RULES TO GOVERN THE MATCH. The men shall wear knit shirt and short coat or jacket, not extending below the hips, with strong collar and elbow for grasp of the opponent, and thin rubber

3. Both men shall stand up breast to breast, with limber arms and show fair and

10. Not less than ten nor more than twenty ninutes' rest allowed between such

12. The ring to be twenty-four feet square, and nobody to be allowed, inside except the referee and two umpires, who shall be chosen on the day of the contes Referee's decision to be final.


