




The Montreal District Cattle Show was held at the usual place, Plains of St. Anne, on Thursday the 16th September instant. The Judges being duly appointed and sworn, proceeded to the inspection of Stock, &c. &c. - and made the following adjudications:

N.B. Mr. David Stanfield, Petit Côte, was awarded a premium for a Stallion imported by him, and recommended by the Judge as a useful Horse for saddle or draft.

A very fine young Horse, thoroughbred, and a Bull and Cow, imported by Commodore Barrie, having arrived in Montreal the day previous to the Cattle Show, the Commodore (by particular request) had the politeness to have the stock taken to the Show, in order to afford an opportunity of judging the merit of particular breeds.

The young horse Daghie, rising two years old, bred by Commodore Barrie from as good blood as any in England, was declared by good judges to be an animal of the best promise (of the racing class) that has ever been introduced into this province.

The young Bull, (one year old past) a cross between the Dartmoor and Lancashire breed, was considered to be the best of the age that has been imported to this country, and well adapted to the Upper Province, for which he is intended.

The Cow, (four years old), of the Lancashire short-horned breed, notwithstanding the colour (nearly white) being disapproved of, was a fine animal; and the size not being over large, was well calculated for this country.

It is much to be regretted, that persons bringing Stock to the Cattle Show, will not endeavour to conform to the rules of the Society—to have the several animals entered in the same class kept together, to afford a better opportunity to the judges to determine accurately the comparative merits of such. In Britain this rule is particularly attended to. The Stock would also appear to much better advantage than as the present practice allows, sorts, and sizes intermixed.—It is to be hoped, that at the next Show, this rule will be better attended to.

Some of the best Stock in the District that have obtained premiums at former Shows, were not exhibited this year—a rule of the Society disqualifying animals from obtaining the same premium a second time; consequently, the first rate animals were not brought forward; but, notwithstanding this circumstance, the Show of Neat Cattle and Sheep was very gratifying.

The Show of Brood Mares, calculated for the Saddle, were not numerous; and this is the more extraordinary when there are so many fine Horses in the District of Montreal.

The Society's imported Ayrshire Bull was not sold; consequently, he remains with the Society for the use of the District.

There were some excellent pieces of Canadian manufactured Woolen Cloth exhibited.

The premiums, eighty in number, were paid, as awarded, in presence of the Committee.
