William Bonney Makes a Few Statements in the West. Column Camp—Needs Which Led Up to the Death of the Major—How He Said He Knew that the Major Was Dead.

London, Nov. 9.—William Bonney, the only living white officer of Stanley's rear column, who is personally acquainted with all the terrible events connected with the misfortune at Yambou camp, has made the following signed statement to the London Times.

"I regret very much that I am obliged to take part in the controversy which has arisen through the publication of Major Bartlett's diaries and letters.
