#### MEETINGS.

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## REPORT

OF THE

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY

FOR THE YEAR 1880.

The Committee of Management, on completing their term of office, beg to make the following report, being

the 45th since the foundation of the Society.

The Society's sources of revenue having been materially affected by the falling off in the rate of interest upon their investments, the Committee have been obliged to curtail their expenditure accordingly. They have, however, endeavoured to distribute the amount at their disposal as carefully as possible, and have relieved 78 cases of distress, comprising 169 persons, the total amount expended in charity being \$505.84. For details regarding this expenditure the members are referred to the report of the Sub-Committee of Charity appended hereto.

One ordinary member has been enrolled, and one

has resigned.

The usual anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of St. George's day, when the Rev. G. V. Housman, one of the chaplains to the Society, preached the sermon, and the Revd. M. M. Fothergill, the Revd. C. W. Rawson, and Revd Thos. Richardson assisted in the service. E. A. Bishop, Esq., organist to the Cathedral, undertook the musical portion of the service, and the ladies and gentlemen of the choir and others tendered their valuable assistance. To all of the above mentioned the Committee desire to express their appreciation of this and previous similar favors.

We have to mourn the loss by death of Mr. James S. Crawford, a life member, and for some time Secretary c a life meml Ou

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Mr. James time Secretary of the Society, Mr. Wm. Enfield Cole, junior, also a life member, and Mr. Thomas Glover, an ordinary member.

Our Society in the person of its chief officer has been the object of the usual civilities on the part of sister societies and other corporations in this city.

We have been addressed on two occasions by the North America St. George's Union, enquiring in the first place for details as to our, organization, membership, revenue, and expenditure, and secondly, asking for information in regard to our district as a field for immigration. To both of these communications your Secretary replied. The North America St. George's Union is an organization composed at present of about fifteen St. George's Societies in the United States, and as many in Canada, united together for the advancement of objects, common to all, and representatives from which meet annually to confer upon any matters which may be in the interest of the St. George's Societies upon this continent.

Your Committee desire to express their sense of the careful and pains taking manner in which the Chairman of the Sub-Committee of Charity, Mr. Oliver, has attended to the duties of his office, viz: the superintendence of the distribution of the Society's charitable fund. The judicious expenditure of from \$500 to \$700 per annum in charity is a task of no little difficulty, but the fact that so large an amount is annually distributed to the deserving poor should be very satisfactory to those who, by becoming members of the Society are now contributors to this fund, and the operations of the Society generally should, in the opinion of your Committee, be of such interest as to induce a larger attendance at the various meetings, in a body composed of over one hundred persons now resident here.

As in former years, your Sub-Committee have not avoided being imposed upon; they nevertheless feel they have done what they could to avoid such cases.

The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D.D.; D.C.L., Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jocob Mountain, the first Anglic in bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789 at Norwich, England, came to Canada with his father, 1793, and died after a brief illness at Bardfield his country seat, on 5th Jany. 1863. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock, and in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead. while in 1847, when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec in 1849 and 1854 he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his Life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times took a great interest in its proceedings.
