"And he waits below for my coming," cried Helen, with frantic eagerness. "She was about to rush away, when Mrs Allerton gently restrained her."

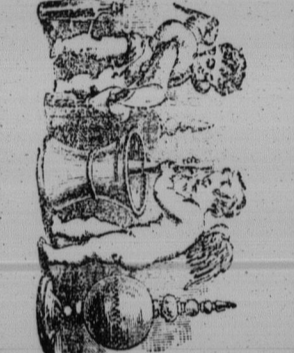
