in danger of being wrested from his grasp, without making some effort to retain possession of it," so we find that several of the colporteurs have been beaten in such a way as to oblige them to lay aside their work for a time, and remain for some months under the doctors' care. "But Christianity never yet quailed beneath the blows of the persecutor, and Divine Truth will not turn aside from its onward and triumphant march because some of its standard-bearers have been subjected to bonds and imprisonment, and others have been called to seal their testimony with their blood. God's Word is gradually being diffused through this vast empire." The issues reached 116,779 copies, of which 1,329 were Bibles, and 9,144 New Testaments. Two European and twenty-one native colporteurs have been employed. They appear well fitted for their posts, and succeed remarkably well in disposing of the Sacred Scriptures. Leaving the great centres of commerce, and their well-known routes, these hardy men traverse hill and dale, often across very rough country, on foot, carrying with a light heart their heavy burdens of books. They are doubtless thus helping to prepare the way of the Lord. "We are glad to report that the workers in China have found some special sympathy among our people in Canada, Mr. Donald Fraser of Nairn having sent fifty dollars for the distribution of Scriptures by the Rev. G. L. McKay, the devoted Missionary of the Canadian Presbyterian Church in Formosa. Others also have shown a special interest in the teeming millions of that immense empire. And should some future day develop a large immigration into our own Pacific Province from the Flowery Land, we or our children may find that we are more directly interested in the leavening of that mass with the Word of God than we have hitherto thought ourselves."

Japan.—There is nothing about this interesting country in the Report for 1873-4, but in the *Reporter* for March last we find that the progress of the work there has not been so steady as we could wish. We are told that there is some of the fickleness of the Galatians, to whom St. Paul wrote, in these modern Japanese, and that among them things generally go by fits and starts—headlong haste at one moment, and the most provoking procrastination at another. And, sad to say, works on gunnery are now more sought after than Bibles. It is pleasant, however, to come across the name of another Canadian Missionary—the Rev. Dr. MacDonald (from the Methodist Missionary Society)—and find him mentioned as actively helping in the great work of the Bible Society. Let us pray that he and his comrade—the Rev. G. Cochrane—may soon be encouraged by seeing these modern Galatians take a fresh start, and fall into a prolonged fit of Bible reading.

Madagascar.—The Rev. J. Parrett, formerly a Missionary in Madagascar, but who was in England at the time the Report was issued, furnished some very interesting information concerning the sale of the Scriptures, and the eagerness of the people to possess the treasure. Among other things, which are all so interesting that we shall try to find room for some of them in the *July Recorder*, he says:—"Several times a number of officers have come down from the Palace, sent by the Queen to purchase Testaments for distribution amongst the strangers constantly going up to the Palace to render homage to Her Majesty. The Queen is very anxious to do all she can to benefit her subjects, and many are the copies of the Word of God that have

been circulated by her. And thus, in one way and another, large numbers of New Testaments, and other portions of the Word of God, find their way all over the island, and prove the pioneers of Christian teachers and missionaries. . . . And what are the results of circulating the Word of God amongst the Malagasy? It is impossible fully to estimate them, but the visible results are *simply wonderful*. The country is being silently but completely revolutionized. In many parts, all visible forms of idolatry and heathenism have entirely disappeared. The whole tone of society is being raised and elevated. Progress and advancement are to be seen on every hand, and the primary cause of these various changes is the *power of the Word of God.*"

Mexico.—"Though the struggle which has been continued in Mexico during many years, first for civil freedom, and next for religious liberty, may not have achieved all the success which either the patriot or the Christian could desire, it has yet won the independence of the nation, and has rendered practicable the preaching of the Gospel, and the circulation of the Word of God." Not many years ago, Scriptures sent to that country were seized at the Custom House and burnt; now, whilst other English goods pay a high import duty, the Bible is admitted free, and is recognized as the best friend of law, order, and civil liberty. The Rev. W. Parkes says that the Government of President Lerdu seemed perfectly honest in its avowed declaration to uphold religious liberty. This has given renewed confidence to the colporteurs. One of them—Bernard Kerb—had been so frequently attacked, and his life so often imperilled, that he had reluctantly given up his calling. But now he is hopefully at work again. The Rev. J. L. Stephens, writing from Ahualuco, says—"I rejoice in the demand for Bibles and Testaments, for, generally, when the Bible comes in at the door, images jump out at the window." "When comparing the results of Bible circulation with the heavy expenditure which it sometimes entails, Mr. Parkes justly recalls to mind the fact that a single Bible has not unfrequently been the channel of spiritual life to a whole family; nay, has sometimes led to the foundation of a Christian Church." In closing his report, he observes:—"Had matters remained as they were some time ago, perhaps the Society would have been justified in withdrawing. But things appear very different now. . . . It would be unfair to the martyrs of the past to withdraw. . . . Difficulties there are, and great dangers in the way, but these do not justify a retreat, but call for more devout prayers and greater energy on the part of all concerned."

In conclusion we cannot but rejoice to know that, while the year has been one of less than average prosperity to our own and other Bible Societies, it has not been unfruitful to the churches, who have been reaping some of the harvest before sown by these agencies. And if there have not been issued so many copies of the written Word by our Society, we are glad to believe that those before distributed have been better used, and that many hearts have been opened to the Incarnate Word Himself.

As our new Dominion is fast expanding and developing, we trust that we and all our fellow countrymen who know that true liberty is in the way of God's precepts, may increasingly feel it incumbent upon us to be earnest and energetic in seeking to establish the authority of His Word in our land, and in promoting its circulation throughout the world, and we hope that we may be more and more united in this great work.

With prayer that God's blessing may attend the future labours of our Society, and that if well pleasing in His sight, we may have a larger measure of success in the coming year, this Report is respectfully submitted.

EXTRACTS FROM AGENTS' REPORTS.

THE REV. J. G. MANLY.—"In the Society's past year (1874-5), I visited fifty-nine branches, formed thirteen new ones, held meetings in twenty places, as out-stations, or as likely to become new branches, revisited five neighbourhoods, spent thirty-three Sundays (usually preaching thrice a day,) and travelled 4,180 miles. . . . Revisitation was necessitated in five instances by local facts which rendered a meeting impracticable at the time of the first visit. At *Yorkville* the income increases every year. *Leaskdale* begins with spirit. . . . *Campbellford* has a model lady-collector. *Minesing* is unexcelled for annual attendance and a cheerful spirit. . . . These descriptions are not in comparison with other places, and the branches not characterized are not in any sense depreciated or disparaged, but are merely not remembered as calling for special remark. All are co-workers for Christ, and may well be thankful for a place in His kingdom, and a share in the superior blessedness of giving for His sake; and there is, probably, not one of us all but might do much more than we have ever done for the evangelization of the world."

THE REV. E. BARRASS.—"In my second journey I spent a Sabbath at *Tiverton*, the recollection of which will always afford me unmingled pleasure. I preached twice and visited two Sabbath schools, one of which was attended by the largest number of young persons and adults I ever remember to have seen at any Sabbath school. At the time of my visits the roads were in the most wretched state. I regret to state that, owing to the severity of the weather, which prevented all kinds of conveyances being of any use, I only could reach some of the places, but I wrote to some of the officers of those branches immediately which I could not visit, desiring them to forward their accounts to *Toronto*. I have again to speak of the uniform kindness of the ministers and friends generally, especially those who entertained me while I was storm-stayed. . . . My five years of agency have greatly increased the circle of my acquaintances, besides leading me to become more attached to those who do not belong to the section of the Church with which I am associated. I shall always take pleasure in aiding the Society all in my power, and believe that more strenuous efforts should be made, by all denominations, to support the Society, which aims to give a copy of the Word of God to every man, woman, and child in the world. . . . *Richmond Hill* was visited on the 15th. The weather was exceedingly inclement, but notwithstanding this, I was cheered by the attendance of an active committee, and a whole band of lady collectors, who had done their work well. The Revd. John Hunt delivered an excellent address. The Revd. James Dick, who has been twenty-two years the secretary of the Branch, retires from that post which he has so honourably filled. A very cordial vote of thanks was presented to him, but I would fain hope that some more tangible proof of grateful remembrance will be awarded to him."

Rev. JAMES B. DUNCAN.—"On reaching *Arkona*, I found that nothing had been done, there were none present, save the officers, and one or two members of committee. The former depository had left the place, the stock had been allowed to run down, and was kept in an unsuitable place. A second visit was necessary to prevent the Branch from becoming defunct. The result was that on revisiting it, I found that collectors had been sent round, and a considerable sum raised. * * * * *

"In *Forest* the moneys were collected, which, with the proceeds of sales in the depot, were handed over to your Agent. The meeting was very thin. A second meeting was appointed to be held on a Sabbath in the Metropolitan Hall. All the churches in the place, Presbyterian, Methodist, Primitive Methodist, Baptist, Congregational, and Episcopalian gave up their service and attended. The hall was crowded to suffocation. Besides the address from your agent, the other ministers present took part in the proceedings. The meeting was a most successful one, and will, I feel confident, be followed by increased interest in Bible Society work, and enlarged liberality in future contributions to its funds. * * * *

"*Ailsa Craig Branch* I found in good working order. The meeting was not large, but the disposition to work and manage the affairs of the Society faithfully and efficiently, was so undoubted, as to obviate the necessity of any special effort on the part of your agent. * * * *

"*Nairn Branch* is in admirable order, and is deserving of special commendation for the punctual, orderly, and vigorous way in which the work is performed. Though the night of meeting was bitterly cold, and most of the people had to travel a good many miles, the large church was well filled. *

"*Warwick Branch* can only be spoken of in terms of highest praise. The meeting was as large as the church (of considerable dimensions) would admit of, and the contributions exceedingly liberal. * * *

"*Aughrim*, the most distant and difficult of access of all the Branches under my charge, I found it to be impossible to reach, in consequence of the state of the roads, and was compelled for this time to postpone my visit. * * *

"The work, I may add, has been arduous, and difficult, owing to the severity and inclemency of the weather, and a little discouraging by reason of the apathy of some of the branches, but on the whole pleasant and full of promise."

Rev. J. A. F. McBAIN.—"It is my duty, as it is my pleasure, to give you a brief report of my work as your agent. It was with some hesitation that I consented to undertake the visitation of some branches, but it has been a work from which I have derived no little pleasure, and I trust it has not been altogether in vain. * * * *

"On going to the Methodist Church in Caistorville (the only one in the village), I was greeted with the largest audience I have met so far in my work. The financial proceeds were not equal to those of last year, partly owing to the fact that their field was somewhat circumscribed, as compared with 1873-4. A very good spirit was manifested by the somewhat large audience. There are several good workers connected with this Branch. * * *

"On Oct. 26th I visited Queenston, and found the whole sum in hand to be about \$1.50; but before we left the Church I got \$11, and since that date the Treasurer sent me \$14.50, making \$27 in all. Many of the friends seemed to be roused to a sense of duty and privilege. This was the first place since I was at Grimsby, that I had the countenance and aid of a minister of any denomination. Here, both the resident Episcopal Minister, the Rev. J. Fennell, and the Methodist Minister, the Rev. Mr. Sylvester, took part in the exercises, both of whom are warmly interested in Bible Society work. * * *

"From Queenston, I went to Niagara. This Branch owes a great deal to the Rev. C. Campbell, who is indefatigable in its interests. I listened to a report submitted by him, which was creditable alike to his heart and his head. Rev. Mr. Sylvester here again rendered me good assistance. Our collection was good, and it was then expected that the proceeds of this year would be fully up to the average. * * * *

"I next turned my attention to the newly incorporated village of Merritton.

I visited this place on January 25th, and addressed the few people who met with my highly esteemed friends, Rev. J. C. Cox (Episcopal Minister, in whose church we met,) and Rev. J. H. Robinson, Methodist Minister, on the subject of Bible circulation; appointed collectors, and returned for the Annual Meeting, and organizing of a Branch, on February 8th. The proceeds amounted to over \$25. A more favourable season of the year will yield more largely in funds. The weather was extremely cold, and prevented some from being at our meetings.

Rev. GEO. BURSON.—“The field of labour assigned to me, comprising eleven branches in the County of Haldimand, I visited between the 10th and 25th of February. * * * The Branches, with the exception of two, seemed to be well managed, and a deep interest manifested in the work of the Society. * * *

“The returns from some of the places are not so large as last year. This is owing to the general depression throughout the country. * * * I have to testify most gratefully to the uniform kindness with which I was received by the friends and office-bearers of the various Branches.”

Rev. B. LANE.—“At Tamworth we had a small meeting. The financial return, owing to the earnest efforts of the Secretary, was creditable. * *

“The meeting at Roblin fell upon the same evening as a tea meeting. I took advantage of the occasion, delivered an address, and received a collection. * * *

“At Bloomfield we had quite a pleasant and enthusiastic meeting.”

Rev. W. SHORTT.—“Bertie Branch.—There is quite a large stock of books in the depository here. It is quite a prominent object in the Doctor's dispensary, and the worthy Doctor is most energetic in pushing the sale of the sacred volumes, having himself found their exceeding value. I wish all other depositories were equally well attended to. In many places they are put in a back room and seldom offered for inspection. If a person desiring a Bible, happens to hear of the depository, and visits it for the purpose of making a purchase, he can do so, but it is seldom a stranger knows anything about those cheap and excellent books put forth by the society. Merchants have so little space for the show-case, and so little time for the circulation of the Scriptures. It makes one sad to think how little we can do for Christ's sake. * * *

“Thorold Branch was visited on the 26th. Your agent felt here as he would ever like to feel, and he wished from the bottom of his heart that every branch was as Thorold.”

“Mr. James Munro and his excellent wife, who received me into their house, are enthusiastic in the good work, and not only contribute of their means, but of their valuable time. The officers appear zealous and earnest also. * * *

“Where the love of Christ dwells, and His spirit leads, there cannot be disunion. Oh that the time may soon come when all will see eye to eye, and know as they are known, when there shall be one fold and one Shepherd.”

Rev. W. S. GRIFFIN.—“Travelled forty miles with buggy to *Sombra*, and found the Society disorganized—no meeting for years—I addressed the few assembled, and reorganized. They promised to canvass the neighbourhood at once, but although I have written to them several times most urgently, I cannot get even so much as an answer. * * *

“*Dresden* had a grand meeting—the best for several years—house full. The officers and people take a lively interest in the Bible cause. * * *

“*Thamesville*.—The annual meeting was unusually successful—and contributions liberal. In no place has the Society warmer friends than here. * *

"Amherstburg.—A large meeting, twice as large as usual—a good collection, and a promise of a good subscription. * * * *

"Windsor.—A fine meeting here also. The friends seemed greatly encouraged. But in consequence of the panic across the river which effects them so seriously, the returns will probably be smaller than usual. They lost their depository by fire, but it is nevertheless in healthy operation again. * *

"Morpeth.—A splendid meeting—friends in hearty sympathy with the cause—the officers are energetic."

Rev. ROBERT TORRANCE—"This branch (Elora) is still doing good service, and its efficiency reflects credit on the energy of its officers, and the Christian liberality of the people * * * * At Drayton, the meeting was held in the Methodist Church, on Friday evening, the minister Mr. Forman being president. We may say there was a large audience, that they were most attentive throughout the services, and that there is evidently great interest taken in the neighbourhood in the work in which your Society is engaged. The only draw-back was the want of proper accommodation for the books in the depository—these being out of sight. Arrangements however were made for removing them to another building, and having them placed so as to catch the eye of visitors on entering the store. We trust the change will be followed by increase of circulation * * * * I reached Clifford on Monday afternoon, 1st February. Both the clergymen of the village were away from home. One gentleman showed how deeply he was interested in the cause, by coming a distance of seven miles, and was punctual to the time advertised. * * * * Next forenoon I reached Harriston, and called first upon the President, afterwards I visited the depository, where I found the books packed away in boxes under a table * * * * Next day I should have gone to Hollin, but the cold was so intense, the wind so high, and the snow falling so fast, and drifting as it fell, that my good friend and host Mr. Anderson advised me to remain, although he offered to try the roads with his horse and cutter. After serious thought it was concluded that there was no use in setting out, as the roads were impassable, and the severe cold rendered travelling dangerous. After breakfast on Friday, Mr. Anderson started to drive me to Drayton, in the hope that if we could reach it, a distance of ten miles, I might get through to Glenallan, where a meeting was announced for the evening. After proceeding little more than a mile, the horse stuck in a snow-wreath, and could not free himself. Mr. Anderson had to walk back to the nearest house for a shovel that we might dig him out; having succeeded in this, we drove on, for the most part through the fields, a short way farther, where it was found that the attempt to proceed with the horse and cutter must be abandoned. With many thanks for his kindness, I sent my good friend home, and walked to Moorefield, hoping to get a car to Drayton, but on my arrival at the station was informed there was none, and would not be any that day. * * * * On Tuesday evening, 23rd February, a meeting was held at Rockwood, and was a very good one. The office bearers here are earnest men, and their spirit is among the collectors. * * * * Next day Mr. Bryant drove me through soft snow and pools of water over to Hollin. There, through the energy and punctuality of the President, Mr. Reed, and his fellow office bearers, everything was in readiness; this is one of the best managed branches in the district; the public meeting was but small, comprising only about thirty persons, young and old. The state of the roads was given as a reason for the smallness of the audience. * * * * My cordial thanks to friends, for the warm reception they accorded me, the readiness with which they granted their co-operation, and admitted me to their hospitality."

MR. LOWRY in his report for May, of his labours in the vicinity of Toronto, says:—

“This has been one of the most interesting months that I have ever spent in the service of the Society. I have travelled from Carleton Village, including Seaton Village, to Eglinton, including Davisville, beyond Todmorden, beyond Taylor's Mills. I have supplied about 40 families with Family Bibles, and a number of young persons with pocket Bibles. An old coloured woman whose son was killed on the Railway some years ago, and whose husband died since, I supplied with a family Bible, gratis, she being unable to pay for one. She thanked the Lord for His blessed Word. I gave a Bible to a coloured family in Carleton that were without one, and a Testament to a man who had several parts of the Bible but not a complete copy of the Scriptures. I think that my work in this section has not been in vain; while it is the duty of our Society to send colporteurs to the backwoods, it is equally their duty to remember those at their own doors.”

MR. MCPHAIL, June 2.—“Canvassed Bexley, the people are very poor in general. There was a demand for Bibles and Testaments, but money was extremely scarce, so that in order to do something for the good of the poor people, I have ventured to trust those that I think will pay me as soon as they can, to the amount of sixteen dollars and seventeen cents, but the Society has nothing to do with this, which is at my responsibility. I hope the secretaries of the Bible Society will allow me a place of more genial nature, for a month or two, where I can support my family.”

MR. MCPHAIL, in July.—“I could not get to Harcourt but by the Bobcaygeon road, and when I came to the line leading to Harcourt, the bridge on the Burn river was swept away, so then I had to go through Minden to come round what they call the Narrows, and then found the road impassible. My horse plunged into the water on the road about three feet deep, and all was likely to get through till I came to the floating logs, which the horse could not get over. I had to plunge into the water and shift the horse to the land side, but the light waggon was left there, and was not in my power to get it out, but a generous old Irishman on perceiving my difficulty came forward and helped me to get the waggon out. I was not well from the plunge I got into the water, and wore my clothes till they dried on my body; from that I went to Harcourt, 24 miles from Haliburton, 20 miles of which is entirely occupied by wild beasts and mosquitoes, from which I got a rough reception, till my throat swelled that I could not move my head from one side to the other, but by washing it in water and salt, I am nearly well.”

MR. STEPHENSON.—“By what I see and hear in travelling from house to house I am fully convinced that there are numbers who are richly clad, and who also fare sumptuously every day, and think not that many are destitute of the necessaries of life, or that many are shivering in rags with famine staring them in the face. So I believe that numbers of people, who are so fortunate as to have a good supply of Bibles, think not but their neighbours are the same. The ignorance of some people with regard to the object of the Bible Society is astonishing. One person waited upon by your Agent expressed his surprise when told, in answer to a question, that colporteurs sold Bibles. He always thought they were sent to give them away, and when informed that it was their duty to sell all that they could, and to give to such as were not able to buy, he then asked, why send them to such a part as this? why not send them to Muskoka? but when interrogated as to whether he thought the Bible Society neglected Muskoka or not, confessed he did not think they did.”

MR. MCINTYRE.—“I went to say good-bye to a Roman Catholic woman, she wished me God-speed in my work. I believe she was blessed through the reading of the copy of the New Testament I made her a present of. I told her to look to God, and she said she would. One of the hotel-keepers came

to me on the 30th of this month, and paid me for Bibles to put one in each of his rooms. I sent them to him. God will bless them to the souls of them that read them. Many a one came to me, and said, thank God for the Bible Society that we can get God's word so cheap, and men sent to the very door with it; the people appreciated the labours of the colporteur very much, and when he bid good-bye, many of them cried. I hope God will bless the word to the saving of their souls."

Mr. BADGER in his report for February says, speaking of the Black River settlement,

"The Protestant portion of this community complain that no minister of any denomination ever visits them, or holds any religious service in the settlement. Being destitute of the means of grace, and some of them also of the word of God, they received me very kindly. I read and prayed with most of them, and encouraged them to look to God, and read His word, and trust in Him. May a kind Providence soon open the way for the ministration of the Gospel amongst them."

Mr. BADGER's March report opens as follows:—

"From my last you will see that my labours at the commencement of this month were in the Township of Ryde. This is a new township, and as yet thinly settled. Many of the families are large and in poor circumstances, and several of them without the Bible. There is also a great scarcity of money throughout the township, so that several, who desired to obtain Bibles, went from neighbour to neighbour to borrow enough to enable them to purchase. In this effort they were not successful, so I gave them Bibles; for which your noble Society received many thanks. I spent Sabbath with them, and on very short notice a very respectable congregation gathered, to whom I preached. I encouraged them to organize a Sabbath School, concerning which I have since received a note, and an application for a grant of Bibles from the U. C. Bible Society. * * * * * The Township of Draper is much improved since my former visit. I visited the few settlers in the Township of Oakley, and a large lumber shanty with about 36 men, more than half of whom were Roman Catholics. I was kindly received, and held religious service with them in the evening. They gave good attention, and I trust that by the blessing of God some good was done."

REPORT OF THE THIRTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY MEETING OF
THE UPPER CANADA BIBLE SOCIETY.HELD IN THE RICHMOND STREET METHODIST CHURCH, ON WEDNESDAY MAY
5TH, 1875.

The Hon. G. W. Allan, President of the Society took the Chair, and was supported by a large number of clergymen and other gentlemen on the platform.

The proceedings opened with the singing of the hymn, "The heavens declare thy glory, Lord," followed by reading of Scripture and prayer by Rev. T. W. Jeffery.

The Chairman then delivered his annual address. He said—"It is now just 45 years since the York Auxiliary Bible Society held its first annual meeting at an hotel on Front Street, in the then town of Little York. Ten years after, at the annual meeting held on the 6th of May, 1840, in the Wesleyan Methodist Church on Newgate Street, a resolution was passed to the effect that the laws and regulations of the Toronto Auxiliary Society, as it was then called, should be repealed, and that the same society should be continued, under the name of the Upper Canada Bible Society. From that meeting we date our anniversaries, and we are assembled to-night to celebrate the thirty-fifth annual gathering of the friends of the Bible Society of Upper Canada. I do not look upon these anniversaries as merely intended for the purpose of bringing the society before the public, for they serve another and a very valuable purpose, in enabling us to mark our progress in the great and noble work for which we were organized. Upon such occasions we take stock as it were, of our gains and losses—what fresh inroads have been made upon the kingdom of Satan by carrying the Word of Life into those dark and benighted regions where superstition and idolatry have hitherto held undisputed sway, or we note where the enemy of souls has been gaining ground, it may be even in the midst of civilization and the highest mental culture, for lack of due and faithful exertion on the part of those who love the Bible. Again, such gatherings as these serve to cheer and stimulate us to fresh efforts in the Master's cause. Whatever may be our conscientious differences on many other subjects, here we are to-night all bound together heart to heart by our love and reverence for that one blessed Book, which is our common inheritance as Christian men and women, and which we cling to and cherish as the dearest, the most priceless treasure on this earth. Still, anniversaries doubtless also bring with them occasionally a retrospect not altogether free from regrets. We all know that in the family and social circle the day as it comes round may sometimes find us less prosperous in this world's goods, or saddened by the remembrance of loved ones taken away; or, if all has gone well, yet as year after year passes there is old age creeping on, and the years draw nigh when we have no pleasure in them. I have no fear of our society growing old in the sense of decrepitude or decay. The noble President of the great Parent Society, at its last annual meeting, in opening the proceedings, said that the society had now reached its three score years and ten, and yet it stood out like Moses of old, "its eye not dim, nor its natural force abated," and I am sure we can all join in the fullest faith in the heartfelt prayer which Lord Shaftesbury uttered on that occasion, and humbly believe that it will be realized for us also, and that if this society, as well as its great parent, should be permitted to complete its centenary, it shall be found not worn nor wearied, but acting in the Spirit of God, and still living and vigorous, and true to its great objects. But our anniversary to-night, as the report will presently

show, may find us not prospering quite so much as in the previous year; and there are vacant places too in the society's ranks, for old and well-trying friends have been taken from us since we last met, and have entered into that rest which remaineth for the people of God. But though we may have to acknowledge a falling off in our receipts for the past year, and cannot point to the same number of issues, yet let us only look back to former years, and see how God has prospered us hitherto, and we cannot doubt that with His blessing on our renewed exertions we shall speedily recover any lost ground, and this temporary check will itself be only a fresh incentive to greater efforts in the future. Our lost friends we cannot recall, but they have left us the memories of their pure lives and of their love and zeal for the Bible cause; and we cannot doubt that the same God who in His Providence has thought fit to remove these His faithful servants will raise up faithful successors to them, who in their day and generation will prepare to spend and be spent in His service. And now as regards our receipts, let us look back for a moment, as I have suggested, and compare the position of the Upper Canada Bible Society in 1875 with that of the York Auxiliary in 1830. The subscriptions to York Auxiliary during the first year of its existence (1829), amounted to \$529.30, and its issues for the same period 152 Bibles and 390 Testaments. In 1840, when the change took place in the name and constitution of the Auxiliary Society, the total receipts from all sources amounted to \$2,055, and their issues 2,919. Last year, our report showed that from these small beginnings, the income of the Society had swollen to over \$33,000, and the issues had multiplied into 42,240 Bibles and Testaments issued by the Bible Society during the year closed in April, 1874. Now, the report this year will show a deficiency both in our receipts and our issues, but there are circumstances which in some measure account for this falling off, without supposing any lack of zeal or interest in the society's work on the part of our friends, and we all know that the unusual severity of the winter interfered with business of all kinds, and had, doubtless, an unfavourable effect on the society's operations; but it would be a faint heart that, looking back upon what has been done for us in the past, could be discouraged even for a moment. What an incentive have we to renewed zeal and activity in this glorious work, when we see how God by His providence is opening fresh doors for the entrance of the gospel message into every kingdom and nation throughout the world. When I look back even upon the period during which I have filled this chair, just fifteen years to-day, I cannot but marvel at the wonderful way in which the strife of nations, the political changes which have taken place in the various kingdoms of the world, have all fallen out for the furtherance of the gospel, and by degrees, in one country after another, hitherto almost sealed against the admission of the Book of Life, have the barriers been thrown down, and the agents and colporteurs of the Parent Society made good their entrance. True it is that, on the other hand, we have to mourn over the fact that in the very midst of Gospel light and knowledge there are dark spots of rationalism and unbelief, and it is inexpressibly sad to know that even in some of those grand old Universities in Old England, which for generations past have done so much for the formation of sound learning and true piety, there are now too many to be found who look upon the precious teaching of the Book of Life as carrying no authority with it, or reject all its statements which they in their pride of intellect cannot reconcile with their own preconceived notions and finite reason. It may be that in His infinite wisdom, and for a trial of our faith, God may see fit in these latter days to let the scoffers prevail for a time, and the way of truth to be evil spoken of. But what believer has any fear for the great issue? What Christian who knows his Bible but feels assured of the ultimate triumph of God's truth over every form of error by which that truth has been assailed? And who that

remembers that glorious promise which God uttered by the mouth of His Prophet when foretelling the coming of the "Messiah," His sufferings, His humiliation, His death—"He shall see of the travail of his soul and be satisfied"—will not recognize in that promise the sure downfall of error, and of everything which opposeth itself to the knowledge of God, and of His Son, and the coming of that day when

"Jesus shall reign where'er the sun
Doth his successive journeys run ;
His Kingdom stretch from shore to shore,
Till moons shall wax and wane no more."

A band of children then sang "We won't give up the Bible."

After an abstract of the report had been read by the Permanent Secretary, the children sang "The Bible Song."

The Rev. A. H. Baldwin, B.A., then moved the following resolution :—

"That the Report, of which an abstract has just been read, be adopted and printed for circulation under the direction of the Board ; that thanks be given to the Officers, Committees and Collectors of the various Branches through the country, to whose zeal and energy the Society is so much indebted ; and that the following gentlemen be Officers and Directors for the ensuing year."

The names are given on page 5.

The Rev. gentleman said :—

"*Mr. Chairman and Christian Friends* :—It was with great pleasure I accepted an invitation to speak this evening for the Bible Society. One great cause of my pleasure was that I remember, you will kindly excuse me one so young talking of remembering, as a boy, of some twenty-five years ago, being brought to this Church for a Bible Society Meeting, and the impression which I had, how many were there, and how glorious the singing was. It may be that in those days people were not educated properly as regards singing, but my impression was, that every one sang as if he meant it. One of the hymns, on that occasion was, 'From Greenland's Icy Mountains' in the old style, and the power of the hymn still lives with me. I remember some years after, being asked by a college companion to go to a Bible Society meeting in Reading, in England, and how that invitation brought back the happy evening in Richmond Street Church, Toronto. So you can easily conceive the pleasure which I now have in speaking, not from any idea of personal power, but the being permitted to say a word or two in behalf of so glorious a cause. To me it seems no small matter to which St. Paul refers, when he speaks of the Jews as those to whom the oracles of God were entrusted, and how much more important it is that we who have the Bible should be obedient to the command, 'Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature.' Some tell us that this distribution of the Bible does harm, but what we have to look to is God's command. Let us use every effort, let us not rest till not only every home, but every one has a copy of God's Word. For me it is enough that God's command should be plain, and in His hand I leave the issue.

"I remember once being asked by a lady in England, if I believed in eternal punishment, and on my saying that I did, she replied she did not believe it, for if I did I would be more in earnest about men's souls. How many who tell us they believe in the Bible, never or seldom use it ; how often is it resting quietly on the shelf, or hidden away in a trunk, but not used ; how often do men find it hard to read that Word, but when, by God's Spirit we love to read it, and by His Spirit understand it, then we love to spread it. It is the practical infidelity of the day which mars and hinders the work. If the so-called Christian young men and women would make more use of that Word, if they would be in earnest, the Bible Society would have no need.

The President has rightly referred to the state of the Universities in the Old Country—at least I can speak for one. The difficulty lies not in some particular mode of worship, but in the want of practical religion, and in growing infidelity.

“Now there is much which God gives to cheer us in these days of doubt. Not only is there that testimony in the heart, which those have who read it by the power of God’s Holy Spirit, but the very earth is yielding her hidden treasures. God has been, as it were, giving additional causes for us to credit the Bible as His Revelation. Not only have we the Sinaitic discovery, and the Moabite stone, but the great and glorious work in Palestine and Assyria. Nor should we be unthankful for the careful work of one, of whom Canada may be proud—Withrow—who has given us so much and so truthfully of the Catacombs of Rome. How marvellous it is that in our day great tablets should be discovered at Ancient Nineveh, and that God should have enabled Sir Henry Rawlinson and others to read these. That already we should read of five kings of Israel and Judah in the tablets found, and that we should have an account of the flood so similar to that in Genesis, that we must conclude that the one was taken from the other. May we not when we gaze at these tablets, with their records stretching back 2500 years before Christ, well look up and thank God for His mercy. One who seems, as it were, to do this to help our weak faith in times like these.

“There is another proof to us of God’s word, and that is in the blessing which has accompanied the efforts of such men as Varley, Moody and Sankey. Men who win men, who speak to men’s hearts by that simple gospel. Here is its power and its greatness seen. Well may we thank God for this strong proof of the reality and saving efficacy of that Word.

“Some think that the divisions among Christians do an insuperable amount of harm; yet God’s very word tells us that there will be divisions. You may nominally get people under a certain name, but impossible to get them here all to think exactly alike.

“There is one thing which I should like to refer to, and that is the putting of Bibles in the Railway cars. Some are opposed to it, and one lady told me she did not like it because she had a servant, and whenever she went into the kitchen the servant always had her Bible open, and she was the biggest hypocrite she had ever met. So it might be, but it is not a necessary consequence, but the reverse from prayerful reading; but I do think that when Roman Catholics are not ashamed to read their books, we Protestants should not be ashamed of the Bible. One word more, and that about the finances. I see that there is a deficiency this year. Now I am glad to see so many children here, but I think that children are sometimes hardly treated in the matter of giving. They are given 25 cents, but of this they are not even to have a cent to buy a sugar-stick. But is this principle to be carried out? No, as they grow up they have their own wants. A man has his wife and family, also his horse and creature comforts to look after, and then the Bible Society last, and this change does such harm. But if we could give our tenth or proper portion, there never could be a deficit of \$2,000, nay nor \$5 in the Bible Society, not even in the very hardest years in Canada.”

The resolution was seconded by C. A. Morse, Esq., and carried.

The Rev. C. D. Foss, D.D., of New York, moved the second resolution, which was as follows:—

“That while we rejoice at the increasing activity of spiritual life, which is being manifested in so many ways throughout Christendom, we pray that it may be displayed still more abundantly, in uniting *all* Christians in the blessed work of sending forth GOD’S HOLY WORD until it is brought within the reach of ‘every kindred and tongue and people and nation.’”

In moving the resolution Dr. Foss delivered a most eloquent and forcible address, and we regret not having been able to obtain a more full report of it than the following :—

After referring to the scope of the resolution, which he said could afford subjects for twenty addresses, he alluded to the existence of evangelical agencies beyond the regular work of the Church, and the intensification of the spirit of Christian love as contrasted with national feeling and the special ardour certain Christians felt in the success of their own denominations. Owing to the spread of Christian principles two of the greatest nations in the world had settled a difference which in old times would have been referred to the arbitrament of the sword, by a peaceful Conference at Geneva, which had served to cement their friendship. The recent Evangelical Alliance Conference at New York was another token of the rising tide of Christian love above mere national pride and the narrow divisions of special denominations. At that Conference, delegates attended from every part of the world, and were united in the common brotherhood of Christ. He then touched upon the proofs of the Bible being God's Holy Word, and quoting the two canons of scientific men—the law of cause and effect and the law of need—he said they could be enlisted on the side of Christianity. Under the first canon, the existence of the Bible could be accounted for, under the supposition that it was of Divine origin, for it had caused a revulsion of feeling that had swept away the polytheism that formerly existed, and replaced it by a general belief in the unity of God. In discussing the law of need, he argued that a conviction of a hereafter, a belief in a Heaven which could be attainable, and a love for a God, were spiritual necessities in order to satisfy the three-fold nature of man. The Bible was the only means offered that satisfied this spiritual necessity, for it opened the doors of heaven to his soul. He ridiculed the Darwinian theory of man's development from some lower organism, and affirmed his conviction that nothing explained man's origin but this : "In the image of God created He him." He showed how beautifully the New Testament harmonized with the Old, and pointed out how unfaillingly the Saviour had fulfilled the pre-appointed mission. Whatever the scientists did, whatever was true or good in their discoveries, would, he felt convinced, in the end redound to the honour of Jesus.* The speaker concluded a very able address by expressing the gratification it gave him to attend the meeting, to be present at which he had travelled 500 miles.

The resolution was seconded by George Hague, Esq., and carried.

The meeting then sang the hymn "Oh Word of God Incarnate."

The third resolution was moved by the Rev. J. G. Robb, B.A., and was as follows :—

"That whilst thankful to God for His continued mercies, we are sorry to hear of a decrease in the receipts of our own and other Bible Societies, including our great Parent, the British and Foreign Bible Society, and we earnestly hope that in the coming year, our people will be ready to deny themselves rather than suffer the spread of God's Word to be limited by a lack of funds."

The rev. gentleman was sure if they all felt that the Bible was the source of peace for time and of glory for eternity, that there would be no lack of funds. Although the Bible had many foes, it should not be forgotten that He that is with us is greater than all that are against us. It must be a source of pain that the President of the British Association openly announced recently at Belfast that the highest attainments in science lead to the denial of the existence of authority for God's Word. Professor Tyndall said we must look not to the spiritual, but to matter for the potency and promise of every form of life. There is nothing in the ascertained facts of science to warrant that assertion. The rev. speaker handled in a masterly manner the

admission of Tyndall that we must prolong the vision beyond the mere experimental. That is, the scepticism of present experimental scientists has *no experience* to rest on. To discover a theory subversive of revelation they are forced to "prolong the vision" beyond the limits within which, as scientific men, they have circumscribed truth. It must be satisfactory to the friends of the Bible to know, and from the mouth of the High Priest of modern infidelity himself, that science does not eschew revelation; but to do so the infidel must go *beyond* the truth that science has taught him. That is, we have a frank confession that the Bible cannot even yet be assailed upon the true principles of science, and within the range of its vision. It must also be satisfactory to the friends of God's Word to know, that the most eminent scientific men claim kindred with them, and avow the most decided hostility to those who thus, without the warrant, though in the name of science, oppose themselves to the inspired scriptures. The very highest intellectual endowment and scientific attainment perfectly consist with a simple and scriptural faith. The Bible was attacked from another quarter. Protestants were asked, "Where was your religion before Luther?" Well, it was where all true religion was—in the Word of God, and therefore it was the religion of God. Protestantism would fall when its foundations fell, and that would not be until God's own throne rushed to ruins. They could enter the domains of science and show that science is not opposed to the Bible. If a man wanted to show himself true to a cause, he ought to do so not only when it was at the height of its prosperity; therefore there was now an opportunity for all true friends to aid the Bible Society, although he did not believe the cloud under which the society laboured was larger than a man's hand. By the grace of God this would yet be transformed, and covering the heavens of the future would shower down rich and abundant blessing. They should look upon it but as the recession of the wave, which at the next turn would rise higher, until the full coming of the tide would cover the world. The rev. speaker drew a graphic picture of the present condition of Italy, and noted with exultation that Pope Pius could look out of his window and see a store, over the windows of which was written, "The depot of the British and Foreign Bible Society." The time was contemplated by the society, when the miracle of Pentecost revived through our labours and prayers, all men would hear the Word of God in their own tongue, and then the knowledge of God would cover the earth. Christianity is emphatically a religion of "giving," and should this principle operate rightly upon all they would not have to come before them again with a deficiency.

REV. J. J. RICE.—In seconding the resolution, said :—

"I ask five minutes for a few practical remarks, in support of the resolution now before you. In order to meet man's manifold wants God has done, and arranged to have done, all that is necessary. Among these wants, a sound morality is prominent, and, its supply essential to the well-being of the race. That supply has always been looked for in connection with religious training and practice; but no religious system, save that of the Bible, ever yet essayed to meet the moral want of the race. Indeed, the very devotions ordained by many of the systems were inseparably associated with gross immorality in a variety of forms. Morality is not Bible Christianity; but the Bible admittedly furnishes and enjoins upon all an absolutely perfect code of morals, and hence meets what every other religious system has failed in. Again every period has furnished its full share of unfortunates, and these have their claims upon their fellow-creatures. To destroy the lives of such has been the policy pursued, as a rule, under the operation of every religious system save Christianity, and that too with its full concurrence. What a delightful contrast to such a course does Christian philanthropy furnish.

The Bible has generated a spirit of true and universal brotherhood, which has suggested and set on foot in the spirit of Christ, means for the alleviation, and so far as possible, the removal of every species of human misery. Hence, we claim that all those philanthropic institutions which abound in Christian lands to-day, have had their origin in, and have been necessitated by the general circulation of the Bible. A gentleman, visiting lately, in my company, the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, after having examined its excellent management, and its judicious and ample convenience and accommodation, enthusiastically exclaimed, 'What a magnificent testimony is this to the value of our common Christianity—nothing else could have dreamt of such an institution as this!' And my friend was right. Another great and universal want of the race, is a comprehensive charity—the opposite and corrective of intolerance and persecution; and surely we might expect religious systems to furnish this. But have they done so? The prosecution of false religious systems has developed more intolerance and persecution of such as would not bend to them than all else combined. It is only the practice of Bible principles that checks the natural tendency in our race to intolerance and persecution. Romanism may be cited in proof of this position. Whatever may be said to the contrary, it is well known that the unrestricted circulation and perusal of the Bible is forbidden in Rome, and that sacraments, papal dogmas, priestly absolutism, etc., have been substituted for saving Gospel truth. The result is, as all history proves, that a most intolerant and persecuting spirit has been evoked within her pale, the result of which has been the infliction of wrong that has been a reproach to the very name of Christianity, in whose interest the wrong has, professedly, been perpetrated. It has been asked if Rome, again dominant, can ever repeat her atrocious barbarities. I reply, 'No,'—not that the system has changed for the better, but that the influence of Bible teaching has now become so general, that even Romanists themselves feel its force, in spite of the false teaching of their system. God in pity for our fallen race, in these and other respects, gave the Son of His love as a corrective of all existing human woes and abuses, and Jesus, having accomplished his life-work here, instructed his disciples to go out into all the world, and to preach the GOSPEL to every creature, a commission which can only meet its fulfilment in the exact ratio of Bible circulation. This resolution asks that our people will be ready to deny themselves, rather than to suffer the spread of God's word to be limited by a lack of funds. To meet all the claims of the society upon you, I am sure not one of you need exercise much self-denial; but, even were it otherwise, the practical benefits resulting from increased Bible circulation are such that all must concede that, for such an object, self-denial is right and an imperative duty."

The resolution was carried.

The collection was then taken up, and the meeting sang the hymn "Let everlasting glories crown."

The following resolution was then moved by the Rev. J. M. Cameron, seconded by J. George Hodgins, Esq., LL. D., and carried.

"That the hearty thanks of this meeting be presented to the Trustees of the Metropolitan Church for its use on Sabbath evening last; to the Trustees of this Church for its use on the present occasion, and to the Organist, Choir and Children for their valuable services in connection with this Annual Meeting."

The meeting then sang the doxology, and the benediction was pronounced by the Rev. Alexander Topp, D.D.

THE REGULAR QUARTERLY MEETING of the Directors was held at the Depository on Tuesday, 13th April, at 7.30 o'clock P.M., the President in the

chair. After devotional exercises, conducted by the Rev. R. D. Fraser, the minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. The death of the lamented Bishop Richardson having been referred to, a committee was appointed to draft a suitable minute to be placed on record. The "Committee on the premises" reported, recommending certain alterations and repairs. The report was amended so as to provide for a more convenient room for the meeting of the Board, and was then adopted. Mr. Joseph Strain, one of the oldest colporteurs in the Society's service, having tendered his resignation on account of growing age, and for other reasons, the Directors adopted the following resolution:—"That the Board, in view of the proposal of Mr. Joseph Strain to resign his connection with the Society as colporteur, should a pension be granted him, while not being in a position to make such a grant, there being no fund available for such a purpose, are yet prepared, should Mr. Strain still desire to resign, to vote him a gratuity equivalent to three months' salary; and that the Secretaries on receiving Mr. Strain's resignation draw upon the Treasurer for the amount of ninety dollars, and forward the same to him with an expression of the esteem of the Board, and their best wishes for him." It being thought desirable that the number of the *Recorder* containing the Annual Report should also embody other matters of general interest, it was ordered "That in future the May number of the *Recorder* do contain the Society's Annual Report; the proceedings of the Annual Meeting; an alphabetical list of the Branches, showing the officers and contributions of each; a list of subscribers of \$1.00 and upwards; together with any other matter of general interest that it is thought advisable to insert, and that it be published in a neat wrapper." It was decided to request the use of the Richmond street Methodist Church for the Annual Meeting; to invite the Rev. Jno. Potts to preach the Annual Sermon; and to leave the general arrangements to the Secretaries. The Secretary submitted the Depositary's monthly statement of Receipts and Expenditure, and reported gratuities to the amount of \$16.26. Grants were made as follows:—to the Quebec Bible Society, \$500; to British Columbia for Colportage, \$300; for Colportage, &c., in Manitoba, \$500; to the Brit. & For. Bible Society, £200 sterling. The Rev. Jas. Dick, for so many years Secretary of the Richmond Hill Branch, being about to resign, the Directors elected him a life member of the Society in consideration of his valuable services. After routine business, the Board adjourned at 10.50 P.M. to meet again on 29th inst.

ADJOURNED QUARTERLY MEETING OF DIRECTORS.—The Board met in the usual place at 7.30 P.M., on Thursday, 29th April, the President in the chair. After devotional exercises and routine business, the Rev. S. Rose, on behalf of the committee appointed to draft a suitable minute relative to the death of Bishop Richardson, submitted the following:—

"In the recent decease of the Rev. James Richardson, D.D., senior Bishop of the Meth. Episcopal Church, the Upper Canada Bible Society has lost one of its most valued and honoured friends and members, its pioneer agent, and one of its Vice-Presidents, whose praise was in all the Provinces, and whose earnest and exemplary efforts for the country's good knew no abatement till the final summons came. Seldom indeed, does such a vacancy occur in the ranks of the Society's oldest, best and most honoured adherents; and the Board of Directors desire not only thus to recognize and record the worth of the departed, but also to assure the relatives and friends of respectful sympathy, mingled with thanksgiving and congratulations on account of the fact that they have such a memory to cherish, and such footsteps to follow in certain and blessed hope of a glorious reunion." On motion of the Hon. Wm. McMaster,

seconded by Warring Kennedy, Esq., the above was adopted, and a copy ordered to be sent to the family of the deceased. An application from the Methodist Missionary Society, for a grant of scriptures for use in their Missions in the North-West, was received, and 150 English Testaments, 20 Cree Testaments and 5 Cree Bibles were granted. Messrs. Kerr & Anderson were appointed to audit the Society's accounts. The Annual Report was read by the Permanent Secretary, and referred to a select committee. The Secretary reported arrangements for the Annual Meeting, and the meeting closed at 11 P.M.

The REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING of the Board was held at 7.30 P.M., on Tuesday, May 11th, the Hon. W. McMaster in the chair. The meeting was opened with prayer. On motion of W. Kennedy, Esq., seconded by Alex. Rattray, Esq., it was resolved, "That the cordial thanks of this meeting be tendered to the Rev. John Potts for the able and eloquent sermon preached on the occasion of the anniversary of this Society, in the Metropolitan Church, on Sunday, May 2nd; and that he be requested to furnish the manuscript of the same, for publication in the *Recorder*."

The Depository's statement of Receipts and Expenditure was read, and gratuities (made during the month of April) to the amount of \$17.52 were confirmed. A committee was appointed to confer with a similar committee from the U. C. Tract Society as to the distribution of the Ketchum Bequests, and the appointment of a successor to the late Bishop Richardson as representative of the Societies in the matter. The standing committee on Agency and Colportage for the ensuing year was appointed, as also a special committee to take into consideration the whole question as to the system of Agency. The Permanent Secretary was granted leave of absence for two weeks, purposing, among other things, to visit the Bible House in New York during that time. After the discharge of routine business, the Rev. J. J. Rice led in prayer, and the meeting closed at 9.30 P.M.
