A DEAVY EXPORT DUTY ON ORE.

Leave the Minerals Where They Are or Get Some Good Out of Them.

Editor World: The writer of the following, having visited nearly every county in Ontario, south of the C.P.R. main line, spent over a year along the north shore of Lake Superior and nearly two years on the prairie; in the grazing district and in the Rocky Mountains. He has been through to Vancouver, has visited a pirtion of the McKentle route for the C.P.R. and feels free to assert that the Dominion of Canada, with a wall of non-intercourse or total prohibition of all trade with the United States, has the people and the material within her own borders to build up a greater and wealthier nation within the next 50 years than our neighbors, and even then not be so narrowminded.

The Cammore coal seams are on the south side of the C.P.R. track, and on the north side are large beds of Hematite iron ore and blenty of limestone convenient if required.

Leaving Canmore for the east, we pass through the beautiful and fertile valleys of the Kananaskis and Bow Rivers and the footbills to Calgary, the distributing depot for the mountains and the distant posts on the Athabaska, Peace and McKenzie Rivers, where are situated the most extensive petroleum fields in the word waiting for the entrying of the thickness, lies all along the Bow, Elbow, Red Deer, Battle and North Saskatchewan and Rosebud Rivers, or over 40,000 square miles of Canadian territory, extending southerly to within a few miles of the boundary line. Hamilton, land commissioner of the C.P.R., has received some samples of grain that are very interesting in view of the fact that they came from a region that has always been considered to be outside the agricultural belt of the Northwest. They were sent from Lac la Birche, 350 miles north of Calgary. The samples consist of wheat, oats and barley, and were grown on the farms of George Tuintelle, L. Paul and the Roman Catholic mission. The wheat is red fyle and is plump, bright and hard, and superior in all respects to any sample seen in Manitoba this season. The barley and oats are also of very high grade. The grain does not show the least signs of having been affected by feest. These samples show that the half is not yet known of the extent of the agricultural area of the great Northwest.
